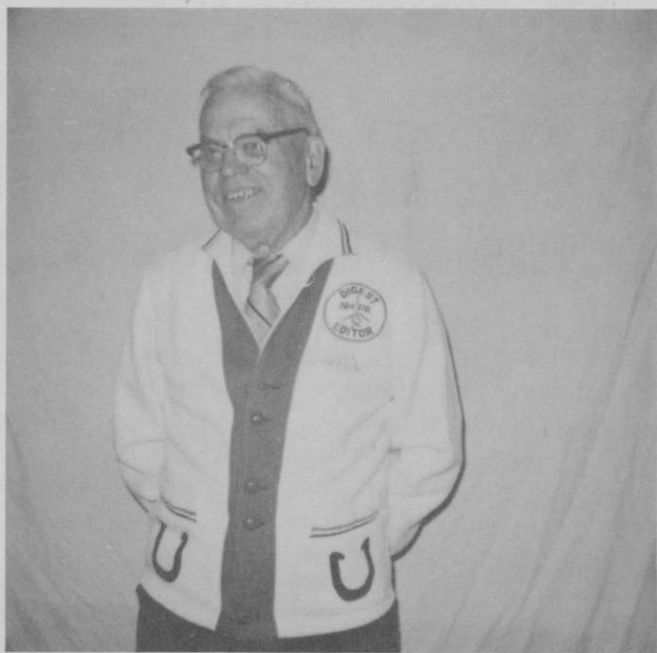

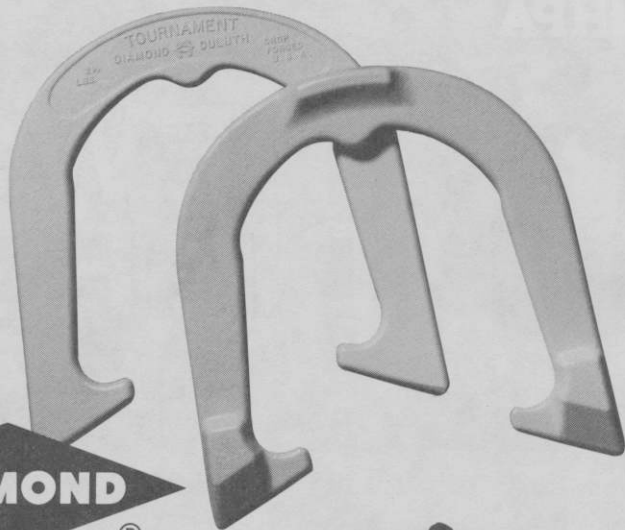

AN ERA OF THIRTY-TWO YEARS WITH THE EDITOR

The NEWS DIGEST came into being at the 1956 World Tournament held at Murray, Utah. At the invitation of Mr. Archie Stokes who was the NHPA President at that time, Ellis was invited to be present for the purpose of instituting a means of communication relating to tournament results and association activity for the membership.

Previous to 1956, tournament results of national origin had been published in "The Horseshoe World" by the late Raymond Howard of Ohio, and followed later in "The Horseshoe Pitcher" published by Mr. Byron Jaskeulak of New York each month, until his death at which time the magazine stopped.

Mr. Stokes had learned that Ellis had published a two color brochure of coming tournaments beginning in the Spring of each year and another brochure in the Fall of all the tournaments within the State and area surrounding.

So, at the 1956 NHPA Convention the delegates voted unanimously to innovate an NHPA magazine with the first official issue being that of January, 1957. A sample issue had already been presented at the Convention in July of 1956.

Since the first issue which contained 16 pages, Ellis has never missed putting out an issue for thirty-two years. Down through the years he has worked with several NHPA Presidents and Secretaries in promoting the DIGEST as it is today, the present issue being a 60-page plus edition.

During the intervening years, Ellis was busy in horseshoe pitching circles. On getting a call from Mr. Matt Niesen of Chicago who was the producer of the TV program "Championship Bowling" (a forerunner of the PBA Bowling Tour of today) Ellis was invited to join Mr. Niesen to try and arrange to have a TV series to be called "Championship Horseshoes." A date was set and the first trial program set up with Ellis and Truman Standard of Canton, Illinois, being the participants. The initial taping was sent to the NBC headquarters in New York where it met with approval and the telecast started with an 18-week series sponsored by the RCA Corporation and emanating from the NBC studios in Chicago. Many top pitchers of that time took part, namely, Ellis Cobb, Truman Standard, John Landmeier, Arthur Dugle, Milton Take, Curt Day, Don Titcomb and many others.

