



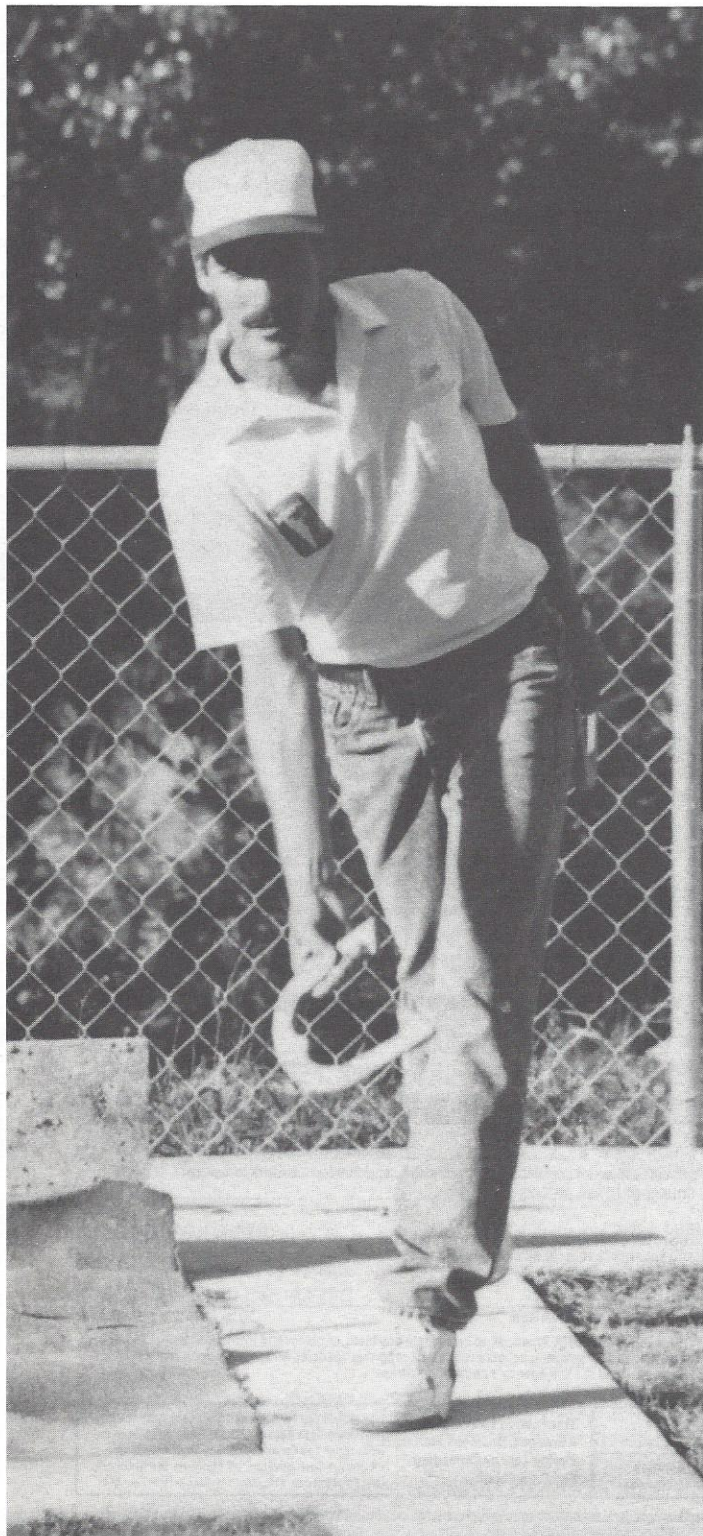

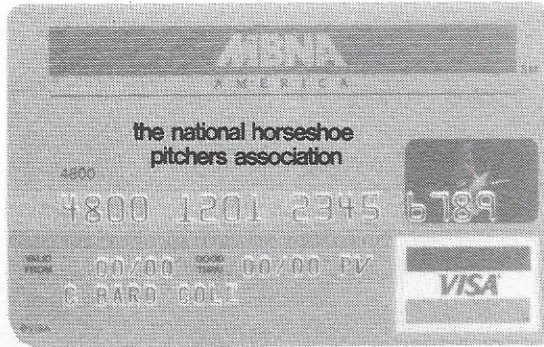

President's Message

Spearfish, South Dakota, site of the 1989 World Tournament, was the host again this year. The tournament hadn't been fully outdoors without cover since our last visit. While Alan Francis repeated his 1989 victory, the weather was not as good as it was four years ago, turning ugly on a couple of occasions and having a definite effect on some of the pitching.

