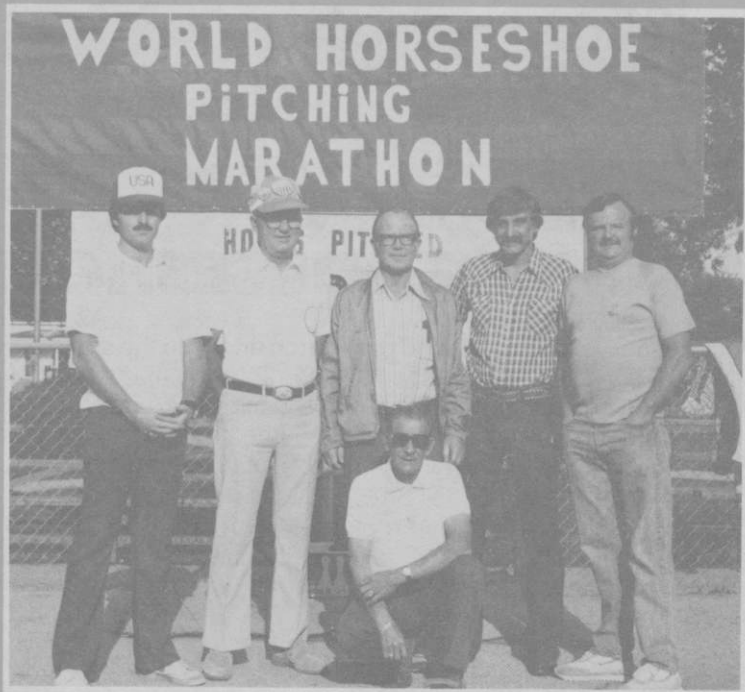

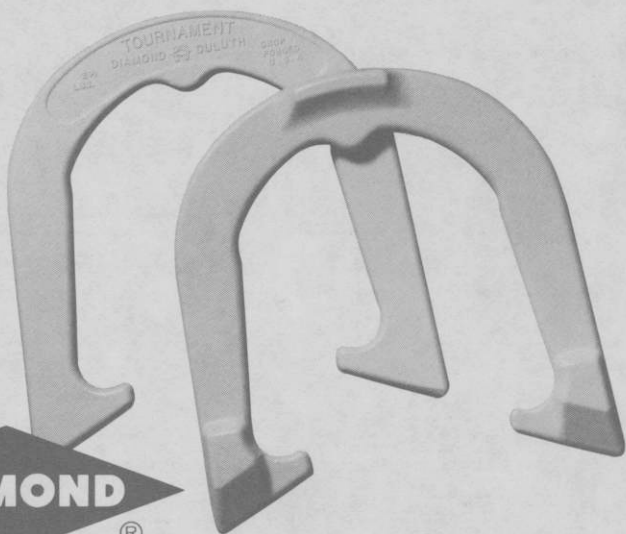

NHPA PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA SET HORSESHOE RECORD

A team of six pitchers from the Southern California Horseshoe Pitchers Association in May, 1983 pitched 200 hours of continuous pitching in Pomona to capture the worlds marathon record.

A crowd of dedicated spectators — including Wally Shiple President of the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association cheered when President of the Pomona Club Hal Slagg pitched the final seconds to break the 140 hour record set in 1981 by the team in Genola, Minn.

It's estimated the team walked 600 miles and threw 64 tons of iron during the nine day event in the attempt to earn their place in the Guinness Book of World Records. Each man pitched a four hour shift every 24 hours. The six players were Hal Slagg, Jim Dow, Ronnie Simmons, George Whittenmore, Roy Holiday and Bob Obermeyer.

Chairman Hal Slagg was involved in SCHPA first world marathon June 11, 1977 in South Gate where he and 5 other members broke the 100 hour worlds record set by a Pennsylvania team by pitching 120 hours.

Congratulations and hats off to all six players. A salute to all the observers and friends who dropped by during the 200 hours to say hello and keep company. During this event \$200.00 in contributions were donated by many people and presented by Hal Slagg to the Pomona Youth Sports Committee.

Jim Brown, Chairman of the youth committee said the group plans to explore the possibility of organizing a horseshoe pitching league for Pomona youngsters.

On behalf of the NHPA thanks to the Mayor of Pomona, G. Stanton Selby, Director of Parks and Recreation D. Bridges and Parks Security Officer, Don Royle for all the support and cooperation.

