



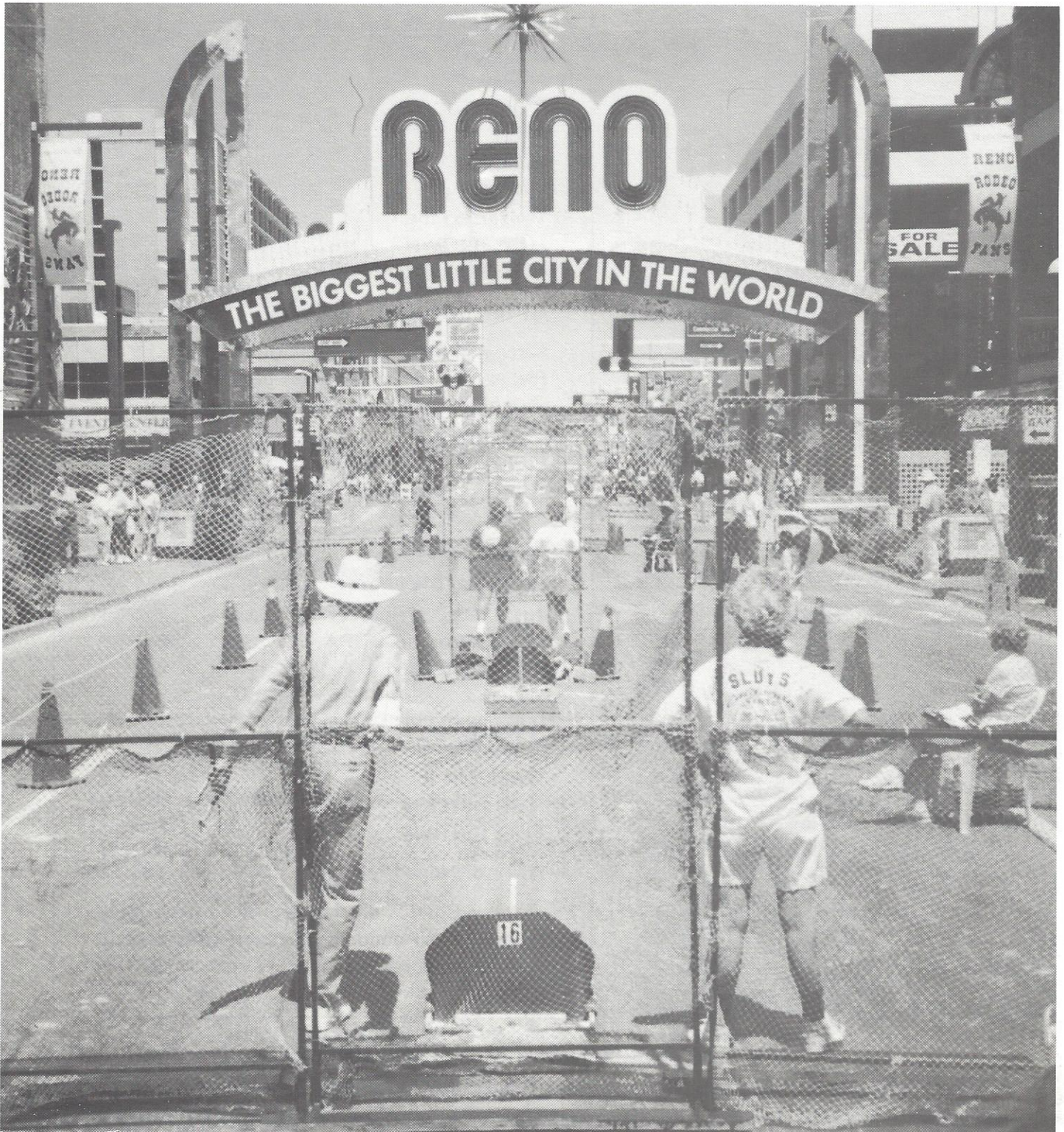

# President's Message

Several changes are in the works with regard to NHPA membership cards. First, there will be a temporary application/receipt card available to any charter secretary who wants to pass these on to clubs or leagues. The purpose—to give the member a recognizable receipt that will allow them entry into tournaments while they are waiting for the permanent card to arrive from the Charter secretary. This application/receipt form is perforated into two parts. The application side, which is filled out and sent to the charter secretary with the dues, the second part is the receipt for the member. Some charters may not want to use this new form but many will find it very useful to use for snowbirds and others who will need to show proof of membership before their permanent card is available.

The actual permanent number membership card will be different in a couple of ways to assist NatStats, our membership files and charter people using computers. It will be the size of a credit card and have a slightly different look with boxes to be checked off to indicate membership category and pitching distance. The most significant change is that the 5 or 6 digit number will be a permanent one that will stay with the member for as long as they maintain membership and reside in the same state. The first 1 or 2 digits of the card will designate the region or state code where you live. This is the same number that has appeared in *Newsline* in the RD region reports for years. The next 4 digits will allow

up to 9999 member numbers in that region. Following the 6 digits will be a decimal point and one more digit which will indicate the current year.

We will issue a new color card each year as we always have. The first 5 or 6 digits will remain the same with only the last number following the decimal point changing to denote a new year. If a member moves out of state, doesn't rejoin or passes away and the card number goes unused for 2 or more years, the charter secretary can then reassign that number.

The use of this new permanent number will greatly aid in the tracking of pitching averages in the NatStat file. However, it will initially increase the workload as every member number now in the file will have to be changed. We want to do this ASAP because World entrants will be sending in their forms with the new 1994 number while in most cases, NatStats will probably still show the member's 1993 number. Charter secretaries can help things along by promptly sending in membership report forms to Donnie who will make a copy and forward it to NatStats. In this manner, many files can be updated before any actual tournament results are reported.

It is important for Charter secretaries to realize they will have to keep good records from one year to the next because it will be their responsibility to see that in 1995, and years following, a member gets the same 5 or 6 digit card number that is assigned in 1994. Only the last digit following the decimal point will change to reflect the current year.

## Dave's Court Report

■ With the introduction of the new permanent member number, we are ending all use of the Complimentary Card Program. Charter secretaries should notify all tournament directors that the Complimentary entry program no longer exists.

■ Harry Schmidt, an NHPA member from New Jersey died in early April this year. In his Last Will and Testament, Harry bequeathed \$2,000 to the NHPA. For years Harry was a tireless worker for the National and New Jersey associations and his dedication and gift is certainly appreciated. The NHPA has a Memorial Fund account set up for such purposes should anyone else be interested.

■ A "tip of the hat" to Stewart Snyder of the Sonoma County, California, Horseshoe Club. Stu has been making it a practice to personally give every new member of the club a one year subscription to *Newsline*. More than a dozen so far. Thanks Stu. Thanks also to the Minnesota State HPA who included 24 *Newsline* subscriptions as prizes at their 1993 State Doubles Championships.

■ NHPA Sanctioned CI/Lg play of 400 or more shoes is being recognized by NatStats as a tournament played if it is first reported to and verified by the NHPA 3rd V.P. It is treated the same as any sanctioned tournament, being counted as 1 of 4 events needed for World or Regional entry and if it applies, 1 of the 3 highest when figuring your average.

■ A Junior Boy or Girl who becomes 18 years of age and moves to adult pitching status might sometimes have difficulty getting four tournaments in as an adult prior to the

World entry deadline. This could also be true of the 40' adult who becomes 70 years old and moves up to 30'. The NHPA Council has agreed that these people can compete in their new classification at the World as long as they have the required minimum total of 4 events in the last twelve months with at least 2 pitched in the new classification.