With the 1995 World being awarded to Perry, Georgia, who will provide an indoor facility and next year in Syracuse also being indoors, it would seem that the delegates are sending a message. In 1987 we went indoors in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. Starting with that year and counting through to 1995, 7 of 9 World Tournaments will have been played under roof, 4 of the last 5 completely indoors. While that may be good for the game, people are beginning to question the geographics.

By the time the 1995 tournament is completed, 5 of the 6 Worlds since 1990 will have been held at locations east of the Mississippi River. If you include the decade of the 1980s, 11 of 16 World Tournaments will have been at eastern sites with only about 45% of NHPA membership living there. The eastern sites are to be commended for their constant bidding interest and in recent years, the ability to offer a roofed or indoor facility. However, let's continue to encourage sites in the West, Mid-West and even Canada to bid. Since 58% of entrants use the World as their primary vacation and enjoy traveling in different directions, we should try to move the event to a different geographical area more often to maintain the interest and gain participation from a broader base of the membership.

Say, did you happen to read the sports section of the

August 3rd issue of *USA Today*? While winners of the Championship finals received mention in the "Update" column, writer Taylor Buckley did his "Commentary" article on the World Tournament. You had to read it a couple of times to determine if Buckley was bashing horseshoe pitching or, in his way, giving us some praise. Titled, "These pitchers play for pure love of their sport," Buckley said things like, "In the U.S. frame of reference, this cannot be a sport. No large people or objects collide. Golf galleries are noisier around the putting green than these spectators. Monotony on this scale is rarely duplicated outside a United Nations debate. Players are shod in K-Mart basics and if anyone has spent more than \$100 on equipment, he or she is crazy. Fingers or ankles are taped with duct tape, right out of Ace Hardware. These people couldn't attract lightning with their steel shoes on their heads."

Now, these comments which were sprinkled around the article at first reading may sound demeaning. Perhaps purposely so because Buckley, like so many other media people, was merely writing about his observations. He was giving an indication of why it is difficult for us to gain a degree of recognition in the field of sports, why we are not a spectator sport and why we have trouble attracting sponsors. On the other hand, Buckley went on to say that, "This can't be a sport. It's far too civilized. There is too much camaraderie. Is being a world champion that no one recognizes that important? No, it's only important that skill, grit and suppressed joy are readily available to be witnessed and shared...not so much by the world but by those who really matter." I think Taylor Buckley liked what he saw.

Convention Highlights

The meeting of delegates was held on Monday, July 26 at the Holiday Inn. Thirty seven (37) Charters plus Canada seated delegates representing 137 delegate votes. This represented 79% of the 173 maximum possible, more than enough for a quorum. Canada, while not an official NHPA charter, is allowed to vote on the playing rules and World Tournament site selection.

The revision of the Playing Rules was the 12th and near last item on the agenda of the meeting. The first 11 items, including 1995 World Bid presentations and election of officers, were dealt with rather quickly. Perry, Georgia won out over Blue Springs, Missouri for the right to host the '95 World while three incumbents, Winston, Born and Loucks were returned to office. Dick Hansen of Wisconsin was elected to the 5th VP position. Getting to the proposed Rules Revision by 11 a.m., an hour before the lunch break and two hours before expected, gave everyone a lift and reason to believe things would be over well in time for the first round of Championship Finals scheduled for 5:30 that evening. But, that was not to be the case.

Working our way through the rules revision, much the same way as we did with the bylaws last year, section by

section, paragraph by paragraph, many questions were raised. Each one was addressed separately if opposition, questions or an amendment was put forth. Surprisingly, throughout the entire revision, questions about a single word, generally "must, should or shall" surfaced. It seemed that the delegation did not wish to use the word "shall" in areas where no penalty was specified for failure to do so.

As the afternoon grew long, it was realized that the meeting would push the scheduled 5:30 pitching time. Looking out the windows eased the sense of alarm because it was raining, heavily. So the meeting went on to just a few minutes before 6 p.m. when the rains and the meeting adjourned. Voting on the rules had been completed with all delegates still seated approving the revision and its amendments by a vote of 120-4.

Complete voting results, charter by charter, on the 1995 World site, election of officers and the rules revisions are printed in this issue.

