Just a reminder, elections are open for President, and 5th VP. Per the By-Laws, incumbents running for a NHPA office must announce their candidacy in writing to be received by the President and the Horseshoe Pitching Newsline Editor no later than February 1, 2018. NHPA members who want to run must announce their candidacy in writing to be received by the President and the Horseshoe Pitching Newsline Editor no later than April 1st, 2018.

Each year the NHPA votes to award an individual to receive the Arch Stokes award. This is the NHPA's most prestigious award and is awarded to an NHPA member who has done the most during the preceding three to five years to promote, foster and build the sport. We also vote to award an NHPA Achievement award to a member who the Council feels has worked at promoting and growing the sport of horseshoes. For Charters who feel they have members worthy of being nominated to receive one of these awards, please contact me and I will send you a nomination form or you can find it on our NHPA website. The deadline for the Stokes Award is March 31, 2018 and the NHPA Achievement Award deadline is, March 1, 2018. One other nomination for members to consider is the NHPA Hall of Fame. If any of you have an individual who you feel is a candidate, please contact myself or Vicki Winston at horshuvicki@socket.net for a nomination form. Nomination forms must be received by Vicki Winston by January 31, 2018.

The 2018 World Horseshoe Tournament will be held July 9th – 21st, 2018 at the Florence Civic Center. The NHPA trailer has already arrived from St. George and plans are being finalized for the preparation for this event.

RULES, BYLAWS, & SPONSORSHIPS

I am honored to serve as 1st Vice President of the NHPA. However, I feel obligated to make genuine contributions to our sport rather than just to occupy the position. I have been pleasantly surprised to see that our current NHPA Officers are a very dedicated and industrious. My major responsibilities include rules, bylaws, and developing sponsorship.

Bylaws proposals were acted upon at the 2017 NHPA Convention in St. George, Utah. The NHPA Bylaws can be amended at every third NHPA Convention but amendments must be published in advance and approved by a two-thirds vote of the delegates at the Convention. However, emergency

amendments can be made at any NHPA Convention but require approval of three-fourths of the delegates. The 2020 Convention will be the next regularly scheduled time for amendments.

The 2018 NHPA Convention in Florence, South Carolina will entertain all new rules proposals. Any member can submit a proposal but it must be submitted to me no later than November 30, 2017. I would ask that each proposal be submitted by first quoting the current wording followed by the proposed wording along with the reason for the proposed change. The proposals can be submitted to me at gbroberts5542@yahoo.com or by mail to 638 Salem Cave Road, Beaver, Ohio 45613. Once I receive the proposals, they will be reviewed by the Rules/Bylaws Committee to assure they are appropriate and properly worded. I have a very knowledgeable and experienced Committee consisting of Dan Sanders, Jerry Labrosse, Clarence Lassiter, Debby Michaud, Gail Sluys, and Richard Altis. Once all proposals are finalized, they will be made available to the NHPA Executive Committee at the Winter Meeting in January 2018. Once approved by the Executive Committee, all proposals will be published in the Newsline and will be included in all delegate packets to assure that all voting members will be familiar with the proposals. Some proposals that are being considered by NHPA members include a definition of what constitutes a sanctioned tournament, a minimum number of shoes for a league to be Natstats eligible, and a clarification of the forfeit rule. If you have any questions about this important process, feel free to contact me at 740-835-1925.

Sponsorship is a subject that all of us talk about on a regular basis. It frustrates many of us when we see the success of the American Cornhole Organization in getting sponsorship for their major tournaments, and we ask ourselves why we cannot be successful. Casey Sluys made many efforts in the past to get some major companies to get interested in sponsoring us, and he can attest that getting sponsors will not be an easy task. I do not claim to be an expert in this area, but I know that it must be a priority as we move forward. I am recruiting capable people to assist me in this process. I've had a few people volunteer to help. We must develop a formal strategy and procure the assistance of capable people. If you have experienced people in your Charter that are willing to lend their expertise, please have them contact me. I will keep the membership informed of progress in this area.

I look forward to continuing to work toward the long-term survival and improvement of our sport.

Rules Proposal Deadline Nov. 30

Rules proposals will be voted on at the 2018 NHPA Convention in Florence, South Carolina. In order to get a rules proposal on the agenda, the proposal must be submitted to Gary Roberts at gbroberts5542@yahoo.com no later than November 30, 2017.

Proposals can be mailed to Gary at 638 Salem Cave Road, Beaver, Ohio 45613.

Proposals should include current wording, proposed wording, and the reason you feel the rule is needed.

