And what a host Knoxville turned out to be; led by the staff of the Knoxville CVB/Visit Knoxville including Kim Bumpas, Jennifer Morris, Mary Blair, Keli Gibson and all the other staff who assisted to make this event a success. Also included from the Knoxville Convention Center, Events Manager, Kate Jackson. What a great job these folks did making this event one we'll never forget.

I would like to thank all the NHPA Officers, Directors, spouses, and support staff for the great job of running the 2012 World Horseshoe Tournament. Everyone did a great job in the coordination and preparation to assure this tournament ran efficiently. Also, a special thanks to Bill Marvin, Ronnie Miller, Dave Sidles, Jerry LaBrosse, and Rob and Ann Hagman for coming early to assistance in the court setup.

Congratulations to all the Division and World Champions. Seven of the eight championship divisions saw the title going to different individuals from the previous year. Only Joan Elmore was able to repeat with a perfect win/loss record and averaging 84.62%. This is Joan's sixth title. Alan Francis won his 17th title with a perfect win/loss record. Alan Francis of Defiance, OH, who is listed in the 2011 edition of the Guinness Book of World Records for most world championships in horseshoe pitching, added another title to this record. In the Senior Men's Division, James Cooper had a perfect win/loss record averaging 69.58%. For the Senior Women's Division, Gert Wilcziek also had a perfect win/loss record averaging 81.97%. In the Elders Division, Rich Pintor had a 13/2 record and averaged 78.86%. In the Junior

Girls Division, Brianna McCormick had a perfect win/loss record averaging 60.53%. In the Junior Boys Division, Dalton Rackstraw had a perfect win/loss record averaging an outstanding 83.48%. In the Cadets Division, Ryan Schepers had a perfect win/loss record and averaged 49.40%.

The 2014 World Tournament will be held Buffalo, New York. The dates will be July 14th – July 26th, 2014 and will be held at the Events Center located at the Hamburg Fairgrounds. The facility is air conditioned and should be a very nice facility for our event. Congratulations to Chuck Giglia and Frank Kwiatkowski for a successful bid.

At the Hall of Fame Banquet, one new member was inducted into the National Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame. Will Gullickson who was honored in the Promoter/Organizer category. Roc Gullickson was there to receive the plaque in Will's honor. During the banquet, a number of donated gifts were auctioned off. Paul Stewart was appointed to be our auctioneer. Thanks to Paul for doing this for the NHPF. You always provide some additional entertainment to our events!

In conclusion, I just want to say to everyone that the NHPA Council works hard at organizing all the events at the World Tournament. I encourage those who were not able to attend this year in Knoxville, try to attend the 2013 World Tournament in St. George, UT which will be held July 22th – August 3rd at the Dixie Center. St. George will be great city to visit with many attractions and things to do.

Any that are, can call me at any time and I will be more than willing to explain the who, what and how's of just what it is that I do all year. I would recommend that the person taking my place be retired, as it is almost a full time job. I know that because I did not retire from my job with AT&T until almost a year after I was elected Secretary/Treasurer. Those were some very long days that first year.

WINSTON THEATRE DEDICATION SPEECH *by Stu Sipma*

It is with great honor for me to be here today to speak on behalf of the late Earl Winston. Over my years as a NHPA Officer, I really never got to know Earl when he was a player or when he was involved in the National Organization. What I did get to know about Earl and what he did for horseshoes was through all of his friends, and trust me there were a lot of them. Vicki, you have to be very proud of Earl as a husband, a player, and promoter for the game of horseshoes.

Earl was born June 4, 1927 in rural Knob Noster, MO. He was the eldest child to Wayne and Leona Winston who had a total of six children; all the other siblings were sisters. He was probably a little spoiled and definitely became the apple of his mother's eye, as the girls all left home and he didn't until he was 33 years of age.

At the 1959 World Tournament, Earl got better acquainted with a young woman from Portland Oregon, Vicki Chapelle. A long distance romance flourished keeping the postman busy. There was one time Earl made a short visit to Oregon during the winter holiday season and Vicki's finger sported an engagement ring when he departed. The couple married June 10, 1960.

Earl came from a long line of horseshoe pitchers, so it was only natural for him to follow in their footsteps of his dad, his grandpa Ernest, and several uncles. His Uncle K.C. Winston was once a Junior State Champ. After retiring, K.C. moved back to Missouri and took up horseshoe pitching again. He enjoyed pitching for as long as his health would let him. Earl's dad, Wayne, was the first World Intermediate Champion winning that title in Fargo, ND in 1967. As a young boy Earl watched the competition at the MO State Fair until he was finally old enough to join in.

Earl accomplished much during his horseshoe pitching career. He won the Men's State Championship in 1955, and there were several years he qualified into the Men's Championship Class at the World Tournament attaining some 70% plus averages. His best tournament was an 80% plus, when he won a Tournament of Champions at Phelps Grove Park in Springfield, MO. In 1995, he won the Senior Men's State Championship and when the computer paired him with his wife that year in the State Mixed Doubles play, he also became a State Doubles Champion.

In every category Earl has excelled, giving his time and energy and helping and promoting the game that he loved. Along with years of service to the State of Missouri, Earl was elected NHPA 3rd Vice-President in 1972 where he served until he was elected the 1st Vice-President in 1983, spending a total of 28 years as a NHPA Vice President. He also served on the NHPA Hall of Fame Committee and the NHPA Rules

Committee, spending a period of time as the chairman of each. Earl also was named as one of the original directors of the NHPF when it was formed to oversee the property in Tennessee that was being donated by Dr. Jack Freeman. For his pitching, and especially for his years of service, Earl was inducted into the NHPA Hall of Fame in 1988 and has been a recipient of the NHPA's most prestigious award - the Arch Stokes Award in 1992.

