5th VP & REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT By GENE VAN SANT

More and more race tracks across the country are staging "\$100,000 Horseshoe Pitches." A track in N.J. and one in Calif. were two that I was aware of. Most recently, "Cantebury" in Minnesota held such an event. Our NHPA Regional Director for Minnesota and the Dakotas was asked to supervise the event. That regional director, Len Lipovsky, along with his son, Dale Lipovsky, a two time world champion, really got involved. They gave six demonstrations on the track between races, answered questions, and gave advice over the loud speaker system. To quote Len, "It was great fun, exciting, and one of the most beneficial events for publicizing horseshoes that I have ever participated in." The rules are far different than our NHPA rules in that contestants throw from 47 foot! On the first pitch of the initial show Dale put a solid ringer on and the crowd went wild! "Tough luck Dale, in that you did not qualify for the \$100,000." T.V. and radio celebrities were there and competed in a pitch-off for their favorite charity. as we in the NHPA know it, but is fine publicity for our organization. "Thanks Len and Dale for a job well done."

Continuing in the publicity vane, California held its state tournaments over Labor Day weekend, August 30-31. The site was the 16 court complex in Riverside, Calif. Les Burroughs, Regional Director for Calif., reported 209 entries. The weather was on the warm side, but aside from that, the courts and facilities were first rate.

Complete results will be published in the Digest so I will not dwell on it. What I want to inform you on is publicity! On my return from the World Tournament in Ainsworth I wrote to KCBS, the CBS TV channel for the Los Angeles area, the second largest TV market in the nation. I addressed my correspondence to "Kevin O'Connell." Kevin is the weather man and does most of his weather reports live on sites of community events around the basin area. I invited him to the Calif. State Horseshoe Tournament. I received a phone call from the program director on Wednesday, August 27th, that Kevin would be doing his weather from the tournament site! They could not be there on either the 30th or 31st but did the live telecast from the courts on Friday the 29th.

I had the honor of being interviewed by Kevin, answering questions about the NHPA and organized horseshoes. The program was viewed by several million people in the market area. Kevin and I also threw two horseshoes on camera. Remember, this was live TV! Me nervous? Judge for yourselves. My first shoe hit my leg coming through the swing and wound up 25 foot in the air bouncing off the concrete platform! So much for my celebrity status. My next shoe, while not a ringer, was a good shoe, just a bit short, which is par for the course for me! Kevin managed to get both of his shoes in the pit. Not bad for a first time pitcher. We salvaged the day by having 10 year old Kevin Kecskes of Fontana, Calif. throw two shoes. Oh to be young again! He nailed them both, perfect ringers! By the way, Kecskes went on to win the State Junior Championships. He is a great young pitcher and just may be our next Walter Ray Williams, Mark Seibold or Allen Francis.

I have had many calls from people who saw the telecast wanting to know more about our organization. I have been stopped on the street by total strangers that recognize me from the program. None have asked for my autograph, however. A great pitcher, I will never be, but, I sure have fun and love the game. Maybe all those aspiring pitchers on seeing an "expert" throw a bummer will decide to take up the game. After all, "if "he" can hit the concrete, I won't feel bad when I do." I guess my point is that if we keep plugging away at the media, little by little we can and will gain

the publicity that we so richly deserve.

Dear Mr. Cobb:

I would like to comment on the time frame Kevin Cone mentioned in his "Ringers Remembered" article.

Why do we pitchers bother keeping track of those errant shoes that do not wind up as ringers? We accomplish nothing by counting the shoe that doesn't get the job done. Close should only count with hand grenades! Ringers are the name of the game! Throw 2% or 92%, you are still trying only to make ringers. Counting only ringers is the ultimate solution to the time frame we are trying to solve. If we were to count ringers only as one point, a game could be a set number of shoes or points, count all ringers. Games would be much more on schedule, scorekeeping would be a dream come true. Judging would be a snap as only ringers would be in question. Spectators could look at the scoreboard and immediately know the game score and the percentage each pitcher is hitting! No more asking, "Hey, scorekeeper, what did those two have for average?" I heard that question hundreds of times in many different tournaments. If we want the spectator and the money to become involved with our sport we must make a change.

