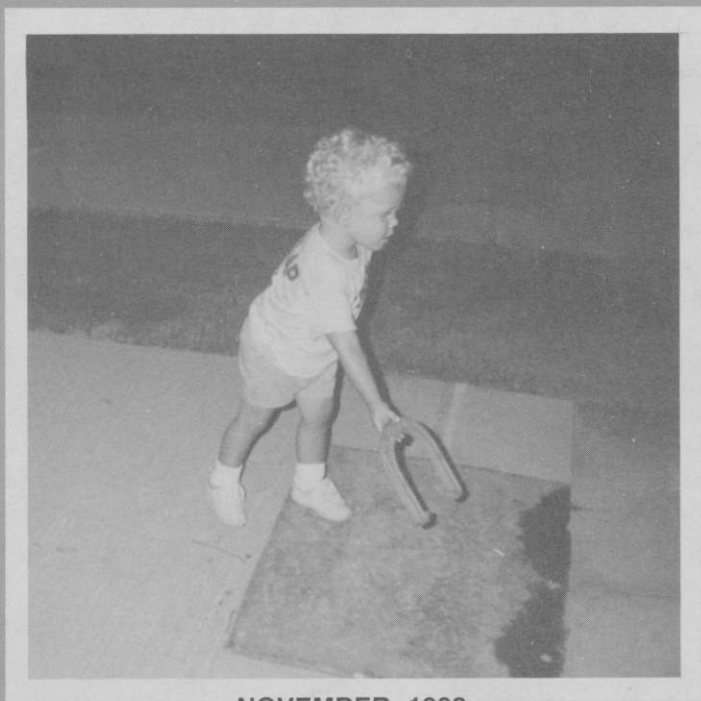

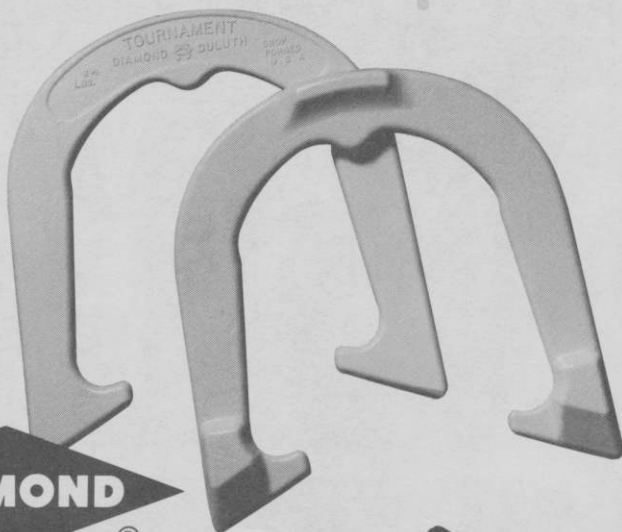

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT . . . DAVE LOUCKS

Last month in this column, I wrote about some significant changes to our Constitution and By-Laws. One of them, the need to have played in three NHPA sanctioned tournaments in the prior year to enter the World Tournament, brought a few hostile letters. Seems as though a few pitchers think this is an unfair requirement.

The letters, less than a half dozen, all came from pitchers in extreme Northern States where the pitching season is short and prior support of NHPA sanctioned tournaments has been almost non-existent. Some of the complaints were in behalf of pitchers who aren't NHPA members and don't want to sanction even their State Championship. But, since the 1989 World Tournament is going to be close by, they now want the right to pitch in it without prior qualifications.

I discussed the subject with the Spearfish directors and NHPA members in Minnesota where short seasons and limited sanctioned tournaments prevail. Both strongly supported the requirement of 3 prior sanctioned events and said that special tournaments would be scheduled to give pitchers the opportunity to meet the minimum requirements. Other States could take the same action as well.

While the proposed 3 tournament requirement was first published in the May Digest, several states saw the likelihood of the passing and took steps to have more NHPA sanctioned tournaments in 1988. For those who may still find this a difficult requirement to meet, the NHPA Executive Council has agreed to allow a slightly modified version. We will allow for 1989 at least, an average obtained in NHPA Sanctioned League play to count as one of the three tournaments.

DAVE'S COURT REPORT

It's not too soon to begin making your arrangements for the 1989 World Tournament in Spearfish. I recently had the opportunity to visit and view the facilities and spent some time talking with the local business leaders. The community appears excited about the event and several motels have already taken bookings, a year in advance. The 50 RV sites adjoining the courts in the city campground are all reserved. There are other campgrounds available in the immediate area. These and a map of Spearfish showing the location of motels are reproduced elsewhere in this Digest. There is also a list of the motels with addresses and phone numbers. An updated list of motel rates are being gathered by the Chamber of Commerce and will be published soon. The host is recommending the Holiday Inn of the Northern Black Hills which will be the site of the Banquet and Convention. They are holding a limited number of interior poolside rooms for pitchers at a reduced rate of \$58.00 per night for 1-4 people. Reservations must be made by 5/31/89.