Earl, not only was a great horseshoes pitcher and promoter, but will be remembered for his attendance of over 50 consecutive years at World Horseshoe Tournaments.

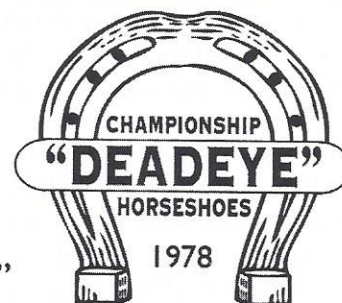

When word got out about Earl passing last August and what should be done with the memorial money, it wasn't long before I got an email from Vicki requesting that there would be nothing more honorable than to have the memorials go towards improving the Hall of Fame Theater with the addition of a touch screen TV. The NHPA Council approved this expenditure in his honor; especially for all he has done for the game of horseshoes, both at a State and National level.

There were many people involved in making sure it happened and I would like to thank them for all their hard work. This tournament today is a perfect occasion for this dedication of the theater room on behalf of Earl Winston.

Now is also the time for all of YOU to go to work, as well – RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS into the NHPA! Here are some ideas for you to try:

Fall carnivals – many elementary and middle schools and churches host fall (or Halloween) carnivals. They are always looking for new and interesting activities that can be enjoyed by people of all ages. Contact your local school or your own church about running a horseshoe pitching booth. You won't need a full court – just one end. Let players throw a few shoes down for a ringer and you bring them back. Prizes can be awarded just as in any carnival game. Be sure to have plenty of NHPA handout information with your local contacts for those who may be interested!

Football tailgates – Tailgating is a growing pastime in our culture. Most will want to do something besides eat or drink to pass the time. They may as well be pitching horseshoes instead

of tossing washers or bean bags! Talk to your high school or local college and offer to set up a horseshoe pitching activity before the big game! You could even hold a small tournament with team apparel as prizes! And again – handouts, handouts, handouts!!!


Fall League – With summer-time activities drawing to a close, people will be looking for something to take their place. Now is the time to publicize your Fall League. To increase participation, have each of your existing members bring a BRAND NEW member for a partner! Hold a short league (maybe 4 weeks) so the newbies won't be reluctant to join. Remember that membership cards purchased in October will be good for the entire upcoming year!

Off-season club activities – If you are in a region where pitching is not an option in the winter months, hold other club activities to keep your members involved. A Score keeping clinic that teaches HS Scorekeeper would be a great idea! Or a "movie night" complete with popcorn and Jujubes – the viewing, of course, could be Walter Ray Williams "How to Pitch Horseshoes!" It and other videos are available through Game Related Sales.

And don't forget about the upcoming NHPA sponsored events at your Hall of Fame facility in Wentzville, Missouri!! League players will surely want to compete in the National Sanctioned League Tournament! Those with a more frivolous nature may prefer stepping out on the wild side in full Halloween gear for the HALLOWEEN BASH! And of course, the Red, White and Blue Walking Doubles Tournament is on the horizon!


There are still items available for your promotional use – bumper stickers, rack cards and NHPA handouts. Please contact me with your mailing address in time for them to arrive in the mail for your next event. And, as always, keep telling me about your successes so they can be shared with others! REGIONAL DIRECTORS REPORT *by Debby Michaud, NHPA 5th VP*

What a great World Horseshoe Tournament! We have just recently returned home from Knoxville, TN where we watched over 1,200 pitchers compete in the wonderful Knoxville Convention Center. It was an inviting city to walk through and it was a very nice venue for the competition.

First and foremost, I HAVE to thank all of the Regional Directors and their designees who helped make every 'shoe check at the World Tournament smooth and efficient. It worked out very well. However, if any of the pitchers or workers have any suggestions to improve on what we do during the 'shoe checks, please send those suggestions along to me – thank you!

Before I talk about anything else, though, I do have a topic that I want to write about that has nothing to do specifically with the World Tournament, but has everything to do with safety for all pitchers and their families at every tournament. It is this.....

We had an emergency situation at our courts a few weeks prior to the World Tournament. The person who had the emergency recovered well and was even able to compete in the World Tournament. However, while he was ill, he could not talk and we knew nothing about his medical history or his medications. That day, we strongly encouraged all of the other pitchers to carry a list with them at all times. This list should include the names of all of their medications and the reason they are taking them, their medical history and their full name and date of birth. We also encouraged people with diabetes to carry their glucometer (a machine to measure blood sugar) everywhere they go. At least one of the pitchers who was there that day did listen – and when HE had a medical issue at the World Tournament, he pulled out his medication list to show us. It is SUCH a

valuable thing to have – some people even carry their EKG's with them as an EKG is as individual as a fingerprint. This medical information gives all medical personnel the information that they need to give care more quickly and accurately. Having the glucometer allows personnel to determine if the blood sugar is or is not the cause of the problem. That is all I will say for now. Just, please, print up a list of your medications, laminate it, and carry it. Then, print up another one, laminate that, and give it to the closest member of your family for them to carry. Good for you!

