# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE *by Dave Loucks*

Another world tournament has been added to the record books. While entries didn't reach the expected level, competition in the championship finals of the Men's and Women's Division certainly didn't lack for excitement and some great pitching. Sylvianne Moisan retained her Women's crown for the third consecutive year with a record of 15-0 and 86.0%. Taking second was Amy Hall of Virginia with a 14-1 record. Amy's only loss was to Sylvianne who threw a 95.3% game. Brian Simmons regained the Men's title by beating defending champion Alan Francis in a terrific last game of 114 shoes. Brian had 106 ringers for 93% to Alan's 98 ringers and 86%. Brian averaged 85.31% over 15 championship games while Alan averaged 81.59%. Congratulations to all the division and class champions and thanks to all who came to participate or just be a casual spectator. Your support of the NHPA World Tournament is appreciated.

A lot of people prayed for mild temperatures hoping to not see the

scorching heat that has followed the W.T. for years and was blanketing much of the country when players left home for Red Deer. Well, someone was listening, as heat was never a factor this year. In fact, rains came to the drought stricken midlands of Alberta over several days and with it, some very chilly temperatures. It was so cold one day that Red Deer had its first ever snow fall in the month of August. Fortunately, all play and practice courts were indoors in the climate controlled pavilions of Westerner Park. This was a wonderful facility with one of the best court setups we have had in years. The Red Deer World Tournament Committee did a great job and cannot be thanked enough. Two years of meetings and advanced planning with sub-committees for all activities certainly paid off for the Red Deer staff.

The Awards Banquet was held in the upstairs Frontier Room of the Westerner. 250 tickets were sold and nearly all attended and enjoyed what many said was the best buffet meal

they had ever experienced at a W.T. banquet. It was wonderful and our emcee Paul Stewart, a last minute appointment, was really great. Paul did such a good job with his southern drawl and humor that even the most serious left with smiles on their face. Inducted into the NHPA Hall of Fame were two lady pitchers, Canadian Diane Cantin, formerly of Quebec, now living in Alberta and Beverly Nathe of Minnesota. The Stokes Memorial Award went to 5th VP and website director, Paul Stewart from North Carolina. Achievement Awards were presented to Ed Smith of California for his assistance and support of the NHPA website and Jeanette Claas of Missouri for her outstanding work as editor of "Shoe Biz", the Missouri State horseshoe pitching newsletter. Kurt Whaley of South Dakota accepted the Presidential Award for his development work and gift to the NHPA of the new HSMaster software horseshoe program now available without charge to any club or charter.

## DAVE'S COURT REPORT *by Dave Loucks*

### **Pocatello Wins Bid.**

Pocatello, Idaho won the delegates support and will host the 2004 World Tournament starting July 26, 2004. Kitchener, Ontario, Canada who was also bidding lost out to Pocatello by a vote of 101 - 27.

### **Eau Claire in 2003.**

Eau Claire, Wisconsin, will host the 2003 World Tournament over the dates of August 4-17. A large entry sign-up is expected, perhaps surpassing the record of 1740 set by Kitchener in 1997. Unfortunately, indoor space will limit us to 48 courts. We will most likely go to at least 5 pitching shifts a day and consideration will be given to using the outdoor courts of the Eau Claire club, which are about 2 miles away.

### **Championship Men and Women.**

During delegate discussion of the pitching format for the 2003 W.T., a couple of options to change the Championship Men and Women were presented. There was some lively debate as the pros and cons were discussed. In the end, it was approved to enlarge the championship groups of Men and Women from 16 to 24 players for Eau Claire. In so doing, the top 16 entering percentages of each will be seeded directly to the division championship based on their NatStat record. Since these 16 will have no class play, the prize fund a class would normally play for will be added to the championship prize fund. There will still be class play for all other men and women after which, the top 8 percentages will advance to fill out the championship 24.

