



JACK O'CONNOR PLAYOFF WINNER AT PREIMESBERGER JULY 4 OPEN — S. KARASCH WINS LADIES WITH 7 STRAIGHT C. WHITE TOPS IN BOYS WITH 7 IN A ROW

In the July 4th Open tournament held at Preimesberger Arena Indoor courts in Genola, Minnesota over that holiday, Larye Ambrose, defending champion and Jack O'Connor and Dave Hughes ended up in a 3-way tie for the Championship. Larye Ambrose defeated Dave Hughes and Jack O'Connor defeated Ambrose in the final playoff game hitting 36 ringers in 72 shoes for 72 percent. Ambrose had 68 percent. In the Ambrose-Hughes match Ambrose hit 70 percent against 68 percent for Hughes. Ralph Simon won the high ringer award with 44 ringers in 88 shoes.

The tournament was a tremendous success having 17 classes of men and 6 classes of Ladies and 3 classes of Boys.

In the Ladies divison, S. Karasch had a clean slate of seven straight victories with a ringer percentage of 61.7. P. Negaard was runnerup with a 6 and 1 record and 67.7 percent ringers.

In the Boys class it was C. White all the way with 7 straight wins on the board and a 52.0 percent ringer average. Pete O'Connor ran second with 6 and 1 and 51.3 percent.

Dolores and Henry Preimesberger extend their thanks to all the fine pitchers for making the tournament a success, and congratulations to all winners. Also to the volunteer help in running the meet. Elmer Hohl of Wellesley, Ontario took advantage of a situation in his game with Carl Steinfeldt, defending champion, in the Eastern National tournament held at Outwater park courts in Lockport, New York. With the score at 48-46 in favor of Steinfeldt, Carl missed with two shoes to leave an open stake whereupon Elmer dropped on a double to take the title 51-48. Jim Solomon of Uniontown, Pa. finished in third spot with a 11-2 record and 70.8 percent. Wind hampered tournament play causing a drop in ringer percentages.

Ruth Hangen of Getzville, New York who was the Ladies' defending champion had a perfect slate of 5 wins and a ringer percentage of 69.6 to successfully retain her title winning over Lorraine Thomas of Lockport, New York, 51-22 after trailing 9-0. 

Most sports announcers are not too well versed in our sport. You could be surprised at the results of such a program.

I was recently on the Pete Kulis Sport Talk Show on Radio station WHMP, Northampton, Mass. It was an hour and one-half show with 95 percent of the time given to "horseshoe talk." The announcer told me that it was one of his more interesting programs. I have a tape of the program.

If you are able to arrange a show in your local area, write to our NHPA president of NHPA secretary and have them send a "thank you" note to the station for giving our sport publicity. Announcers appreciate such letters. Plan to arrange such a program soon.

My announcer, Pepe Kulis, not being familiar with our sport, was most uncanny with the intelligent questions on horseshoes that he put to me. I was able to give all aspects of the game and some publicity during our lengthy program.