Getting back to the World Tournament, this year there were SO many people who spoke to the officers with words of appreciation and even praise. This was so thoughtful, and believe me, these kind words help to motivate us to continue trying to improve and streamline our game. We DO want constructive criticism but we, being human, also appreciate the positive comments. As a matter of fact, we like ALL comments.

The convention proved to be quite interesting with some good discussion and some good disagreements. I'm sure the discussion is not over although the voting, at least for this year, is done.

In future columns, I will touch on some new ideas that have been mentioned. I would like for us all to share fresh ideas about our sport. SANCTIONED CLUB/LEAGUE REPORT *by David Sidles*

On June 4th my wife and I had the honor of representing the NHPA at the National Veterans Golden Age Games. This annual multi-sport event for veterans 55 years and older was held in St. Louis and hosted by the Quail Ridge Club. Horseshoe pitching was one of the 14 sports or games that the veterans participated in. Out of a total of 787 veterans, over 350 entered the horseshoe event. They were classified into three groups; ambulatory, visually impaired and wheelchair. The tournament was run as double elimination, 20-shoe count-all games.

The veterans only pitched from one end, meaning someone had to read the score and bring back the shoes. Lots of volunteers cycled through during the day helping with these duties. I worked outside and my wife Carla worked inside. It was a bright sunny day and the temperature was starting to soar! It was a challenge keeping 16 courts playable all day.

I asked Carla to share some of her memories of the event. "I had an opportunity in July to go with Dave down to Missouri and volunteer for the Veterans game. I stayed inside to see how I could assist and ended up keeping score and being a walker to retrieve the shoes. What an inspirational experience. There were Veterans, men and women, on the indoor courts that were in wheel chairs or visual impaired.

We would line them up and they would throw away- "watch out I'm dangerous" they would yell and more times than not - ringers would go on. If they didn't make it they would say - "I'm here for the fun." There were a few that stood out- we helped the visually impaired on the courts so they wouldn't bang their heads on the beams. Then I would tap the stake so they could hear where to throw it and off they went. A gentlemen from Oregon was amazing, one or two ringers for every three he threw. I finally asked if he had played before he lost his eyesight and he said "Oh Yeah" it was great, the thing I miss the most is playing horseshoes. I told him he still did very well. After the game was over he handed his opponent and an apple pin, just like the real Olympics he indicated. A gentlemen in his wheel chair would line up and then lean over so far I thought he would fall out. "Don't worry" he said, "I just have to get good aim" and he would. He smiled and he won, you could tell he really was enjoying himself. One lady was so excited when she won her match she cried, "I don't believe it"

she said. The organizations in Missouri did a great job of feeding the vets and had a very nice program before it all started. The buses just kept coming and there was lots of fun, but there was competition as well. Never give up, never give in and enjoy every moment that is what I went away with that day. Volunteering is so rewarding - do it when you can."

As it got later in the afternoon, a huge thunderstorm developed just east of the building. There were only a few games left and it appeared it would miss us. But as it passed, a huge inflow gust of probably 60 mph wind came from out of nowhere, the flags around the courts stood straight out and the little portable tents that were set up over the metal bleachers didn't stand a chance. A couple blew clear over the hill and one hooked a metal bleacher and tipped it over. No one was hurt though and we moved indoors for the remaining championship matches.

We met many wonderful veterans that day including one gentleman celebrating his 93rd birthday. He had served in WW II, Korea and Vietnam. It was truly a rewarding day.

fun things to do, and I hope to return someday to enjoy some of the things there wasn't time for on this trip. All in all.... THANK YOU KNOXVILLE!!!

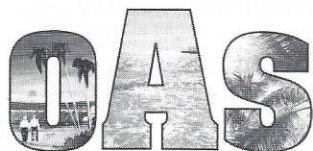

NHPA RULES AND BYLAWS by Dan Sanders

Rules Changes Report (PRCs passed at the Knoxville Convention)

The following Proposed Rules Changes were passed by a two-thirds majority vote of the Convention delegates at the Knoxville, 2012 Convention. The new wording can be found below, in italic/bolded print, and will appear in the revised edition of the RGS Book, and will become effective on January 1, 2013. Copies of this new RGS Book/revision will become available via your Charter Secretary, or by contacting your NHPA Secretary/Treasurer Dick Hansen.

Published here are the PRCs that passed the 2012 Convention delegate vote:

PRC1 – Rule 1, Section E.1

Current Wording: (also see RGS, page 8)

Section E – Elder Men (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become seventy (70) years old).

1. Elder Men may pitch from any place on either the extended or full-distance platforms, and shall observe the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul line. Elder Men must notify their Charter secretary, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares himself a short-distance pitcher, he must remain a short distance pitcher for that entire calendar year. Alternately, if a member starts the year as a short distance pitcher, he may change to the Open Men's Division, but must remain in that Division for that entire calendar year. Note: See RULE 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying.

Approved Change Of Wording: (new wording is in *italic/bold* print)

Section E – Elder Men (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become seventy (70) years old).

1. Elder Men may pitch from any place on either the extended or full-distance platforms, and shall observe the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul line. Elder Men must notify their Charter secretary, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares himself a short-distance pitcher, he must *remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time he may switch back to the Open Men's Division*, but must remain in that Division *until the next year's membership card is purchased, etc.* Note: See RULE 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying.

PRC 2 - REQUIREMENT 2 – ALL NHPA TOURNAMENTS/LEAGUES

Section E – Tournament Credit (see RGS page 23)

Current Wording:

For singles and doubles events, all contestants must have completed at least half of their scheduled games to receive NatStats credit for that event, with a minimum of one hundred (100) shoes pitched.