■ Look out World, 1993 Junior Champ Jim Walters is about to take you on as an adult. Not only did Jim win his 5th consecutive World Junior Title in Spearfish, but a month later pitching from 40' in the men's division, Jim won the Ohio State Championship—most likely the first of many.

■ Another Junior Boy, Lenwood Conner Jr. of Virginia, who finished third in the Boys' Division at the World, also completed a performance that had people talking. On August 7th in Petersburg, VA, young Conners had a 91.6% tournament, pitching 229 ringers out of 250 shoes. Wow!

■ Many thanks to John Decker, NHPA RD from MI and recipient of the 1993 Regional Director of the Year Award. At the World John was once again responsible for the checking and weighing of all horseshoes being pitched by the contestants. John reports that 2,513 pair were checked with a total of 213 shoes being found illegal. That's 4.23% that were too wide, too heavy or altered. An NHPA provided grinder was available to take some metal off the wide and heavy shoes and most were ultimately brought into spec. The 4 most widely used brands at the World were the Deadeye, Allen, Diamond and Imperial. John also reported 11 Dress Code violations.

### 1994 National Horseshoe Pitching Championships Camping Information / Registration Form

Camping facilities for the 1994 Horseshoe Pitching Championships will be provided in the Hamilton and Jefferson lots adjacent to Belle Isle Road on the New York State Fairgrounds in Syracuse, NY. These lots are large, open grass fields on the west end of the Fairgrounds approximately 15 minutes walking distance from the Center of Progress Building. Restroom and shower

facilities are available in the immediate area. Tram rides are available for on-site transportation.

There are approximately 750 13' x 40' camping areas, which include 165 sites with full hook-up (water, electric and sewer). The remaining sites are dry camping that have electric available. Sites will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

Sanitary trucks will pump each unit daily at their respective slots.

Participants may begin arriving up to one week before the event and can stay up to one week after the event. The fee for camping will be \$12.00 per night/per unit.

Check in must occur between **8 a.m. and 8 p.m. at Gate 6**. This entrance is for campers only. Permits will be held at the gate.

# Letters to the Editor

To The Editor,

Now that all our NHPA tournament statistics will have a bearing on seeding for World Tournament, the issue of pitching in wet and muddy conditions has become more important. Pitching in "mud" rather than "seasoned clay" will make a difference. There may be a few who welcome muddy pits—to get themselves into a lower class and winning; however, I believe most like to win because of their pitching, not by "sandbagging." Also, those wanting to maintain their good percent, will not risk entering too many tournaments, for fear of wet courts or extreme wind.

I am sure no one would want to work their way out of the top class because of pitching after rain, when they know they are capable of maintaining their percent under normal conditions. I am not in upper classes, but I do not like to have my percent lowered because of poor conditions either; we all have our priorities, even though they vary among people.

I would like to see guidelines set, so everyone knows what to expect—when it comes to that we need "CCC" (having *consideration* for the *combination* of view of all, and *cooperation* in listening to them). Even before guidelines, we can always use "CCC."

I don't have the answers, but for guideline starters;

1. At the scheduled tournament starting time, and/or as soon as rain stops, if pits are soft and muddy, have the tournament—but "just for fun"—no statistics to be sent in. (If it is the last chance for a pitcher to qualify, only that person to be given the option to have their results sent in, for qualifying purpose).
2. The better option is to have the tournament sanctioned and wait—2 hours or whatever it takes; also have dry clay on hand to add so when pits are normal, tournament starts—behind schedule. (This can only work if there is enough daylight left or lights are in place; if this isn't available a "fun tournament" is the only alternative.

If it is felt that tournaments should be "run" by the hosts and all decisions made by the director, then I have these thoughts: putting himself

in the "pitcher's shoes," he can ask, would he want to pitch in these conditions, or should he cancel? If the decision is to play with the court conditions wet and the pits muddy, a pitcher should have the option to participate or not. If he opts to not play, it should be without animosity, by either director or pitcher.

My most recent experience brings all this to mind again, however, this letter is not a direct criticism of that tournament only—I mean whenever the weather is not favorable.

Tournament hosts and directors all deserve our respect and appreciation for donating their time in providing enjoyable, challenging horseshoe competition.

A few observations and comments on our sport's divisive practice of mixing 30 and 40'ers in tournaments.

Since it takes more skill to pitch a ringer from 40' than 30', how can any 30'ers (either sex) ever feel they defeated any 40'er? The playing field isn't even to start with and matching ringer percentages doesn't make it even because the *skills* are not comparable at different distances. Wish it weren't that way but talk and arguments don't change the inherent advantage the 30'er has when he or she is closer to the target than the 40'er.

The fact we have a foul line at 37' and endeavor to enforce its observance is tacit admittance that any shortening of the pitching distance is an advantage and should, and does, result in a penalty.

When a 40'er finds he has to move up or give up competition it is amazing how quickly he realizes his potential for ringers has greatly increased. Once he gets his turn adjusted to the shorter distance—WHAMO—he's pitching more ringers than ever, often a lot more. This without long protracted practice. If he doesn't have too many ailments my guess is he'll be adding 10 to 25% to his former 40' percentage.

This will, of course, vary between individuals and as "father time" (arthritis, bursitis, less stamina and strength, poorer eyesight, cardiac and vascular problems, ad infinitum) makes his presence known and

takes its toll, the percentage will come down proportionately.

Probably the best thing for our sport would be for all 70 year olds to move up to 30'. Then, perhaps there would be numbers enough to form their class. Otherwise, many of the 40'ers would soon revolt (many are now totally frustrated with the situation) when obliged to compete with these guys who used to pitch in classes below them.

These 30'ers haven't suddenly become more skillful, they just are closer to the target and the same skill they had at 40' now, predictably, results in more ringers. It is an injustice for 40'ers to have to compete with 30'ers unless some fair way is arrived at so equal skills are competing and not equal ringer percentages, as is now the practice in mixed classes.

Handicaps penalize the more skillful pitchers by artificially elevating the less skillful pitchers to the other's level. This kills incentive for either one to practice and endeavor to improve their skills.

I should say I'm nearly 75 years old and moved up a couple of years ago—so don't dismiss my comments as coming from a disgruntled 40'er. However, I did have the same opinions before I changed to 30'. I sympathize with my 40' competitors, as I used to be one of them.

Moving up to 30' has confirmed my previous beliefs and convinced me of the validity of this discussion. I would like to see comments from other 30'ers, particularly the men, as I doubt many women fully appreciate or have experienced pitching from both 30 and 40' distances.

One often mentioned solution to the problem, and probably least palatable, would be for everyone to pitch the same distance. That would be unworkable in most cases as all would have to pitch from 30' and the 40'ers couldn't be expected to suddenly adjust to the lesser distance and pitch competitively, even if they wanted to. It is a poor solution and shouldn't be considered. I mention it only because some 30'ers think that is the way to go.

A suggestion, somewhat related to the subject, is that it would be more informative to the readers if the 30' pitchers would be designated when

in mixed classes when reporting tournament results—it would be of added interest.

Kudos to our president/editor and his staff. They really publish an excellent magazine.

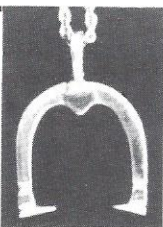
Is the ridiculous designation, Champion of Class X, Y or Z any real distinction to a pitcher, champion of the lowest (poorest) pitchers in the NHPA?