As the series progressed it rose to the second spot on the Nielsen rating for the period of the broadcast which competed with "Movietime U.S.A." at that time. On the final night of the series Don Titcomb of California was featured as the series ending was telecast on the "Tonight" show coast to coast.

Other things began to happen to Ellis as he went about his horseshoe duties. In 1961 he was made a Life member of the NHPA while Cletus Chapelle of Oregon was the NHPA President. In 1962, Ellis was presented the "Arch Stokes" award at the 1962 World Tournament at Greenville, Ohio, for outstanding service. As time went on, Ellis worked with a large trophy company designing a new figure for horseshoe trophies depicting a real horseshoe pitcher rather than that of a bowling figure. Ellis served as the model and six weeks later the finished product emerged. Soon afterwards it was being used by the four major trophy companies in the country beginning with the Brunswick Trophy Company of Gary, Indiana.

Since that time, Ellis was inducted into the NHPA Hall of Fame at the World Tournament at South Gate, California, together with Vicki (Chapelle) Winston. In 1978 Ellis was inducted into the Illinois State Hall of Fame of which he was secretary for thirty-two years. Ellis' wife, Virginia, is also an Illinois Hall of Fame member.

Ellis has received many other awards and commendations and hundreds of congratulatory letters from the many NHPA members and subscribers throughout the United States and Canada on his dedicated service to the NHPA and horse-


shoe activity. He is most humble to all his many friends and associates he has made.

Lest it not be forgotten, Ellis has played in four World Tournaments beginning in 1948-1949-1950 and 1951. However, due to his company having a big printing contract, during the summer months, Ellis has not been able to compete in World Tournaments since. In his World Tournament competition he has played against such horseshoe pitching notables as Ted Allen, Guy Zimmerman, Fernando Isais, Casey Jones (whom he defeated in the 1951 event), Stan DeLeary, Louie Dean, Tommy Brownell, Dean Brown, Lowell Gray, Elmer Hohl, Curt Day (whom he also defeated later), Ellis Griggs, Earl Bomke, Milton Tate, and many others of note.

Other than horseshoe activity, Ellis and his wife are very active in the Masonic fraternity and appendant bodies.

Thus ends an era covering thirty-two years, and to those who will pick up the "reigns" and continue on we say farewell and "best wishes" to all.

PERSONALITY PROFILE—1988

Anyone who was in Eau Claire, WS, for the 1987 World Horseshoe Tournament would have seen Frank Hiendlmayr pitching horseshoes—several times and on several different courts. At 86 years of age, Frank was determined to pitch as many games there as possible—so he offered to fill in wherever and whenever any class needed an extra person. No complaints of fatigue, no aches and pain here. With his 1¼ turn, using Red Henton horseshoes, he pitched over 50 games of horseshoes, a feat many one-half his age would like to emulate. He pitched again in the 1988 World Horseshoe Tournament in Pleasanton, CA.

When not pitching at a World Tournament, Frank and his wife, who is a nurse, can be seen at courtside watching games with an avid interest. It's easy to spot Frank. He is a tall straight figure with a shock of pure white hair and a distinguished white beard. He attributes his excellent health and good appearance to never using alcohol, tobacco, or coffee, eating very little red meat or salt, and to marrying "one of the best." He also tends a "small garden" which is 60' x 80', bowls 7 times a week with a 183-196 average (watch out, Walter Ray!), enjoys riding a bicycle, fishing, and photography. He has even travelled to Africa to photograph the wild animals.

In addition, he is in the export business after "retiring" from two other businesses. Living in a suburb of Cleveland, he is a cornerstone of the horseshoe pitching community there, having 77 years of pitching experience. All members should try to encourage more persons to participate in our fine sport, otherwise participation will decline.

I would like to see some interesting statistics published like was done before, that is, the top pitchers in the U.S. and Canada.

My variation of statistics would be the top (10) pitchers using ringer percentages for right hand pitchers throwing $1\frac{1}{2}$ turn, $1\frac{3}{4}$ turn, single flip, double flip, triple flip, etc., also the same for left hand pitchers and also Junior players. These figures could come from yearly listed percentages kept by state secretaries or conductors of area tournaments.

Very few pitchers pitch the flipshoe and holding a percentage over 50 percent. I maintained a 52 percent average during 1987.

I would like to hear of others with the same thoughts as mine.

MINUTES OF THE 1988 REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S MEETING

The annual Regional Directors' meeting was held at 3:00 P.M. on August 5, 1988, at the World Tournament in Pleasanton, California. There were 27 RD's, ARD's and representatives in attendance, representing 21 regions.

