



## A New York Member Speaks Out

Dear Sirs:

At the recent N.H.P.A. Convention in Keene, N. H. a statement was made by one of the delegates with which I wish to take issue. This was in reference to Mary S. Lee, of Brooklyn, N. Y., the girl who pitches the men's distance of forty feet.

In August of 1972, before the New York State Tourney was held in Pulaski, N. Y., I wrote to Mr. Ralph Dykes, who at that time was President of the N.H.P.A. for a ruling on whether Mary S. Lee could pitch with the men at the 1972 Pulaski, N. Y. State Tournament. Mr. Dykes' ruling was that "she must be allowed to pitch with the men if she so chooses". However, the N. Y. State Tournament Director refused to let her pitch in any of the men's classes.

The statement the delegate made was that no ruling was given in this matter. I am enclosing a copy of the ruling given by Mr. Dykes and would be deeply grateful if you would publish it in the Digest.

Mary has given up horseshoes on account of what happened at our 1972 State Tourney. If possible will you please publish my letter also.

In conclusion, I would like to say that I am no Johnny-come-lately to horseshoes, as I have been pitching since 1918 and have attended at least fifteen World Tourneys as a spectator, have seen all the greats, and near greats, from Jackson to Day and in losing Mary, in my opinion, we have lost a potential great player, who with more encouragement could have eventually played with the best.

#### FOLLOWING IS THE RULING IN THE NHPA FILES

August 23, 1972

Dear Betty:

The NHPA has been asked to render a decision on the question of a Woman player playing in the State Tournament against men if she pitches the regular distance of 40 feet.

The present question relates to Mary Lee of Brooklyn playing in the New York State Tournament at Pulaski, N. Y.

NHPA records show that this question was resolved as far back as 1938 when Ruth Allen of Hempstead, N. Y. entered and played in the New York State tournament held at Rye, N. Y. She pitched the regular distance of 40 feet and after considerable controversy was allowed to pitch in that and subsequent state tournaments in New York as well as other NHPA tournaments in the east and Canada.

Ruth Allen in the 1930's was in much the same position as Mary Lee is today in that although a woman, she pitches the regular distance of 40 feet and is entitled to pitch for the state title as long as she plays under the same rules as her male opponents.

Consequently in accordance with the precedents and rulings established by the NHPA and its New York State Chapter in 1938 Mary Lee must be allowed, if she so chooses, to pitch in the New York State tournament for the state title in what is normally referred to as the Men's Division as long as she plays under the same rules and conditions as the other contestants including the pitching of the full distance of 40 feet.

Trusting that as State Secretary you will make the state officers and state tournament officials aware of this ruling.

#### TIPS FROM THE TOP

1 — Curt Day, 1974 World's Champion — reverse three-quarter turn. "Ringer consistency to pitch ringer after ringer, you must be able to keep perfect alignment. Alignment is acquired by having a relaxed and well balanced starting position, a smooth step, a rhythmical swing and a good follow thru. Good footwork is very important. The amount of horseshoe pitching practice needed depends on your ringer confidence."

2 — Paul Focht of Ohio — 1962 World Champion. "Learn your correct position on the court, then practice the proper footwork, swing and release until every pitch

is a tournament pitch."

#### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Do you follow the shoe in flight or do you keep your eye on the stake?
 Answer: Bob West, Oregon. Do not watch your shoe in flight, but keep your eye on the opposite peg. After a time, you can 'feel' the turn of the shoe while watching the peg and your ringer percentage should improve."

 Is the shoe held tight or loose?

Answer: Danny Kuchcinski, Indiana. "Your grip should feel natural — not too tight, not too slack. To slow down the rotation of the shoe, grip the shoe a little

tighter and vice versa."

If some one will volunteer to keep the above two columns going, I'll submit a cartoon each month.


