NHPA 1976 Constitution And By-Law Changes

ADMINISTRATION

ARTICLE 2 - SECTION 2 (DELETE)

"or more than twelve (12) delegates to the National Convention." (It was voted in 1974 to have no maximum delegates.)

ARTICLE 2 - SECTION 4 (ADDITION)

To be a Delegate to the National Convention, a person must be a resident of the State or Charter which he is representing, and be a current member of the NHPA.

ARTICLE 2 - SECTION 12 (ADDITION)

No member will be permitted to speak on any subject (pro or con) more than twice, and the first time no longer than five (5) minutes and the second no longer than three (3) minutes, with the exception of a committee report and recommendations and visiting guests who have a message to impart.

JUDICIARY

ARTICLE 4 - SECTION 1 (ADDITION)

Juniors may join the NHPA by payment of a reduced fee, if so designated in the By-Laws. If the fee is lower, those Juniors who pay the lower fee will **not** be counted when computing a Charter's delegate strength.

BY-LAWS-AMENDMENTS

ARTICLE 8 - AMENDMENTS (CHANGE)

The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended at any Convention of Delegates by a two-thirds vote of those present.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1 - SECTION 2 (NEW SECTION) (ADDITION)

All Regional Directors and Chairman of the By-Laws Committee shall be informed of any Executive Council decisions pertaining to the NHPA Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE 3 - SECTION 3 (CHANGE)

Change "\$500" to \$2500.

(This is increasing the bid for sponsorship of a title match if someone wants to contend for the World title.)

ARTICLE 5 - SECTION 1 (CHANGE)

Junior dues shall be one dollar (\$1.00) plus the amount set by his State Charter. They will be designated as a Junior on their membership card.