At the Council Meeting prior to the RD Meeting, the NHPA Council gave me the go-ahead to re-align the regions and make some of the regions smaller, assigning new RD's. There are going to be more regional tournaments as time goes by and there should be a representative of the NHPA, be it a council member or an RD or ARD in attendance. The people putting on the regional tournaments are going to work very hard to make these tournaments a success and they need our help as much as possible. Along with re-aligning the regions, I will assign new region numbers that hopefully will have more meaning.

Discussed at this Regional Directors' meeting were regional tournaments. Most were of the opinion that if the regional tournaments, somewhere in the future, are going to replace the world tournament and only have the winners of the regionals compete at the world tournament, you will not get the \$40,000 or \$50,000 bids as you will not attract as many people as you do now for a world tournament. Should any of the regions be interested in holding a regional tournament you should go to your Chamber of Commerce and state officials and see if they are willing to put up \$4,000 or more to have a regional tournament. The NHPA will put up 50¢ for everything over the \$4,000 bid up to \$1,500. If your state is interested you should contact Dave Loucks and get a copy of the contract and go forward from there. I have enclosed some guidelines for the regional tournament.

This is the first year we have had no year on the tournament, class, doubles champion and doubles class patches. The majority of the RD's stated they had had very few complaints. Some said the people that wanted the year on their patches had it put on. Don Koso is working on making 1989's out of some 1983 patches I had left over. We'll see how that works out. Anyone that is interested in trying to change the year on any patches I have left from prior years, I will be happy to send you some to experiment with. The RD's and ARD's in attendance felt we should go another year without the year on the patches.

REGIONAL REPORT—(Continued)

There were pro and con discussions about the NHPA being involved with the AAU. One RD tried to get a tournament going with the AAU and they wouldn't have anything to do with the NHPA. Another RD had some very favorable comments about the AAU. Another stated the AAU provided the trophies for a tournament and then after they were presented the AAU asked for the trophies back because the NHPA pays dues and that makes us professionals in their eyes. Several RD's have had problems dealing with AAU and will not work with them again.

An ARD brought out that they had heard that NHPA memberships being sold to Thousand Trails members were one dollar less than if you were not a member of Thousand Trails. We do not know at this time if Thousand Trails will pick up that dollar and pay it to the NHPA. Another RD said they sold NHPA memberships for the regular price. Some Thousand Trails facilities are very good and their people very cooperative. Other places the RD's have gone the courts are very poor and the Thousand Trails people don't seem to know anything about the NHPA.

It is felt that each charter should have a publicity director. With a person designated as publicity chairman, the NHPA would get better coverage and possibly attract more members. It seems the media and newspapers get used to working with the same person and cooperate better.

The RD's felt there should be better coverage for the game related items, having more sub distributors. In one area the state secretary purchases horseshoes from Ed Domey and then has these items for sale at their tournaments. This way the NHPA makes a profit from these items that are sold. This is one answer to the situation but more sub distributors is a better one.

The NHPA Digest was discussed and most of the RD's felt that there should be more stories, a different format and less errors. Most states have a news letter now and they felt the state news letter should publish the tournament results. It was brought out that the subscriptions should get to Donnie right away. We should increase the cost of the NHPA dues to cover the cost of the Digest subscription.

There was a discussion about the courtesy card and I passed out a letter from Donnie Roberts explaining it. For those of you not in attendance I have enclosed a copy of that letter. To summarize the discussion, each club is allowed a card for complimentary pitchers. They are allowed 14 complimentary pitchers a year. This pitcher can only pitch one time in a lifetime free. Should they want to pitch again they must join the NHPA. Courtesy card pitchers are covered under our insurance but cannot win a patch.

The insurance program was broought up and many felt it had saved horseshoes for their state. The parks and recreation people would not let them pitch without insurance. Most in attendance understood the program. Any questions they had were already answered by Dave or Kathy Loucks.

I told those in attendance I would not be seeking the office of 5th VP next term. I will only fill the remaining months of Gene's term in office. I pointed out to those wishing to run for the 5th VP position, your commitment should be sent to the Digest a minimum of three months prior to the World Tournament in Spearfish. The deadline for the Digest is the 10th of the month prior to the month it is to be published. I hope there are 45 of you wishing to run for this office. It is one of the most important positions in the NHPA Council. I will assist anyone wishing to run in any way I can.

I have enclosed for your information the results of the voting on the constitution and bylaws changes voted on at the convention.

The meeting was adjourned.

