PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What is it about World Tournament sites that the weather gods don't like? Just about every year unusual and generally record breaking temperatures hit the World Tournament location like a runaway train. Hibbing proved to be no exception as high temperatures and 90% humidity moved in for more than a week pushing the big cooling fans in the arena to the limit. Courts were set up in two hockey rinks, but the ice was missing, replaced by the green carpet that was trucked over from last year's event in Bismarck. This made the courts look and feel better than stark concrete and protected it from the many errant horseshoes that seemed to land short of their mark.

Despite the weather, which they could not control, the Hibbing Horseshoe Club did a great job in preparing

and maintaining the facilities. While planning and setup takes the efforts of many, the day-to-day facility support and a big reason for the success of the tournament was due largely to the efforts of Tom Keppel, secretary of the club. Tom and brother Tim were seemingly always there, always working and never complaining. Bill Grillo, retired Hibbing Chief-of-Police, was the driving force behind the bid. He brought the NHPA to town and was instrumental in getting a great portion of the community involved where virtually every restaurant, sign and store window welcomed horseshoe pitchers.

The main activity of pitching went off pretty much like clockwork. There were no major glitches and no shift delays. This was due primarily to some good preplanning and the tireless

efforts of the NHPA Council who supervised the running of each shift in both arenas. Of course, we had the usual fine supporting cast of runners, computer people and office staff who quietly work behind the scenes. And what about that finish in the Open Men's Championship? We couldn't have scripted it any better. Defending champion Brian Simmons and Alan Francis, both without a loss, met in the final game with the World Championship title returning to Alan. The ladies provided some excitement and great games too. While Sylvianne Moisan won her second straight women's title, Amy Francis took second and continues to excite the imagination that someday we will see husband and wife each holding the championship trophy.

DAVE'S COURT REPORT

Some personnel changes are underway in key NHPA positions. Recently appointed Newsline Editor, Lloyd Kilgore, asked to step down due to health problems that were being affected by the deadlines of the magazine. Lloyd is a very gifted writer. We wish him well and hope that he will still occasionally contribute stories to the magazine. The new Editor is Paula Summerlin of Webberville, Michigan. This issue is Paula's first and we certainly wish her much success. Publicity Director Billie Sue Pennington is stepping down October 1st. Some 3 years ago she accepted my challenge to take publicity in a new direction. What a job she has done. NHPA publicity jumped into the electronic world with online capabilities most of us find difficult to imagine. Those of you who have visited the NHPA website and clicked on publicity and the various related windows have seen only a smattering of the work and improvements Billie Sue has brought to the NHPA Publicity program. While she is stepping down, she is not stepping away. Billie Sue will continue to work behind the scenes and assist the new director with various functions she set up. Thank you Billie Sue for your contributions and your friendship over the years.

Publicity and Promotion are now going to be combined under an NHPA Vice-President. The two functions overlap in

several areas and National Promotion Director Bob Dunn who has been wearing several hats has indicated a desire to concentrate more on the history of the game and the Horseshoe Trader program that he developed. As such, 2nd VP Casey Sluys has been appointed to be Director of NHPA Publicity/Promotion. We shall appoint two assistant directors, one on each side of the country, who will work with Casey on various programs, those already underway and others to be developed.

NHPA Rules, previously with the 2nd VP will now become the responsibility of 4th VP, Bonnie Seibold. This should be a smooth transition because Bonnie, as a long-time Council member, is aware of what the responsibility entails and it fits nicely into alternating years with the Bylaws, which the 4th Vice President now handles.

CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS

The convention was smooth and relatively quick this year, four hours from start to finish. Eau Claire, Wisconsin, was confirmed as the site of the 2003 World Tournament. Red Deer, Alberta, Canada, host site for the 2002 event is well along in their preparation. Handouts and souvenirs were hot items in their booth as a great number of our pitchers plan to make Red Deer and the Canadian Rockies their vacation spot for next year.

Delegates were told of the Hall of Fame building plans in Joelton, TN and how the NHPF operates and interfaces with the NHPA. On display at the NHPF booth was a wall poster with several enlarged photos of the building under construction. Display items will be moved to Joelton in early November where they will be cataloged. If all goes as planned, the Hall of Fame exhibit should open to the public sometime next spring.

