FROM YOUR PRESIDENT . . . DAVE LOUCKS

How do you support the NHPA and the growth of our sport beyond buying a membership card? Do you participate in and support NHPA sanctioned tournaments or is your interest primarily in the resident club and local, stay at home, activities?

It is an unfortunate fact of our sport that a big majority of the membership is not interested in the national growth of horseshoe pitching. They are apparently not concerned by the lack of media coverage, by the absence of sponsors and the general indifference to the sport itself. Is it all too true that 10% of the membership does 100% of the work for 90% of the pitchers who really don't care?

This year marks the first time for Regional Tournaments and a World Tournament where the bid was 60% more than ever before. With more than \$5,000 in prize money in each of the lowa and Oklahoma Regionals plus near \$60,000 in the Pleasanton World Tournament, one would think the events would be well attended. But, they weren't, at least nowhere near what they should have been. Entries did not reach expectations for any of these 3 major events.

For some, there were legitimate reasons for not attending. But, for many, reasons merely become excuses for indifference. Something is wrong when a sports activity cannot generate enthusiasm and support among members let alone the outside media and sponsors we seek to attract. Perhaps we need a change in the direction of our sport. This is not a new idea but one expressed in 1940 as it was perceived and written about in the publication HORSESHOE WORLD. Even then, participants were calling our sport monotonous and totally lacking in spectator appeal. Now, 48 years later, we still hear much of the same as the search goes on to bring recognition to Horseshoe Pitching.

WORLD TOURNAMENT COMMENTS

World Tournament time is just around the corner and more than 825 hopefuls are polishing up their games in an attempt to win one of the World Championships.

Looking over the pamphlet from Kevin Cone regarding World tournament All-Time victory leaders, it appears that Boulder's Ted Allen has a super lock on a career total number of wins. Ted won 771 games in his 31-year span at the World. At present the closest active competitor in the Championship class is Jim Knisley of Ohio. Jim has 435 victories and with some luck and maybe a little Geritol could pass many of those listed ahead of him. At present Carl Steinfeldt has 10 and Don Titcomb has 435, but both of these former Men's Champions have elected to pitch in other divisions this year.

Among the active pitchers in the Championship class this year in the top 50 include Mark Seibold with 412; Walter Ray Williams, Jr., 248; Jesse Gonzales, 190; and Art Tyson, 187. Glen "Red" Henton is 14th on the list, but has been competing in other divisions for several years. Red won 375 in the top class.

In Women's circles the top five listed all competed last year. Vicki Winston, 10-time World Champion, has 186 wins; Ruth Hangen, 125; Phyllis Negaard, 91; and Debbie Michaud, 91. Former Champion Lorraine Thomas is not competing this year. She is third on the All-Time list with 111.

Other active women in the Championship class this year will include Boinnie Seibold with 67 wins; Fran Carnahan, 42; Tari Powell, 34, Diane Cantin, 23. Sandy McLachlin, the 1987 winner with 16 wins, should move up the ladder this year.

The girls Championship divison probably will have a new leader when Debbie Bestul takes to the courts after another title. She has 22 wins, five behind the leader in this group, Lina Pateneaude, with 27.

In the Senior men's division, Glen Portt is now second behind John Manker, who has 62 wins. Portt could take the All-Time lead by increasing his present figure of 54.

In the Junior boys group Edward Neeb with 31 and Chad Hyatt with 27 have a chance to move up the ladder. Alan Francis is the leader with 61 wins in 70 games, and an 81.7 percentage overall.



My long time friend and quail hunting partner for years was industriously mowing his lawn. I had tried many times to get him to join our horseshoe club but to no avail . . . even though he was a fairly good pitcher.

"Jim, I need to sign up one more pitcher for our tournament today. How about helping me this one time?"

He looked up at me. (Did I detect a sly look in his eye?) "What's it worth?" I knew what was coming. The previous hunting season I had purchased a new 20 gauge automatic. Jim had asked me to use it on various occasions. I would always answer, "Heck, no. I don't want an amateur hunter using my gun." I could see that now—I was about to pay the price.

"Well, I'll tell you what. I'll think about letting you use my 20 gauge. You know you always wanted to."

"Think about it?"

"Well, OK. I'll let you."

"I'll do it. Who am I pitching?"

"Nothing to worry about. It doesn't occur too often but today there happens to be five women in your class. But that's no problem. You can beat them easily if you'll just use a little psychology . . . and other things."

"Other things?"

"You remember how our wives kept pestering us to come up to our hunting cabin to clean it up . . . and how we finally let them?"

"Hey, you mean how we put those rubber black widow spiders under just about everything? Yeah, I remember." He bent over laughing.

"Well, when you pitch your first opponent, look down at the backstop, kinda gasp, jump back and say, 'Did you see that black widow spider? Look close when you pick up your shoes.'







During this time he established world-wide recognition in creative art . . . The Cannes Festival in France 1956 . . . Buenos Aires Invitational 1962; both exhibited his outstanding work. Smithsonian Institute, Washington, D.C., and DeYoung Museum, San Francisco, include his work among their prestigious collection. Many other museums across the USA, too long a list to enumerate here, display his work. Fifteen cherished awards won in State and National competition are mementos to his artistic skill. The California School of Fine Arts honored him as instructor from 1957 through 1962.

Military leadership was evident. "Gung ho," Ernie said he was, a 1st Lieutenant performing as Parachute Combat Platoon Leader when he led his 513th Parachute Infantry into the fray—Battle of the Bulge during the Ardennes Campaign. "We really caught hell," he remembered all too well. "I lost forty-three out of fifty men after eleven days of combat. I was wounded, captured, surrendered the town which we had taken and as prisoner of war, spent three months in a German hospital for disabled American soldiers." Ernie hastened to conclude . . . "When American forces crossed the Rhine, I was among the first POWs released to be sent home."

Ernie would be first to admit he's not a great horseshoe pitcher; not because his left leg now is two-and-one-half inches shorter than the right, and the left foot has no feeling . . . But then, who needs to pitch horseshoes to gain National recognition when he can achieve it—all for good of the sport—through CREATIVE ART?