Approved Change of Wording: (amended/approved wording is in *italic/bold* print)

For singles and doubles events, a contestant must have pitched a minimum of 100 shoes to receive NatStats credit.

Exception (approved by NHPA Council): If all games of the round-robin schedule have been pitched in less than 100 shoes, these statistics may be submitted for NatStats credit.

wording) – It is proposed that Rule 3, Section D.1 (below), with indicated changes/additions (in *bold/italic* print) *be moved to a new location*, under Rule 3, Section C.2 (see RGS page 10). 1. The Pitcher – During the entire address and *prior to the release of the shoe* (amended), the contestant must not start or step completely outside the pitching platform with either foot.

Exceptions:

(a) A contestant observing the thirty-seven-foot (37') foul line may start directly behind the pitching platform provided they step within it when they release the shoe.

(b) A physically challenged contestant *requiring the assistance of special equipment, such as a wheelchair*, must have at least some contact with the pitching platform and be completely behind the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul line when the shoe is released.

Approved Changes (Part B): It has *been further accepted* that the following text information replace the current text in Section D.2, as follows: Note: This PRC was amended/accepted/approved on the Convention floor. This change of wording is in *bold/italic* type, as follows:

When not pitching, any contestant shall stand quietly and stationary at least two (2) feet behind any contestant on their court, or on any adjacent court.

Approved Changes (Part C): For editing reasons, it has been accepted that the current text heading for Section D.3 – *The Contestants*, will be changed to Section E – *Crossing Over*, as presented below. The current text information will remain the same, other than the reference change to *Section D*, in two places. Accepted changes are in *bold/italic* print.

Section E - Crossing Over

If both contestants use the same pitching platform to deliver their shoes, the contestant pitching first should cross over (in front of the pit) to the other pitching platform and then move back to the position described in *Section D*, above. As the first contestant is crossing over in front, the second contestant should be crossing over and onto the same pitching platform, from the rear. If the contestants use opposite pitching platforms, the contestant who pitches first should step directly back, to the position described in *Section D*, above.

RULE 3 – PLAY OF THE GAME AND VALUE OF THE SHOE

Current Wording: (also see RGS, page 10)

Section C – Delivery of Shoes (currently reads):

1. Delivery – The contestant pitching first shall deliver both shoes (one at a time) and then the other contestant shall deliver both shoes (one at a time). A contestant may deliver the shoes from either the left or right pitching platform, but in any one inning, both shoes must be delivered from the same platform. A contestant shall pitch the entire tournament with the same hand/arm, except in the case of a medical emergency (to be determined by the Tournament/League Officials).

Approved Change of Wording: (new wording is in *italic/bold* print)

Section C – Delivery of Shoes

1. Delivery – The contestant pitching first shall deliver both shoes (*underhand, and* one at a time) and then the other contestant shall deliver both shoes (*underhand, and* one at a time). A contestant may deliver the shoes from either the left or right pitching platform, but in any one inning, both shoes must be delivered from the same platform. A contestant shall pitch the entire tournament with the same hand/arm, except in the case of a

medical emergency (to be determined by the Tournament/League Officials).

PRC8B – Rule 1, Section A - Juniors

Current Wording: (also see RGS, page 7)

Junior Cadets (any pitcher nine (9) years old or younger for the entire calendar year).

Approved Change of Wording: (new wording is in *italic/bold* print)

Junior Cadets (any pitcher *twelve (12)* years old or younger for the entire calendar year).

REQUIREMENT 4 – WORLD TOURNAMENT PLAY (also see RGS pages 25, 26)

Current Wording:

Section F – Playoffs

In a World Tournament, games won and lost shall determine the order in which the winners are placed. Pitchers tying for first place of a Division shall be decided the winner as follows: if two tie, a one-game playoff to forty (40) points; if more than two tie, the first place shall be decided by a ladder-type playoff based upon ringer percentages; in all others ties (second and below), trophies and prize money shall be awarded based upon ringer percentage. First place ties at the “Class” level will be determined by forty (40) shoe playoff games. Percentage ties for all move-up positions into a Championship Class shall be broken by a forty (40) shoe playoff game.

Approved Change Of Wording: (mostly all new or revised wording)

Section F – Playoffs

In World Tournament play, games won and lost shall determine the order in which the winners are placed. *If there is a tie for first place, a playoff game will determine the winner. All playoff games will follow the same format as the round-robin play for that Class. If more than two players tie for first place, a ladder-type playoff will be used, based on ringer percentages in that competition. All other ties (second place and below) will be determined by ringer percentage. If still tied, “who beat who”, and then “ringer % vs entry %” will be used. Note: Percentage ties for all move-up positions shall be broken by a playoff game.*

2012 NHPA STATE OFFICERS MEETING

August 3, 2012 - 1:00 p.m.
Knoxville Convention Center

Jerry LaBrosse presided over the meeting. 24 states were represented.

Jerry reported that Charter Communications is reaching over one half of our membership. Jerry would like a spring up-date on all State officers so he can keep a current data base. All comments on the Charter Communications were positive. Jerry also recommended that each state have a Charter Communication director.

State membership was discussed. Having a promotion director was highly recommended. Twelve states in attendance already do have a person designated. Ideas to target new membership were: advertising, new member packets available which include

If still tied, additional innings will be played (see Rule 8, Section B.2).

