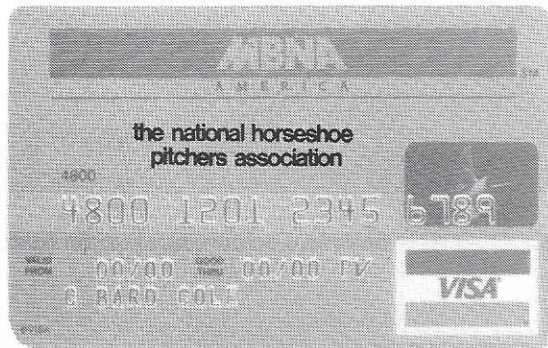

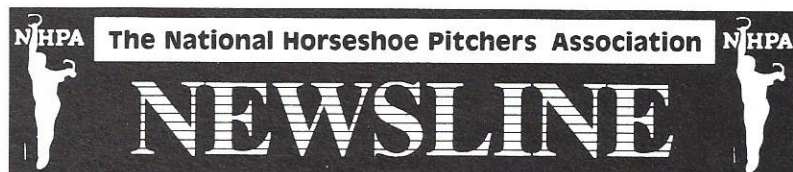

# President's Message

Every World Tournament host extends an invitation to what they believe will be the best ever event for the NHPA. Most go to great lengths to please the pitchers and the NHPA officials who run the tournament. Generally, it is a local club or charter that pulls things together at a contracted site. This year it was a bit different. The new Perry club was involved, as was the Georgia Regional Director and some members—but the real glue that brought this year's World together was provided by the Georgia National Fairgrounds themselves.

For all the applause given several past World Tournament sites, the 1995 event, in the minds of most observers, topped them all. The NHPA provided new portable courts and rubber walkways, but the Georgia National Fairgrounds & Agricenter provided the best facilities and working support seen in recent memory. Reaves Arena not only housed the courts but provided ample space for booths of future hosts, bidder displays, sales booths, photos, results boards, check-in, computer, press and administration offices with the greatest overview of the courts ever. There were both indoor and outdoor practice courts, indoor recreation facilities for

juniors and the exercise crowd, a lake for boating and fishing, grass RV spots with hookups, meeting rooms for small gatherings, the convention and a wonderful Awards Banquet, all within a minute or two walk of each other.

Michael A. Froehlich, Executive Director of the Fairgrounds deserves a great deal of credit for his interest in horseshoe pitching and support to bring the NHPA to his Perry, Georgia facility. He had previously been involved with horseshoes at the Ohio Fair. Once the commitment to the Georgia Fairgrounds was made, I visited the site and began arrangements with the man who made it all come together, Don Nelson, sales and marketing director. When I arrived 5 days prior to the tournament, Don had nearly everything in place. Fairground personnel were at our call, especially Don, who was there to help us from early morning to lights out. I wonder if the man got any sleep. The help, cooperation and facilities provided us was second to none. The Georgia National Fairgrounds and staff have set a new standard to which future World sites will be compared. On behalf of the NHPA, I thank them for everything and hope that we can one day return.

## *Highlights of the Tournament and Convention*

New NHPA portable courts with 18" wide, 50' long rubber runners as walkways sat atop the concrete floor of Reaves Arena. Charter flags hung from side rails above which spectators viewed the competition below. The wide interior hallways were busy with activity, product and souvenir sales, booths of future hosts and bidders, craft displays, tours, a special awards and photo area and of course, the ever crowded results posting boards.

While not initially expected, the Championship Men and Women Finalists found themselves playing for additional prize money. Fred Rich, fellow pitcher and promoter of Team Tuff-E-Nuff added \$2,200 in bonus money. \$1,100. went into each of the two championship groups with \$800 to the winners and three \$100 bonus prizes for special game performance. If you were a member of the player supported promotional team Tuff-E-Nuff, there was a chance for an even bigger bonus prize.