Playing finals of 23 games will add at least one day to the championship rounds. That means the tournament may have to run one day longer than usual and end on Sunday, August 17th. Alternately, the tournament committee will look at the possibility of setting up Classes A and B to play their 15 games over two days so move-ups could be made and allow the championship four days to play, starting on Wednesday and ending on Saturday. There is also the possibility of a reverse start, playing the higher percentage pitchers the first week. There are several possibilities here with pros and cons on every side. While we have been discussing the championship men and women, there is a very good possibility that direct seeding to the championship group of other divisions will also be made. The Tournament Committee, made up the NHPA Council, will have some decisions to make at the annual winter meeting.

## Convention and Bylaws.

Based on 2001 membership, charters could have been represented by a total of 154 delegates. As it was, 128 votes were initially seated in Convention. All were voted on the 2004 World Tournament site. When it came to the Bylaws, only 124 votes could be tallied. One charter with three votes left the meeting after a break and Canada's one vote cannot be used for NHPA bylaws. There were just five proposed changes to the bylaws. Rather than reprint them here, those readers who are interested can review them on the NHPA website or refer to the March/April 2002 Newslines issue. The voting results were as follows; #1 Passed 92-32. #2 Failed 26-98. #3 Passed 87-37. #4 Passed 85-39. #5 Passed 124-0.

NHPA Officers Casey Sluys, Bonnie Seibold and Dick Hansen were running for re-election unopposed. All were unanimously returned to office for another two-year term.

The delegates voted to continue donating interest from the NHPA money

market account to the NHPF as well as approving the contribution of \$1.00 for each paid membership as of the end of 2002.

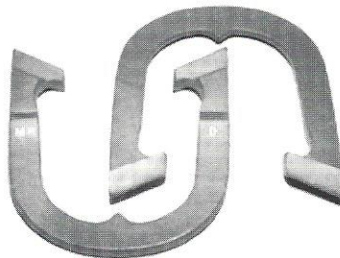
that 44 years ago at the W.T. Convention in Murray, Utah, there were only 28 delegates seated at the July 25, 1958 meeting. At that time, the NHPA financial report showed a cash balance of \$3,320.43. Thanks to some help from the Murray Board of Commissioners, the World Tournament prize fund that year was \$4,000.

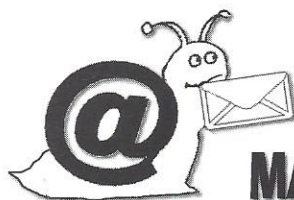

Hopefully, this could be something that could be done at very little additional expense to the Newsline magazine.



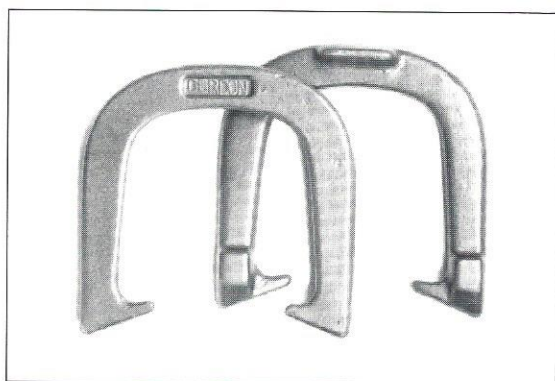

I brought up the idea on resurrecting the NHPA Regional Tournaments, but not taking it to the National level as it was in the past. The main discussion was on how to break up the regions. I will mail different ideas to the Regional Directors and have them present them to their Charter Officers.

Some proposed changes to the Tournament Sanction Certificates were discussed but not accepted.

There was discussion on what type of temporary protective barrier should be used if there is no permanent fence surrounding the courts during a sanctioned event, and how it would affect the NHPA insurance.

## Bobby Cook

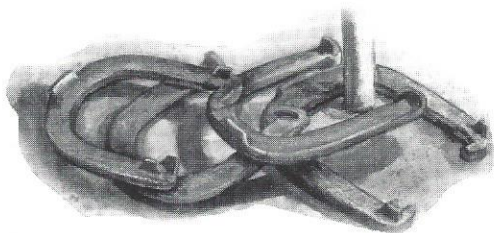
Tennessee

# STATE OFFICERS, REGIONAL DIRECTORS & SANCTIONED CLUB/LEAGUE MEETING *by Phyllis Quist*

This year a combined meeting of the State Officers, the Regional Directors and the Sanctioned Club/League members was held on Saturday, August 3rd, in Red Deer, Alberta. The meeting was co-chaired by Jerry LaBrosse, Minnesota State President and Phyllis Quist, Washington State President.