In Memoriam

Horace (Bert) Snart, Daupin, Manitoba, Canada, passed away suddenly in Daupin on Sunday, April 10, 1988, at 76 years of age. Bert was inducted into the NHPA Hall of Fame at Levittown, Pennsylvania, in 1976. He was inducted into the Manitoba Horseshoe Hall of Fame in 1979 and in 1983 was inducted into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame. He received the Queen's Silver Jubilee Medal on the 25th anniversary of Queen Elizabeth's coronation. He was also the recipient of other local honors and awards throughout his active career.

The Bert Snart Trophy, donated to the Canadian Horseshoe Pitching Association by the Daupin Horseshoe Club in 1970, is awarded annually to the Canadian men's singles champion.

He gave freely of his skill and interest to community projects. Bert will be remembered as a kind, gentle and modest man, and will be missed by many, especially his family.

The sympathy of Horseshoe Canada, Manitoba HPA and the NHPA is extended to his wife Doreen, and all members of his family.

GENE AND OPAL RENO, DAVID CLAYTON WIN ARKANSAS STATE TITLES—BERRY-MELSON DOUBLES—1-88-027

The Arkansas State Tournament was held Labor Day weekend, Sept. 3-5, at the new 19 court facility in the Rock Creek Recreation Area in West Fork, south of Fayetteville. A special thanks goes to David Ray for making the grounds available and to the NW Ark. League, who has worked so diligently the past two years to complete the facility in time for the 1988 State Tournament.

The Park Inn in Fayetteville provided a conference room, without charge, for the AHPA annual meeting. A plaque was presented to Carol Elliott in memory and appreciation of her husband "Doc" Elliot. "Doc" was elected Vice President of the AHPA for 1988 and passed away suddenly July 1.

The AHPA adopted its Constitution and By-Laws, thanks to the endless research and effort of Len Trowbridge, Ira Scott, Bill McKay and Della Matheny.

Organized horseshoes are relatively new in Arkansas compared to other states. The first State Horseshoe Tournament was held in Hot Springs City Park in 1981, with 16 pitchers, but no sanction. Ira Scott won the title of Champion. Bill Webb is the "Daddy of Horseshoes" in Hot Springs, and after the tournament Bill and Ira decided they would like to organize a State Association. With the necessary instructions from Donnie Roberts, the association was started with 12 members with Bill Webb as President and Ira Scott, Secretary. Ira Scott served as state secretary until 1987, when he was elected President. The association only had three officers until 1988 when it elected four Vice Presidents. The membership in the Association has now reached 123, so four V.P.s were elected to the council. In 1982 the State Tournament consisted of 50 shoe games, and Floyd Toole, member of NHPA Hall of Fame served a judge.

Hot Springs was the only league in the state with enough courts to host a State Tournament until 1986 when Ozark constructed 10 courts. In 1987 and 1988 the Hiway 27 League in Story, under the leadership of Bill McKay built a 16 court facility, with 8 more being completed. There will be some tough bidding to host the 1989 State Tournament.

Opal Reno of Elkins has been Women's State Champion in Arkansas since 1983. James Melson of Altus was Men's Champion in 1982 and '83; Ira Scott regained the title in 1984; Archie Matheny was Champion in 1985 and 1986; Jim Derry of Hope earned the title in 1987. In 1988 Gene Reno of Elkins went undefeated in 10 games to win the State Championship Title. Gene joins Opal as being Arkansas State Champion in 1988. We are proud to have the Renos in Arkansas.

There were 77 entries in the 1988 State Tournament. Arkansas was represented at the Original Regionals in Ponca City with six AHPA members. We may be new and few in number, but we're making progress.

A KINDER, GENTLER NATION OF HORSESHOE PITCHERS

They were shipped to him along with a lot of horseshoe literature and a Digest subscription so that he could stay up to date on our sport.

From that time on we received an occasional contact and more recently his press secretary and others have called frequently. Horseshoe pitching is the number one hobby for George Bush. He pitches every chance he gets and is a keen competitor. Word is that he beats everyone in Washington.

At the Ohio State Fair in August of 1988 during the Governor's Invitational Tournament, George Bush and Dan Quayle came to the horseshoe tournament. It was a specific effort to be at the horseshoe event on their part. Both gentlemen pitched for about 30 minutes, greeted everyone, and were delighted to see a set of official horseshoe courts. After both men pitched some shoes, Donnie Roberts presented Bush and Quayle with a pair of Ohio horseshoes on behalf of the Ohio Buckeye State Horseshoe Pitchers Association and a NHPA membership compliments of the Ohio Association.