Rule 11 - Section G - Forfeits

Current Wording: (see also RGS pages 19-20)

In tournament competition, the wins and losses and all statistics accumulated shall remain in the books for a contestant who has to forfeit one (1) or more games, for any reason. A contestant may miss any number of games, due to illness or other legitimate reasons approved by the Tournament/League Officials, and still be permitted to return to competition. If a contestant forfeits for an unapproved reason, they will not be allowed to return to the competition and will forfeit all prize money and/or awards for that event. Any contestant who forfeits games shall finish wherever their record puts them in the standings, unless they forfeit for unapproved reasons; then they shall finish in last place. If forfeiting for an unapproved reason, this member shall also be subject to a one (1) year suspension from the NHPA (see Bylaws for additional information).

Approved Change of Wording: (new wording is in *italic/bold* print)

*If, for any reason, a pitcher must forfeit a game prior to its completion, this player will receive a loss for that game and any accumulated statistics (shoes, points, ringers) for that game will be deleted from their records. His/her opponent will receive a win for that game, and if there are any accumulated statistics (shoes, points, ringers), they will remain in his/her records.** A contestant may forfeit any number of games, due to illness, *injury*, or other legitimate reasons approved by the Tournament/League Officials, and still be permitted to return to *the* competition. Any contestant who forfeits *such* games *will* finish wherever their W/L record puts them in the standings, unless they forfeit for unapproved reasons (*see NHPA Bylaws, Article III, Section 8, a-d*). *If so*, they will not be allowed to return to the competition, *will be moved to last place in the standings*, and will forfeit all prize money and/or awards for that event. If forfeiting games for unapproved reasons, *this contestant* will also be subject to a one (1) year suspension from the NHPA (see NHPA Bylaws, *Article III, Sections 8-11*); *to be decided later by the Charter and NHPA Officers.* * *Please note: If a forfeited game is “in progress”, a Pacer should be used so that this game can be completed, for the opponent.*

rules, etiquette & dress code, give a free tournament entry for new members, have business cards to hand out for all officers (Vista Print is a very reasonable online business to get cards, etc. made), use Don Titcombs ‘Pitch & Win’ program at state and local fairs and get on your Community Activity Calendars – usually published by the local Chamber of Commerce.

We briefly discussed the medical exemptions. There is no “Temporary Exemption”. Once it’s done, it’s done. If any change needs to be made, a review by the State officers is necessary.

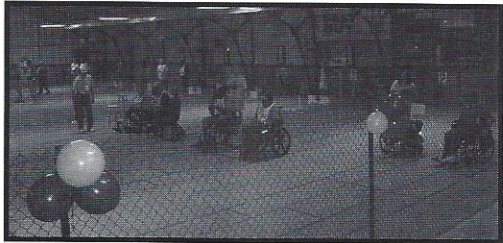

NATIONAL HORSESHOE PITCHERS HALL OF FAME AND MUSEUM *by Jeanette Claas*

Welcomes Veterans from Across the Nation

The warm summer breeze touched the 150 American flags, gently waving them through the air greeting the Veterans as they arrived at Quail Ridge Park. The color alert for the day was Red, White and Blue. Bunting was placed on the fence



throughout the outdoor courts and balloons were scattered throughout the indoor fencing. Red, white and blue tents were placed in the

front and back of the facility. The atmosphere was now set to welcome our National Veterans to the National Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame. What an impressive site it was; bringing a tear to the eye and a smile to the lips; making us feel proud to be an American. It gave us the opportunity to pay our respect to all Veterans who have served our country in war time and in time of peace.

In 2010 St. Louis was chosen to be the site of the 26th National Veterans Golden Age Games for the year 2012. This event is held for Veterans 55 and older who receives care from the VA. It is the only national multi-event sports and recreation senior's competition program designed to improve the quality of life for Veterans, including a wide range of abilities and disabilities. It is a national showcase for the preventive and therapeutic value of sport, fitness and recreation for Veterans. Over 1,000 Veterans traveled to St. Louis for the event.

When the St. Louis VA Medical Center won the bid to host the Golden Age Games, they began searching places to hold each of their 14 events in which the Veterans would be participating. Searching the website for horseshoes, they quickly found the NHPA Hall of Fame facility. They were impressed with what they saw on the website and lost no time in contacting the QRHC. They paid their first visit to the facility in July 2010. Upon this visit they were in awe of the facility and said that the horseshoe event had never been held indoors. They couldn't wait to inform the horseshoe pitchers of the venue they had chosen for them.

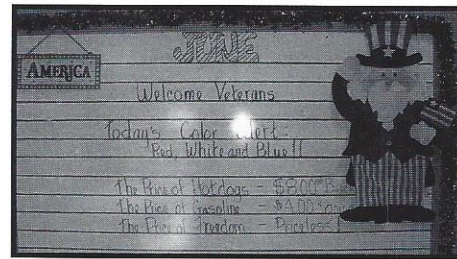


Throughout the last two years the QRHC received many local, state and national Veteran Administrators touring the building, making plans for the upcoming horseshoe event. The QRHC was also making plans to figure out how

we were going to get 350 Veterans pitching horseshoes in one day. But it happened and we did it! Not only that, but we fed meals to over 300 people during the course of the day from our small concession area. We didn't know if that was possible, but it happened and we did it!



