

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT — GLEN A. PORTT

I am writing this on July 4, 1985...25 days before the World Tournament Convention. What follows is what I said to the delegates on July 30th under 'Memorandum of the President.'

"Ladies, gentlemen, friends...and (smile) enemies, I realize that what I say here as an outgoing President will make little difference on how you vote upon the important business which will be brought before this convention. Each of you have had sufficient time to go over each item and each of you will have a chance to vote. But how about approximately 8000 members who are not given a chance to vote or to be represented by their delegates?

When elected your President, I ran on a platform of being in favor of some type of PROXY voting. I still am. It was only about 40 years ago that the South kept the blacks from voting by imposing a 'POLL' tax. Thus, most blacks couldn't vote *due to financial reasons*. The Supreme Court of the U.S. threw out all such requirements citing 'discriminatory practices.'

I want to ask you a question...Aren't the NHPA members in the western states being treated the same way? Due to the fact that the W.T. is held (for the most part) 1500-2000 miles or more from the western states, those states are unable to have their quota of delegates present due to financial reasons. This is simply a 'POLL' tax in another form. It should be removed. At the present time, the west has approximately 25-30% of the NHPA membership. These people can vote for the President of the United States... but they can't vote for the President of the NHPA! Every corporation of any size in the U.S. uses the PROXY vote. Isn't it about time the NHPA did?

The next item I wish to cover is a site and the physical facilities for our National Headquarters and our Hall of Fame. Due to the Springfield plans, the Council suspended all action on this matter. We are now back to square one. It all comes down to the fact that you can have these facilities if you really want them. I often think of the article by Jim Woodson written some time ago for the Digest. Jim asked, "Why Ain't We Got No Angels?" To answer in the same vernacular, "We ain't!" Therefore, it boils down to doing it ourselves. A Hall of Fame and a National Headquarters are within reach financially. It is up to you. Someone has to grab the ball and run with it.

I've served two interesting years as President. That's long enough. This organization needs new peopl...because new people bring new, fresh ideas... different ways of doing things. Corporations around the world move their Executives often because they know that when an executive stays in one place too long, stagnation sets in. Everyone becomes complacent...happy with the status quo...and the attitude becomes, "Why change things?"

There is a saying in the Air Force that it takes several *different* Base Commanders to make a good base. Why? Because each one has a different area of interest. Each one has new ideas.

To each of you who wrote letters and also those who asked me personally to re-consider my decision *not* to run for the Presidency...my sincere thanks. To be very honest, I thought about it. Although there are many, many reasons why I would not change my mind, I will give you only one. That one is *because I gave you my word*.

I announced in the March issue of the Digest that I would NOT be running. I could not now, at this very moment, announce that I am running. To me, it is just that simple.

The NHPA is a good organization and I am proud to be a member. It will always have my best wishes for its success. In closing, I'll keep it simple...Goodbye!

NHPA PUBLICITY REPORT

All members are asked to put together a write-up concerning the 1985 World Tournament, in

their local newspaper.

July 24-August 3, Lafayette, Indiana, about an even 1000 entries, men, women, boys and girls. Give the name and state of winners of the championship classes. All entries will play in roundrobin matches in classes according to their ringer percentages. The tournament features opening and closing ceremonies. An annual convention. A Hall of Fame Induction and banquet and several committee meetings. The tournament is sanctioned by the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association that represents most organized horseshoe pitching.

Special notes of interest: during the 10 days of one on one competition, about 6500 games will be played. About 800,000 shoes will be thrown. About 2,000,000 pounds of steel will be thrown,

equaling about 1000 tons.

Contestants are from almost every state and provinces of Canada.

Thousands of dollars in cash, trophies and scholarships are awarded.

The object of Annual World Tournaments is to promote the sport in its highest form in as many sections of the country as possible. It is also held to give players from all states and provinces an opportunity to compete in their respective classes, annually.

Members are asked to give this information to reporters. They will write it up in their own style

of reporting.

DAVE'S COURT REPORT

In our sport, like any other, growth and recognition go hand in hand. Rarely can one be obtained without the other. In recent months, we have attempted to identify all those who have pitched perfect games and establish a program to recognize the individual. There are, however, many other areas in our sport where guidelines for recognition have not been determined or accomplishments have gone basically unnoticed.

