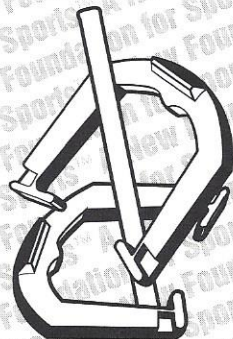

President's Message

It was twelve years between World Tournaments in Ainsworth, Nebraska, but if you attended both times, very little change would have been noticed. The town is still about the same small size while the hearts of the townsfolk still remain "BIG." Just as they were in 1986, Ainsworth in 1998 were great hosts to the World Tournament opening their homes, hearts and hospitality to the NHPA as nearly a thousand entrants, with family members, converged on this town of 1800. Forty outdoor courts were made ready by probably the largest and most dedicated work crew the NHPA has ever encountered. They were there every day, all day and into the night. Between pitching shifts, the courts were completely swept, stakes painted and an occasional stake replaced. The gates, information and support trailers were manned, EMTs on sight and free shuttle service to anywhere in town was

always available. The volunteerism of the Ainsworth people was second to none and the NHPA is deeply appreciative for without Ainsworth stepping in after Morgantown withdrew, the NHPA may not have had a 1998 World Tournament site.

The one thing Ainsworth could not control was the weather. We had our share of light to strong wind and rain. The tournament was delayed several hours three different times, but again, marvelous work by the ground crew had the courts ready for pitching within an hour of rain stoppage even though it was soggy going on the grounds outside the courts. Pitching percentages were not always what some expected but we did have fun, we did finish at the scheduled time and we did crown World Champions in seven divisions plus nearly 60 different classes. Complete results can be found in this Special World Tournament issue.

Non-Pitching and Convention Highlights

WEBSITE...Only in its second year, but the NHPA website was in daily operation for the benefit of all attendees and interested parties following the tournament at home. Under the capable guidance of Paul Stewart and Duane Goodrich, this year's website results posting added live photo coverage, quick e-mail exchange and the opportunity to get out to the public a change in the World phone number. The scheduled phone number was inadvertently installed three weeks prior at the farm of two octogenarians who initially couldn't understand why they were getting all these strange calls for information on horseshoes. When you consider that we received an average of 1200 "hits" a day, you have to know that the NHPA website had a regular following and received a lot of favorable comments. Congratulations to Paul and Duane who plan even more improvements and surprises for us at Greenville, Ohio in 1999.

Bismarck Wins 2000...Three very capable and competitive sites had set up booths to gather delegate support as they bid for the year 2000 World Tournament. Bismarck, North Dakota; Gillette, Wyoming; and Midland, Michigan each had sharp looking booths ably manned by members of the Visitors & Convention Bureau and horseshoe pitchers from the areas. It was a friendly tug of war as each bidder expelled the virtues of their pitching site and city. At the end of the first week, it seemed to be anyone's guess as to who would win. On Convention Sunday, a speaker from each site gave a last overview of their bids and voting immediately followed. No site received the required majority on the first ballot which was 36 for Midland, 40 for Gillette, and 56 for Bismarck. Because it pulled the fewest votes, Midland was dropped from the second ballot which when counted had 90 votes for Bismarck, 42 for Gillette. Our thanks to all three sites. We hope that Midland and Gillette will be back in the future.

Foundation Contributions Still Slow...While much better than last year, member support and contributions to the NHPF remain well below our needs and expectations. As a fund raiser with \$5.00 of the \$15.00 ticket price going to the Foundation, only 222 tickets were sold for the Awards Banquet

in Ainsworth. After paying the bill, a \$1,030 gain was realized. During the entire two weeks of the tournament, only 36 individual donations totaling \$2,045 were received. Unfortunately, no donations came from the regulars of the championship groups save for Junior Steve Morris. With the exception of Walter Ray Williams Jr., who previously gave \$2,000, the NHPF still hopes adult championship pitchers who win the most, expect the most and perhaps stand to one day be in the Hall of Fame will come through with contributions. Maybe a Junior shall lead them. Thanks to Steve and the other 35 contributors who are acknowledged later in this issue.