As a matter of interest and notification, Walter Ray Williams Jr. was appointed to both the Hall of Fame and Rules Committee filling vacancies created by the resignation of former members.

The Charters of Arkansas and Northern New Mexico presented delegate lists but the representatives did not show to be seated. Alabama, Alaska, Connecticut, Florida, Hawaii, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Mississippi, New Hampshire, Southern New Mexico, Eastern Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Vermont and West Virginia did not submit a delegation list as required by NHPA Bylaws and thus were not represented at the convention.

Letters to the Editor

Dear Editor,

Now that the World Tournament is over, I have a few ideas and comments to share. I'd like to greatly thank all the people who worked so hard at the tournament to get everything done. However, I think it's grossly unfair that all entries pay the same fee, yet some get to pitch 40 some games while others only get to pitch 10 or 11.

I'd like to see the pre-lims eliminated. Everyone has to pitch in at least 3 NHPA events (league or tournaments) to qualify, so why not just use the average of the 3 highest to determine what class they pitch in. I'd like to see all classes in the men's and women's divisions at 24 with everyone playing 23 games and prize money and trophies going to the top 6 or 8. The championship classes could pay an extra \$50 to \$100 and have prize money for all and trophies for the first 6.

In elders, seniors and junior classes where the entry numbers are smaller, the classes could be smaller with a double round robin and prizes to the top 3 or 4 and prizes to all in the championship classes. Pacers should be used for dropouts. At any rate the same format should be used every year, so that we would know from year to year exactly how the tournament is going to be run.

Editor's Comment

As one of the seven World Tournament committee members, I feel qualified to comment on the above.

First, it takes 4 NHPA events pitched in the twelve months prior to qualify for entry. While this committee member agrees and would like to see all seeding based on NatStat averages, thus eliminating prelims, it may be awhile before this becomes a reality. Not all the pitchers in the Championship Prelims agree with this idea. Two other Championship group women have written me. One agrees with seeding the group, the other does not.

Second, the tournament format has been basically consistent for 3-4 years, at least for about 90% of the pitchers. Everyone below the Championship Classes has been pitching

at least two days, generally 11 games. We have been using double round robins in classes made smaller by greater percentage spreads or smaller entry numbers. Pacers are always used for dropouts unless several have dropped and it makes more sense to reform the groups.

Third, we have for years been using a basic formula of advancing 25% of open section players to a Class Finals, all of which receive cash and trophies. In the Championship groups, while all receive cash, the basic 25% receive a trophy. While some deviations are seen, we do our best to keep these to a minimum. A few years ago, when we tried straight round robin play in the classes, with no finals, there was a lot of support to return to finals, which we did. It is possible there would be less sentiment for class finals if everyone played more games as you suggest. However, more games in the Championship Finals has always been the practice. It is generally seen as an incentive and a bit of recognition of what the World Championship should emphasize—the best pitchers we can showcase.

Fourth, the suggestion to seed everyone into 24 person groups so all could pitch 23 games in four days would be liked by a big majority of the pitchers, I'm sure. But, such a format would cause a problem you probably haven't thought about. There is not enough time in two weeks to allow everyone 23 games of pitching. Based on this year's entry level of 1500, each pitching 23 games, it would require 17,250 games. On 42 courts, it would take 411 rounds to complete. With 24 rounds (4 shifts) a day plus time for awards being an optimum number, it would take 17.1 pitching days to finish the tournament. If we had more entries, like we did in Columbus or less courts as we may have in the future, it could take as long as 24 days to complete the tournament, twice as long as the currently allotted time.

In conclusion, eliminating championship prelims and class finals and allowing everyone to pitch and equal but greater number of games may have merit. However, we could do so only if the total games per person

were 15-17 while the courts remained at 42 and entries didn't exceed 1500. Now, if we limited entries and somehow found a 48-60 court facility, the 23 game proposal would work in a two week time frame.

Dear Editor,

As President of the Missouri Chapter, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who assisted us in Spearfish in making a bid for the 1995 World Tournament. We feel that we made some new friendships and want those involved to know how much we appreciate their taking the time to stop by and talk with us about the Blue Springs site. We thought we had a good chance of getting the bid until Georgia passed out the peaches at the meeting.

Kidding aside, there is a possibility of Missouri bidding again but not without the help and feedback of the membership.