Don't forget the 6th annual Las Vegas Hacienda Hotel Tournament. Registrations will be taken through Monday, November 28th. Play will start on Tuesday morning the 29th and run through Friday, December 2. The Hacienda has purchased a new artificial pitching surface which holds the shoe much better than the old. Prize money will be \$2360 in each 36 person class with \$500 for first place. Remember, this is a handicap event where everybody should come with the expectation of having fun.

REPORT OF 1988 STATE OFFICERS MEETING

The 1988 meeting of State Officers was called to order at 1:00 P.M. on Saturday, August 6 at the World Tournament site in Pleasanton, California. There were persons present representing 14 states. President Loucks joined us midway during the meeting.

The chair explained why it had been necessary to replace Jim Acock, of Missouri, who had been chairman of these annual meetings for many years.

As is suggested each year, there is a desire to set up a uniform system for determining pitching averages. However, no system meets with unanimous approval. At such time as the NHPA is prepared to receive all sanctioned tournament results and enter them on a computer, the World Tournament director would then have the statistics at his or her fingertips and would be able to place all contestants by a predetermined method. Until such time, it appears the chaos of unsubstantiated averages will continue to be a major conversation piece at each World Tournament.

The chair pointed out that she had personally made inquiries concerning the requirement of reporting one's "last 3 events" on the World Tournament entry blank. She was told that this was done at the request of a majority of state officers. This was deemed the method that would please the most people. By the discussion that followed, it was very apparent that various states continue to "do their own thing" and the wording on a World Tournament entry blank is largely ignored. Perhaps this is one reason we continue to have complaints about incorrect entering averages each year.

It was asked if perhaps there could be less time made available for entering the World Tournament. Some entries come in during January and February, while a large part come in during May. If limited to a couple of months, it might help clear up the problem with averages. Then again, it might not.

A question was asked about the "courtesy card" program. It was clear that much misunderstanding exists. Mary Van Sant distributed copies of a paragraph of explanation, but this did not answer all questions. A suggestion was made that Glenn Portt, as author of the program, pool ideas with Dave Loucks and Donnie Roberts and that the three come up with a printed page of exact guidelines concerning the program. One secretary reported asking the same question of all three men listed above and receiving three different answers. Some feel 14 guests a year per club are way too many. Some would rather not use the program at all. Others are using it, but maybe in ways other than intended by the originator. The insurance aspect of the guest card was cleared up by President Loucks when he stated that guests at sanctioned events would be covered.

Someone asked, "What is a sanctioned tournament?" The chair replied that it is a tournament where the participants are required to have NHPA cards and are required to use NHPA approved equipment. The person asked if Classes A and B could be sanctioned and not the lower classes. They were told that this was not supposed to happen. It was the feeling of this individual that there were sanctioned tournaments being conducted in this fashion, including the Ohio State Tournament. It was felt that the NHPA should investigate such claims and if these situations were found to exist, the sanctions for such tournaments should be withdrawn.

A person from a state having problems signing full NHPA members asked how other states got people to buy a full combined state and national card. He was told that a separate state membership should have been abolished years ago.

New state or charter secretaries feel that there should be printed information outlining duties, explaining report forms, explaining the procedure for handling an out of state pitcher who shows up at a sanctioned tournament without a card, explaining the courtesy card program, etc. Regional directors have guidelines in printed form but charter secretaries do not. Information not obtained from a previous secretary becomes something the new secretary must stumble onto accidentally.

A suggestion was made that rule pamphlets be made available to distribute with each membership card sold in 1989. Some states report they are already accomplishing this each year by printing their own material.

The NHPA insurance program was explained by President Loucks. There were questions and some discussion and President Loucks volunteered to remain after the meeting to answer questions that some persons might have. The NHPA insurance program has met with resounding approval from all but two or three small areas.

Making the Digest and NHPA card a mandatory combination was suggested, as it is every year. This is another issue that will never receive unanimous approval. It did lead to a lively discussion concerning the magazine itself and a show of hands was unanimous that the magazine needs changing in its size, content and circulation department. Complaints of new and old subscribers not receiving issues are overwhelming.

It is being the consensus of those present that we had gone on long enough, the meeting was adjourned.

THANKSGIVING IS A TIME FOR THANKS

The most prolific writer in the world (and the oldest) must be a man named 'Anonymous.' Millions of sayings, verses, essays, stories, etc., have been authored by him. A few years ago I ran across one of his writings that made an indelible impression upon me. He wrote:

"I have drunk from wells I did not dig,
I have been warmed by fires I did not build."