The tournament itself ran very smoothly, scheduled shifts were on time and the air conditioned facility was very comfortable. Scorekeepers were not as difficult to find as last year, but we still had some problems on a few shifts. The Perry club did train some local people in scorekeeping clinics and it helped. The new scoresheet seemed to be very well accepted and it certainly facilitated work in the computer room. The basic pitching format used for the second consecutive year and approved for next is well supported by the pitchers and immensely helps the tournament flow.

The Convention held on Sunday, July 30th was called to order at 8:10 a.m. 133 charter delegate votes out of a possible 160 were represented. Canada had one vote for the World Tournament. All charters except Alaska, Arizona, Southern California, Hawaii, Idaho, Maine, Mississippi, Montana, Western Nebraska, Northern & Southern Utah,

Vermont, West Virginia and Wyoming were represented.

St. Louis had withdrawn their bid, sighting a lack of sponsor interest, leaving just Perry, Georgia and Kitchener, Ontario, Canada in the running for the 1997 World which Canada won by a count of 114-20.

There were five proposals for changes to the playing rules all detailed in a previous issue of this magazine. All were approved, the first three by a count of 133-0, #4 by 112-21, #5 by 106-27. Four NHPA Officers ran for re-election unopposed and were put back into office by acclamation.

The delegates approved retaining the same format of play for the 1996 World. A delegate proposed changing the fifteen class games from 40 to 50 shoes. This received majority voice approval of the delegates, but in the week following, much opposition to the change was expressed by players. The tournament committee shall review this aspect and its effect on the tournament reporting its decision in a later issue. It was accepted that alternate pitch would not be used and in games with a pacer, the pacer shall always pitch last.

The convention concluded with an exciting announcement that an agreement had been reached in principle with Dr. Jack Freeman of Nashville whereby the Jack Freeman 38 court complex and land in Joelton, Tennessee, could be donated to a charitable NHPA entity (yet to be formed) and become the site of our long sought Hall of Fame. There are several legal and tax conditions to be met before this could happen but the delegates approved pursuing the project. President Dave Loucks will later this year, again meet with Jack Freeman and attorneys. A comprehensive report of the planned project and its progress will be published in a later issue of *Newsline*. The shortest convention in recent history ended with adjournment at 11:36 a.m.

It is my belief that your format of play should be a club decision suited to fit your individual situation. I do agree that handicapping and count-all tends to be encouragement for beginners and lower percentage pitchers.

Our National Publicity Director, Bob Champion of Colorado gave a fine presentation of how that State conducts their annual League Championship tournament, with a ques-

tion and answer session. Some interest seemed evident and hopefully will entice other Charters to consider this type of event for their sanctioned leagues.

My compliments to the Georgia Agricenter staff and employees, all of whom showed us true southern hospitality. I, and I'm sure all others, enjoyed and appreciated their efforts and fine facilities. The facilities left no room for any complaints. Georgia—you did good!! and we'll probably come back, if invited again.

Congratulations to Canada for getting the bid for 1997. Having seen their facilities, I believe you will like them.

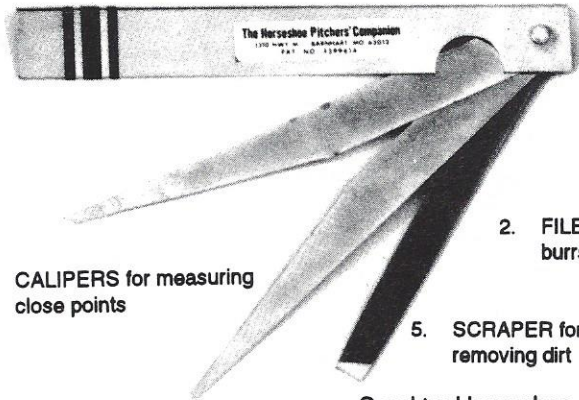

# 2nd VP Reports On World

In Perry, Georgia we had a Rules Committee meeting with rather poor attendance. Discussion centered around the lack of short distance pitchers in some Charters. One suggestion was to lower the age limit of the Elder Class to 65 years old, another was to hold more MIXED tournaments. MIXED being identified as mixed distance, not mixed gender. This would mean that all pitchers are seeded by their percentages only.