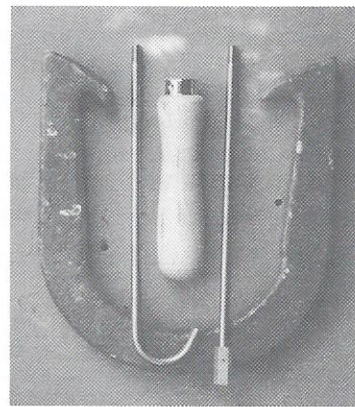

## News Release

The largest of the three NHPA sanctioned clubs in PA, we concluded our twelfth consecutive year in September. Our annual award banquet was held on September 25th at the L.C. Simpson Restaurant in Dormont.

Each of our 64 members received a hooded rain jacket with our club logo and their name imprinted on them, along with the other trophies, certificates, NHPA patches and door prizes earned by the men and women who participated in our doubles summer league. Dominick Massella was honored by being the tenth member to be inducted into our Hall of Fame.

During the '93 season, club members traveled to compete in many sanctioned tournaments. In State tourneys we had a combined 23 firsts, 18 seconds and numerous third place winners. Four members participated in World in Spearfish, S.D. with Gene Swogger placing second in Class N and Frank Kallay receiving \$150 in Class I, coming in 9th. We also had a good showing in the PA State Championships. 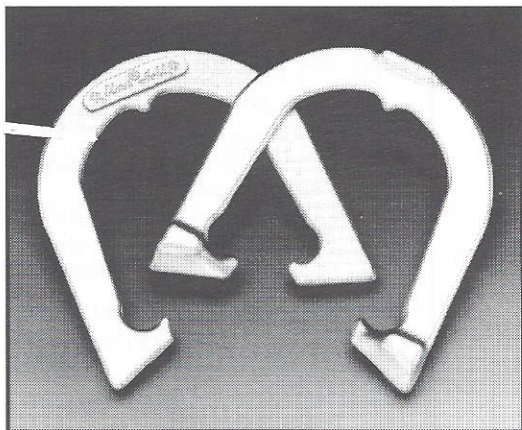

# West St. Paul Junior League Has Most Successful 2nd Season

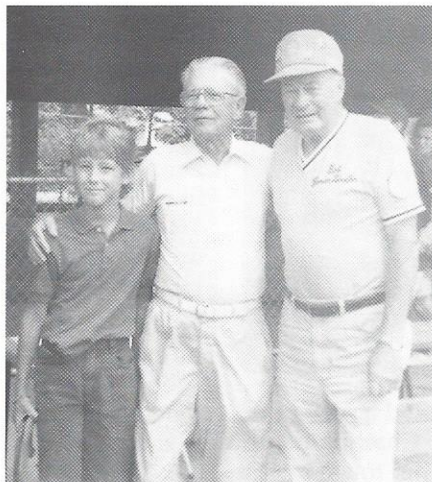

Horseshoe Heaven is how the local newspaper referred to the phenomenon occurring in West St. Paul, Minnesota. It all began with a short 4 week instructional league in the fall of 1991. Twenty youngsters tried their hand at horseshoe pitching for the first time. This is the approach league director, Bob Chavie, took with plans to have a Junior Sanctioned League in 1992. Where did the twenty youngsters come from?

For the most part, they were children and grandchildren of present club members. The instructional league was well planned and critically important—well staffed. Volunteers were scheduled so there was an instructor for every two junior pitchers. This initial step was successful. The proof came when it was time to start the 1992 season and the Sanctioned Junior League Program.

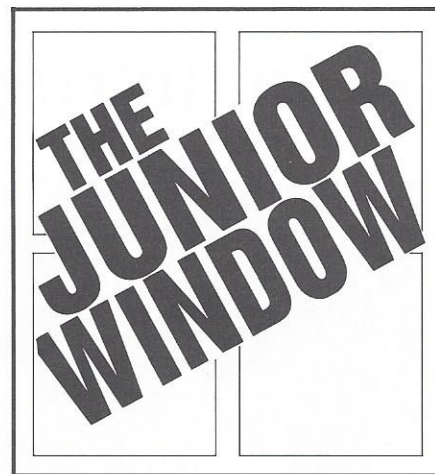
Forty-four Junior pitchers started the season—the initial 20 and they brought friends. 44 Junior pitchers in the first full season of a new Junior league! Sponsorship is also a big reason for the success. Chavie had raised some \$2,000 over the winter months, so all the newcomers were decked out in Junior league pitching shirts and matching caps. Ample instructors and supervision was arranged.

The league was conducted as perfectly as possible. There was the season ending class tournament. Many were able to participate in the 1992 2nd Annual Junior Only Open (held at the same court site). McDonalds sponsored the awards program—a youthful touch of hamburgers and fries at courtside. When Chavie is asked to explain the success of his program, all this is touched on but one issue is added. As many of the new pitchers are from 6-9 years old, moving them up to a pitching distance of less than 30' to bring them some success is the real reason the league has caught on and the big reason the kids have stuck it out

and are willing to invite their friends. Well the 1993 season rolled around



and an even larger enrollment was anticipated for there had been a waiting list started late in 1992. The 1993 Junior league membership is 23 girls and 37 boys for a total of 60 NHPA Junior members. The 12 court West St. Paul facility now holds the Junior league on two separate days and there are even more kids on the waiting list hoping to get the chance to join the league in 1994. It is a tremendous job that Bob Chavie and his staff have accomplished in a very short time and is the reason for the Junior Only Open being successful and growing each year.

## 1993 Junior Only Open Has 48 Pitchers

On August 18th, Jessica Dunn directed her third Annual Junior Only Open. Three tournaments may seem insignificant until it is realized that Dunn is just 17 years old, and that the Junior Only Open in each of its three years has been the nation's largest sanctioned Junior tournament.

The 1993 Class A champion is Chad Schultz who surprised defending champion Mike Casalenda with a 52.3% game in route to a 8-2 record. Michael Tuhy won Class B on 10% and a 9-1 record, Class C champion was Alex Closmore 6-4, 13%, and Class D champion—Trent Schultz 7-3, 8.3%. A special feature of the Junior Only Open is the starter groups of younger members pitching less than 30'. These kids, aged mostly 6-9, put on quite a display of enthusiasm and full knowledge of the game. 24 youngsters competed for trophies

and honors in 4 starter group classes. The champion was Eric Hanson 10-0, 7.1%, Class B champion—Cassandra Wills 6-0, 6.6%, Theresa Casalanda won Class C 6-0, 7.2%, and Dan Bonkowske won Class D 8-2, 6.7%. All classes were 6 pitchers and a double round robin of 30 shoe games. The starter groups used count-all scoring and the 30' classes pitched cancellation scoring.

The participants and audience of parents and friends were treated to a celebrity appearance as Ralph Rasmussen pitched out the first shoe to start the championship class. Rasmussen was Minnesota State Junior Champion in 1923, 1924 and 1925. At 83 years of age, he showed great form in clearly hitting the pit on his first toss in nearly twenty years. Ralph is also a 1993 inductee to the "Founders" category of the MGSHPA Hall of Fame.

This tournament will hopefully continue to be New York's summer classic for young pitchers. Champion—Gary VanCauvenberge 37.4%, Runner-up—Keith Wilkenson 41.4% and 3rd place—Steve Mumford 7.7%.

■ Congratulations to Spearfish for 93 Junior pitchers in the 1993 World Tournament. This surpassed the 89 Juniors at the previous W.T. in Spearfish. 1992 (Columbus) had 78 Juniors, 1991 (Biloxi) had 59 Juniors, 1990 (Stone Mountain) had 55 Juniors. The 1993 total is not a record however. In 1981 (Genola, Minnesota) there were 75 boys and 23 girls for a total of 98 Junior participants. Maybe 1994 can bring a new record.