The delegates returned incumbent NHPA directors to office. 1st VP Allen Baptist, 3rd VP Lorraine Sternberg and 5th VP Paul Stewart running unopposed, were all re-elected by acclamation. President Dave Loucks, running against Jim Gorth, was re-elected by a vote of 89-36.

Thirteen Rules proposals were discussed, some amended, and all voted on. It took 84 delegate votes for the needed two-thirds to pass. If you have access to our website, you can review the results there. If not, refer to pages 8-9 of the May/June *Newsline* issue.

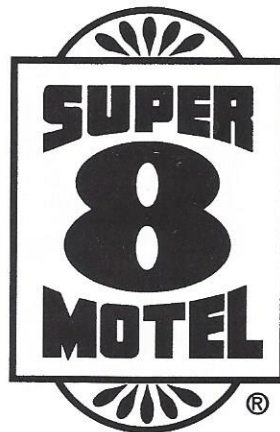

2001 World Horseshoe Tournament Hibbing, Minnesota

This year we again headed north to attend the World Tournament. Hibbing is in the Arrowhead region of northeastern Minnesota, the center of the Mesaba iron-ore country. The town is pretty, neat and tidy. The houses and yards are well kept. Many of its streets are lined with elm trees that meet overhead like a cathedral ceiling—delightful. The surrounding countryside is beautiful with its lakes, birch trees and evergreens framed by the red mountain range.

Hibbing's story is another interesting bit of Americana. This had been logging country, with camps for up to 200 men each. When Frank Hibbing explored the area in the 1880's, he heard rumors of rich ores in the ground. Mining the ore began in 1892. From the beginning, the ore was taken from the surface, or open pit mining. It's now called the Grand Canyon of the north, so gigantic is its depth and area.

Hibbing was platted in 1893. It was the fastest growing village on the range. The population reached 1,000 by 1895, and 2,500 by 1900. The mining attracted immigrants from everywhere—Italy, Germany, Finland, Poland, Serbia, etc. Today, the ethnic diversity is still represented by the many denominations of churches around town—Methodist, Catholic, Episcopal, Lutheran, Greek Orthodox. (At one time there were 30 different languages being spoken—which contributed to accidents on the minefield!)

The town lots were 25 feet wide. The houses had only a narrow sidewalk between them. In fact, the eaves touched each other. The lots cost \$300 apiece, but the company held most of the leases. It was a rough town with saloons, hotels, boarding houses, and stables. There was no pavement at first. Wooden sidewalks were built to help

keep the pedestrians clean. The railroad came in the early 1900's, bringing people in, and the iron ore and lumber out. Schools, a fire station and the city hall were built.

Then came the rumor that the town was sitting on even more and richer ore. The mines put out a statement that they were NOT planning to move the town. Privately, however, the mine company was buying up property. Another business area was platted in South Hibbing, two miles away. There were court cases back and forth, claiming graft. Meanwhile, a new City Hall and Courthouse, and the fabulous Hibbing High School were built to lure the residents to move south.

There was no vote by the people. The move began. Some large buildings were moved on steel rollers. Some, too big to move, were cut in half or thirds moved and re-assembled in South Hibbing. Many people were glad for the move, for the better living conditions they would have—the original houses had been little more than shacks. Also, World War I was going on, and people thought it un-American to oppose, as the mining industry was vital to the war effort.

Kids did some of the demolition work. They pounded nails from boards, and earned \$1.50 for every 1,000 bricks cleaned! During the depression of the 20's and 30's there was still work in N. Hibbing demolishing buildings. They all had to come down. The last weren't removed until the 1950's.

The ore didn't extend as far under the town as at first thought, however. Mining it was discontinued after a time. The rest of the abandoned town is now a park-like area with trees, streets, streetlights, and sidewalks up to long-gone houses. They say it's not a ghost town, though. The people didn't leave—they just moved south a few

miles.