Paul Stewart and Kurt Whaley did a presentation on Kurt's horseshoe program that he has been working on and perfecting for about seven years. It appears to be a great program and very user friendly. It is called H.S. Master. It's free and can be downloaded on the internet. We encourage everyone to check it out and give it a try.

Allen Baptist said they are working on again having Regional Tournaments. He had sent out a questionnaire and had gotten very little response. It was discussed and felt that maybe having six or seven regions across the U.S. might be feasible. Allen said they would continue to look into it. There are some changes for court sanctioning. Allen will be sending out guidelines to all Regional Directors. Rick Rebman, Oregon, asked if our insurance covered tournaments where there were no fences. Allen suggested that rope or reflective tape be used to define 'pitching areas' and spectator areas. Any insurance questions should be addressed to Bonnie Siebold, 4th V.P. as there have been some changes to our insurance policy.

Lorraine Sternberg had several of the League Red Books and Junior Pamphlets for distribution. She said they are considering holding a National League Tournament, possibly in Joelton in May or September of 2003. Mr. Filley said maybe a regional tournament would be easier to at-

tend. Allen Baptist suggested starting with a State league tournament. Lorraine reminded everyone that she needs all the stats turned in within a couple weeks after the leagues are finished. There will be special patches for the 25th anniversary of the sanctioned league program.

The two bidders for the 2004 World Tournament gave brief presentations. The Kitchener folks asked everyone to stop by their booth and check out all the information. Bobby Faulkner, V.P. of the Idaho H.S.P.A. also gave information on Pocatella's facilities and venue.

Jerry LaBrosse said that he has been using Kurt Whaley's program and it is a very good tool. Almost any report needed can be generated plus running tournaments of any format. Phyl Quist asked for e-mail addresses of all State presidents so that a link can be established for any questions, concerns or ideas that may arise during the year. Ward Lutz of Minnesota told about their sponsoring of the Make A Wish Foundation as a state charity. They raise funds by adding \$1.00 to each tournament entry fee and also by selling Schedule Calendars. He said he would like for the Council to consider the Make a Wish Foundation on a National level also. Ward said we should not just be about horseshoes but should also be involved with our sport in community and charity activities.

It was the consensus of those in attendance that the combined meeting was a good idea.

We received a call on Monday of the second week from "Canada AM", which happens to be similar to the USA's "Today Show". We played phone tag for about a day and a half until finally making contact. They were calling from Toronto wanting to do a live remote interview with us at 5:45 or 6:45 AM. Deciding to ask Walter Ray Williams, Jr. if he would be willing to assist with this interview, he replied, "sure I don't need any sleep". The interview happened at 6:45 AM, lucky for us. We met at the Telus building in town for a live feed to Toronto. It only lasted maybe 5 minutes, but it was a national show, which was seen throughout Canada. Another National show came onsite to do an interview with Alan Francis. We staged him right by the open doors leading into the pitching arena. The women in the interview, in Toronto, asked what all the back round noise was during the pre-interview. Alan explained that she was listening to horseshoes hitting the stake and then landing on top of one another. Both live feeds went very well and we can only wish for something like this in Eau Claire in 2003. Rest assured that all major networks will be contacted prior to our 2003 event. Perhaps they will make room for us on their schedule?

Two different local radio stations conducted onsite radio interviews. They were there for two hours on two separate occasions. Each time they interviewed 6 different people. A French language TV station came to conduct an interview with pitchers also. Many thanks to Leo Michaud for acting as interpreter/liaison between the various French language pitchers and the TV station.

Numerous phone interviews were done with various other newspapers who later sent photographers over to snap some pictures for their articles. We received a phone call from a fellow named Leonard who was doing a free lance documentary on horseshoe pitching. He was shown every aspect of how the tournament is structured, from pitching instructions to computer room, plus website, and interviews with Championship pitchers.