■ Betty Lapping (JPD Western Pennsylvania) profiled 14 year old Keith Hayes. Keith has his sights on winning the Pennsylvania State Junior Championship and is surely a likely candidate after pitching an 80% game in the Cliff Walters Memorial Tournament in April. Hayes is a member of the Erie Horseshoe Club and attends Iroquois High School.

■ In 1992 the MGSHPA Executive Board approved a Junior Honor Roll as part of the Minnesota State Horseshoe Hall of Fame. This category is for those pitchers that have significant performances in a Junior career. This year's charter Junior Honor Roll inductees are: Alden Sandquist—four time state champion (1974-77); Boni Boser/Poplinski—two time state champion (1982-83) and two time World Champion; and Chris White—1983 State Champion and holds the all-time tournament record of 88.49%.

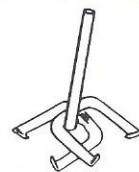

## ARIZONA

Paul Anderson of Prescott has been named junior program director for the state. Prescott's first official horseshoe club was organized in the summer of 1990, after receiving permission from the local YMCA Board of Directors to develop the old concrete tennis courts into a 12-court, chain link enclosed complex for horseshoe pitching.

Anderson has been a life-long pitcher, having worked with young people in Indian Guides, Cub and Boy Scouts, Little League baseball, and organized a VFW Junior Rifle Club which was affiliated with the National Rifle Assn.

He now would like to have the opportunity to help boys and girls to learn the skill of horseshoe pitching. Prescott has many dedicated and qualified members who will offer coaching and assistance. Sounds like a super program, one that could be initiated by other clubs and charters.

## CALIFORNIA

The Southwest Pacific Zone Regional in Reno, Nevada, found Sharon Paddock of Eureka winning the 30-foot Championship and Don Gregson of Crestline topping the 40-foot group.

In the six person class double round-robin Paddock went 9-1 with a 72.6% finishing two games in front of Gail Sluys (60.3%). Other participants were Jack Stewart (6-4, 60%), Billie Sue Pennington (4-6, 67%), John Bracken (4-6, 58.4%), and Andrea Adams (0-10, 37.8%).

Gregson's 9-2 record (61.6%) edged Don Titcomb (57.8) by one game in a playoff. Dave Loucks (7-3, 55%) was third followed by Foster Kenton (3-7, 52.9), Bill Brown (2-8, 47.8) and Harold Holbrook (2-8, 46%).

On August 15, 1993 at the Northern California Senior's Championship in Vallejo, Orville Saffle, pitching in the 30-ft-C group, entered the tournament with a 33.18% average. After five 40 shoe games and one 20 shoe playoff game, Orville had 73 ringers with 220 shoes pitched, equaling exactly his entering average of 33.18%.

On September 19, 1993, at an Open Tournament in Davis, Derald Rasmussen entered the tournament with a 29.64% average. Derald pitched seven 40 shoe games. He had 83 ringers for 280 shoes pitched which gave him a 29.64% average, the same as his entering average. This was Derald's 35th tournament entered for this 1993 season, so far.

## CANADA

In 1986 Ed Murray, then President of Horseshoe Canada, started high school horseshoe competition at Vernon, British Columbia—first of its kind in Canada.

In coordination with physical education departments of senior secondary schools, five high schools in B.C. have

joined in this program. Its favor is spreading all the way across Canada, for in 1992, the Province of Nova Scotia adopted Ed Murray's established system of high school horseshoe pitching.

In B.C. annual school championships are held at school-year end. These games are sponsored by B.C. Horseshoe Association that also furnishes trophies; every pitcher gets a prize—gold for winners, silver for losers. One Grand Provincial Championship Cup is for the year's winning school.

What do teenage students think of it? "They love it!" Ed Murray proclaims with pride.

## COLORADO

CHPA vice president Paul LaCrosse, who finished 5th in the World Tournament Championship class, captured his eleventh Colorado Class A title over the Labor Day weekend to best the ten titles won by the legendary Ted Allen.

Walter O'Dell, son of the Colorado president David O'Dell, won his third straight junior title and has four more years of competition. Walter and Washington vice president Jed Pexton (formerly of Colorado) were inducted into the first Junior Hall of Fame for the state.

Colorado led all charters in World Class Champions at Spearfish in 1993. They came home with 9 championship trophies. Tracy Wilcox of Boulder won Girls Class D, the first girl to win a first at World for the Silver State.

Each year the *Double Ringer*, the newsletter for the state, sponsors a Las Vegas Extravaganza. Numbers at \$10 a crack. Dick Leffler won the \$900 prize on the turning of the wheel.

## CONNECTICUT

Sherman Green was inducted into the State's Hall of Fame in 1992. Other members in the Hall of Fame through the years have been Samuel Bartram, Lester Lane, Donald Harrison, William Kamszik, William Crofut, Michael Vecchitto, Fran Wagner, Ervin VanDine, Norman Rioux, Willie Paradis, Roger Henson, Guido Giorgetti, Dwight Smith, William Doyle and Walter Mrozek. Samuel Lane, John Dudek, Dominic Majewski, Ralph Hillburn and George Trabucchi were inducted in 1993.

You guessed it! The Class A winner of the Rioux Challenge tournament was Norm Rioux with a 9-0 record and 80.6%. In second place was "Gentleman" John Kapnis. He was 8-1 with 75.5%.

## FLORIDA

Jim Pelkey, 2nd vice president of the FSHPA, who suffered a heart attack at the 1993 World Tournament, was scheduled to return to his home in Florida after recovering in Syracuse, New York. He had a by-pass some 7 or 8 years ago and this attack was some sort of a flare-up.

From Sept. through April, 66 tournaments are scheduled in Florida. Pitchers are reminded they must pitch in 5 tournaments to qualify for the 1994 State tournament in Cocoa.

Former World Champion Carl Steinfeldt thinks the 1995 World Tournament at Perry, Georgia will be the best ever.

First vice president Norman Gaseau reports that efforts are under way to construct overhead covers over the pits at the Clearwater courts.

## CHARTER CHATTER

### IDAHO

More than 10% of all ISHPA members participated in the World Tournament at Spearfish. It was busy at the First Security Games in Pocatello this past year. Entries increased from 90 last year to 144.

### ILLINOIS

Cliff Baker won the Men's Class A state title and Tari Powell took the Class A Women's division. Cliff closed with a 16-1 record and 75.19% in the 18 player round robin schedule. Powell closed with a perfect 7-0 record and 78.9% to easily take her division in the tournament held at Oakland over the Labor Day weekend.

Newcomer Steve Snook won the junior boys title and Misty Pierce won the girl's crown. Roland Stobaugh won the Men's 70+ competition and Ed Bell, Jr. is the senior men's champion.

This was the first year for the 12-player format in the men's classes which will be reviewed at the Spring meeting.

Forty pitchers competed in the 1993 World Tournament at Spearfish, South Dakota. Illinois had only one World Champion in 1993—Ivan Glasscock in Class N went through the prelims and the championship round without losing a game—an 18-0 record.

### IOWA

The Francis family from Blythdale, Missouri strikes again. In the Frank Jackson Open at Kellerton, Iowa. Alan, the 1989 and 1993 World Champion was first, Brett finished second and Joyce was fifth in the Class A division.

Gloria Baken from Marion won her first class championship in Class J. A weekend of horseshoes in Kellerton and on to Ottumwa was Gloria's birthday request when her husband Fred said she could have anything she wanted. She also went on to win in Ottumwa. Congrats are in order.