We did not realize until after the vote the importance of on-site camping. We did not offer a shuttle service between the campgrounds and courts in our bid and wonder if that would have made a difference. We knew that inclement weather was a possibility and that outdoor courts would have to be covered. Our plans were to have large tents over the courts with open sides for ventilation. Like the shuttle issue, we wonder if this would have been acceptable to the majority of World pitchers.

I would very much like to hear from pitchers who attend the World and would one day like to see the tournament held in Missouri. With your comments, we can not only better prepare our bid, but help other sites who are thinking about a bid. By working together and hearing from you, we can all benefit.

Please take a few moments to send me your thoughts on what would have made the Missouri bid more attractive, but more importantly, what you hope to see in future bids from any site.

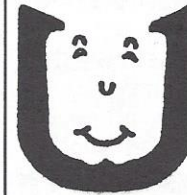

John Decker, RD from Michigan, expressed a want for the RD's and ARD's to help check and measure shoes for the rest of the World Tournament. Les Burroughs, RD from Southern California brought up that the only way anyone should get a certificate to run a tournament is to go through the charter. Much discussion was held on this. It was stated that although this is a good idea, no tournament director is obligated to go through the charter. Some do and some don't. Rich Paul, RD from MT and Leo Wanner, RD from Northern California, both commented on their areas and hopefully

we resolved the issue to everyone's satisfaction.

Again, there was much discussion on the fencing issue. There were many ideas on how to finance the fencing around courts and bring the courts up to NHPA specifications. I expressed the feeling myself on the reason for fencing, which is SAFETY and the insurance issue. I feel it won't be too long before the insurance will require it.

Also discussed were the backboards. It was stated by myself about the NHPA council decision to allow the backboards to be mounted on the fence behind the stakes to allow spectator participation and viewing. It was stated that the Federal Government has many grants to help cities get things done. These can be used to upgrade courts.

Regional Tournaments were then discussed. Rich Paul, RD from MT said he found out about an upcoming Regional Tournament being held

in his area through the newspaper after the NHPA council had already awarded it. He had concerns about the tournament being held on courts that didn't fully meet NHPA Sanctioning Requirements. I expressed concerns about it also, since he brought them up. Rich Paul stated that he would be traveling to the site within the next month and would let me know if there were any major problems.

There being no further business, we had the candidates for NHPA office speak.

Then I presented the Regional Director of the Year plaque to John Decker from Michigan for 1993.

I thanked the Regional Directors for their hard work the last 4 years, and asked them to support whichever person was elected to the 5th Vice President position.

There being no further comments or business, the meeting was adjourned.

Report of 1993 State and Charter Officers Meeting

The 1993 meeting of State and Charter Officers was called to order at 1:30 p.m. on Friday, July 23 at Spearfish, S.D. A fast check of the registration sheet showed we had officers present from approximately 17 charters.

Candidates for NHPA office were introduced and asked to give brief statements as to why they would be the best choice for the position they seek.

Mr. Oliver Smith, the man in charge of the NatStat Center, was present at our meeting and gave a brief outline of what the NatStat Center is now able to provide for individual charters. Anyone interested in more details should contact Mr. Smith. He stated that most charters are cooperating very nicely in reporting sanctioned tournament results, but mentioned that he had so far heard nothing from two states for 1993. When asked what two states had not reported thus far, he told us they were Kentucky and Wyoming. It was pointed out to persons present at our meeting that the 1994 entry form for the World Tournament will have only spaces for information such as name, address, phone, card number and division entered. There will be no spaces for listing individual tournament averages and the verification of same. If a pitcher does not have the required number of tournament averages on record in NatStats, their World Tournament entry will be denied. NatStats will become the official source for entry into the World Tournament and also all NHPA Regional Tournaments. *It is very important that all tournament directors make sure their tournament results are getting sent to Nat Stats!*

Mr. Smith gave the results of a random study he had done on approximately 180 plus 1993 World Tournament entrants. According to his records, over 80 of those persons did not have sufficient entry requirements. There were almost 30 names, out of that 180 plus, that did not even appear in the computer. This, along with other instances that were mentioned as having happened at the 1993 World Tournament, gave us a few good examples why a national

stat center is needed. In order to keep this program in operation, it was announced that starting in 1994, NHPA members will be assigned a permanent card number. Cards will be numbered with the first two digits identifying a pitcher's region, then up to four digits for membership within a region, then a decimal to designate the year. New cards of a different color will be issued each year, but a system will be worked out by the NHPA or Charter Secretary where a pitcher will receive the same card number each year for as long as he/she remains active within that charter.