Chief Brandel of the St. Charles County Parks Department rose early at 4:00 a.m. on June 4, 2012 to open the park gates at 5:30 a.m. Volunteers from the QRHC began arriving early to uncover courts, put towels out, began preparing food, etc.



Soon our dignitaries and Veterans arrived for the Opening Ceremony at 7:30 a.m. An impressive Presentation of the Flag was presented by the St. Charles County Sheriff's

Honor Guard. The National Anthem was sung by Catherine Pescarino, and the Pledge was led by Navy Veteran Norm Pierce. Bettie Yahn-Kramer, Director of St. Charles County Parks, welcomed the Veterans. Maura Campbell, of the VA Hospital, and Dave Sidles, NHPA 3rd VP, expressed their sincere thanks to the Veterans. Ray Nadler, WWII Veteran and QRHC member, spoke of the time when he received his greetings from President Roosevelt in 1944 and was drafted into the U.S. Army. Ray was dressed in his soldier's hat and carried the banner with him that his parents displayed in the window while serving his duty during wartime. Ray served in General McArthur's Honor Guard during his service time. It was a touching moment as he recited a poem comparing an old veteran to the shattered banner of yesteryear.



At 8:00 a.m. competition began on both indoor and outdoor courts. Wheelchair Veterans and other handicapped Veterans pitched indoors while the ambulatory Veterans pitched outdoors in the beautiful weather that Mother Nature created just for them. Buses would come and go during the day, taking some Veterans to other events and delivering other Veterans to our courts. There was activity all day long and many

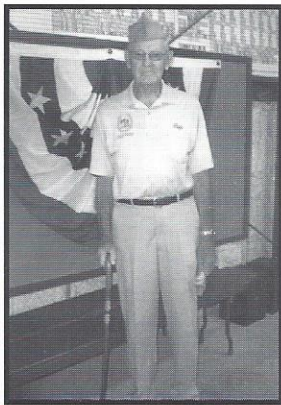

were presented to the lucky winners during their events. The QRHC was presented with a trophy depicting the St. Louis Arch and medal on it. It will be forever kept on display on the trophy case.



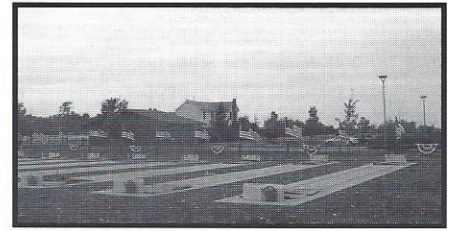

The last of the volunteers sat and talked about the day long event. We were invited to attend the Closing Ceremony of the National Golden Games at the St. Louis Convention Center on June 5th. Approximately 1,500 Veterans and family members attended. St. Louis's Major League Baseball Hall of Famer, Ozzie Smith was the Master of Ceremony. Rocky Sickmann, Iran hostage from Missouri, told of his 444 captivity days in 1979. A movie presentation of the Veterans participating in the 2012 events was shown. The National Games will be held in Buffalo, New York in 2013.

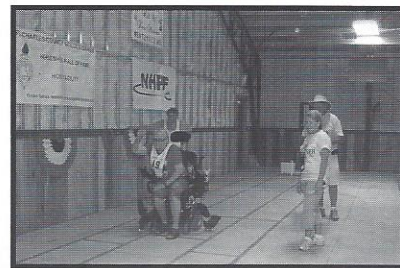

Youth for Understanding (YFU) is an international high school exchange student program. They are one of the oldest and largest such programs, annually exchanging approximately 4,500 students worldwide from over 50 countries. The students involved in this program are often very outgoing, positive young people, looking for new experiences and are taking a big step in leaving their home countries to study a year in the United States learning about our cultures and heritage. YFU is always looking for caring, loving, supportive families to volunteer as well as to become Host Families for the arriving students. Most of these students have been planning for up to a year or more to come to the US and have put a lot of time, effort, and money into this opportunity. Schools in other countries don't always start as late as in the US, so their commitment is locked in whether they find a Host Family or not. Being a HF, you are able to temporarily adopt a child, welcoming them into your home for the school year as one of your own. It gives you a wonderful opportunity to help build and strengthen international bonds and understanding of our country and its culture.

The students are also encouraged to join sports teams to get to know different people, and to learn something new. This is a perfect opportunity to introduce them to the world of Horseshoe Pitching and help give the sport a chance to blossom worldwide! If you still have children of your own at home, it can offer them a lifelong friendship and give them a once in a lifetime view of life in foreign country. Whether or not you have

children, it also gives you a wonderful opportunity to experience or re-experience local and statewide events and locations such as festivals, parks, restaurants, government buildings, museums, theme parks, sporting events and so much more. When you have a student that is in the US for the first time, almost everything here is new to them, and through them you can find new appreciation for things that you may be used to or have overlooked. Many students return later to visit with their HF, and all of their friends that they make during their year, and often welcome the same friends to visit them in their own country. With social media, email, and services like Skype, it is becoming increasingly easy to keep in contact with these young people as they grow into their own place in the world. Students will be arriving throughout August and some students still do not have a HF locked in at this time. It is a very nerve-racking time for those that do not have a placement as they are hoping that their planning and effort is not in vain. Emergency placements are short term, but very beneficial, as it allows the student time to enter school in the US and begin looking on their own and with volunteer support for friends at school, in sports, or the community that can provide them with a more permanent placement. The NHPA World Tournament players were “Itchin’ to start Pitchin’” on July 30th. The Elder’s division this year (22 Classes) helped kicked off the first week. The 2012 Elder’s set a new World record with entries at 351. The old record was set at 329 during the 2010 Iowa World Tournament. Soon the Elder’s entries will surpass the Men’s group for the most pitchers. If you would like to see past 40 point era entries by each division since 1982 to 2012, go to NHPA website and click on WT and then World records then click on “WT Entries by Divisions”. Data on the 50 point era to follow.

