Anthony Wins Michigan Water Wonderland At Burr Oaks

Harold Anthony, of Arcanum, Ohio, won a pressure packed play off game from Jim Knisely to add the Michigan National Open to his laurels, held at Burr Oak, Michigan, June 16-17. They were tied at the end of the regular competition, in Class A, each

They were tied at the end of the regular competition, in Class A, each losing only 1 of 10 games. Anthony defeated Knisely, Bremen, Ohio, in the regular session and then was upset by Mark Freeman, Lapeer, Michigan, to create the first place tie situation.

Knisely leaped into a quick lead over Anthony in the overtime struggle and held a 38 to 21 margin at the half way mark. At this point, Anthony made his move, caught and gained the advantage at 45 to 41. With the score at 48-45, he, won it all on a 3 ringer 3 count on the final pitch. The game lasted 110 shoes. Anthony had 80.9%, while Knisely had 79%.

Two Buckeye pitchers from Greenville, Tom McEldouney and Jim McComb, fought it out for the Class B division title. They each tied at 6 and 1. McEldouney won the playoff by a narrow margin.

Other winners included: Tom Stiverson, Waldron, Mich., in the C-1 division, and Verne Snyder, Battle Creek, in C-2. Another cereal city victor was Jim Davis, in D1 and Milt Greenman, Jackson, Mich., D-2. Fred Smith Sr., Dimondale, Mich., took the E-1 title, while Robert Whittaker, Ohio, edged Paul Hackman, Burr Oak, Mich., in a playoff for the E-2 trophy.

Women's winners were Jean Swarthout, Milan, Michigan, in Class A and Thelma Neff, Greenville, Ohio, in Class B division.

Doug Anthony, Ohio, won the junior Boy's A division, and Robby Darnold, Ypsilanti, Mich., took the top trophy in B.



The Massachusetts Open Tournament was held on Sunday, June 17 and 24 at the Westside Horseshoe Courts located in West Springfield. The tournament was conducted by Gil Brinkman.

Excellent weather and playing conditions were enjoyed by 100 participants from seven states, including four women and seventeen junior boys. All games played consisted of 50 shoes.

Art Tyson, Brian Simmons and Syble Horton were the winners of their respective divisions.

Class A was divided into (3) six man groups. The top two leaders in each group met in a final playoff round robin. Art Tyson did it again and posted a 76% average. In the initial round robin Art averaged a fine 81.6%. This tied the all time performance in a New England tournament held by James O'Shea, Brockton, Mass. It is to be noted that the method of play in the respective tournaments was of different duration.