We took a tour of the aforementioned High School, and were thoroughly impressed. A very large red brick structure, it was built in the 1920's for 4 million dollars. It would cost 50 to 100 million dollars to duplicate today.

The entrance features an eighteen-foot-wide marble stairway, and mosaic tile floor. Solid marble balustrades and brass handrails frame the stairs. The hand-carved plaster moldings throughout the school were fashioned by Italian artisans, painted in pastels and gilt. Murals depicting American history are on either side of the entry.

A large mural of the mining and steel industries was brought from the old Lincoln school in North Hibbing. There are 17 men depicted in the mural, each representing a different nationality.

The 1800-seat auditorium was modeled after New York City's Capital Theatre. The seats are original. They've been re-covered twice. The crystal and beaded chandeliers were imported from Belgium. Each one is now insured for \$100,000. As a student enters high school, he is assigned his own seat in the auditorium, and it is his until he graduates. The students are extremely proud of their school, and vandalism or graffiti is unheard of.

The tournament was held at two locations. The smaller was at a fairgrounds building.

The main location was at the Hibbing Memorial Arena. This was a wonderful, multi-purpose building. The main area is the hockey and/or basketball venue. But, at every turn you were surprised with another room or group of rooms:

The County extension offices, the servicemen's facilities, such as the VFW, a senior center and dining room,

STATE OFFICERS MEETING

A very positive and upbeat State Officers meeting was held Saturday, August 4, in Hibbing, Minnesota. The meeting was co-chaired by Jerry LaBrosse, Minnesota State President and Phyllis Quist, Washington State President. Twenty-two were in attendance, representing 10 states.

The two NHPA presidential candidates, Dave Loucks and Jim Gorth, briefly addressed the group and said they would each elaborate more on their platforms at the convention.

Phyl Quist displayed the Washington State directory, which is a loose-leaf 7x9 notebook with a page of contacts, tournaments, directions, motels, etc. for each State Charter and a map off the Internet pinpointing the courts at each Charter. When any changes occur, just that page needs to be replaced to keep the books current. Also, Washington does a yearly calendar showing all tournaments, the registration deadline and the telephone numbers to call to register. They are sold for \$3.00 to cover the printing cost. After July 1st the calendar is given to any new pitchers that join. Also Phyl had a photo album entitled "Who's Who in Horseshoes." It has close-up photos of pitchers and spouses, alphabetized by last name. This is a good tool in getting to know everyone.

Ward Lutz of Minnesota said Jerry LaBrosse has developed a database program, which has all the state info and can generate almost any report by any given category that is needed. He also makes up personal business cards for

every officer. The front has general Minnesota horseshoe pitching information and the back has personal name, address, phone, email, etc. This is a great promotion idea. Minnesota also puts out a pocket size schedule each year.

Marlys Timm, the News Media director for Minnesota, encouraged states to keep a scrapbook of all news items. She also reported that the Post Office issued a pictorial stamp cancellation in conjunction with the 2001 World Tournament event.

Rick Wright, 1st V.P. Minnesota, reported on a one-day, statewide summit they conducted early this year. All officers and T.D.s were invited. They made up packets with all the rules information, a T.D. procedure sheet, the programs they offer, how to register clubs, how to submit to newsletter, how to contact the media, etc. He said it was very successful and productive.

Glen Jamison, NHPA statistician, strongly urged all charters to get programs so that all stats can be uniform and submitted in ASCII format. He also urged clubs to get Microsoft Access. Bill Trader, North Dakota, suggested contacting Microsoft as we are a non-profit organization and they may contribute the older software programs for little or nothing. Jim Gorth, California, said the MicroOffice program also has Micro Access on it. Glen suggested that each president appoint someone to promptly submit tournament results to him and also to check the Internet to see if any tournaments are missing. Glen is

continually working on updating the program.

Joe Faron, Missouri President, said they have made their newsletter mandatory for all members. Minnesota, Washington and South Dakota incorporated their newsletters as part of the yearly dues. Jane Smith, 1st V.P. Wisconsin, said they give away subscriptions as prizes at events.

Jerry LaBrosse asked about tournament participation. Almost across the board, all states reported that tournament attendance was down this year.