After the pitching, Mr. & Mrs. Bush and Mr. & Mrs. Quayle retired to a trailer set up for them to rest and have a coke. At this point, the Secret Service told Earl Vansant and myself that the Vice-President needed to talk with us. At his trailer, we were both presented with a Vice-Presidential shirt and had a long conversation about horseshoe. During this conversation, Mr. Bush restated what Barbara Bush had already indicated, plans were in the works to construct an official horseshoe court on the Whitehouse lawn. I am to work with Don Rhodes to plan this construction.

After the rest, Mr. Bush held a news conference, with all major media present. I'm sure all of you saw it on network news with horseshoe in the background.

This story about the activity of George Bush as relates to horseshoe has been kept short. I just wanted to briefly update people on what is happening. Now that George Bush has been elected President, it will appear that we will have a few years with the chance to see our sport get some notice. I feel certain that you remember the impact Dwight Eisenhower had on golf and the similar impact that the Kennedy brothers had on touch football.

My tentative goals for our sport as relates to Mr. Bush are to facilitate the court at the Whitehouse, to try to arrange for our world champions to be honored at the Whitehouse as is done in other sports, to see if it is possible to get a horseshoe pitcher on the President's Council for Physical Fitness, and to work with Mr. Rhodes to arrange a few visits of our top pitchers to the Bush home in Washington, D.C.

There is absolutely no effort to get involved in politics, just an effort to promote our sport.

Needless to say, there will be a constant effort to get Mr. Bush in his new position as President to attend our World Tournament or even come to play. We have classes for 25% pitchers as you know.

RESUME OF 1988 WORLD TOURNAMENT

Three former World Champions, Walter Ray Williams, Jr., Mark Seibold and Jim Knisley, battled down to the wire before Knisley defeated Seibold, 40-38, in a playoff to capture the 1988 World Championship at Pleasanton, California, August 1 through 12. The winner's share was \$3200 of the \$60,000 prize fund.

Jesse Gonzales from Los Osos, California, and Seibold, Huntington, Indiana, put the crimp in Williams' chances when they took turns dropping Walter Ray in the final two games.

After losing to Williams in the third from the last encounter, Knisley collected his winning wares to drop Seibold and Gonzales to force the one game playoff. Seibold, who had led the tournament going into the final five games, took an early lead in the playoff and held a seemingly comfortable 32-16 advantage midway through the fracas.

However, the cool Bremen, Ohio, veteran was not to be denied. He scored 15 consecutive points to climb within a point, and took the lead on a three-ringers-three call before Seibold recovered to regain the lead, 35-34. The two gladiators exchanged three pointers and the score settled at 38-37 with Seibold holding the advantage. Mark left a single opening on his final two shoes and Knisley calmly tossed a double to win his second World Championship in five years.

Midway in the tournament, Alan Francis, a four-time junior champion who competed in the Men's World Championship for the second year, was a giant killer and helped to determine the eventual winner. Francis from Blythedale, Missouri, defeated Knisley, 40-15, Williams, 41-32, and Seibold, 42-34, which is the modern day record for consecutive victories over the top three leaders in the tournament.

Williams led the percentage parade for the 31-game round robin play with an 80.2 mark. The Champion was 79.9 and Seibold closed with 78.8. Fourth place went to Erie, Pennsylvania's Steve Kuchcinski; Francis was fifth; defending champion Dale Lipovsky, Bloomington, Minnesota, was sixth; followed by Richard Pintor, Colorado; Art Tyson, New York; Gonzales and John Kapnis from Salem, Massachusetts. The surprise finisher this year was Colorado's Rich Pintor, who in his first Championship appearance, finished seventh.

Total participation in the 67th World Tournament was 839, including 639 men, 129 women, 42 boys and 29 girls.

Dianne Lopez Women's Winner—The old adage "If at first you don't succeed, try, try again" does not apply to Diane Lopez of Lampoc, California. She won the 1988 Women's World Championship on her first try.

Breezing through nine straight opponents the first two days, including defending Champion Sandy McLachlin from Canada, 42-32, the hard throwing "flipper" star dropped her one and only game to 10-time World Champion Vicki Winston from LaMonte, Missouri, 41-24, in the tenth. She then proceeded to take five straight in convincing fashion from Canada's Myrna Kissick, Indiana's Sue Snyder, former champion Phyllis Negaard from Minnesota, California's Sharon Paddock and last year's runner-up Diane Cantin from Canada.

Lopez finished with a 14-1 record in the 16-person field, closing with an 83.4 percentage. McLachlin's 85% was high for the group. Last year the 17-year old McLachlin fired a World record 88.2. The latter's two defeats came at the hands of five-time World Champion Ruth Hagen, who at 72 years old, still has that touch, and from the 1988 Champion Diane Lopez.