Convention...Only 39 of 52 charters were represented. They carried 131 delegate votes. All officers up for election were running un-opposed and returned to office. As expected, proposal No. 2 about a tournament membership card with *Newsline* included and a league membership card without the magazine drew the most discussion. There was, however, some unexpected lengthy discussion on a couple of other issues which were amended on the floor before being voted on. Refer to the March/April *Newsline*, page 12-13, for the original proposals. The following is the delegate voting results.

Your RD letters this past twelve months have been very helpful in preparing our Regional Director Program's *Newsline* reports. My thanks to all RDs and Assistant RDs. You are a significant link between the National office and your local charters. Keep up the good work.

The "patch" program over-runs have been reduced to nearly an absolute minimum, creating considerable savings. If you need extra patches, be sure to send your order...I can fill

them in 1 to 2 weeks.

I want to again ask RDs and Assistant RDs to encourage charters to establish an internet website for the purpose of posting tournament schedules, tournament results and other charter information. We want to provide "links" to these websites from our NHPA website and promote increased viewer traffic to the charter websites. Help is available for any charter in need of assistance. Free software is available for reporting data to NatStats and on membership reports to NHPA Secretary/Treasurer (in the event charters do not presently have software available).

Several charters are distributing copies of the NHPA Official Playing Rules along with membership cards. This is a good idea for improving upon an "informed membership."

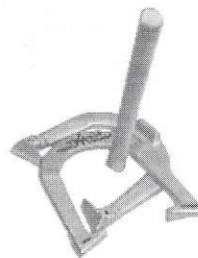

1998 State Officers Meeting

The 1998 State Officers Meeting was held Saturday, July 25 at 10:00 a.m. in Ainsworth, Nebraska, with twenty-six state officers present. The meeting was chaired by NHPA 4th Vice President Bonnie Seibold and Secretary/Treasurer Dick Hansen.

The meeting opened with discussion on tournament results being sent to NatStats without membership card numbers for each tournament entrant. Glenn Jamieson asked that the Charter Officer responsible for sending results to NatStats make an effort to make sure there is a card number for each tournament entrant. Glenn also made the suggestion that a fee be charged back to the charters for each member sent in without a number. Paul Stewart and Duane Goodrich made the suggestion that each charter be sent a copy of the NHPA software program that is not at this time using some sort of program to report both membership and tournament results. Dick Hansen said he will see to it that it is sent to all charters not reporting on disk or by e-mail.

Paul Stewart asked what needs to be done when a member moves from one state to another. Glenn responded that he needs to be informed when this happens so as not to end up with two files for the same member.

There was some discussion on the safety of scorekeepers and if they should be moved to the one end of the court. No recommendation was made. Ken Jaeger, WI, explained the new method of keeping score being used without scorekeepers and how the players keep their own.

Dick Dvorak, MN asked Glenn to explain how NatStats handles the difference between league and tournament results. Glenn explained that the software program he is using treats both the same and each is considered an event. A Bylaw change to be voted on at convention will correct this if passed. It was also recommended that it should be amended so that leagues should be a minimum of 400 shoes.

Bud Shardine, UT voiced his support for the proposed Bylaw change to include *Newsline* with membership

dues and Dave Loucks explained how the new dues structure would work and effect each member. Dave also expressed his concern that the NHPA membership is uninformed because only 20 percent of the membership now subscribe to *Newsline*.

There was some discussion on what the requirements should be to enter a

Charter State Tournament. Dick stated that each Charter should have a minimum number of tournaments pitched in their state to qualify for their state. This helps to support the Charter and its tournaments.

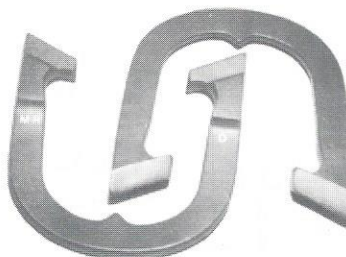

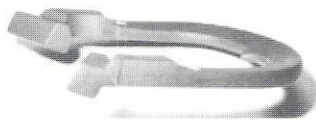

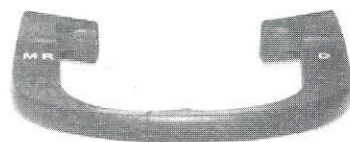
The edges of the Mr. D. Shoe are not round like they are on other shoes. The extra, extra heavy heels tend to keep the heels down as the shoe rings the stake, giving the square edges, and the calks on the bottom of the heels a better chance to grab the pit surface, or the other shoes on the stake, to prevent the shoe from turning around. This will lessen the chance of it being knocked off the stake.