These were only suggestions and nothing concrete was decided. At present I have no rule changes in my possession, but we have until December 31, 1996 to turn them in.

Being one of the persons responsible for running a shift, starting on time, scorekeepers, runners, judges, etc., etc. I found it difficult to seat scorekeepers. Perhaps if we raised the scorekeeping fees to \$1 per player at World Tournaments people would want to recoup their money. Perry did help us by training some local folks to keep score, but there still were not enough for each shift. We had very few A and B Class players in those scorekeeping chairs. It would be nice to see some more of you top pitchers participate with the running of our World Tournaments.

Judging was also a responsibility of mine. Here again we had to beg time after time. I'll say it again, I wish the top classes would assume some of this responsibility. A set of judging guidelines were passed out at the State Officers' and Regional Directors' meeting. Anyone interested in receiving a copy of this, send me a note. They were developed to assist judging at any event and were developed to take the stigma out of judging.

I would like to thank all of the help I received with the various shifts. Gene Burlingame and Janet Van Hagen!! You guys were great! Thank you to all those who volunteered to judge, especially Omar Blacketer. This man judged two consecutive sessions everyday he was available. He has judged at 15 consecutive World Tournaments. The man is an inspiration to all of us.

# Regional Director's Report

The 1995 Regional Director meeting was held at the World Tournament in Perry, GA on Saturday, July 29 at 2:30, there were 18 in attendance.

Rick Rebman from the State of Oregon and Regional Director for the Charters of Washington, Oregon and Idaho was announced as the winner of the Regional Director of the Year Award. Rick was not in attendance, the meeting time conflicted with his pitching schedule, the award would be presented at the Awards Banquet.

I had four items on the agenda for discussion after which the meeting would be open to the floor.

1. Ron Latiolasis, RD for Louisiana, could not attend but he is looking for help in running school Physical Education classes on horseshoe pitching. Earl Waggy explained the program that he helped set up for a school and he will contact Ron to help him out in any way he can.

2. Tournament results. I asked the RDs for their input on tracking tournament results to make sure all are reported back to NatStats. Paul Stewart and Al Sandham reported that they are sending them in on computer disk and it seems to be working fine. Jim Haupt suggested that Oliver Smith of NatStats and I get on the same E-Mail to help speed to flow of information. That will be taken under consideration. After more discussion it was left that I will have Oliver send me a list of any tournaments not reported and I will pass that information on to the Regional Directors for follow up as to the reason they were not reported.

3. Just as a point of record I felt it necessary to point out to the RDs that receipts are required for all expenses and must be sent to me for approval. I then pass them on the NHPA Secretary/Treasurer for payment.

4. State Doubles Patch. To clear up some confusion on the doubles patches it was discussed as to which patch goes to the State Doubles Champion and which to the State Doubles Class. Because there is only one patch for State Doubles it was decided that the State Doubles

Champion shall receive the State Doubles patch and all other doubles classes in the State Tournament shall receive the Doubles Class patch. Jim Haupt made the recommendation the year be removed from all patches but the State patches. It was pointed out by Al Sandham that it was also discussed at last year's RD meeting and the general feeling was that the membership prefers to have the year on all patches. I informed the RDs that I will again cut down on the patch order and if I should run short at the end of '96 there could be a two to three week delay in shipping for late fall tournaments.

The meeting was then turned over to those present for their suggestions. Bob Champion asked if there was any spot checking of shoes being done on the courts. My response was that I have done some spot checks but mostly looking for those pitchers that did not have their name checked off as having been checked. All were found to have legal shoes and all said they went through the line and had their shoes checked. Al Sandham suggested that each shoe checked be marked with a paint or dye to make spot checking easier. After some discussion it was dropped. Early Waggy recommended that only the winner of each class should have their shoes checked. After some discussion I agreed to bring this to the next NHPA Officers Meeting.