The Storm Lake Star Spangled Spectacular lived up to the Storm part as 35-45mph winds came off the lake all day.

1992 World Champion Kevin Cone was the tournament director, presented a period of instruction as part of the program. Francis Edwards won the morning class with a 6-1 record and 24.6 ringer percentage with Bob KcKee (7-0 and 40.0%) winning the afternoon session.

### LOUISIANA

The Harahan Horseshoe Association has formed a truly mixed league for Thursday nights this Fall. Twenty members are pitching and each team must have at least one female.

The 1993 U.S. National Senior Sports Class IV "Senior Olympics" was held in June at the LSU Parker Coliseum. Over 300 men and women entered the horseshoe event.

It was interesting to witness a 95 year old man pitching against a 98 year old. Also, there were three entrants in the 90-94 age group. Many LSHPA members assisted to make this event a most successful one.

The *Kenner Picayune* published a full page 2-color photographic spread about horseshoes in the Louisiana area, including five colored photos of the area pitchers.

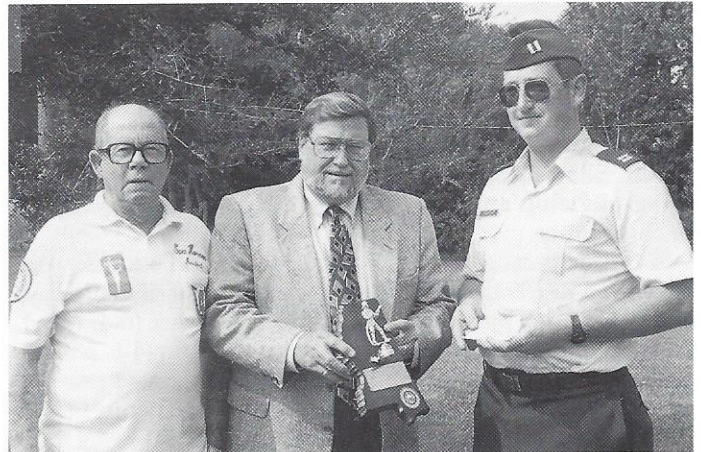

### MINNESOTA

When you think of horseshoes, you may envision older gentlemen pitching informal games in makeshift backyard pits. In West St. Paul, however, horseshoe pitching is becoming a young person's game. More and more youngsters are flocking to the horseshoe courts to learn the sport. Each Wednesday and Thursday afternoon 6-14 year olds come to the courts at the West St. Paul Sports Center for 2 hours of horseshoes.

The top 5 NJSHPA pitchers as of Aug. 11 are as follows: Art Tyson of Mt. Vernon (NY) on top with 77.19. Sonny Durando rates 2nd with 70.17 followed by Joe McCrink 69.17, Joe Schultz (NY) 67.26 and Joe Belcavitch (PA) 58.16.

When you scan the results of most of the tournaments in the state's area, Sonny's name comes out on top. He won the Gene Castner Open (6-0, 69.1), Ted Lewis Memorial (6-0, 67.2), Split the Stakes (5-0, 62.2), Bill Kolb Open (4-1, 64.4), Flemington Open (6-0, 66.0), Vineland Open (6-0, 71.4), New Jersey Open (7-0, 70.0), Millville Open (5-0, 68.8). *Chatter Note:* Wonder when we will see him at the World. Maybe in Syracuse?

Featured in a recent issue of the *Jersey Jargon* was John Rosselet (deceased) who was inducted in 1979. He was the 1942 runner-up in the state tournament, served as secretary-treasurer from 1940-42. John was the 1941 NHPA vice president at 19 years of age. His promising career was cut short when he was killed in World War II.

### NEW YORK

Canadian Champion Andre LeClerc went undefeated with a perfect record of 7-0, in winning the Annual Syracuse Pioneer Open at the fairgrounds indoor courts. Over 150 pitchers participated from New York, Pennsylvania and Canada.

LeClerc was truly "Andre the Giant" as he averaged 80.9%. In one game he pitched 47 ringers in 50 shoes for a 94%. He finished 4th in the 1993 World.

Sylvianne Moisan from Canada nosed out Sue Twyman and Angeline Moisan in a playoff to win the women's title. Her top performance was an eye-popping 44 out of 50 for the 88% women's high. Rounding out the Women's Class A was five time World title holder Ruth Hangen from New York. At the World she had four titles in a row 1970-1973.

### NORTH CAROLINA

North Carolina horseshoes are setting new records in 1993 thanks to all the hard work of state officers, tournament directors and club officers. The membership has reached an all-time high of 147 adults and 5 juniors. Not only is membership up, but the tournament attendance is up.

Donna Kiefert from West Fargo captured her first state title, Chris Husted of Glenburn (48.5%) won his first junior crown. In the first ever Elders class, Joe Wingenback of Carson pitched 29.6% to win.

Highlighting the tournament was the Annual Hall of Fame Banquet, where Gary Erickson of Mayville and Doug Gronneberg, Hannaford were inducted into the NDHPA Hall of Fame.

Twenty-four new courts have been constructed in Bismarck. They were built in a "T" shape with 8 courts in each segment with the clubhouse setting where the "T" intersects. They will be totally covered in 1994. With the final completion of the Bismarck courts, North Dakota will lay claim to 3 locations totally covered—Fargo, Mayville and Bismarck.

### OHIO

Painesville was the host for the 1993 Northeast Ohio District tournament when a bitter cold and damp Saturday greeted 35 brave souls. Jeannie Manns of Painesville won Class A over Bob Lautenschleger with a 6-2 record and 62.8 ringer percentage. Oscar Manns had the high ringer figure but closed with a 4-3 record and 64.6. Debby Szuhay took Class B (5-1, 46.2), Ben Salvi went 6-1 with 44.6 to capture Class C, Al Seremak was 4-1 with 35.5 to win Class D and John Beharry nipped Alfred Dotson by one game, tossing his 30 foot pitch to a 7-1, 33.1%.

Ohio's Hall of Fame includes seven former Adult World Champions—Fred Brust, Columbus; George May, Akron; Harold Reno, Sabina; Charles Bobbit, Lancaster; Harold Falor, Akron; Mayme Francisco, Columbus; Opal Reno, Pike County; and Jim Knisley, Bremen.

### OREGON

Barry Chapelle went 7-1 with a 55.16% to edge Jerry Gorton in a playoff to win Class A in the Juniper Open. Gorton had the high game of 80%.

Patty Sapp captured the Women's A-1 (7-0, 64.93) while Pat Opper was the A-2 champion.

Ben Wiedrich went 6-0 with a 74.44% to win the Newberg Class A crown. Gerry Staley was the Class B winner.

Sapp had an impressive Class A victory in the Skinner's Butte Open, closing with a 7-1 record and fine 73.43%.

Lowell Davis from Creswell was undefeated and edged Sapp by one game in the Class A division in the Stewart Park Open. Davis' 57.94% went a long way since Sapp finished with 71.25%.

### TENNESSEE

Shannon Banks is the 1993 Tennessee State Singles Champion. He also holds the 1993 State Indoor Champion title. 1993 Women's State Champion is Alla Faye Rutherford who is a newcomer to horseshoes in Tennessee. Shea Lebow is the Boys' State Champion for 1993.

Membership in the Tennessee Horseshoe Pitchers Association is at an all time high; over 120 pitchers have joined the NHPA from Tennessee this year.

### TEXAS

Coke Bowker won Men's Class A, Hazel McCall captured the Women's Class A and Chad Mitchum took the junior crown in the Jimmy Bryant Classic in Waco August 7. Ed Arionus finished second behind Bowker and registered the tournament high 71.3 percentage.