An ideal flip has the shoe coming to the stake as it has just leveled out. Sometimes our aim is off just enough that the point, or heel, of the shoe will hit the stake as the shoe comes in. The points of the heel of the Mr. D. Shoe are at a slant, so that the first part of the shoe to hit the stake is on a plane with the bottom of the shoe. This forces the point of the shoe down, therefore; the extra, extra heavy heels on the Mr. D. Shoe will force the calks on the bottom of the shoe into the pit. The "dead soft" rating then entices the shoe to drop next to the stake for a point.

Because the heel of the Mr. D. Shoe is so heavy, sometimes the heel that doesn't hit the stake will jerk around the rear of the stake. This causes the other heel, that is now holding onto the pit surface, to hook the stake for a ringer as the shoe turns around the stake.

Shoes with hardened points, that hit the stake in this manner when flipped, have a tendency to jump away from the stake and spin to the rear, out of scoring range.

Shoes with blunt points, or shoes flipped with the slope of the heels going up, makes the top plane of the shoe to be the first part of the heel to hit the stake. This, more apt than not, will cause the shoe to flip over backwards and come to rest several inches from the stake - a lot of times out of scoring range.

The "live" NHPA website was set up early Saturday morning, July 18 at Ainsworth and experimental pictures and messages were exchanged with viewers "back home." WEBCAM shots were made throughout the tournament, first from ground level and later from above the courts on temporary

scaffolding. High temperatures and humidity were experienced on Monday, July 20, opening day of the tournament. Later in the week, on Thursday, heavy rain fell during mid-day, temporarily stopping play and causing cancellation of Junior class play. Juniors made up their lost time by pitching extra games on Friday and Saturday. The weather cooled off during first half of the second week, accompanied by occasional cloud covering.

All divisions completed scheduled play, thanks in large measure to the efforts of the Ainsworth ground keeping crews.

The website used three monitors to display data, e-mail, WEBCAM, and Photo Album pictures. Digital cameras recorded still shots for six photo albums and two Camcorders provided pictures for the WEBCAM.

The website averaged 1,200 "hits" from viewers each day of the tournament and many incoming ICQ and e-mail messages expressed appreciation for the website information. Most, but not all ICQ and e-mail messages were answered during the hectic two weeks. Apologies to those whose e-mail addresses were not returnable.

Paul Stewart received the NHPA Presidential Award for his many State and National contributions to horse-shoe pitching during the past year. Among his recognitions were his NHPA website efforts. Paul captured many pictures throughout the tournament on his digital camera, and most will be used throughout the coming fall and winter to enhance the website.

All tournament results are posted on the NHPA website, with complete details on all championship finals. Our website administrators are already planning improvements for next year's "live" NHPA website at Greenville, OH.

You have until December 31, 1998 to submit any rule change proposals. Please send them to me (address on page 3). Thank you all for the vote of confidence with my re-election to second Vice President. It will be my privilege to serve the NHPA for the next two years.

