

CHAMPIONSHIP HONORS IN GREENVILLE, OHIO RINGER CLASSIC GO TO CARL STEINFELDT, OPAL RENO, BRENDA RENO AND MARK DYSON

Defending champions in the annual Greenville, Ohio Ringer Classic added to their laurels as Carl Steinfeldt and Opal Reno pitched to Class A honors in the Men's and Women's divisions in the Classic held at the City Park courts in Greenville, Ohio on July 3 and 4.

Brenda Reno made Champions a family affair by winning the Girl's Division while Boy's World Champion, Mark Dyson breezed through his division for the Classic Junior Championship.

A classy field of pitchers in both Men's and Women's divisions led the 225 entries in the 1981 Tournament through two days of contests.

For the first time in Classic competition the "four dead" one point Eastern system scoring was used in the men's and women's Class A divisions with a hearty acceptance by pitchers and spectators alike.

In a spirited contest for High Qualifier honors Ralph Maddox topped Doc Maison and Clarence Bellman with a 277, 89% record. Maison and Bellman had identical percentage tosses but were respectively one and two points behind Ralph in totals. Maddox also had a perfect game, 28 ringer string in his match with Wilbur Kabel. 