Bastrop, Texas was the scene of the Jerry's Kids Classic with Vonnie Avila closing with a 7-0 record and tournament high 62.1%. Other class winners were Judy Woodworth in Class B, Bennie Underwood in "C," Sam Alexander "D," Russell Woodworth "E," Janet Jordan "F," and Ron Duhon "G."

Ed Arionus (72.1) and Bowker (65.4) are the top two percentage pitchers in the state in the men's division. Mary Ann Kramr (67.1) and Jeanne Stewart (63.5) top the women and Celeste Polak, 3-time World Champion heads the juniors with 66.8. Doug Macha (55.2) is second and Chris Polak (50.4) is third.

### VIRGINIA

Lenwood Conner, Jr., who finished third in the Boys Championship at the World in Spearfish, closed with an 11-0 record and 75.6% to win Class A in the Shenandoah Valley Tournament.

Other class winners were Gary Morris in Class B, Ron Trobaugh "C," Jeff Massey "D," W.L. Doss "E," Earl Waggy "F," and William Jones "G."

Conner started pitching in 1986 at age nine and won the state title with a 56.0%. Since then he has been undefeated for 8 straight years. As a World warmup Lenwood went 7-0 with an 80.7% to win the sanctioned Summer Fun Tournament in Grottoes.

Fifteen year old Brad Eppard from Elkton placed in four different categories in the NHPA Junior National Top Ten for 1992.

### WASHINGTON

The newsletter *Shoes News* from Washington posted some interesting figures—Oldest active player, John L. Kronholm, born July 7, 1909...That's 84.

Highest tournament scores—Herb Criss, 88.72% and Michelle Ives, 71.15%. Most tournaments played—Bob Wallin, 30 and Jean Smith 21. Most Improved—Don Ferguson, 4.55% increase; Arletta Kerstetter, 7.73% and Mark Rupprecht Jr., 4.02%.

Michelle Ives had the high single game percentage of 89.29. Art Sperber had a single 92.90 and Mark Rupprecht had a 65.38.

A total of 34 sanctioned tournaments were held from August 1992 to August 1993.

President Pat Quinn writes that "Washington pitchers at the World were at a real disadvantage in that few pitchers

have a chance to practice on clay. Wouldn't it be nice that at least our top pitchers got more of a chance to pitch on clay?" How about clay courts in your back yard?

### WEST VIRGINIA

Rick Cale from Masontown is competing and winning in horseshoes and is averaging in the neighborhood of 80%. Rick finished 19th at the 1992 World Tournament. He has won the state title the last three years and was runner-up two years before.

Cale edged Eldon Sarbaugh from Ohio to win the 40-foot group in the North Eastern Regional and 12th Head-of-the-Mon River Tournament. Cale was 14-1, Eldon 12-3.

Arnold Griffith of Oceana was inducted into the state Hall of Fame last year and we understand they had no selections this year.

### WISCONSIN

The state had some eighty entries at Spearfish. Some were winners. A few just got lucky: Gerri Meistad from Racine saved all her luck for the nearby gaming town of Deadwood, South Dakota. Her entry fee there was only two quarters and her prize was \$1,500.

Bob Phelan of Appleton was inducted into the Wisconsin Hall of Fame over the Labor Day Weekend. Bob held the office of Secretary-Treasurer for the WHPA from the time of its inception, 1967 until 1973.

Jim Haupt, writer for the Wisconsin newsletter wrote this little diddy in the June issue: "Don Titcomb, formerly from California, Florida and now Kentucky was telling about the time he had just won a long 120 shoe game during a World Tournament many years ago and a guy came up to him and asked if Titcomb was all through with that pair of shoes. Titcomb said he was and the guy said, 'Good, cuz they're mine. Did you know you used the wrong shoes for the last game?'"

## Horseshoes

*All superstitious beliefs about horseshoes can be connected with the ancient religions pronouncing crescent and U-shaped objects powerful and protective designs. Due to this notion the ancient temples had their doorways arched in horseshoe fashion.*

*Since horses were held as sacred animals until the 4th century, their crescent-shaped shoes became objects of worship, and beliefs developed around them that they could protect homes from bad luck and evil spirits.*

*The belief developed that when the horseshoe was hung with prongs facing toward the ground the Devil would be sucked into the metal and driven into the ground, thereby not harming the occupants of that house. When the horseshoe was hung in that fashion, it was believed that a magic ray would protect that doorway from harm.*

# The Toll of Time

## CARL VON DER LANCKEN

Long time NHPA member and horseshoe pitching promoter Carl von der Lancken died June 24, 1993 in Troy, New York at age 83. Carl was born in Rochester, graduated from the University of Tulsa, Tulane University and received his juris doctorate degree from Cumberland Law School. His working career was one of service to various labor and political committees with a 15 year stint as a political science pro-

fessor. Carl is listed in *Who's Who in American Politics*.

His interest in horseshoe pitching started as a young man. In the late 1930s he won the New York City championship averaging 72%. His career found him traveling extensively across the United States and Europe, where he always gave pitching exhibitions and served as a roving promoter at the request of the NHPA. Carl was editor of the first NHPA *How To Do It* horseshoe manual.

Carl lived in White Plains, NY for 16 years until 1976 when he moved to Panama City, FL where he stayed until 1989 when he returned to Troy, New York where his daughter Paula lives. A member of the New York State Hall of Fame and former President of the NYSHPA, Carl also served the NHPA as a member of the Hall of Fame Committee for several years. He was the committee chairman in 1970-71. In 1977 he was elected to the NHPA Hall of Fame.

# NatStats Reveals Top Pitchers

The NHPA computer data files on pitching averages, better known as NatStats, has printed out a listing of the top percentages in the file as of October 1, 1993. This includes both U.S. and Canadian pitchers who have been reported in tournament results submitted to NatStats.

While the data is interesting, and in some cases surprising, there is also a degree of importance applied when you consider that it will be the NatStat files that will determine where you are seeded and whether you are eligible for the 1994 World Tournament. The data file will give us the average of your 3 highest tournaments and also tell us whether you have the required 4 events pitched in the past twelve months.

Every Charter except one is reporting their tournament results. The lone exception is Wyoming, who as of the report date has not submitted any 1993 tournament data. If they don't come in, Wyoming members who want to pitch in the World may be shut out, just as any other pitcher who does not have the required minimum 4 events in the file as of the entry closing date.

So, if you plan on the Syracuse World Tournament and think your required tournaments will be borderline, make sure that your Charter officers have assigned someone to report the results of every NHPA sanctioned tournament in a timely manner. If you are in doubt, you can mail a request for your printout to NatStats. You must include a self-addressed stamped envelope for the return of the data. The address of NatStats can be found on page 3.

The following 50-40-30-20-10 rankings show the top Nat Stat averages for Men, Women, Elder Men, Junior Boys and Girls as of October 1, 1993. For all but the juniors, only pitchers with at least 2 tournaments reported between 10/1/92 and 10/1/93 are shown. Since results are posted nearly every day, one has to expect some movement on these lists especially for those individuals who show 4 or less tournaments. If you see something that appears to be out of line, you are encouraged to contact NatStats.