Jerry suggested that each club appoint a News Media director. The San Diego club paid for an ad in the newspaper and from that ad they gained 15 new pitchers. Vickie Winston said to be sure to also check the NHPA website for people who are inquiring about horseshoes.

Dave Loucks handed out NHPF flyers and asked that everyone put them on display at all tournaments. All information needs to filter down and each of us can make a difference in our state.

The meeting was adjourned.

the diversity of Hibbing, here come the horseshoe pitchers! From a teen preacher, to a Doctor of Theology, from a research scientist, to a police chief, from a ten year old with boundless energy, to a wheelchair pitcher. From little girls to seniors. What other sport is as all-inclusive?

Our favorite moment this year involved our friend, Earl Simler. After 20 years of attending and pitching in the World Tournament, he won his first trophy ever. But the wonderful thing is that he not only got a trophy, it was a First Place trophy—he won all 15 games. Way to go, Earl!

The next thing I brought up was the fact that next year is the 25th anniversary of the sanctioned league program. I do have several plans that I am working on for that.

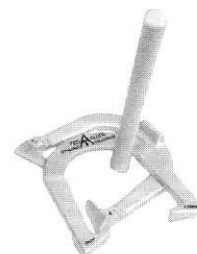
We had a short review of the forms that are to be submitted. It's important to be filling out the top-ten form. This is the only way members of your club can make the top ten.

OPENMEN

From day one it looked like Brian Simmons was on a mission, posting high percentage wins not seen in recent years. Jim Walters appeared to be on the same wagon. Alan Francis, although on a all win streak, was less impressive.

Simmons in expected style of a returning champ, was first out of the gate, absolutely astounding the bean counters who know something of past records. His five games over ninety percent on that first day, had fans recalling the tournament records of Casey Jones in 1948 and the 88.2 of the great Elmer Hohl in 1968.

Meanwhile, six-time champ Alan Francis was chugging along marking his wins in the style of an eighty percent pitcher.

Jim Walters, the long lanky pumper, reaching to score, kept other Ohio folks keenly interested as he registered 85% the first day with zero losses

The only man new to the championship class was Mark Mauthe, a Wisconsin walk-on. He found his way into this World Tournament by being in town, on hand to take advantage of a drop-out. Mauthe began big, winning his first two games over the for-

midable competition of well known pitchers, the entertaining Massachusetts fireman with the hatchet wind-up, John Kapnis, and the effervescent Art Tyson.

Day two, during the second five games, Simmons and Francis continued to win by nearly the same percentage, but still Simmons had the edge. Walters met Paul LaCrosse pitching with new resolve. In spite of an 81% effort, Walters let it get away to LaCrosse (84.9%) in a lengthy game of 104 shoes.

Walter Ray Williams pitching passably well and at one loss suffered a barrage of Dale Lipovsky, Francis, Walters and Simmons that effectively put him out of the race.

Simmons pronounced his rally word for day three was, "Be tough." Tough. He was against the tough competition of the top of the order dispatching Lipovsky in just 38 shoes with his high game of the tournament, 94.7%—he missed two shoes. In come-back fashion Lipovsky, pitching 84.2%, stretched the next game with Francis to 114 shoes. Francis, pitching his best of the three day run, was up to the chore with a game of 91.2%. Later,

Francis admitted the long game had tired him and his feet were hurting.

Meanwhile, Walters, still pitching near 80%, was nicked by the two leaders just prior to the final game; the one everyone was waiting for, Francis vs. Simmons.

The big game started out tough for Simmons. He lost three shoes early. Some thought they were on and off. Simmons later stated they were really "poorly thrown shoes." The lead may have built confidence for Francis as he dominated, starting with 30 ringers for 32 shoes. The game went to 80 shoes, Francis missing only seven times allowing Simmons just 15 points. This final game was the champion's best game of the event, 91.3%. Conversely, Simmons at 81.5% pitched his low game.

Francis tried to share the moment saying, "It's a great feeling. (I was) up and down, but this ices the cake." Even Simmons with the top average of 87.5% admitted Francis was, "Awesome."

