Annual Rock River Valley Open Tournament Sept. 7

The 15th Annual Rock River Valley Open tournament will be held on the Laurence Park courts, midway between Rock Falls and Sterling, Ill., on September 7th, Labor Day. Qualifying will start on Sunday, September 6th, from 2:00 A. M. until 8:00 P. M. and continuing on Monday from 8:00 A. M. until 10:00 A. M. Tournament play will start at 11:00 A. M. The top 60 players will make up the tournament which should include every pitcher that participates. There will be 12 players in each class, being grouped into six men in each group, consisting of Class A, B, C, D and E.

Class A and B players must qualify on courts. All others may bring a qualifying score signed by a club officer or member, or they may qualify on the courts. They must toss 100 shoes to qualify. Entry fee will be \$4.00, with an additional fee of \$2.00 for an extra 100 shoes, if time permits. Players may qualify on Sunday, twice for the original \$4.00 fee.

may qualify on Sunday, twice for the original \$4.00 fee. We will reverse play from other years. Classes A, B and one-half of C, which is Group I will pitch first at 11:00 A. M. and one-half of C, D and E will pitch after they are through. The winners of each group will play for first and second place prizes and trophies. All pitchers must be registered by 10:00 A. M. There will be each prizes for every pitcher, plus two trophies being awarded in each class, also additional prizes of free dinners and prize for high qualifier. San Bernardino, Calif. Horseshoe Pitcher's Club Tourneys

The San Bernardino Horseshoe Pitcher's Club has completed the first halfyear 1970 tournament schedule.

The San Bernardino Club with 50 members (more or less) is active throughout the year, both locally and in the Southern California Association and many of our members are subscribers to the News Digest which we cannot do without in order to keep current on events throughout the U. S. and Canada and the many other interesting articles therein.

The San Bernardino courts (8) are located at Perris Hill Park, are playable and in constant daily use throughout the year. The popularity of the courts are also evident in that the Southern California Association has scheduled five of their tournaments here this year.

This year, the Club officers organized "team matches" with computed handicaps for each player. Play every Wednesday night, each team composed of 5-8 players and alternates. Period runs for 10-weeks and two trophies or suitable awards at stake — one for the player attaining the highest score for the entire period and one for the player with the highest weekly score first three times. Two players pitch together, 100 shoes, all points counted for each player. This has proved to be very popular and draws out approximately forty-five per cent of the members into this contest.