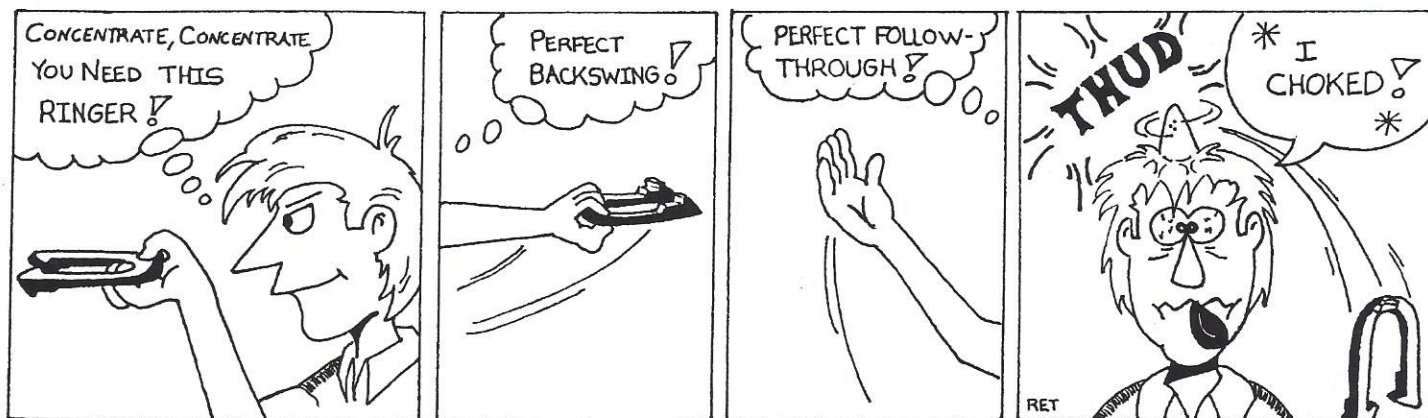

OVERVIEW

OF THE

SEVEN WORLD DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIPS

OPEN MEN

Alan Francis from Defiance, Ohio, the master of the 3/4 reverse turn, fashioned a 14-1 record with an impressive performance to win his fourth straight World Horseshoe pitching title and sixth overall at the 80th Annual Tournament at Ainsworth, Nebraska.

The four-time boys champion, who has continued his mastery as an adult, bested Mark Baumann (12-3) from Madelia, Minnesota and six-time World titleholder Walter Ray Williams, Jr. from Florida, who closed with an 11-4 record and edged three-time champion Dale Lipovsky, Minnesota by percentage. Dale kept the crowd excited as he defeated both Francis and Williams during the last day of the event. Finishing fifth was Tommy Gann from North Carolina.

Maybe it is too soon to write about "Legends", but youthful Sir Francis (only 28) might be creeping up on Ted Allen's 10 World titles in a period of 19 years from 1933 through 1959. Alan's overall 85.82% for the final 15 games places him in a special class. He registered the high single game of 92.4, added a 90.6, 90, two 89.1s, and four others over 87%.

Alan's only loss came in the 11th game when Lipovsky nailed the champion 40-30. With Williams closing in on the leaders, Lipovsky claimed a 41-33 victory over Walter Ray in the 12th scheduled game.

In what may be the first time in modern play the men's champion has also won the Class A preliminaries, Francis closed with a 78.59% and 12-4 record as the top 16 pitchers compete for percentage to reach the finals. Looks like Alan saved the best for the finals. The personable 1998 champion was pleased with the sixth title, but did suggest that in the windblown finals, the pitchers could have been flying kites.

Alan's four straight titles is the third time this has been accomplished in the men's championship. Ted Allen did it in his early years of competition and Fernando Isais from California won six-in-a-row, 1947-1952.

In open men's competition since 1909, there have been 80 championships and 60 of them have been won by just 12 men—Allen 10, Isais 8, Frank Jackson 7, 6 each by Elmer Hohl, Williams and Francis, and 5 by Charles Davis, 3 each by Danny Kuchcinski, Jim Knisley, Curt Day and Lipovsky.

OPEN WOMEN

Youth must be served, call out the Kemper Cavalry. Insurance for victory came on the strong arm of 20-year old **Becky Kemper**, a blonde filly from Pleasureville,

Kentucky. She took over the reins of the Women's Championship to win her first World title, and will now carry the torch into the 1999 tournament in Greenville, OH.

Becky engineered her 1-1/4 turn Imperials into the winner's circle with an impressive final game victory over three-time champion Sue Snyder, 42-31, a pitching partner from Madisonville, Kentucky.

Becky's mother Sue Kemper, was on hand for the "show" and admitted she was more nervous than her cool-pitching daughter. "I only got two hours sleep Friday night before the finals," she volunteered. "Becky slept for eight hours. I'm the nervous one."

Becky recalled after the final game, "Winning the championship is unbelievable. The clay was excellent and it was the best I have pitched on during my 22 tournaments against top competition this past year.

Kemper's only loss came at the hands of Mary Ann Peninger from Derby, Kansas in the 13th game, 40-35, a 102-shoe marathon. Mary Ann finished fourth behind Ohio's Amy Francis (yes, she's Alan's wife), who bested the Kansas pitcher, 40-31, who then dropped the last two games to Snyder, 40-37, and defending champion Bev Nathe from Minnesota, 40-19. In Bev's opening game she posted the second best single game, a 90% effort. Kemper had the highest single, a 90.9 against North Carolina's Rivers Prewette; in the fourth game.