NHPA 2nd Vice President Casey Sluys joined the meeting to thank the Regional Directors for their response to a letter he sent to all of them asking for their help and recommendations for good judges. He also asked for their comments on the judging guidelines he passed out to all the judges. All agreed that it was a good form to follow and needed.

There was some discussion on the new courts, the World Tournament site bidders and the late schedules. I recommended that the place for their concerns was on the convention floor. Meeting was adjourned at 4:00 with a thanks to all in attendance.

# Hall of Fame Report

The Annual NHPA Hall of Fame Awards Banquet was held in Perry, GA on July 30, 1995. **Ed Quigley** of New Jersey served as emcee. During the evening, two special guests were recognized. Ed Quigley introduced **Frank Hiendlmayer** of Ohio, who was the oldest participant in this year's World Tournament. At the young age of 94 years, Frank participated in the Men's Open in Class H-1. Earl Winston introduced **Edna Moon**, Pete Moon's widow, who came all the way from Australia to attend the 1995 World Tournament.

**Earl Winston**, Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, made the induction speech for the only 1995 inductee who was not able to be present. This was **Louis Dean**, a left handed pitcher from California, who also served as a NHPA first vice-president in the late 1940s and then NHPA president in the early 1950s. His pitching records were highlighted by his World Tournament performance in the 1954 six man playoffs at Murray, Utah.

**Donnie Roberts** spoke on behalf of **Vince Yannetti** of New Jersey, highlighting his performances in the organizational and promotional area of our sport. Vince once served as manager of a contest that would pay \$1,000,000 to anyone able to pitch a ringer from a distance of fifty feet. This was held in view of 100,000 people at a race track. Vince has been active on both the national and local level.

In the player category, **Len Lipovsky** was proud to introduce his son, **Dale**, and give some highlights of Dale's pitching career. Dale has won three world titles, with two of them coming back to back in 1982 and 1983. By the stats given us by Len, it is clear to see that Dale has been an outstanding pitcher for many years, both on the local and world tournament scene. His averages were quite often in the very high 70% range and many times into the 80% bracket.

The final inductee of the evening was **Kevin Cone** of Iowa. **Bob Champion**, the NHPA Publicity Director was pleased to do the honors. Bob especially highlighted Kevin's performance in his home state and stated

that Kevin has never lost a game to another Iowa pitcher. At the World Tournament level, Kevin has always placed high and grabbed two runner up spots, one in Ainsworth, NE and the other in Spearfish, SD. His one World Championship came in 1992 in Columbus, OH.

Prior to the Hall of Fame induction ceremony, the NHPA Achievement Awards were presented and also the Stokes Award. The evening was topped off by some excellent entertainment by The Girlfriends. They were assisted during their performance by Ed Quigley, Art Tyson, Vince Yannetti and Bob Champion, who all performed admirably, much to the delight of the audience.

During the evening, it came to mind that our Hall of Fame inductions are much different than when my wife Vicki, and Ellis Cobb stood out on the horseshoe courts in California in 1970 and were inducted in a brief ceremony. Not many years later, Carl Steinfeldt was inducted just before the championship trophies were presented. Being a little nervous, Carl asked for his wife Bea to come and stand beside him. My hope is that everyone appreciates the quality of the program we now use to present our highest honors to the worthy recipients.

On the Tuesday after the banquet, some members of the Hall of Fame Committee met and discussed several areas of concern. We didn't have a quorum in attendance, but those present were of a mind to have only twelve names on the nomination list for each category. The members of the screening committee appointed by the NHPA president a few years ago are responsible for limiting the list. They will be considering the removal of some names who have been on the list of nominees for many years and have received little or no support for the past several years.

The most exciting news concerning the Hall of Fame is that at last we could go public with a possible plan that may bring the NHPA an eventual permanent site for a Hall of Fame building. The delegates at the 1995 NHPA Convention gave permis-

sion for pursuing a plan whereby we may acquire the Jack Freeman Courts and some property at Joelton, TN, if all of the legal details can be worked out, whereby Dr. Freeman can make the donation. This will take some time and much additional research, but the delegates granted permission for the executive council to spend some funds to make the necessary studies. I'm sure that Dave Loucks will keep you informed of progress in future issues of *Newsline*.