In an on court salute, Francis pumped his shoes in the air in regaining his dominant title, Horseshoe Champion of the World.

SENIORMEN

Strange things developed for some of the Senior Men. Two-time former champion, John Brown was on the court for the first game as the record shows but was evidently in another world as Bob Lautenschleger nailed down the initial match in just 32 shoes. It would later prove to be a trade-off.

John Brown rebounded from the first game defeat to win the next game against none other than Howard Weitzel who, perhaps on a senior moment, played his low game of the finals. In a sense the Brown-Weitzel play-off was set up as a result of this

game.

Weitzel's good fortune carried him through some close games. Ron Hassler had 39 before he went down. Wayne Totten rose to 37. Bob Garber, whom earlier had given John Brown his second loss, was stopped at 39. Weitzel's own assessment was, "I was just so darned lucky to come back (from being down) on three of those games."

Lautenschleger was the victim of John Mathy's high finals game of 82.5% and sustained three other losses including a 39 point attempt versus Gerald Stangland. He went after the

leader, cutting Weitzel short in that 11th game. He had now won over both Weitzel and John Brown and figured in their play-off.

The tall man from Saskatchewan, Howard Weitzel, went all the way in the extra game pitching just about his average game, 65.5%. John Brown actually had high average for the class, which was very evenly divided. All twelve Seniors ranked between 59 and 65 percent.

Weitzel, who has been on this Earth 79 years remarked, "It's the joy of my life to (finally) win this, one time."

Day one, the Elders played six games and with the lengthy 110 shoe game between Clayton Gage and Ed Kowatch, the start of the Open Mens class was delayed. Both pitchers are known to hang tough in the long run, and when the numbers came in it was determined the game had set new World Tournament records for the Elders. Kowatch won pitching 82.7% while Gage clicked for 80.9%. We came away with all kinds of new numbers: ringers for the winner, ringers for the loser, double ringers for each, individual numbers and combined pitchers numbers.

On other courts the defending champion, Bob Logan, and Ed Arionus were leading the pack with all wins.

Indiana is thought to be home of the best batch of Elders. In this class Indiana was represented by Bob Logan, Curly Seibold, and Ed Kowatch. But, Kansas also provided three; Melvin Bray, Duane Pollard, and Merlin Potts. Potts did end up at the bottom of the heap but his total shoes pitched ranked up with the leaders meaning that he did not give up easily.

A three-quarter turn is the most popular with this group. We counted two tossing a one and one-quarter,

one flip and the rest the three-quarter.

Nearing the end of an otherwise perfect day for the Texas flipper, Arionus was left standing with 39 points versus Laymon Gullet The next game was Arionus versus Logan who had a clean record. Arionus cranked it up a notch, evened the field with Logan and came back in play-off. Two eighty percent (83.8% & 86.2%) games and Arionus claimed the title. It was his fourth World championship in

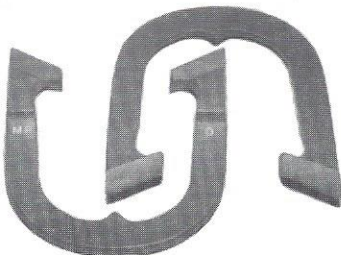
three separate divisions, probably the only man ever to accomplish that feat. Arionus now owns World titles in the Intermediate, Senior, and Elders divisions.

Someone asked him, "When did you know you had it?" Ed replied, "Yesterday, or was it tomorrow?"

Arionus left the next day to visit the place where he grew up, Black Duck, Minnesota, just up the road a-piece.

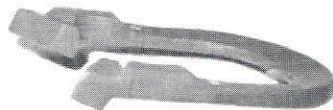

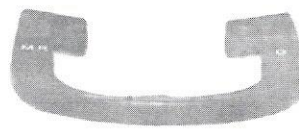

OPEN WOMEN

There were five current or former Women's World Champions in the Women's Championship Class at the 2001 World Horseshoe Tournament and they put on an excellent show of competitive pitching.

Eleven women averaged over 73% ringers but only ONE averaged over 80% ringers. That was Sylvianne Moisan of Quebec (the winner and still champion!) who averaged 83.64% ringers over the three-day competition.