Many thanks to the Tennessee State Clubs who put in many hours making sure the courts were ready for pitching. Also, many thanks to the NHPA officers for keeping the World Tournament running so smoothly. Thumbs up to the Stat Room for keeping the computers working and getting the printed results out to the pitchers. Kudos to the “Daily Shoe” for the good information. I might add that it’s always fun to run across old acquaintances.

The 2012 NHPA Hall of Fame and Awards banquet was a hit as many players received awards. This year two men received 90% patches for pitching 90% games in the 2011 world tournament. Dan Watson (Men’s Division) from Alabama pitched a 91.18% game and Paul McGee (Elder’s Division) from Maryland

pitched 93.18%. Also, other 90% patches were handed out to past recipients.

Congratulation to Joan Elmore from TN and Ralph Adrain from OH for their perfect game award. Joan pitched her fifth perfect game (22 ringers out of 22 shoes) and Ralph pitched his second perfect game (16 ringers out 16 shoes). Super performance by these pitchers.

Congratulation goes out to Ottie Reno for his 53rd World tournament. Ottie, who is 83 years young, finished tenth in Elder’s Class C1 (4-11, 46.33%).

The States winning the most 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place trophies at the 2012 World are: Ohio takes the top spot with 28, Missouri 17, Tennessee 16, Kentucky 15, and Illinois 13.

WORLD TOURNAMENT SENIOR MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP *By Chad Hyatt*

Jim Cooper wins his First Senior Men's Title

I have had many opportunities over the years to compete against Tennessee's, Jim Cooper. However, it was a practice session earlier this year that was the most influential. While pitching together in Waterloo, New York at a Horseshoe Pitching Pro Tour event, Jim talked about what appear to be the "magic" in his game. It was amazing. If he could reach out and be up on his toes, then his shoe would be up in the air and smoothly floating along landing on the stake for a ringer. The more I listened to him, the more I started experiencing that magic. It was great to watch that magic, but even better to see it pay off big for Jim in Knoxville as he captured his first World Championship in the Senior Men Division.

From the start, Jim Cooper was looking strong at the tournament. He outpaced everyone in the Class Play rounds and easily secured the number one seed with a 67.68%, well in front of the next closest competitor, Raymond Bedard of Massachusetts with a 62.88%.

As the Championship Finals began, Jim came out a bit cool against Jon Harris of Colorado, but heated up nicely after that, ending the first day with a strong 74% game against Dennis Wilson of Pennsylvania and a perfect 6-0 record. However, it was looking like the final day of the tournament would be one to watch as four-time world champion, Ron Deckard of Florida, enjoyed a perfect

record on the first day, as well. Not too far behind were Bedard and Rich Knerem Sr. of Ohio.

On the final day, it seemed that Cooper knew his destiny. He fired all but one game in the 70's and left no doubt about his intentions on winning this event. This day started with Deckard looking especially strong against Knerem as Deckard threw 80.36%. Cooper blasted Mick Gillette of Missouri with his own 76.19% game. The second game (eighth round of the tournament) matched the two undefeated stars against each other, but it was Cooper stepping up the pace with a 78.85% game to claim the win. It wasn't over yet, but Cooper had put himself in the driver's seat with this win. He finished the day by knocking off Tom Westbrook of South Carolina along with Knerem and Bedard. In the end Jim averaged 69.58% and worked his magic to an undefeated tournament and a well-deserved World Championship title. Congratulations Jim Cooper. You deserve this title!

WORLD TOURNAMENT ELDER MEN'S 30' CHAMPIONSHIP *By Chad Hyatt*

Pintor Pitches His Way to First Elder's Title

Some people used to say that Rich Pintor pitched off of the wrong foot, but what they should have said is that he pitched off of the other right foot. No matter how you look at it, everyone now knows Rich Pintor is the 2012 Elder's World Champion.

Many people would argue that the Elder's division is the most competitive division in horseshoe pitching today. It took a 70% ringer average to qualify for the championship finals and then, with all of that pressure on them, no one averaged under 70% in the finals. This division saw every player in the group throw at least one game of at least 79.5%, ten games over 85% and two of those games were over 90%. The top game in the group was 95.35% by Virgil Rife who threw 82 ringers out of 86 shoes. His opponent, Rich Altis, threw 81.4% the same game. As you can see, competitive horseshoe pitching was certainly on display as these top 16 Elders matched talents against each other.

The division was looking competitive beginning on the first day. By the end of these early rounds, Pintor, Rife and Bobby Fields were undefeated and looking strong. Not far behind was defending champion, Russ Phillips at 4-1. The long game of the day came between former champion, Ed Arionus and Barry Chapelle. The game was 110 shoes and Chapelle came out on top, 40-28.

As day two started, things took a bit of a turn. Field dropped his first game, Rife dropped his first two games, and the eighth game was unlucky for both Pintor and Phillips. By the end of the second day,

Pintor was 9-1, Rife and Fields were 8-2, and Phillips was joined at 7-3 by Rich Altis. This day saw a couple of long games, both in the seventh round. First, Arionus battled in a 106 shoe game with Rife and won his second 100+ shoe game of the tournament. In the longest game of the division, Lawrence Hinton bested Herschel Walters in 114 shoes with both players throwing over 80% ringers for the match.