Meanwhile, plans have been made to have another small Hall of Fame exhibit at the Iowa State Fair and I will be on my way to Des Moines just two days after arriving home from Perry, GA with what items I can get in my car. I certainly appreciate all of the help that the members of the Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association give in helping to set up the display and then to man the information table during the fair. This exhibit could not be done without their help.

# Francis and Snyder Win U.S. National Titles

1995 World Champions Alan Francis and Sue Snyder made a clean sweep in Perry as they also won the U.S. National Championships. Play took place on Sunday, July 30th between the NHPA Convention and Awards Banquet.

There were six 30' and seven 40' pitchers, each a winner or second place finisher in one of the 1994 Regional Tournaments. The NHPA awarded two plaques and \$1,550 in prize money. As an experiment to

keep the 40 point cancellation games from taking too much time, we tried a scoring method that has met with success in some charter play. That was to award each player one bonus point on every 4-dead call until one of the pitchers reached a score of 30 points after which the bonus point was stopped.

The Regional Tournament concept as we have tried it during the past three years has not worked to expectations. No new tournaments with

any significant prize money have developed and some Regionals have been poorly attended. As such, Regionals are being curtailed for 1996 as we attempt to devise a new method of determining who will play in the U.S. Nationals beginning in 1997 or perhaps 1998 as the 97 World will be held in Canada. Those players who won a 1995 Regional will be invited to Gillette for the last National Tournament under the current format.

# The World at Perry Georgia

*An overview  
of the 1995*

*World Tournament*

## **MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP**

The stage was set in late games of the Men's Championship for Blythedale, Missouri's Alan Francis and Brian Simmons from South Berwick, Maine to compete in the tournament's final game for the 1995 World title.

The gladiators were both 10 and 4 as game number 15 was scheduled to begin. Francis tied Simmons with a six-pack in the third inning, but Simmons took a 13-6 lead after 20. Both pitchers operated with close scoring efforts until Francis gained the advantage, 33-26 at the 56-shoe mark. In the next 12 innings, Simmons nailed four scoring ringers and one point to force a 39-39 tie after 82 shoes.

Simmons' single ringer in the final inning left Francis with a chance to win it all with two ringers or a ringer and a point and the four-time Junior champion and Men's champion in Spearfish in 1989 and 1993 was in position to win his third NHPA title and first indoor crown.

At the start of the final game Francis did not know that defending champion Walter Ray Williams, Jr. had lost his last two outings. Francis does rate Williams as the best in the World and the man to beat in all tournaments.

It was a pressure-packed moment on that last pitch with the score tied at 39-all. Francis had won his previous two championships with a combined total of two points.

Williams from Stockton, California was in the hunt until his final two games when fourth place John Kapnis from Massachusetts and 1992 World Champion Kevin Cone from Iowa registered consecutive wins over the six-time champion. In the 12th game Kapnis also figured into the final picture by handing Simmons his fourth loss.

Simmons reached the final game against Francis with impressive victories over Art Tyson, New York, 42-17, and three-time World champion Dale Lipovsky, Minnesota.

Simmons is not a newcomer to horseshoes. He is the 9-time Maine State champion and has won the New England championship four

times including the last three years. His highest overall tournament percentage has been 84. He has won five Maine boys' titles.

High game for the tournament was registered by Williams, a 92.1 effort against Mike DiMartino in the second game of the round robin. Williams suffered through a 59.7 game in the tournament opener, won by Charles Meridith, Kentucky, who shot only a 62.9 in winning. Thereafter, Walter Ray changed to the 1¾ turn and in the next 14 games it almost brought him a seventh Men's Championship, only to fall short with the loss of the last two games.