Over 80% performances came from two other competitors: Sharon Paddock 81.7 and Cantin 80.2. Lopez earned \$2400 first place prize money.

Debby Bestul Wins Again—Seventeen-year old Debby Bestul from Eau Claire, Wisconsin, won her fourth Junior Girls World Championship in five tries besting Canada's Alana Johnson, 41-32 in a playoff. Debby and Alana finished 5-1 after the finals round robin play.

Debby finished with a 58.5 percentage. She was 42.5 in 1984, 63.8 in 1985, and 65.1 last year. Two years ago she lost the title to McLachlin, the defending women's champion last year.

Steinfeldt Wins Seniors—Former World Champion Carl Steinfeldt of Rochester, New York, became the first NHPA participant to win titles in three classifications when he captured the

men's Seniors crown. He defeated defending champion Ray Hill of Michigan in the final game to go undefeated with a 11-9 record.

Steinfeldt won the World's Men's Championship in 1976 at Bristol Pennsylvania and followed in 1978 with the Intermediate crown before returning to Championship play until this year. His 11-game percentage in 1988 was 74.1.

Titcomb Intermediate Winner—Don Titcomb of San Jose, California, went undefeated to win the men's intermediate title, closing with 76.6 percent. A former World Champion who won the top title in 1960, in the days of Ted Allen, Fernando Isais and company, competed out of the Championship division for the first time since he started his career many years ago.

Titcomb had a commitment at the Santa Clara County Fair in San Jose which made it impossible to pitch with the "big boys." He performed on the stage at the fair three times daily at 1:30, 4:30 and 6:30 with trick horseshoe pitching and discussing horseshoe pitching with anyone after the show. He is the Ambassador of Horseshoes in the San Jose area.

Neeb Junior Boys Champion—Edward Neeb became the third Canadian boy to win the World's title when he completed the 12-man field with a 11-0 record and 80.7 average percentage after several tries in the championship group.

Steve Hohl, with a famous last name, won the 1978 title, and for seven years it was Mark Dyson and Alan Francis taking charge before Tony Hankins of Kentucky and Kipp Barody from New York took over the last two years.

Neeb was not pressed during the competition and finished three games in front of Steven Barnes of Missouri, Jim Walters, Ohio, and Doug Macha from Texas.

Other winners in some of the major championships were Jeff Williams, San Jose, California, in Men's Class A; Francis White, Erie, Pennsylvania, in 70-Plus Elders 40 feet; Herb Rushing, Grass Valley, California, in 70-Plus Elders 30 feet; Edi Holland, Dayton, Minnesota, in Women's Class A; Ben Fields, Honolulu, Hawaii, in Intermediates Class A; Floyd Voyce of Mesa, Arizona, in Seniors Class A; Julie Walters, Troy, Ohio, in Girls Class A; and James Ornelas, California, in Boys Class A.

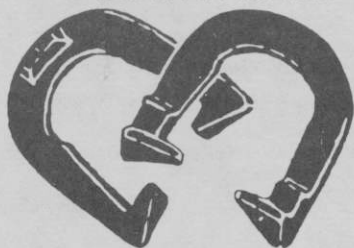

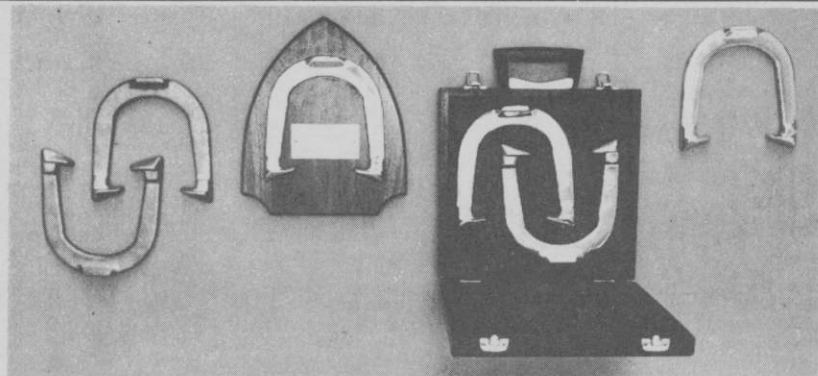

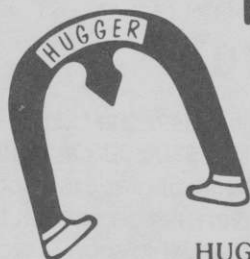

The great state of Tennessee is well known in horseshoe circles. They have had an active association for many, many years. Dexter Stallings, who is an NHPA Regional Director has been secretary of that association for some 25 years.