Thank you to all of you who conducted press interviews between games! I realize it was an inopportune time, but it was great publicity. My sincere thank goes out to the Red Deer folks especially their advance publicity team; they did an exceptional job!

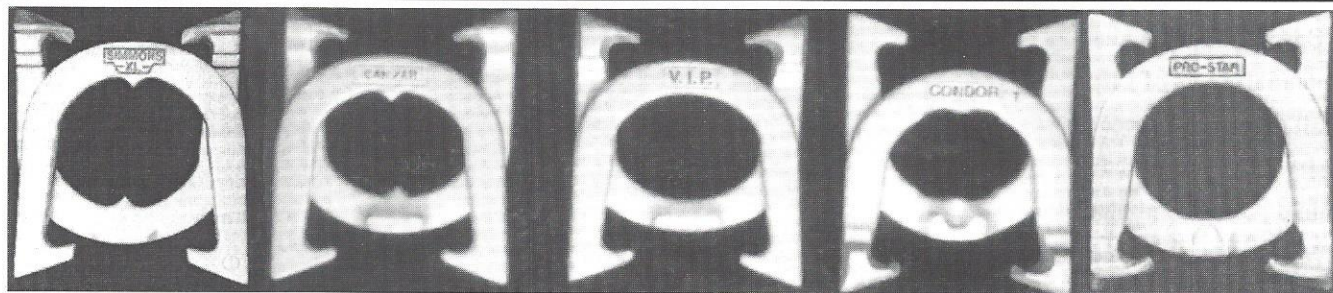
Jeanette Class, editor for the Missouri "Shoe Biz" received an achievement award. Unfortunately she was not in attendance to receive it.

# CHAPLAIN'S CORNER *by Pastor Jerry Holt*

Today's topic is sportsmanship. Tennis was once called the gentleman's sport. I have long thought that the current sport of ladies and gentlemen is Horseshoe Pitching.

I was taught early on to be a good sport. My good friend Homer Cain says, "a person walks a little taller when he is winning." I concur with that. I personally choose to try to mask my feelings while on the court. One ought not to make it miserable for others when he is not playing well. At such a time one is likely to feel discouragement. How can one not care when he practices so much attempting to play well? Yet excessive moaning and groaning on the courts is out of place.

Here are a few sportsmanship reminders. After the toss to see who throws first, most shake hands and wish the other a good game. Some have their own expression they opt to use such as pitch your best.

While one's opponent is pitching he should not be a distraction. Stand at the back of the court on the opposite side. Do not talk, clang shoes, etc. Do not stand up even with the opponent where he can see you with his peripheral vision. I have heard of the little trick in which one even looked at his opponent while he was delivering his shoes while standing directly across the court.

Most do not prefer talking during the game. Never should one say something to try to gain a psychological edge. The only honorable way to win a game is by simply throwing more ringers than your competitor. Occasionally I have heard of a player doing something to needle his opponent to throw him off his game. That is not proper mentality.

There is nothing wrong with measuring a shoe to see if it is a ringer. Most of us have been fooled both ways. Most pitchers wouldn't want a ringer that isn't on. Neither does one want to give up a shoe that will measure.

Sportsmanship does not rule out competitive spirit. This can be a tough and grueling game.

At the completion of the game, most pitchers give a simple handshake and share that the other pitched a good game. Occasionally one's rival is badly off his game. In my opinion, that is not the time to try to cheer up or encourage your fellow pitcher. Often one is just not ready to hear it. Perhaps a little later one might encourage his opponent if it seems appropriate. For me, when I am badly off, I would just as soon hear the words, "good game", get the handshake, and move on. One should not throw a victory party on the court in the face of his opponent.

When the world tournament was held in Biloxi, Mississippi several years ago, Jesse Gonzalez and I were both in the championship class. We were visiting in a room where all of us were waiting for our class to commence its pitching. He made this statement to me that is worth passing on: "Sportsmanship is important. We must keep sportsmanship in the game." It's a thing of honor. Good sportsmanship makes it more enjoyable for everyone.

All this does not lessen the ecstasy of pitching really well or the great low one can feel when pitching poorly. It has to do with conduct, displayed attitude, and observance of the rules.

Good pitching and hope to see you on the courts.