## **WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP**

Records fell in Perry, Georgia when Kentucky's Sue Snyder captured her third World Championship in the final game against Canada's Sylvianne Moisan, 40-27.

Eight records were broken and two were tied as the contestants pitched a 130-shoe game, which incidently happens to be second high in World play.

Sue's victory, which gave her a perfect 15-0 record for the tournament was a come-from-behind win for the defending champion, who trailed 18-4 after 54 shoes. The duo followed with 11 "four deads," tying the 1985 mark set by Vicki Winston, Missouri and Fran Carnahan, Pennsylvania.

Snyder steadily chipped at Moisan's lead until she took a 23-21 lead at 92 shoes. The winner then steadily pulled away, taking a commanding advantage, 30-21 after 98 shoes. Moisan managed only two scoring ringers from then to the end when Snyder, from Madisonville, Kentucky, scored three-ringings-three at 130 shoes to nail the victory.

Other new records established by the two contestants for a single game are as follows. The old records all made in 1983 are indicated by parenthesis.

Ringer percentage, loser—Moisan 86.9 (Tari Powell, Illinois 86.5; Ringers, winner—Snyder 116 (Debby Michaud, Massachusetts 114); Ringers, loser—Moisan 113 (Powell

109); Double ringers, loser—Moisan 49 (Powell 47); Total ringers—Moisan and Snyder 229 (Michaud and Powell 223); Double ringers—Moisan and Snyder 100 (Michaud and Powell 98); Cancelled ringers—208 (Michaud and Powell 202); Four dead—Moisan and Snyder 40 (Michaud and Powell 39).

The other record tied was double ringers by the game winner, Snyder with 51, set by Michaud in 1983.

Although Moisan finished second in the tournament, she did have the high percentage for the 15 games played with 85.49%. Snyder completed the round robin schedule with 84.19.

## SENIOR MEN CHAMPIONSHIP

The former California Flash, Don Titcomb, joins another lefty, Carl Steinfeldt from Florida with three World titles in three championship divisions—Men's, Intermediates and Seniors in the 77 year history of the NHPA.

Now called "Colonel Don," the popular Kentucky lefty nailed the senior crown at Perry, Georgia with a 7-2 record and 63.83 percentage, just another one of his top performances during a long and illustrious career in horseshoes.

Titcomb won his World title in 1960 with a 33-2 record and 84.9% at Muncie, Indiana, and added the intermediate title at Pleasanton, California in 1988, shooting 76.6 with a 94% game.

Don is the current Kentucky State Champion winning the title in 1993 and 1994. He won the California title eight times. Titcomb has a back problem and possibly will go to a shorter distance if it continues to bother his pitching.

## SENIOR WOMEN CHAMPIONSHIP

On an informal invitation from Georgia's Iris Sandham at Las Vegas, Teddy Guillotte from Sonora, California struck gold at the 1995 World Tournament with a fantastic 70.11

ringer percentage leading to a 5-0 record to edge Ohio's Helen Eakins by one game to win the Senior Women's Championship.

The class has been revived after two years off the record sheet. Marge Spray from Clearwater, Florida won three consecutive titles in 1990, 1991 and 1992. She has not pitched in the World since that time due to medical problems.

The Senior women will have their own class next year if 32 entries are received. If entries are less than 32 they will qualify for the Senior finals as part of the open women prelims.

## ELDERS CHAMPIONSHIP

The name of Frank Bohun from Erie, Pennsylvania may become a courtside name in Elders horseshoe pitching.

He not only won both the championship and Class A titles in convincing fashion, but labeled himself each year as the "Old Timer" to beat at future World Tournaments. He now has enough prize money to finance the trip to Gillette, Wyoming next year...and maybe have enough left over to try his luck at the gambling tables in nearby Deadwood, South Dakota during his stay in the west.

Bohun won Class A with a 14-1 record and whopping 83.50 percentage, but followed with a super win in the Elders Championship, closing with a 5-0 record and an impressive 84.21. That's pitching.

Even if the 40 foot pitchers frown on the "30s," they must have some respect for the Erie "youngster" making waves in the Elders.

