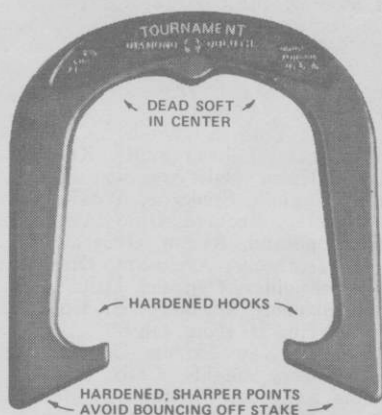
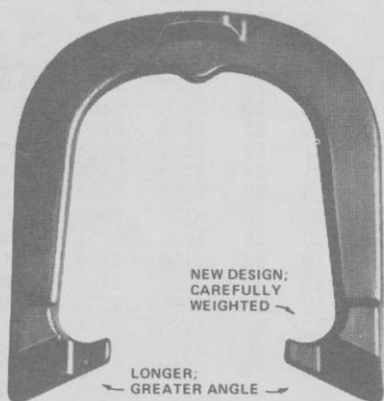

Hohl Repeats As World Champion After Play-Off

Elmer Hohl lost three games. The first game he lost was to Paul Focht on the fifth night. He then lost to Mark Seibold in the third game of the last night, with Seibold shooting 89.5% to his 81.6%. Hohl's last loss was to Bob West in the last game making a play-off for the championship. Hohl had the best single game performance of 31 ringers out of 32 shoes for 96.9% in his first game on the first night of play. He has the highest overall average of 83.5%.

Mark Seibold ended his qualifying round with 29 doubles in a row for 552 Points. Seibold's first loss was to Alan Stockholm on the first night. He then lost to William Henn on the second night of play and did not lose another game until he met John Rademacher on the fifth night of play. He lost to Hohl in the play-off.

Bob West of Oregon was high qualifier with 566 pts., shooting 92.0%. While losing 7 games, he maintained the second highest average of 82.2%. On the third night of play, consisting of 7 games, he averaged 89.3% with 4 games of 90.0% plus.

Longtime Players, Promoter Inducted Into Horseshoe Hall Of Fame

Longtime player Dale Dixon of Des Moines, Iowa, who had to miss this year's events here in Eureka because of illness, was inducted into the Horseshoe Pitcher's Hall of Fame at a banquet-business meeting of the National Horseshoe Pitcher's Association at the Eureka Inn.

Inducted along with Dixon was Frank Stinson of Minneapolis, who is among the leading 36 pitchers in the Men's finals out at Redwood Acres. Stinson, who was a World Junior Boy's Champ way back in 1924, has been among the final top 36 for the past thirty years. The third inductee into the Hall of Fame was Ralph Dykes, past president of the NHPA and a leading promoter of the game. The Horseshoe Pitcher's Hall of Fame, an elaborate plaque, is always displayed at the World Horseshoe Pitching Championships.

In other business conducted by the NHPA, Wally Shipley of Alhambra, Calif., was elected to a two year term as incoming President and the site of the 1975 World Championship tournament was set for Lafayette, Indiana. Their bid was \$8,000.00.

Ray Miller Takes Senior Crown In Three-Way Playoff

Defending Senior Champ, Ray Miller, 70, of Springfield, Ohio, successfully retained his title Thursday afternoon. Miller, Abe Austin of Oak Park, Ill. and Henry Franke, another Illinois pitcher, wound up in a three-way tie, necessitating a play-off. In taking the title, Miller pitched a 62% ringer average. Austin, the former Intermediate Champ, came in with 60% and Henry Franke trailed at 57.1%. Lee Jacobs of Belleville, Michigan won all of his games to take the Class B crown.

"Deadeye" Upset — Brother Jeffrey Takes It All

"Deadeye" Walter Ray Williams Jr., World Junior Boy's Champ in 1971 and 1972, was upset at the World Horseshoe Pitching Championships by younger brother Jeffrey, age 12, who swept all seven of his games with an 85% ringer average to take the 1973 title.

"Deadeye," playing with a broken little finger on his pitching hand, still managed to shoot a fair 78.4% ringer average, but it was good enough only for a fourth place finish.

Final results in the Junior Boy's put Jeffrey Williams of Eureka on top with Alvin Vinsant of Fieldbrook, who took five out of his seven games with an 82% taking second. Dale Schaeffers, a newcomer from Calahoo, Alberta, Canada, took third spot, winning five games while losing two with a 75%. "Deadeye" wound up in fourth place, followed by another Canadian, Glen Fisher of Moundville, Alberta (3 and 4). Mike Stout of Melrose Park, Ill. (2 and 5); Glen Walker, Cumberland, Wash. (2 and 5) and Sam Woodman, Spokane, Wash. (0 and 7), rounded out the top eight.

In his bid for the final Big Eight, Jeffrey Williams came up with a scorching 140 out of a possible 150 total, thereby equaling "Deadeye's" record breaking qualifying round, run up during the 1971 Championships.

Boy's Class B went to Ken Frazer of San Francisco, who came in 5 and 1 in a play-off match. Class C went to Roy Statham of Plymouth, Calif.

The Lights Went Out In Eureka

When lights went out in Eureka on the evening of August 3, 1973, the clanging sound of horseshoes stopped as abruptly as the ending of a cricket serenade on a hot summer night. The second and third games of the second evening round of championship play were under way at the World Horseshoe Pitching Tournament in the Little Cow Palace at Redwood Acres in Eureka, California.

Tempo of the games was being set as pitchers were settling into a long, strenuous grind that evinced the competitiveness of games that lay ahead. All seemed well on the way to another great tournament and then — the lights went out. Some 900 spectators and players were left suddenly aghast in a darkened arena. The sharp percussive noise of horseshoes gave way to the murmur of excited voices. A calm announcement on the intercom gave assurance that lights surely would be back within minutes. All exits were flung open and the gray light of dusk shone through to mark the way out. An orderly evacuation of the arena was accomplished without incident and the unhappy crowd drifted into a nearby lighted pavilion to await the return of lights to the pitching arena. Four-deads lay in darkness hugging cold iron stakes. Games had stopped on the last lighted pitch.

Lights were promised in one thirty-minute period after another and, as time went by participating pitchers met to decide the remaining play of the evening — if the lights returned. Agreement was to drop back to the last complete inning and pitch out the game that was in progress when darkness struck.

At 10 P. M. the blackout had continued for nearly two hours, and this called for another decision from the players — the third game would be finished when lights come on and this would terminate the night's play. One of the remaining three unplayed games would be pitched on each of the ensuing three nights, thus bringing the tournament up to schedule going into the final round on Tuesday.

The pavilion, wired on a different electrical circuit from the arena, substituted for restaurant and entertainment center and both the spectators and horseshoe pitchers, like moths, were attracted to its bright lights. Inside, lights alone was not the attraction, for "Red" Henton with a half-dozen percussion instruments at his command and in excellent voice, joined by his talented wife at the organ, spelled the anxious crowd with lively, gay music that soothed the wound of waiting.

Among the many pitchers from three states that turned out for the annual Southwest Iowa Open, Ray Cavin of Missouri turned in a perfect record of 5 wins to win the annual event played at McKinley Park in Creston, Iowa.