The stage was now set for day three to roll out some epic battles for the title. The first round of the day added to the drama as Pintor was dropped by Tom Hall and Fields was beat by Walters. We now had Rife and Pintor together at 9-2 while Fields, Phillips and Altis were 8-3. The twelfth game of the tournament would pit Pintor and Fields against each other, with Pintor winning what was one of the lowest percentage games for both players. Rife kept pace, as did Phillips and Altis, by winning. This set up the match that everyone was anticipating on this final day, Pintor vs. Rife. Both players were on their games, but it was Pintor with an 81.71% game edging Rife, who threw 79.27% in losing 40-30. Now, it was Pintor's to finish, which he did by knocking off Walters and Phillips. It was as if Pintor really wanted that title as he blistered Phillips with an 89.06% game in the finale to secure the title.

WORLD TOURNAMENT MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP

Despite the List of Fierce Competitors, a Familiar Face Takes Men's Title

For the 2012 Men's World Horseshoe Pitching Championships in Knoxville, Tennessee, the stage was set for the strongest level of competition in recent years. The top six players in NATSTATS had entered the tournament and they all had reasons to believe that they could compete for the title. Former world champions, Alan Francis and Brian Simmons, were certainly ready for their annual battle. Among the other players was Jim Walters, who had recently beat Francis in a thrilling display in Ohio. Tom Williams was feeling strong this year after maintaining a ringer average over 80% all season. Dan Watson had been steady and strong all year and Charlie Meredith was putting in the practice hours to raise his game back to the levels of mastery he displayed in the 1990's. With these six players believing in themselves and ten other fierce competitors not willing to be counted out, this would certainly be an entertaining championship.

As Championship Play got started, the field quickly worked into two groups as one set piled on the wins and the others seemed to pile on the losses. After Day One, seven guys had totaled 33 wins and just two losses. The other eight guys had scrapped together just seven wins and amassed 38 losses. It was becoming very clear who the main contenders were in this championship. However, compiling these wins didn't come without some challenge. Rick Howe pushed Francis and Walters to extended games. Williams was challenged a bit by Jerry Dean, Austin Bailey and Ken Jones. Gerald Bernard made Meredith dig in to remain undefeated. Always tough Tony Hankins got focused against Walters and matched up nicely with Jim as they both pitched well into the 70 percent range that game.

The second day of competition was shaping up similar to the first as the top players continued to win, until starting to match up against each other in the final games of the day. By the end of the second day, it was Francis all alone at the top and undefeated. Meanwhile, the other top competitors had been knocking each other off in the final two games. Williams handled Meredith, but was slowed down by a 90% game from Walters. It looked like Walters was taking

some frustration out on Williams after Watson beat Walters the game before playing Williams. Watson went undefeated on Day Two, beating Meredith and holding on against Walter Mullins, to stay near the top with only one loss for the tournament. Defending champ, Simmons, had his first setback in the tenth round against Mark Smith and Shannon Foster dropped his final two games of the day to drop back from the lead. As the second day settled, Francis was 10-0, Simmons, Williams, Walters and Watson were all 9-1, Meredith was 8-2 and Foster was now 7-3. The great divide in the class was still evident as these seven gentlemen accounted for 87% of the wins for the class. It seemed a bit lopsided, but it sure set up the final day for a number of possible outcomes.

With five games left to play, the third day drama was ready to play out. However, it never materialized until early in the final game. The early games saw Walters stop Simmons and Francis stop Walters. Francis and Williams then knocked off Simmons and Watson over the next two games to set up the finale between the undefeated Francis and Williams, who just had the one loss to Walters. The game lived up to the hype early on as both players stayed fairly even with the score moving into the late 20's. Williams slipped up with a double miss and Francis pounced. "I don't think I missed a shoe after that," noted Francis. With a score of 41-29 and a final game percentage of 83%, Francis regained the title and increased his record number of championships in the Men's Division to 17, further etching in stone his mark as the "Greatest Horseshoe Pitcher of All Time."

Congratulations to all of the Championship Men in the 16-man Group. They were Alan Francis (OH), Tom Williams (MI), Jim Walters (OH), Dan Watson (AL), Charlie Meredith (KY), Brian Simmons (VT), Shannon Foster (TN), Walter Mullins (KY), Jerry Dean (MD), Tony Hankins (KY), Gerald Bernard (NY), Gary Roberts (OH), Austin Bailey (IL), Mark Smith (MN), Rick Howe (MA) and Ken Jones (NM). The states of Kentucky and Ohio each had three representatives in that group and the Midwest can boast that eight players reign from that area. If you want some tough competition at the 40-foot distance, take a trip to the Midwest and try your luck with these great players. It won't be easy!

At the end of day one, four ladies were undefeated – Joan Elmore, Vicki Kunde, Debra Brown and Brenda Tawney. Day two saw only Joan Elmore with that no loss record.

And as day three came to a close, Brenda Tawney had captured the number three spot and Debra Brown took claim to second place – and with a perfect 15 – 0 record, Joan Elmore again retained her title and is our 2012 Ladies World Champion.

We congratulate all the ladies who qualified for the championship playoffs – 16 of the very best. And to Joan – you are an inspiration to us all and your calmness and grace both on and off the courts exudes a great champion and far exceeds championship status.