It is interesting to note that Kemper and Snyder posted almost identical overall percentages for the tournament. Kemper closed with 82.53%, Snyder 82.55%.

Kemper has won seven Kentucky Junior titles, and is looking forward to the adult challenge against State and World pitchers.

BOYS

After finishing second the last two years behind Texan Jeremy Umphries, **Branson Miller**, Middletown, Virginia has reason to "toot his horn." He won the 1998 boys' championship with an impressive 6-1 record having cemented the crown easily after six games before losing in the finale to second place Steve Morris from Darlington, Pennsylvania, 41-26. By the way, Branson toots his horn all the time during school days, making sweet music with the tuba and trumpet in the high school band.

Action in the boys group will again be exciting next year with most of this year's competitors returning to the World Tournament in Greenville, Ohio. In overall percentages, Miller posted a 75.90 to Morris' 75.49. Morris had the high single game of 90.9%, Brandon Lund of Washington nailed

an 89.5 in a 43-4 victory over the 1995 World Champion Joseph Smith, Glad Brook, Iowa.

"Finishing second the past two years was heartbreaking," Branson commented after the event. "1998 was sweet. I love the competition, especially when everyone in the group can be a winner."

He hopes to add his name to the long list of boys who have won at least two titles. In the 49-year history of the boys championship, 16 pitchers have been single title winners. Starting at the top of the multi-winners we find Jim Walters of Ohio with five, Alan Francis and Gary Roberts, also from Ohio, have four each, three each by NHPA President Dave Loucks, California, Walter Ray Williams Jr., Florida and Mark Dyson from North Carolina. Byron Bowman, Utah; Mark Seibold, Indiana; Jeff Williams, California; Farron Eiseman, Wyoming; and Umphries each have won two.

GIRLS

If they say "turn-about is fair play," then the result of the 1998 girls' championship bears out this statement. **Michelle Jarrett** from Ada, Oklahoma, this year's winner and the 1997 champion Rebecca King, Sand Spring, Oklahoma, flip-flopped titles with Becky finishing second at Ainsworth.

Oklahoma may have the championship sealed for the next three years as these two gladiators will face the challenge at Greenville, Ohio next year and Bismarck, North Dakota in 2000. The third year will be selected by the membership next year.

"It was a battle both years," Michelle commented, "Lots of shoes, but I was happy to win, and look forward to competition against Becky in the future. You know, I was pulling for Branson to win the boys' title, and he was backing me."

Michelle posted a perfect 5-0 record and had the high overall percentage of 59.7. The high single game percentage for the 6-player group was pitched by British Columbia's Erin Greenside, a 68.8% against Joy Sandquist of Minnesota.

King posted a 4-1 record and 49.25%, and of course, losing to the 1998 champion, 43-31, in the final game.

In all of her competition, Michelle uses Tournament Diamonds, tosses a soft flip and practices in the family's backyard court to prepare for the important tournaments on the schedule.

SENIOR MEN

Competing in his 28th World Tournament, **John Brown** from Lancaster, Ohio defeated California's Dave Loucks, 42-15, in a playoff to post a 9-3 record and win his second straight Senior Men's title. Brown improved on his overall 65.68% by tossing a neat 72.5 in the playoff.

Brown depended on his old six-year Allens since his year old shoes did not pass the test at the check-in prior to the tournament. After losing two of his first three encounters, Brown reeled off five straight before losing to Pennsylvania's Clair Bruce in the ninth game. Victories over Howard Weitzel, Canada and Gerald Stangland, Minnesota gave him the eight wins he needed to get into the playoff.

Loucks started with a 3-3 record and rallied to win five-in-a-row to gain the necessary wins to reach the final playoff game. Ohio's Bob Lautenschleger finished third in front of Bruce in the 12-man class, with Brown's 65.68 overall per-

centage rating high for the group.

"I love to pitch horseshoes," Brown remarked after the event. I'm so happy to be able to play. I take the wins as they come and seem to be at my best in tough competition."