We have a singles league which for a number of years has been using the count all ringers only method. Each pitcher keeps track of his ringers every four shoes on the board. Throwing fifty shoe games all pitchers know what they are throwing for average at all times. Very little bookkeeping, look at the scoreboards up and down the line and know what the other pitchers are throwing. Everyone knows their average for the game, the night, for their improvement and for tournament average.

The league is a real success usually with a waiting list to enter.

I have been fortunate to have pitched horseshoes in a few world tournaments with some great pitchers. I would love to live long enough to see these great ringer makers get on the national sport scene so the rest of the world can find out what we know is the greatest sport going! Watching Walter Ray Williams, Jr. make the big money knocking down the bowling pins is great. Watching the champ make ringers on national T.V. would be the greatest. Come on! Let's get this game modernized for everyone! Time is of the essence!

While ordering shipping boxes for Star Horseshoes last week, I came across an ad for "Bubble Pack." This is a common, low cost, lightweight, air filled, polyethylene, cellular cushioning used to protect various products in shipment.

My thought at that moment was, "What a good product to adapt for portable horseshoe courts," if it were layered in a four inch to six inch thickness. The top layers could be stapled to a frame with the bubbles face up to cushion shoes and create a stopping surface for sliding horseshoes. This frame could be built to fit down inside existing portable courts or any other court, indoor or outside. At indoor facilities the clay dust has been a large housekeeping problem. Bubble pack would solve that problem. No doubt the top layers may tear a bit, but if it got too bad, a new layer could be easily stapled to the frame in a matter of minutes.

I think this idea should be tried first in a portable court to see how it works. This product can be purchased in three bubble sizes; 1/8", 3/16" and 1/2" and is available in sheets of 12", 24" and 48" widths. The length of the roll is in 3 sizes: 250 ft, 500 ft, and 750 ft. I hope this idea will be helpful for our great sport.

Don Titcomb, 1960 World Champion, drove north to pitch a few 80% games to win top honors in Class A-1 over a strong field of Northern Cal men. Forty pitchers in all enjoyed the Club's new courts and clay. George Greeott, the shoe maker, along with Club president, Eldon Bryhan, are given credit for the professional layout and construction of the twelve new courts in Santa Rosa's environmentally pleasant Doyle Park.

LEE BOUSFIELD D & BELOW, gold country TOURNAMENT June 28 in Nevada City, Calif. EASTERN SIERRA is enjoying its new status as a split-off charter in Northern California with a D and below tournament that attracted 42 eager pitchers, largely from north eastern part of the State, thus serving the purpose for which the charter was granted — to give an opportunity for many pitchers to become more active in the game. Many, many showed up to pitch; new names rarely, if ever, seen on old established horseshoe courts in the valley below to the west. A D-CLASS and below tournament as this one is represented, indicates the importance of lower class pitchers in this game where spread of ability is pronounced. Needless to say, everyone cannot be an A-1 pitcher (even though he thinks that would be great). Lower class pitchers have as much fun pitching as upper-class performers. Pitchers develop from the bottom up, so, be thankful that that opportune position to advance. Don't envy Titcomb and Williams; they're at the top and have no place to go; does a lower pitcher want to be stagnated as they are, with no place to go?

VERDAN ZELMAR OPEN W & J — June 29 at San Jose, California — Northern California boasts of having sponsored 90 sanctioned tournaments for 1986 — Here is yet another, and others following in profusion, attest to this volume of regulated pitching. San Jose Club had five local members in the top A-1 group, winding up with a percentage spread of 33.8% from top to bottom. Don Titcomb and Ed Floyd had a close game that could have gone either way, but didn't; Ed came in second. Junior boys had a tussle between brothers. Terry, the older one, won. Six women formed

two groups that spread from top to bottom in percentage range.

INDEPENDENCE DAY OPEN W & J — July 4 at San Jose — Fireworks and horseshoes flew on this day of festive color and sustained noise.