Marvin Bastian, President of the Tennessee Association, contacted me several months ago and asked if I could attend the Tennessee Hall of Fame Banquet and be the guest speaker. I accepted.

The weekend of October 17 and 18 I traveled to Cleveland, Tennessee. It was a 600 mile trip one way. On Saturday, we pitched horseshoe on the T. R. Little Memorial Courts. In Tennessee, you pitch on Saturday based on your average. Then, on Sunday, you pitch in a class based on your pitching the day before. I pitched on Saturday but couldn't stay for the Sunday pitching.

We had a very fine meal on Saturday at the courts. It was catered and very nice. The pitching was good but we had some rain. (Smile)

Saturday evening, at the Holiday Inn, we had a fantastic Hall of Fame ceremony for 16 very deserving Tennessee Horseshoe people. Over the years 16 people had earned this great honor. More than 50 people were in attendance, with Marvin Bastian as the Master of Ceremonies.

Inducted were: Jim Adkerson, Bill Arms, James Burns, James Davis, Charles Fortenberry, O. D. Lebow, George Lewis, T. R. Little, Carl Montgomery, J. Miff Nave, Roger Norwood, Ben Raskopf, Dexter Stallings, John Walker, Don Ward, and Grady Whaley.

The hospitality extended by Marvin Bastian, the other Tennessee officers and the members of the Association was really great. It was just a tremendous trip.

In East Tennessee, they grow Muscadine grapes. These don't grow in Ohio and were the first I had ever seen. They are very large, sweet, and have very thick skins. Thanks to the folks

in the Cleveland area, I now have several jars of Muscadine Grape Preserves on my fruit shelf.

While at the Hall of Fame Banquet, I had a chance to talk with Nick Nave. He is the son of J. Miff Nave. Nick presented me with a scoresheet dated 1934 in which J. Miff Nave completed against Carmen Cole. It was an official NHPA scoresheet which didn't look much like ours now. In that game J. Miff tossed 113 ringers out of 116 shoes for 97.4% and Carmen hit 95 ringers out of 116 shoes for 81.9%. J. Miff had 26 doubles in a row in one stretch. The most significant item on this August 14, 1934 scoresheet was that the score was 51-0. I doubt there have been too many games where 81.9 was shut-out.

A. TYSON REGAINS NEW YORK STATE CHAMPIONSHIP—RUTH HANGEN WINS LADIES—JOE WINNE, JRS.—SAN 18-88-013

Art Tyson of Mount Vernon swept through 15 games without defeat, averaging 80 percent ringers, to capture his fourth New York State men's horseshoe pitching championship over Labor Day weekend.

Allowing 30 points or more to just two of his opponents in the men's championship fight, Tyson, 49, regained the title he had won previously in 1977, 1980 and 1982. Only four-time champion Mike DiMartino of Churchville (41-30) and Clair Rigby of Webster (40-34) came within 10 points of Tyson in the round-robin competition.

It was only Tyson's fourth game of New York's 58th annual, two-day tournament, held at the Camden Horseshoe Club courts. But Tyson finally caught Rigby at 30-29 and finished the game with 78.1 percent. Tyson's overall tournament percentage of 80.6 was helped by an 89.2 game against Lou Stines of Glendale, which Tyson won, 40-3, and an 88.2 game against Bob Hayes of Franklinville, which Tyson won, 40-2.

"I've been close for a lot of years," said Tyson, who finished fourth in the World Tournament in Pleasanton, Calif., in August and won the Eastern National tournament in Erie, Pa., in early summer. "Second . . . third . . . fourth. I'm always hanging in there but haven't been able to put a cap on it. This year I've been working especially hard on my concentration, keeping my mind on my game only and not worrying about somebody else."

He had little to worry about all weekend, even with DiMartino, who pitched an 83.3 game against him but could manage no more than 30 points because Tyson fired 87.7. The game went 90 shoes. Tyson still needed a victory in his last game, with John Bogardus of Fort Edward, to avoid a tie with DiMartino and a playoff. He nailed it down with a 42-20 victory despite Bogardus' 81.1 percent game.

DiMartino finished 14-1 for second place and defending champion Jim Lewis of Hudson Falls was third at 13.2.

In the women's division, Ruth Hangen of Getzville added to her already impressive record by capturing her 14th state title (and third straight) with a 7-0 record and 72.2 percentage. Traci Hastings of Rome was second (5-2-65.2). Her sister, Terri Wartens of Camden, won the junior girls division (4-1-20.5).