Not only was her win-loss record the same as in her first championship at 14-1, but her winning ringer percentage was only 0.01 different than her ringer percentage in 2000.

Her lowest game was 75.6%, and her strength was most evident against her toughest opponents as she averaged 85.7% against the top six qualifiers.

This from a woman who is just glad to be able to pitch, after having surgery twice in the spring of 2001! As is her style, Sylvianne appeared calm and wasted no time delivering her 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ turn to the stake.

The similarities between 2000 and 2001 did not end with Sylvianne winning.

Amy Francis finished in second place for the second year in a row, pitching the exact same number of shoes, 1020, while pitching 6 more ringers in 2001. Amy, whose husband Alan earned his 12th World Title at these championships, also has a rapid delivery but pitches a single flip.

In third place was another Amy, Amy Hall from Virginia, who is determined to win a World title someday, pitching her smooth athletic style at a 78.21% clip.

Judy Curtiss from Michigan entered the finals with the highest ringer percentage out of the preliminaries and finished fourth.

Noteworthy were Joan Elmore from Tennessee who improved by 5% over 2000 to

finish fifth and Connie Filley from North Dakota who hung tough in most of her games.

The high degree of concentration among all the competitors was obvious.

Sylvianne stated afterwards that she is very happy to have won but was already getting ready to go to the Canadian championships. We are happy that she has recovered from her surgery and we are fortunate to be able to watch all these ladies work their magic!

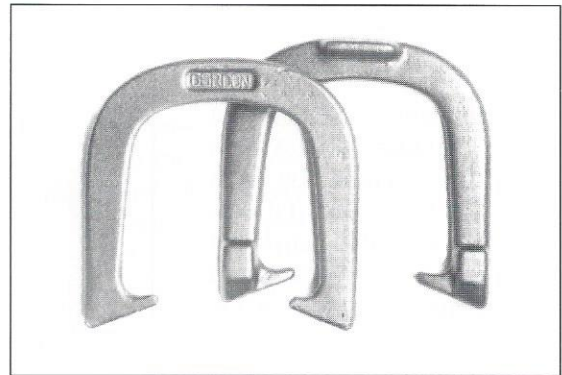
SENIOR LADIES

Jan Turnquist from host state Minnesota entered the 2001 World Horseshoe Tournament as defending Senior Ladies' Champion. But in 2001, her High 3 placed her in Class A of the Open Womens Division for the preliminary rounds. That experience among the top pitchers may have helped her successfully defend her title. Jan won 8 of those games and averaged 65.5% against the top women.

In the Senior Women's Division Championship, 2000 runner-up Edi Holland also from Minnesota, had one loss entering her final game with Jan. Edi prevailed in that game to force a playoff. Jan then pitched her highest game in the championship round, a 77.1% effort, to defeat Edi for her second consecutive title.

Highest game of the championships was by Lucille Leis of Ontario, who pitched a neat 80% and, like Jan, averaged 67.3% overall. Lucille was the third place winner, while Rivers Prewette, Rosalie Judy, and Edi McKinney rounded out the Championship group.

He had won Class C in 1998 and had pitched well in 2000, but he earned a berth in the 2001 Championships by spinning his low 3/4 turn to a 65.54% average in the preliminaries.

Class A in the mixed Juniors Division pitted 8 young pitchers in a double round robin over two nights. The two youngest competitors, Drew Becker of Ontario and Tyler Elfrink of Missouri finished first and second in the preliminaries while Lance, entering with a High 3 of 64%, was third. Watching the preliminaries with rapt attention were other juniors with a chance to make the championship round.

Commentary from them was con-

tinuous, sprinkling in nicknames like "Chip," "Dale," "Preacher Man," and "Special K," speaking of their youthful respect and affinity for one another.

Drew, Tyler, and Lance entered the Championship Junior Boys class along with Marcus Thomsen of Nebraska, pitching a reverse 1¹/₄, Defending Champion and flipper Chase Battle of Arkansas, Keith Boone of California, Brent Keen of Indiana, and the most surprised contestant, James Fortune of Iowa.