The Senior Division was established in 1960, and Brown has added his name to the group that has won at least two championships. Heading the list is John Paxton, Iowa, with five established from 1966 through 1970. Ohio's John Manker has four, Carl Steinfeldt, Florida has won three and six other pitchers have won two each. They include John Wilkinson, Ohio; Marvin Richmond, Minnesota; Ray Miller, Ohio; Glenn Portt, Georgia; Lawrence Miller, Ohio and Ray Hill, Michigan.

ELDERS

For a pitcher who reached his 71st birthday on July 18 and has pitched in sanctioned tournaments only one year, **Bob Logan** from Louts, Ohio found the brass ring in his first World competition by winning the 1998 Elders championship.

Losing only to William Rector from Missouri in the fifth game, Logan reached the forty point level while holding opponents near the 20 point mark except for the 36 points scored by Laymon Gullett, Texas in the third.

"I never expected to do well in my first World, but I enjoyed the friendly atmosphere in the great game of horseshoes, and the nice people in the host town of Ainsworth. I owe a lot of credit to Sue Snyder, Joan Elmore and Walter Ray Williams for helping me with my game," he volunteered.

A 200-plus bowler, a baseball pitcher a "few?" years back and a present day golfer, this amiable gentleman is a great success story in the twilight of his sports career.

In getting ready for the World Tournament, Bob practiced an hour a day on his "half" court in his garage. Diagonally across his garage floor he has only limited distance, so has constructed only one clay pit, measured off 30 feet and pitches. He gets his exercise walking back to the pitching pad to deliver the next set of his Allens. It works for him.

SENIOR WOMEN

Teddy Guillotte
of Sonora, California

struck "gold" again as she went undefeated with a 5-0 record and overall 75% effort to win her third Senior Women World title, one game in front of second place Loree Meier from Independence, Missouri.

Guillotte and Meier were 3-0 before they met in the fourth game of round-robin play and the champion shot her best game 81.3% to win, 42-13. She closed out the competition with a 45-24 victory over Priscilla Hedges from Kansas.

This five-foot-two eyes-of-blue champion started pitching horseshoes late in life and won her first title in 1995 at Perry, Georgia. This third win ties her in total World Championships with Marge Spray from Florida who nailed titles in 1990, 1991 and 1992.

In 1996, Teddy pitched in the Open Women's group and she remarked that "They sent me home early."

"I didn't start pitching until I was 60, and now I love the competition. It is important to start pitching early in life like many of the present World champions. Many of them started before they were ten years of age. I started late, but now I'm having fun that I missed for many years."

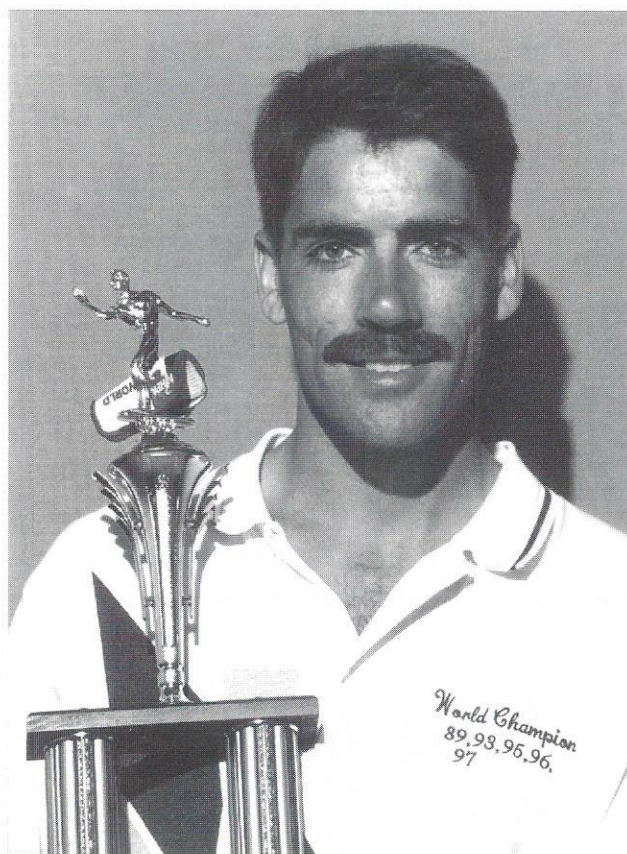