In other business, Don Titcomb gave a brief description of his Pitch and Win Program. Anyone interested can contact Don at 606-744-8602. Casey Sluys distributed copies of the Northern California informational brochure, which is patterned after the one designed by the Iowa Assn. It is felt that this is a helpful instrument in attracting new people to our sport. Kent Armstrong and Al Sandham invited everyone to visit the displays of the bidders for the 1995 World Tournament.

A question was asked about league memberships and the gentleman was wondering why we couldn't have a "league only" card? Beverly Born was not able to be present, but her husband, Floyd, tried to answer the question for her. Briefly, he stated that the league program was designed years ago with the idea of attracting new pitchers to the sport. It was hoped that they later would take the step to full membership and become active in tournament play. This was not happening. Thousands were content to continue to reap the benefits of league play and the awards offered each year, while paying only a small fee that was not covering expenses and which also required extra record keeping. Floyd said that Beverly agonized over the decision for a long time, but finally made the decision that it would be in the best interests of the NHPA to require full membership for all league pitchers. This decision has apparently hurt a few states, but has helped in others.

The question was asked, if pitchers from the midwestern states, which

have been hit heavily by rain and flooding, would be given special consideration when entering the 1994 World Tournament? It was felt that they might have difficulty in obtaining 4 tournament averages in 1993. NHPA President, Dave Loucks, said the council could certainly discuss this subject.

Someone asked how our relationship stood with the Canadian pitchers? Dave Loucks said there were some hard feelings over the first idea of having them pay the full \$12.00 NHPA dues in order to enter a World Tournament. A compromise was reached where they would pay an additional \$5.00 each, which covers the insurance and the \$3.00 that goes into the World Tournament prize fund.

Bud Schardine reported on a program in Utah that uses portable courts to put on exhibitions and tournaments at local festivals or fairs where no regular courts are available. This gets our sport presented to many people who aren't aware of horseshoe pitching and may encourage some new participation.

The question of giving Juniors prize money was brought up. Donnie Roberts informed us that we would not jeopardize any youth's amateur standing as horseshoe pitching is not recognized as an official sport. I believe he stated it is recognized as a recreational activity. Dave Loucks urged that we not give monetary awards to juniors and a suggestion was made by another person that any monetary award could be given to the parents of a Junior pitcher and that would avoid any problems with the By-Laws.

Comments were made concerning the mixing of men and women in the 30 foot Elders Division at the World Tournament. Some didn't realize that the new By-Laws do not designate gender in the description of requirements for the Elders Division. It was pointed out that 1994 is the year for suggesting rewording for By-Laws. A complaint was also registered that the Senior Women's Division was dropped from the 1993 World Tournament due to lack of entries to make competitive classes.

Someone asked why some states

have more than one charter? This person felt it was a problem in his state. Casey Sluys, of California, says he has material available that might prove helpful in states with more than one charter.

Barry Chapelle asked for all charter officers to each year encourage participants from their charter to help out at the World Tournament as judges, scorekeepers, computer operators, scoresheet runners or checkers, etc. There are many jobs to be filled each year, so that the tournament can stay on schedule.

A comment was made by a person who felt littering was bad at this World Tournament. He thought it would look much better if people would be more considerate and put their trash in the proper receptacles.

The suggestion was made that we should hire an organization, such as Boy Scouts, to be official scorekeepers at the World Tournaments. Discussion followed. Again, we are all urged to see that our pitchers are calling scores correctly in our local events.

John Decker asked that all charters urge their pitchers to buy horseshoes from NHPA distributors, as certain guarantees can be honored by NHPA representatives and problems with new shoes can be corrected. When people buy from trunk salesmen, there usually are no guarantees and if they find that their new horseshoes are out of compliance, it's just their tough luck.

There still seems to be a problem with the NHPA handling horseshoes that aren't in compliance, but Ed Domey was not present to take questions. If you have problems or questions about horseshoes that the NHPA sells, Ed Domey is the person to contact.

Barry Chapelle asked everyone's cooperation in the upcoming convention in conducting the discussion on the proposed rules in a dignified and businesslike fashion, so that the long process could be completed as smoothly as possible.

There being no further discussion, the chairman adjourned the meeting.