Once the proposals are received, they will be reviewed by the Rules Committee and those recommended will be forwarded to the NHPA Executive Council for consideration. Finalized rules proposals will then be published in Newsline and will be included in the 2018 delegate packets. The delegates at the 2018 NHPA Convention will vote on each proposed rule.

Progress Report

The NHPA is very popular on the sports events conference circuit! Three such events are attended by NHPA representatives each year for the purpose of promoting the association and seeking the most appropriate venues for the World Tournament - and every timeslot for appointments is always filled!

NATIONAL SANCTION LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

The National Sanctioned League Championship Tournament was held on September 30th and October first at the NHPF Hall of Fame Building in Wentzville, Missouri. The 20 teams battled for over \$3,500.00 in prize funds over the two days of pitching. The three person teams were cross seeded into two classes, the Scarlet and the Gray. Each three-person team played another team each round in a round robin format. Games were 50 shoe count-all and were handicapped at around 92%. Any team winning two or three of the games in a round were awarded a bonus point for their efforts. The winning teams from each class played each other for the Championship. The Scarlet division finished in a tie for first place with the Cedar Rapids and Rice Park teams each scoring 23.5 points. This required a set of playoff games and the Cedar Rapids team managed to win two out of the three games when Glenn Warden and Larry Purcell picked up wins. Susan Fulton won for Rice Park making the playoff exciting and competitive. The Scarlet division also had a three-way tie for third place. Since the tournament pay-outs go down four places, total points were used to separate third, fourth, and fifth place. The standings were as follows:

In the Championship games, Jim's Four Courts (AR) squared off against the defending champions, Cedar Rapids (IA). In Class One, Wendy Hayes (AR) bested Bert Logsdon (IA) 106 to 82 as the playoff game may have worn Bert down a little. Wendy pitched 60% in the win and Bert shot an even 50%.

In Class Two, Glenn Warden (IA) shot 66.0% and beat Hiram Chaffin (AR) 114 to 103. Hiram shot 58%.

In Class Three, Jim Brandenburg (AR) got the best of Larry Purcell (IA) 108 to 95. Jim shot 64% and Larry shot 56%.

With two wins, Jim's Four Courts from Arkansas won the 2017 National Sanctioned League Championship. \$75.00 was awarded to the pitchers in each class who threw the highest percentage game above their average. Hiram Chaffin from Arkansas won the Gray class with a 21.24% game above his average. Terry Cuthbertson of Kansas won the Scarlet class with 20.57% above his average.

I wish to thank those who helped me with the tournament particularly; all those that kept score, David and Carla Sidles, Austin Bailey, Dalton Rakestraw and the entire Quail Ridge Horseshoe Club. It was a great tournament as always as teams left either happy or not-so-happy, but hopefully all enjoyed themselves.

The 2018 Sanction League National Championships are scheduled for October 6th and 7th and the Wentzville Hampton Inn has been selected as the host Hotel. The new hotel is located very close to the Hall of Fame facility and is very nice. Plans are in the works to increase the prize fund next year if things work out. As always, the first 20 teams to sign up get in to this fun tournament. Make your plans early.

Elmer Hohl of Canada won the 1977 World Horseshoe Tournament in Greenville, Ohio by defeating Glen Henton of Iowa in a playoff. As was the custom in those days there were 36 men in the Championship Class. The top five finishers were:

The amazing thing about this is that all of them except Elmer were left handed. This is the only World Tournament in which four of the top five finishers were left handed.

The original Bob Evans Farm is located in Rio Grande, Ohio. The house where Bob was raised is now a museum. NATSTATS: RESULTS & REMINDERS

All you Tournament Directors remember that your job is a very important one and you don't always get recognized for what you do. Great job! Remember to get your tournament results sent in to NATSTATS as soon as possible by whatever process your charter says to do. The pitchers always want to see their percentages updated as soon as possible. I update NATSTATS every Wednesday evening. You are supposed to and should always check each pitcher's card to make sure that they are pitching with a current paid up card (even if you know the person). Always notify all the proper people when a pitcher changes category or has a name change.

All TDs should download the new NATSTATS results from NHPA website (www.horseshoepitching.com) for their state before each tournament when using HSMaster to run your tournaments (even if you run your tournament on paper you should always check for correctness before your results are sent to NATSTATS), that way the results file will show the same as NATSTATS. These are updated each week.

If you have any questions about HSMaster or you are ready to start using it, you can go to www.hsmaster.info and read about all the options. Rob Hagman did an outstanding job of creating this website as a tool for HSMaster. It really isn't as hard to use as it looks and will save you a lot of time plus cut down on the errors. If you have any questions about HSMaster you can contact Rob or me.