James had entered with a 40.10 High 3 and pitched 59.67 in Class B of the preliminaries to earn his way in.

Lance lost his first game to Keith Boone but never looked back. In his second game he made a statement by pitching 29 ringers for 32 shoes, then defeated his next 4 opponents.

He entered the final game against

top seed Becker with that one loss. Becker had just sustained his only loss to Tyler Elfrink by a score of 40-25, so the Championship had come down to this one game, pitting a young man who will enter the Open Men's division next year against a 12-year-old from Ontario.

Drew's 1¹/₄-shoe was beautiful, but Lance was deadly and won a close game to claim his first World Title. Tyler Elfrink of Missouri, a 14-year-old flipper, was third.

After the competition, Lance was happy and seemed stunned by his victory. With his size and his turn, he should be able to move to the 40-ft. distance with no problem.

In any case, the future of the Junior class is in good hands and the adult men will have some new challenges very soon!

JUNIORGIRLS

With the experience of two World Championships behind her, Shalee Sebastian of Pennsylvania served notice that she was ready to successfully defend her title when she won all of her games in the second half of the 8 player double round robin preliminaries. As the only girl in the Class A Junior Mixed Division, she was seeded # 8 and only won half of a game on the first night.

However, she gathered herself together for the second sweep averaging 67% ringers.

In the finals of the Girls' Championship Division, she allowed her opponents 20 points or less in the five games to win her third consecutive World Title. She averaged 60.29% overall, pitching with her no-time-wasted single flip delivery.

Kelly Mallette of Ontario was her

closest competitor pulling in an average of 51.30% to finish second, losing only to Shalee while Tenesia Mayer of New York captured her second straight third place finish with her 3/4 reverse (the only turn among the girls), averaging 42.80% ringers.

Rounding out the field were cousins from Wisconsin, Tina Riehle and Tava Cook, and Meagan Bigelow from Vermont.

2002 WORLD HORSESHOE TOURNAMENT REPORT

The Alberta Horseshoe Pitchers Association and the City of Red Deer are pleased to host the 2002 World Horseshoe Tournament from July 29 to August 10, 2002.

The site for the Tournament will be at the adjoining Parkland and North Pavilions of Westerner Park on the south side of the city of Red Deer. These pavilions have 20-foot high ceilings and a combined area of 71,000 square feet, as well as suitable adjoining rooms and facilities required to host the World Tournament. Both pavilions are air-conditioned. Immediately adjacent to the pavilions is an abundance of available parking.

The population of Red Deer is 69,000 and as such, has many hotels and motels. Our two host hotels are within 10 minutes of Westerner Park. Both hotels have air-conditioned and non-smoking rooms. The Red Deer Lodge can be reached at 1-800-661-1657. The Travelodge Red Deer can be contacted at 1-888-383-2344. Both hotels have set a rate of \$89.00 Canadian for the event next year. (In August 2001, 100 American dollars

would purchase about 150 Canadian dollars.) Other hotel accommodation information can be obtained from the Red Deer Visitor and Convention Bureau at 1-800-215-8946. All hotels are no more than 15 minutes from the pitching site.

Unlimited RV sites will be available at Westerner Park. As further information becomes available, it will appear in the *Newsline* and the *2002WHT.ab.ca* website.

Calgary International Airport is a 90-minute drive south of Red Deer. Edmonton International Airport is a 90-minute drive north of Red Deer. Both have car rentals available, but they should be booked in advance. Pitchers from the eastern coast area may want to check on flights via the discount airline, "West Jet," that flies out of Hamilton, Ontario which is close to Buffalo.

To enter Canada, visitors should have in their possession a valid passport or a birth certificate. Driving time to Red Deer is approximately 16 hours from Salt Lake City, 20 hours from Denver, 22 hours from Minneapolis.

The 2002 World Horseshoe Tournament website is www.2002WHT.ab.ca. It will contain new information as time goes on. Travel, accommodation and site information can be obtained on the website.

Plans for the Tournament are well under way. Tournament format, rules, pitching times etc. will be under the control of the National Horseshoe Pitcher's Association.