ON TOP OF THE WORLD

Even as we broaden our horizons, there is still the reminder that horseshoe pitching thrives in a small town atmosphere. Spearfish, SD was evidence of that belief. Forty-three courts, out in the open, in an attractive park facility. A picnic-like setting. Pitchers greeting old friends and making new ones. Spectators sitting or standing in the sun or shade watching the action and exchanging commentary and stories.

Yet, media attention was intense and continuous. The World Horseshoe Tournament was front-page news and the focal point of the sport section of the local paper, the *Queen City Mail*. Other newspapers, some major, featured tournament highlights frequently. The local radio station scheduled three daily sportscasts from the tournament site; a total of 30 overall. The television people were busy with interviews and videos of the competition.

For two weeks in the beautiful Black Hills, horseshoe pitching seemed to be the National Pastime—but with wonderful differences.

Each game began and ended with a firm handshake or warm hug. Players observed the rules of courtesy and were considerate of the scorekeepers. No one spiked a shoe in or out of the clay. Victors did not do a crazy dance around the stake. No shoe was thrown into the crowd in celebration or in disgust. Judges were respected. No one kicked clay on their uniforms or cussed 'em out. There were no weird hairdos or outlandish attire. And pitchers did not resort to loud grunts or obscene gestures.

No one was ejected from the game because of unsportsmanlike conduct. Spectators were well behaved and did not litter the courts with soda cans and beer cups in a display of anger. None of our highly paid pitchers threw a

firecracker into the crowd or sprayed reporters with bleach.

Player-agents were nowhere in sight. No pitchers were heard to opt for free agency. And the threat of a strike to jeopardize the 1994 World Tournament was not even suggested.

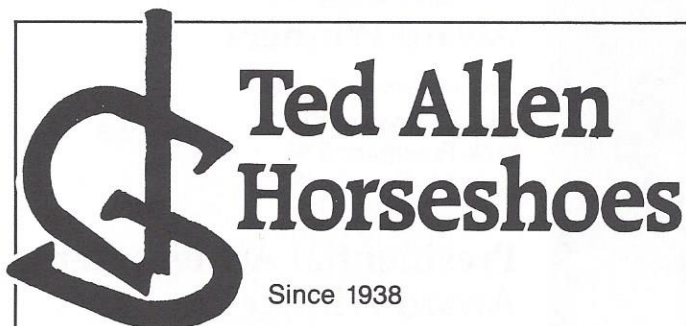
What's wrong with us, anyway? Is horseshoe pitching the only sport that people play for the love of the game? Are we behind the times? (Our sport doesn't even have a bleeding rule.) Perhaps the media hasn't caught up to us yet. Maybe horseshoe pitching really should be the National Pastime, after all.

World Champions Crowned In Spearfish

The 43 court facility in the beautiful city park and campground was again the scene of the NHPA World Championships. The 75th Annual World Horseshoe Tournament had a few afternoon and evening rain delays which didn't seem to dampen the enthusiasm of the 1509 entrants, the second highest entry figure in NHPA history, behind the record 1700 registered in Columbus in 1992.

MEN

Spearfish has been good to Missouri's Alan Francis and Alan was good again in Spearfish. The 23 year old Missouri pitcher won his second Men's World Championship in one of the most dramatic finishing games of memory. Tied after 34 games with defending champion Kevin Cone, Francis, a recent graduate of Northwest Missouri State, took home \$3500 1st place money as he edged Cone 40-38 in the final game of the tournament before an estimated 500 enthusiastic fans.

Francis finished the 35-game slate over six days with 32 wins, 3 losses, and once held a commanding lead, 28-8 in the final match.

"Kevin then got hot and I took a cold streak, as he came back," said Francis, who delivered ringers on 19 of the last 20 shoes.

The eventual winner was shutout for 16 innings as Cone climbed into a 35-28 lead. Francis then rallied to nail 11 ringers in 12 tosses to come within one point of the Iowa auctioneer, 37-38. Two four deads prolonged the game until the 1993 champ nailed two more ringers. Cone retaliated with a ringer on his first shoe. His second appeared to register another four dead, but his final shoe landed on top of the pile and flipped back off the stake. Francis was the 1993 Champion.

"I felt consistent every day," exclaimed Francis. "In the first three or four days I felt that I could do better, and then I turned it on. Concentration has a lot to do with it. Horseshoes is more of a mental game than people think."

Other former World Champions found themselves low in the final standings. Five-time winner, Walter Ray Williams, Jr. from Stockton, California finished 12th, Don Titcomb from Kentucky was 14th; Mark Seibold, Indiana finished 17th; and Jim Knisley, Ohio was 19th.