What distinguishes one tournament from another is generally the size of the event or the number of star pitchers entered. Or one single item could be the NAME. The Donut Open is one of those tournaments where one could never imagine where the name came from. This tournament may have a weird name but it certainly drew in the stars pitchers. And once it is known where the name originated from, even the name no longer seems weird. Homer Cain (OK) was the originator of this tournament and in an effort to obtain some sponsorship contacted an old time buddy who just happened to own a donut shop. Hence the Donut Open.

The first event was held in 1979 and may have not have drawn a great number of star pitchers or out of state players, but one great out of state player came and brought a whole family of pitchers, and this tournament included a Women's division, a Junior Boys division and a Junior Girls division. In second place in the junior girls division was Tina Cain, Oklahoma Junior Girls State Champion, later Oklahoma Women's state champion and currently a NHPA vice president.

OKLAHOMA'S FIRST ANNUAL DONUT OPEN

"Bud Hamilton of Miami, Oklahoma, was the winner in the first Donut Open sponsored by Love's Donut Shop of Tonkawa, during a very hot week of August at Ponca City, Oklahoma. Gerald Kahle, Bartlesville, was runner-up. Don Hanes of Albuquerque, NM was third.

Opel Reno, 1978 Women's World Champion, paid a visit to the tournament and averaged 82.4 percent to win the Ladies Class A title. Janet Walrod was second followed by Emmaline Pearce in third spot. Audrey Reno was tops in the Junior Girl's Class. Tina Cain was second and Brenda Reno third. Dempsey Reno won the Junior Boy's Class.

During the course of the tournament activities, Opel Reno showed her style in exhibition with Bud Hamilton, the current Oklahoma state champion. Although Hamilton managed to outscore Opal by tossing an 84% game hitting 42 ringers in 50 shoes (his highest game ever). Opal racked up 38 ringers for 76%."

Janet Walrod went on to be a ten-time Oklahoma Women's State Champion in 1974-1976, 1978, 1979, 1981-1983, 1986 and 1988. Opal Reno won the Women's World Championship again in 1980. Audrey Reno was the Junior Girl's World Champion in 1977.

The announcement for the second Donut Open was in the July 1979 News Digest:

ANNUAL DONUT OPEN – PONCA CITY, OKLAHOMA – JULY 21

“The second annual Donut Open tournament will be held at the Dan Moran Park Courts in Ponca City, Oklahoma on Saturday, July 21. Entry fee of \$5.00 and ringer percentage should be sent to Homer M. Cain, Route # 1, Marland, Oklahoma 74644 before July 7.”

The announcement did not include the amount of prize money available or any other incentives to pull in top notch pitchers, but they came. How about the reigning Men’s World Champion Walter Ray Williams Jr., and “Deadeye” brought three of his brothers. The top men players were put in the Pro Class; all expecting the champ too win, not the case. Hall of Fame pitcher Merlin Potts of Leonardville, Kansas went undefeated in a class that also included Jeff Williams and Ronnie Simon, 1974 California state champion.

"In the biggest money tournament held in the United States this year, 67 entries took to the courts representing California, Kansas, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Canada in the annual Donut Open tournament held in Poca City, Oklahoma July 19-20.

Walter Ray Williams Jr., of Chino, California topped all comers in the Pro Class with 9 straight victories and posting an 85.5% ringer average. Elmer Hohl from Wellesley, Ontario was runner-up on an 8-1 record and 77.0% ringers. Steve Hohl was third with 6-3 72.0%. Merlin Potts of Leonardville, Kansas was fourth with 5-4 69.0%.

Janet Walrod of Yukon, Oklahoma eased through the Women's Class A undefeated followed by Tina Cain and Emaline Pearce in second and third respectively. Janet hit 58.4% ringers for the tournament.

Louise Abercrombie, the North Central Oklahoma Horseshoe Pitchers Association Public Relations Director, was presented a \$1,325 Las Vegas vacation trip for two for outstanding promotional work. She is a reporter for the Ponca City News and has done a terrific job of promotion horseshoes at every opportunity. She is also a top contender in women's horseshoe pitching in Oklahoma.

Lloyd and Raymona LeBaron, the local club president and secretary-treasurer were presented a \$1,325 Las Vegas vacation trip for two for their work in helping to prepare the courts and other necessary equipment for the tournament.

Earl Winston of LaMonte, Missouri and 3rd Vice President of the NHPA, presented a check for \$500 on behalf of the NHPA to the Donut Open prize fund during the ceremonies.

The first four places in the Pro Class were awarded a \$1325 Las Vegas vacation trip for two. In addition first place received \$300 and a horseshoe clock trophy; second place, \$200 and a trophy and third place \$100 and a trophy.