I have thought about these words many times . . . how true they are . . . how they apply to everyday life . . . to every living person . . . even to our game of horseshoes . . . because we have all benefitted and should be thankful to those men who long ago made it possible for us to drink from those wells and be warmed by the fires they started. *They made our game what it is today.*

I'm thankful for people like Putt Mossman who led the fight to get hooks on caulks legalized . . . to Lee Davis who campaigned for years to eliminate the 200 shoe qualifying round . . . to Wisconsin's Ed Yankowski who designed our NHPA logo which we proudly display . . . and especially to those very early pioneers who decided that *two inch* stakes were just not high enough . . . so changed them to 8, then 12, and finally in 1968 to the present official height of 14-15 inches.

I'm thankful that cities are still bidding against each other for the World Tournament. I don't know just how far back this started . . . or whose idea it was originally . . . but it was long before 1980 as one magazine writer for Sports Illustrated would have us believe. As early as 1948, Salt Lake City (Murray, UT) with a bid of \$8000 . . . and a new car won out over Indianapolis and Port Huron, Michigan. This was probably the first \$10,000 world tournament . . . which would equate to \$70,000 in today's world.

I'm thankful for people like Don Titcomp who has promoted horseshoes for years . . . and is still doing it. For Ted Allen and his many, many contributions . . . to Jimmy Risk who gave 80 exhibitions in 29 days as a USO entertainer in WWII . . . who also served his country as a soldier . . . and who pitched with Harry Truman on the White House lawn.

There are hundreds more who could and should be mentioned. *They all played a part.* Yes, I have drunk from wells I did not dig, I have been warmed by fires I did not build. Haven't you?

EARL WINSTON—NEW HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

Earl was born in 1927 and resides with his wife, Vicki, and son, Carl, on a farm in rural LaMonte, Missouri, less than one mile from his birthplace. An older son, Keith, is attending college. The Winstons raise hay, grain and black angus cattle.

Earl inherited a love for the sport of horseshoes from his father and grandfather. His father attended many World Tournaments and at one time held some records in the Intermediate class. Earl attended his first World Tournament in Murray, Utah in 1951 and has not missed one since. He played in the Championship class in 1952, 1953, 1954, 1959, 1960, 1961, 1962, 1963, and 1986. He averaged over 70% in three of those events and has many other sanctioned tournaments in the 70-79% range. His highest achievement ever was in the 1963 Tournament of Champions in Springfield, Missouri. He averaged 80.1% for the tournament and defeated Floyd Toole with 82.6% in 128 shoes to win the event. He was also Missouri state champ in 1955. In 1978, Earl pitched a perfect game of 24 shoes. It was the second perfect game in Missouri history. Throughout the years, Earl's dedication in terms of organization and promotion limited him from performing at his best. He served for almost 30 years as Missouri State President and still serves as Superintendent of Horseshoe Pitching at the Missouri State Fair. An increase in his farm duties and community affairs in recent years has left him with virtually no time to practice his favorite sport.

Earl has found many ways to serve the NHPA. Several times, when he did not make the Championship group at the World Tournament, Earl served as the official judge, covering all the courts by himself. Many pitchers have acclaimed him as the best judge to ever set foot on the courts. He was also an early Regional Director for the NHPA and has served on the Hall of Fame Committee for many years. Earl is interested in our NHPA history and statistics and helped Gary Kline in gathering material for his book. He has helped in updating NHPA records.

In 1972, Earl was elected to his first term as an NHPA Vice President. He is still serving in that capacity today. He has represented the NHPA in meetings with the AAU and traveled thousands of miles to help us out in times of turmoil. In 1976, Earl and Walter Ray Williams Sr. were instrumental in seeing that the NHPA had legal representation when the World Tournament was threatened with an injunction by neighbors of the Tournament site. The judge found in favor of the NHPA and the Tournament went on as scheduled. In 1978, the city officials of Des Moines tried to renege on their agreement to host the World Tournament. Earl drove up there and met with everyone involved and was able to secure an agreement that the event would go on as scheduled. In 1985, disaster struck again as Springfield, Missouri backed out

of its commitments. Lafayette, Indiana stepped in to host the 1985 World Tournament and Earl made several trips to Ainsworth, Nebraska to secure a site and sign contracts for the 1986 World Tournament.

More could be said about Earl, but it is hardly necessary. He is always ready to work and do what needs to be done. His attendance at 38 consecutive World Tournaments is testimony enough of his dedication to the NHPA. We congratulate him as he joins his wife, Vicki, father-in-law, Cletus Chapelle, and the other honored members of the NHPA Hall of Fame.

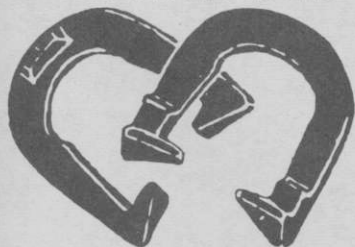

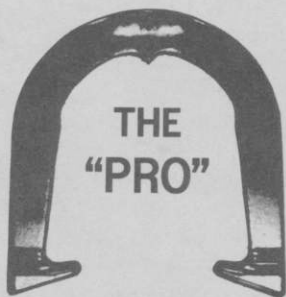