## *Regional Big Success*

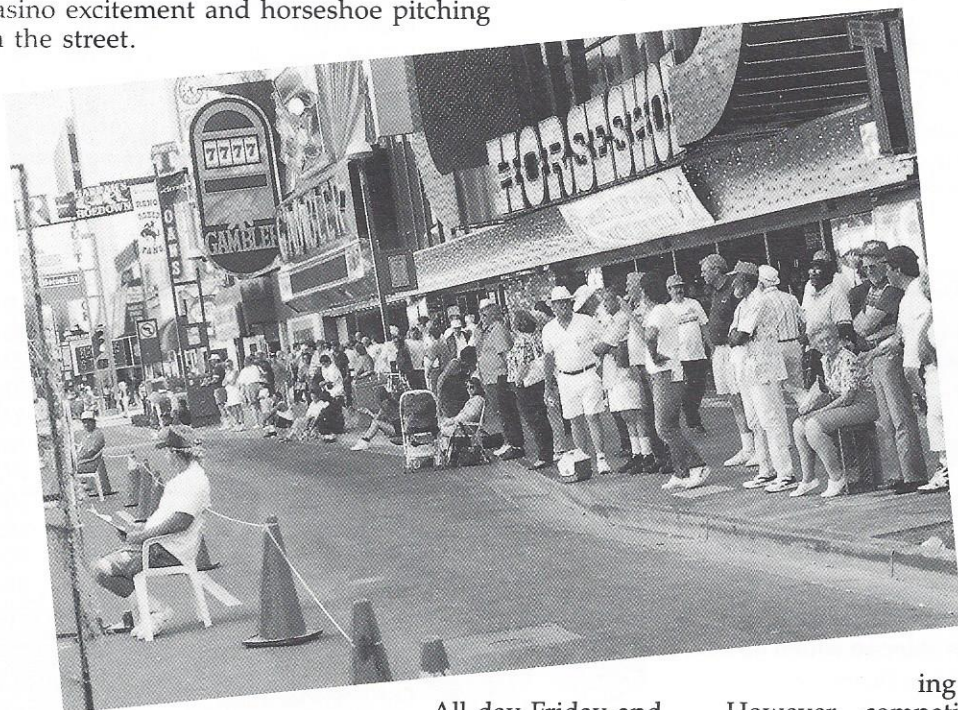
Reno, Nevada, billed as "The Biggest Little City in the World" played host to the 1993 Southwest Pacific Zone Regional Horseshoe Pitching Tournament on June 18-20. Pitchers from six states took part in the three day event which was held as part of the annual Country Junction Days. The city wide festivities included the Reno Rodeo, Chili Cook-offs, parades, western superstar concerts, casino excitement and horseshoe pitching in the street.

the street centerline. In the middle sat the trailer, turned computer room for the event with three 40' courts on one side and three 30' courts on the other side. Temporary barriers were put out the full length of the courts to prevent people from cutting across the courts as they headed for another casino to better their luck.

The top six 30' and top six 40' entrants pitched a double round robin on the portable courts Saturday afternoon and Sunday. Spectators lined the street as they realized there was another game in town. Unfortunately, the city didn't provide bleachers, but many people used the curb or found a chair. The spectators were lucky, they could find shade. The pitchers were out in the hot sun where the blacktop baked, bringing surface temperatures to nearly 120 degrees. The synthetic clay help up pretty good, though it did need some cooling from time to time. In fact, so did the pitchers who between games found shade by mingling a few minutes with the crowd to answer questions about the game.

The hot weather and unusual conditions of street pitching no doubt played a big role in keeping percentages below normal averages.

However, competition was keen and the spectators were amazed by the skill of the pitchers and particularly impressed by the demonstrations of Don Titcomb, who came from Kentucky to participate. When it was all over, two pitchers, Don Gregson and Sharon Paddock, had qualified for the 1994 National Championship to be held in Syracuse, New York during the World Tournament. Better than 50% of all entrants shared in part of the \$5,000 purse.



All day Friday and

Saturday morning, horseshoe competition took place on the 24 clay courts in Evans Park, next to the University of Nevada at Reno. After a Saturday morning parade down Virginia Street, the main gaming street of the city, a block long section of the street was barricaded and six Vegas style portable courts were set up in front of the biggest top name casinos. The courts, brought from Las Vegas by Don Weaver, were set up end to end down

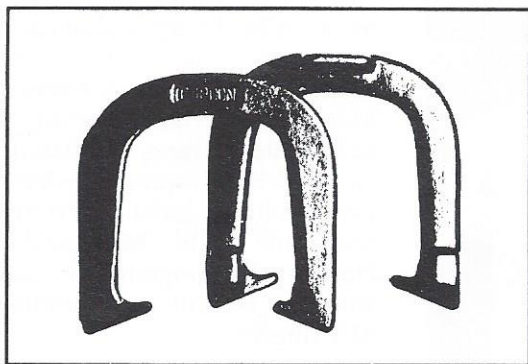

# WANTED Regional Tournament Bids

1993 saw only six Regional Tournaments held and one of them, the Iowa Central event was all but washed out by days of heavy rain. The NHPA wants the Regional Tournament concept to grow where hopefully one day the National Championship might include more pitchers than just 16 and perhaps become an event held at a time and location separate from the World Tournament. For this to happen, we will have to see more competition in the bidding process and some years of successful support by the pitching membership.

While we only had six bids this first year and are pleased with the results, we want to have a full eight Regional Tournaments in 1994. It is a simple process to bid. No minimum amount of money has to be bid, but an added purse to the 80% return of entry fees certainly will help your bid and go a long way toward bringing greater participation if you are a host. You have to crown a 40' champion and a 30' champion who will qualify for the National Championship tourney the following year. The top 40' group cannot be mixed. The top 30' group can mix all categories of 30' pitchers. All groups below these two top groups can mix gender and distance, if you want. Regional Tournaments must be open to any NHPA member who has pitched in at least 4 sanctioned events in the twelve months preceding entry and has this verified by NatStats along with the entering average.

Bids for 1994 are being solicited now. We would like to be able to select the eight 1994 sites by the time the NHPA Executive council meets in January. Don't wait, contact Donnie Roberts or Dave Loucks now if you have questions or need a copy of the bid guidelines. Better yet, send us your bid now! Latecomers will have a chance only if we don't get previous acceptable bids from your Region.

A new horseshoe pitching video, *The Basics of Horseshoe Pitching*. This video, sponsored by St. Pierre Horseshoes, is intended for the new pitcher, schools, libraries, park recreation directors or the individual who might want to just learn more about the game. This could also include long time pitchers who have some pitching faults or are new to organized horseshoe pitching.

*The Basics of Horseshoe Pitching* is aimed at the retail market, but will be available through NHPA game related sales distributors. It should be on the market by the end of the year at a price of less than \$15.