## BOYS CHAMPIONSHIP

In 1992 Glen "Red" Henton, former World class pitcher from Iowa was heard to exclaim—"This boy has World class written all over him."

The boy was Joseph Smith from Glad Brook, Iowa, the 1995 World Champion.

Fourteen-year old Joseph engi-

neered his Henton 1¼ turn to the title with a perfect 5-0 record and 76.54 ringer percentage. Smith, a third World Tournament veteran, finished fourth last year with an 8-6 record and 69.46 and the year before he was ninth with 54.9%.

This year he closed one game in front of South Dakota's Michael Newton (4-1, 75.13) and two ahead of Virginia's Branson Miller (3-2, 78.48). Lenwood Conner, Jr., who finished third last year with a 10-4 record and 73.39, dropped to fifth this year closing with a 1-4 record and 67.29%. Georgia's Lee Presley and Allen Keen, Indiana finished with 1-4 records.

Smith has been the indoor and outdoor State Champion the last three years and will be back next year at Gillette, Wyoming to compete against all this year's finalists except Conner, who was the Boys' Class A winner this year.

Smith's 12-year old brother, Daniel, finished second in Class D.

## GIRLS CHAMPIONSHIP

Seventeen-year old junior veteran Penny Steinke from Waukesha, Wisconsin, closed with a perfect 5-0 record to win the girls' title.

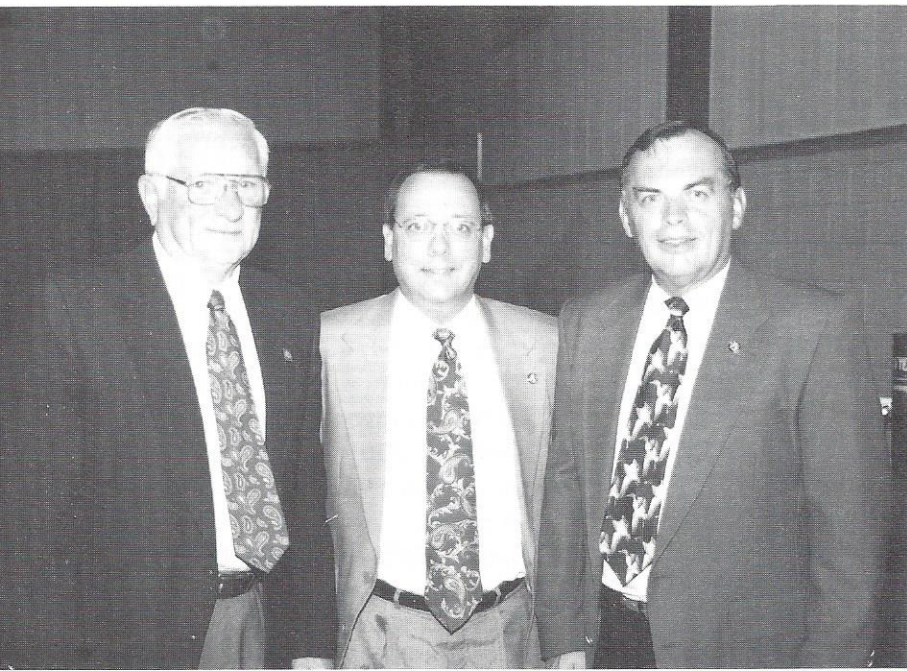
Penny finished one game in front of Kentucky's Becky Kemper, who pushed the champion to the limit before losing, 42-39. Steinke closed with a 59.02 overall percentage.

Canada's Crystal Curtis, the 1993 champion, finished third, losing to Steinke, 42-9, during the 6-person round robin schedule.

"I felt confident this year," Penny said, after finishing third last year. I started preparing for the World in June, but did some serious pitching the two weeks before coming to Georgia."

It was a triple win for the Steinke family this year. Father Tom, won his N2 division and sister Pam took the Women's Class C.

Penny is the state defending Junior champion.