The NHPA has generally conceded that "The Greatest Game" ever pitched by men in a W.T. was accomplished in 1965 in Keene, NH. Glen "Red" Henton and Ray Martin pitched 194 shoes with 312 cancelled ringers and 63 "Four Deads." Glen won 52-49 with 90.2%. Can you imagine what it would feel like to average 89.7%, ring the stake 174 times in 194 attempts and still lose? Ray Martin did, he had just lost to Red Henton who threw 175 ringers. It's difficult to imagine this game ever being equaled but, who knows. Someday, somewhere, two fine horseshoe pitchers may find themselves locked in a herculean effort that may rival the 'Great Game.'

But what about the Women and Juniors? Little has been said about the great performances in these fields. I wonder why! Is it just that any other great game seems pale in comparison to the Henton-Martin effort? Or, is it just that we are slow to recognize the accomplishments of those

who pitch only 30 feet.

A great game was pitched by Ruth Hangen and Debby Michaud in the 1977 W.T. It holds the record for longest game pitched, 134 shoes, total ringers, cancelled ringers and "Four Deads." But yet, it seems to go unrecognized by the general NHPA membership.

In the Jr. Boys Div., Richard Howe and John Passmore in 1975 pitched a game that almost equaled the Henton-Martin game in several categories. It went 190 shoes with 312 cancelled

ringers and 61 "Four Deads."

These two games, if not "The Greatest" in their divisions, certainly come close and perhaps, should be recognized as such. If someone out there thinks otherwise, please write me. I'd like to know what you believe "Was the Greatest Game ever played by the Women and Juniors."





NEW PICTURES CAN WIN, TOO!

Sharon Paddock, member and past President of the Rio-Dell, California Horseshoe Pitching Club, has been California State Women's Champion for the last two years (1984-85). She won the Northern California Women's Championship five times, and finished second once, in the last seven years.

The remarkable thing in Sharon's career is that she didn't start to pitch until 1977 when a local cattle rancher-horseshoe pitcher teased her, saying, "Sharon, you're a regular tomboy. You like hunting, fishing and camping, why don't you try horseshoe pitching."

"Well, I didn't fully agree with Verne, the rancher, that I'm a zany tomboy, nonetheless I did start throwing shoes around, and just throwing them into the pit was what I did at first. Strangely enough, I liked the feeling of the game as I started to make ringers. Somehow, I entered a small tournament not far from home and pitched 20 percent in my first attempt at the horseshoe game on which I am now overly enthusiastic."

She practices diligently about an hour a day on a concrete backyard court filled with clay...her avocation and her hobby, besides, of course, performing duties of a diligent mother and a full-hearted homemaker.

Sharon's starting percentage was twenty in 1977, as stated above. Fifty seven percent won for her the 1978 N.C.H.P.A. Women's Championship and in both '83 and '84 she won the Women's California State Title pitching in the 70's.

Tournaments represent her weekend winnings. During the week, winnings come through performing the task of General Secretary in her family's Real Estate business in Eureka.

Sharon, not satisfied with her slow progress, percentage-wise, recognized her limitation in pitching the flip shoe; "I just couldn't seem to improve my game," she said. "In 1981 I had my husband teach me the 3/4 turn. In this, he was quietly patient, as husbands have to be; I was studiously persistent and the change proved to be worthwhile, for in 1984, I had two 90 percent games in tournament play."

Pitching in San Francisco's 1985 Golden Gate Tournament, Sharon hit 81.2 percent to win the women's top division...she, at age 41, is on her way to higher goals with her new 3/4 turn.

The entire Paddock family is hooked on the horseshoe game; her husband, Bill, keeps at it although he pitches only half as well as she, but this he doesn't mind so long as his better half (literally) keeps on doing well with HIS 3/4 turn. Both children are developing into winners; why not, with a championship-class mother to emulate. Daughter, Candice, 19, was California Girls' Champion in 1983; son Will, 14, has been 3rd and 2nd in the boys' division of the State in the last three years.

Sharon's formula for success parallels that of many other top pitchers; she is aware that she has no monopoly on ringers. She loves the game. She's a graceful pitcher with even temperment, easy mannerisms and flawless form...she advances in her games from triumph to triumph with confident step, not boastful of her achievement, but ever grateful for the position she has gained in a relatively short time.

Tomboy or not, the summation of her solid pitching characteristics, tempered with superb concentration, add up to Sharon's ability to hit the stake with an open shoe.