Canada's Andre LeClerc went from 6th in 1992 to 4th this year, and Paul LaCrosse, Colorado was a surprising 5th place finisher. Art Tyson, who closed in 9th position last year was 3rd, with a 76 percent ringer figure, just behind Francis' tournament high 77.07.

WOMEN

An aggressive Cathy Carter from Iowa rode an emotional roller-coaster on her way to her first World title and \$3000 prize money.

The 29-year old greyhound track maintenance worker, posted a 13-4 record in the three-day finals, edging defending champion Sue Snyder and Angeline Moisan from St. Raymond, Quebec, who both registered 12-5 marks.

All three were tied at 12-4 going into the final game, but Moisan fell to former champion Debby Michaud, 41-19, and ten-time champion Vicki Winston, who still tosses a mean shoe, pitched a 90.6 game to knock Snyder out of contention.

A sixth place last year at Columbus was Carter's best previous showing in the championship class. She finished with 75.2, second to Snyder's 76.59.

Minnesota's Beverly Nathe was fourth, Winston was fifth, just a few percentage points behind Nathe. Michaud was seventh, and former Champion Sandy Janssens from Canada was 10th. Minnesota's five-time winner, Phyllis Negaard finished 15th. The 1978 and 1980 champion, Opal Reno from Arkansas was 16th in the 18-person field.

Since 1920 the women have competed in 62 tournaments and have crowned 23 champions. The leader, of course, is Winston, followed by Mrs. C.A. Lanham, Illinois 6, Negaard 5, Ruth Hangen, New York 4 and three each by Tari Powell, Illinois and Sue Gillespie, Indiana.

SENIORS

Herb Criss found out his horseshoes worked well on clay and the 69-year old retired fireman from Bremerton, Washington, captured his first senior men's title.

However, Criss needed a 42-22 playoff victory over two-time champion Raymond Hill from Wakefield, Michigan, after both had notched 13-2 records in the finals.

Criss, three-time Northwest champion, said he usually pitches in sand pits and was not accustomed to clay. It didn't take him long to adjust.

He improved as the schedule continued and in the last match tossed 45 ringers in 58 shoes (75.8%) and settled for an overall 62.28 percentage

and first place money of \$800.

Ed Arionus from Seguin, Texas finished third with a 12-3 record. Art Sperber, Bremerton, who was last year's intermediate champion finished fourth.

ELDERS

Roy Smith from Arkansas City, Kansas parlayed a 13-1 record and 70.31 percentage into the elders 30-foot championship in the 70-plus division. Smith closed two games in front of Russell Christopher from Saskatchewan, Canada and five ahead of John Bracken from St. George, Utah. The first place prize was \$400.

Francis Nockerts from Louisville, Kentucky, who won Class A last year, and Dennis Reid, Bridgeview, Illinois, who topped Class E in 1992, competed in the championship division this year finishing sixth and eighth respectively.

BOYS

Sixteen-year old Jim Walters from Troy, Ohio won his fifth straight title, to eclipse a record of four held jointly by 1993 open men's winner Alan Francis and Ohio's Gary Roberts.

On the way to his record performance, the youthful flinger set two more records, a perfect 24-shoe 100% game, the first by any junior and the third overall in NHPA World competition.

Last year they said it was just a matter of time until Walters joined the elite, and they were right. Last year he pitched a tournament high 89.3. This year his winning percentage was 88.15.

Walters boasts a perfect 53-0 won-lost record in the championship finals of all five tournaments He was 11-0 four times and 9-0 in the other effort.

Junior pitchers will be relieved to learn that Jim has outgrown the division. The men will find out that Walters is a deadly accurate thrower. We are all sure that the junior champion will spend the next year preparing for his 40-foot debut.

GIRLS

Canada's Crystal Curtis from Alberta defeated defending champion Celeste Polak from East Bernard, Texas twice, 40-15 and 40-23, in double round-robin play to close undefeated with a 10-0 record and 66.04 ringer percentage.

The fourteen year old Canadian star finished fourth in Mississippi and third last year in Columbus. She hopes to defend her title next year in Syracuse.

Polak's efforts to tie Debby Bestul from Wisconsin at four titles went by the boards when her record 79.08 mark posted last year dwindled to 59.58 this year.

Minnesota's Tiffany Gage finished third behind Polak with a 5-5 record and 58.50 percentage.