SJURSET WINS AURORA, IL. FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS OPEN

Clint Sjurset of Elgin, Ill. topped Wayne Hooper of Joliet, Ill. in the play-off game with a 73.8 game to win the championship of the Festival of Lights Open tournament held on Saturday, July 2 at the Phillips Park courts in Aurora, Illinois. Hooper had high single game with 37 ringers in 44 shoes for 84.0 percent.

In spite of a deluge of 6 inches of rain that fell during the night preceding the tournament, with the help of the Aurora League members and players the courts were put in shape and the tournament started on schedule. On Monday, July 4 the members of the Aurora League set up temporary courts at the River St. Park where a clinic was conducted with spectator participation as a part of the Festival of Lights celebration held in the downtown area. This tournament was sanctioned with players coming from a 100-mile radius.

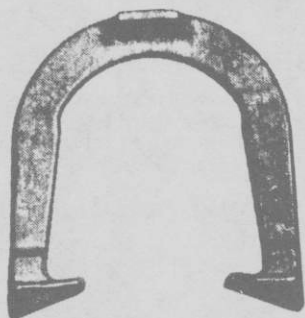

The Piqua, Ohio horseshoe club along with holding it's July 16th. and 17th. annual club tournament at Eisenhower cts. The Johnson Farm is owned and maintained by the Ohio Historical Society and developed it into a state park. Col. Johnson was an Indian agent for the U.S. Govt. in the early 1800's.

Located there is an Indian Museum, restored Johnson home spring house, log barn which along with entry to the ground is free admission during the 3 day festival. Canal boat ride's will be available with an admission fee.

The festival will have many demonstration's such as apple cider pressing, butter churning, canoe race's, beard browng contest, string country and western band contest, muzzle loading rifle shoot off's etc.

There will be room to park 1000 vehicle's on the site, and shuttle buses will be available to and from Piqua.

This year we have a new format that seems to be working well. We use a count all system with a full handicap. This ends up a fun league with everyone enjoying themselves and able to compete with everyone else. We throw 100 shoes each Friday nite, the handicap has a scratch of 300, so your count all score average subtracted from 300 is your handicap. Each nite the players get placed according to their performance in respect to the other players throwing. If your place 1st in a 25 man field, you get 25 points, if last you set 1 point. This is not a league designed for professional throwers but what we need is to set people interested in horseshoe and this seems to accomplish this very well. It is also very interesting to note that women and men are about even in number and I'm inclined to think we may end up with more women in the league than men.

The first nite of play the handicap is based on that nites play, this automatically gives them 300, but on ties we break first on actual points, then rings, then doubles, then who scores first. Those people who played in last year league use the last years ending average for the first nite of play.

We had 12 new players who never played before on our first nite of play. I don't know of any who won't be back. We are scheduling 3 tournaments during the year and at the end will have a potluck banquet to give out the tournament Trophies and also the league Trophies. So Horseshoe is alive and well in Lake Lillian, Minnesota.

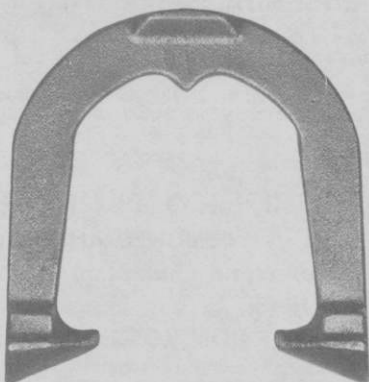

He participated in numerous tournaments throughout the entire state and twice won his class in NHPA sanctioned tournaments this year. He and his partner, Bob Pence former NHPA Secretary-Treasurer, were also leading the weekly doubles league at the Reynolds Club.

His wife Christine also played in Indiana NHPA sanctioned tourneys and was playing on an adjoining court at the Lafayette Club when his death occurred.

Survivors also include his son James Jr., six grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.

The world of horseshoe pitching has suffered a genuine loss and collectively extends its deepest sympathy to the Buell family.

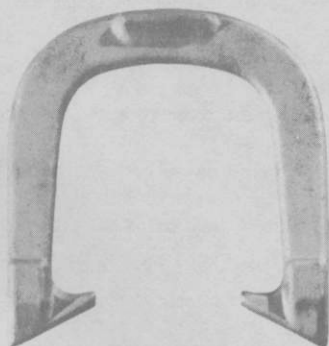

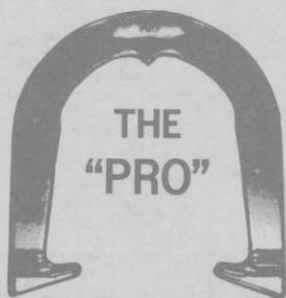