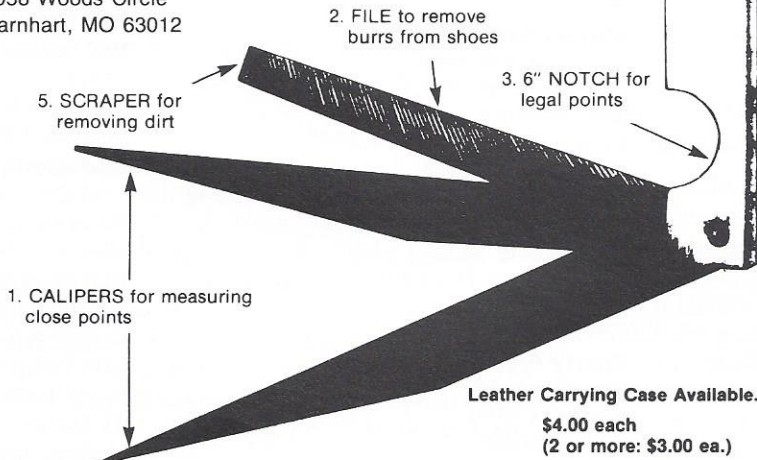

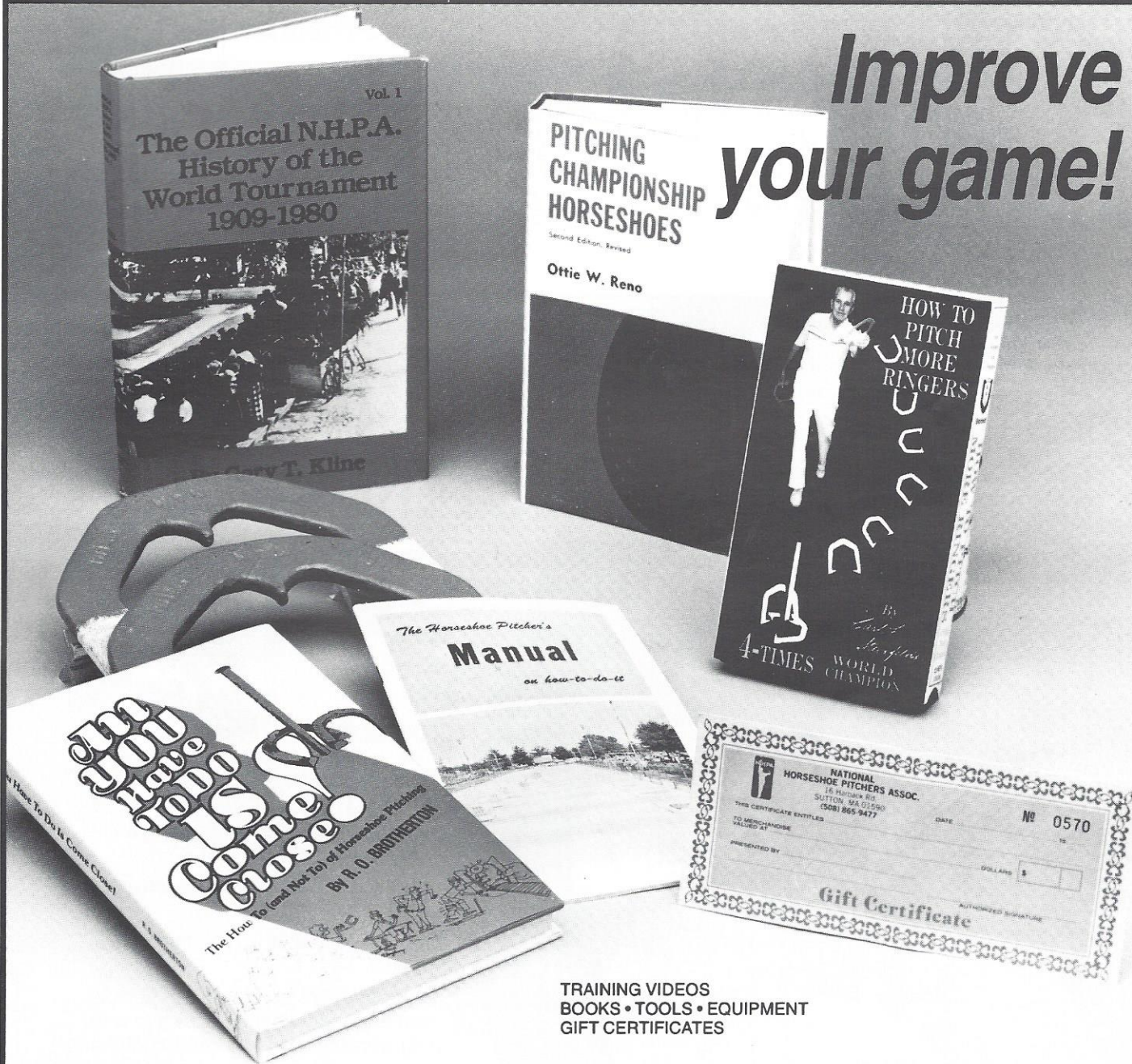

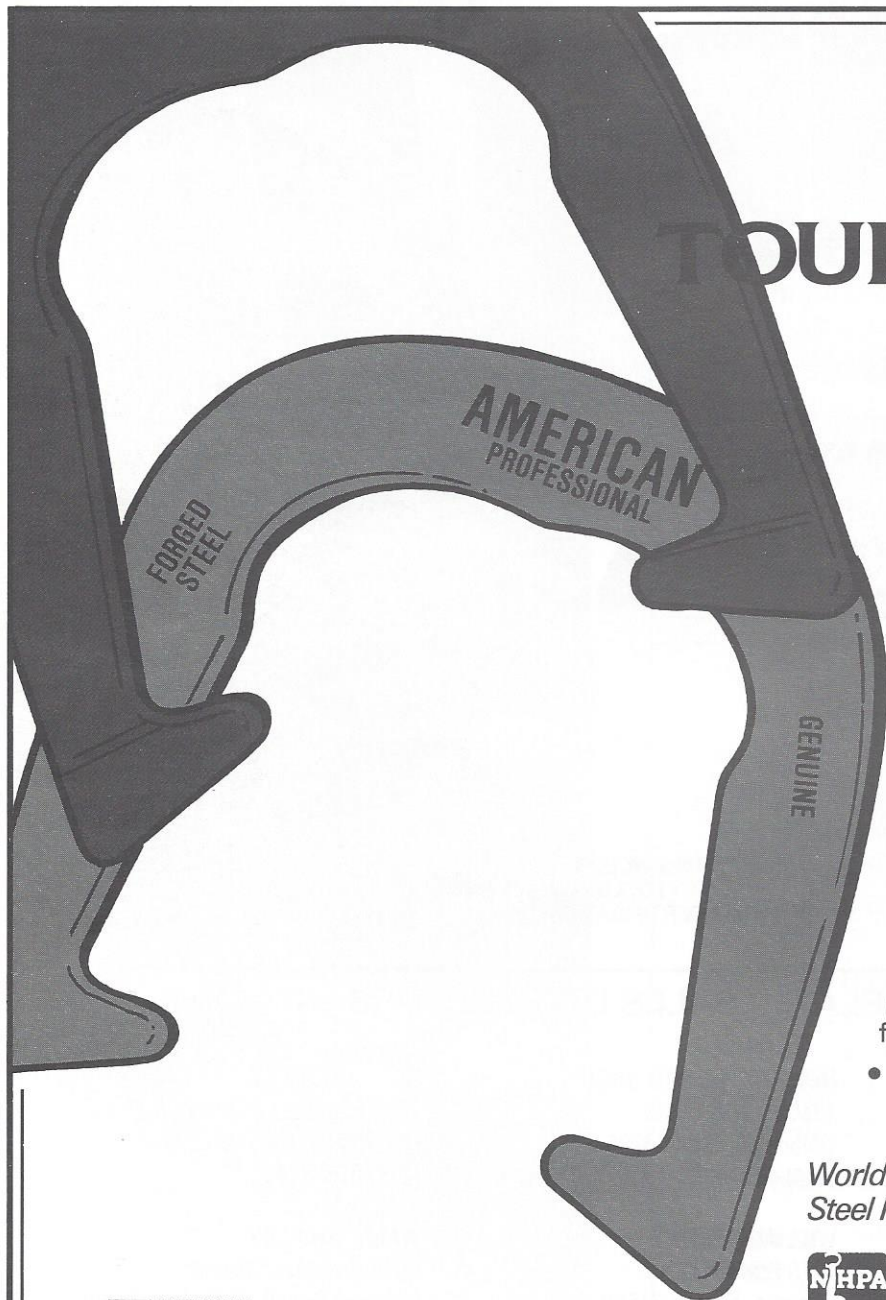