Defending champion Jon Winne of Glens Falls had little trouble in junior boys, going 6-0 with 77.3 percent ringers. Total entries were 255, down from 279 the previous year.

State association members accepted a bid from the Canton Horseshoe Club to host the state tournament in 1989. CURT DAY . . . By GLEN PORTT

I have always realized that Curt Day was a great horseshoe pitcher. I also realized that I really didn't know too much about him . . . so I decided to find out. In almost any gathering of the addicted, where our really great ones . . . our legends . . . are discussed, you will hear the names of Ted Allen, Elmer Hohl, Fernando Isais, and Carl Steinfeldt banded about . . . but seldom, if ever, do you hear the name of Curt Day. I wondered why.

After looking at a few statistics, I decided that if a completely unbiased statistician would analyze the records, a case could be made *that maybe Curt Day was the best of them all*. I can hear you say, "No way. Certainly you are not saying that Day ranks on a par with Hohl, Allen, Isais, and Steinfeldt?"

"That's exactly what I'm saying."

"How can you possibly say that?"

"Because the records reflect it. Let's take a look. All four players pitched more W.T. games than Curt's 574 . . . *but Curt had the second highest winning percentage of all time . . . 86.23%*. Isais's 88.11 was first, Hohl's 84.33 third, Allen's 77.95 fourth, and Steinfeldt's 77.74 fifth."

"O.K. That's a good point. What else?"

"Well, if I asked you which of the five had the best *ringer percentage* for the 100's of W.T. games each played, who would you pick?"

"Elmer Hohl."

"It's possible you may be right. It is so close that a complete search of the records would have to be made in order to say absolutely that it was *not* Elmer . . . but as the records stand today, Elmer was second with 82.28% vs. Curt's 82.48%."

"O.K. Another point. But does that make him greater than Elmer?"

"Definitely not. Both men and enough times at bat so that a comparison can be made. However, Elmer pitched 205 more games so his 82.28% for 779 games is a record. Curt's 82.48% for 574 games is also a record."

"How about World Tournament titles? I don't remember Curt winning too many."

"We all know that Allen with 10 is th leader . . . and tha record won't be broken for a few years. Isais with 8 and Hohl with 6 are next. Then Curt with 3. (Records before 1933 and after 1977 not considered.) In those 3 W.T.s, he averaged 86.2, 84.9, and 81.8. *He won 93 out of 98 games for a winning percentage of 94.89*. I believe these figures put him right up there with the best. What do you think?"

"I agree. Anything else?"

"Yes. After realizing that Curt had not received the credit due him over the years as one of our greatest . . . I wanted to find out more . . . so I interviewed him . . . asked him a lot of questions . . . and recorded the answers."

"What kind of questions?"

Here are a few . . . "Curt, you threw a 3/4 reverse. Did you ever throw any other turn?"

"I have always thrown a 3/4 reverse."

"No man has ever won a W.T. with a *regular* 3/4 turn. Theory is that too many ringers are lost with this type turn. You apparently did not loose too many with your reverse 3/4. Why would a reverse turn stay on better than a regular 3/4 turn?"

"I threw a hard shoe but it landed soft. I practiced throwing so it would *hook the stake* . . . and I pitched from the right side. I seemed to have better alignment from the cross fire position. When I pitched from the left side, the shoe went on more perfect . . . but I would lose more ringers."

"In 1984, *Sports Illustrated* started an article on horseshoes with a 2-page spread . . . showing a big red barn, and you, wearing bib overalls, posing in knee high grass. The author started the article with . . . '*by and large the game of horseshoes remains what it was. The stakes are out there behind the barn. . .*' This drew lots of criticism . . . and many thought it set horseshoes back 20 years . . . because it gave to a million readers a *very false picture* of what the sport is today. Did you ever wear overalls like that when you pitched in a tournament? Were you paid for posing as the producer wanted?"

"I received no pay. I have pitched in overalls . . . but *never* in a tournament. It happened like this. I received a call from Donnie stating a 'Jackie' was flying in to take some pictures. Jackie did take a lot of pictures. I didn't know which ones would be used. I should have asked for more information."

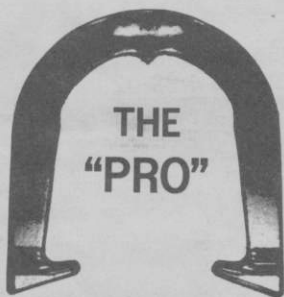
