
Next Evolution of NHPA News!

The National Horseshoe Pitchers Association has reported news to the membership for almost as long as its existence. Coming in different formats beginning with Barnyard Golf and evolving to the Newsline in 1989, the content has fluctuated in quality, according to the general consensus we've heard. Those who recall the older NHPA publications remember a time when they featured much more horseshoe related content and much less administrative chatter. As a council, we knew we had to still relay news in some form, but we see great benefit in reverting our bi-monthly publication to feature more interesting content from the courts rather than a simple officer report. As we've discovered this great tool called the internet, it's much easier for us to communicate more frequently as a council through our constant contact platform. The Newsline era has come to an end with the 2025 World Tournament report but that's not a step back, we're taking a step forward. Our new structure of news will feature two separate publications, allowing us to share important updates with the charters and membership, while leaving room for a horseshoe-news-filled publication. Below is the schedule for these new publications, these may be slightly different than our original Newsline schedule, but evolution comes with some fluidity.

2025 MEMBERSHIP TOTALS ARE IN!

Adult membership numbers landed at 5,989 members for 2025. We showed a decline of 4.4% over 2024 year-end totals. While this was a decrease, we saw a slightly smaller decrease than the 5.5% decline from the 2023 to 2024 membership numbers.

ADULT MEMBERSHIP RETENTION STRUGGLES

Since 2014 the adult membership trend has shown this pattern:

2014 - 2015: 9,903 adult members (2.4% decrease)

2015 - 2016: 9,334 adult members (3.7% decrease)

2016 - 2017: 8,991 adult members (7.8% decrease)

2017 - 2018: 8,295 adult members (9.4% decrease)

2018 - 2019: 7,522 adult members (9.4% decrease)

2019 - 2020: 6,251 adult members (16.9% decrease)

2020 - 2021: 6,954 adult members (10.2% increase)

2021 - 2022: 6,736 adult members (3.2% decrease)

2022 - 2023: 6,632 adult members (1.6% decrease)

2023 - 2024: 6,262 adult members (5.6% decrease)

2024 - 2025: 5,989 adult members (4.4% decrease)

YOUTH PARTICIPATION INCREASES!

Positive news from the 2025 membership report shows an uptick in youth participation over 2024 by 7.5%!



While we're revamping the new member program in 2026, we must get our member retention numbers up if we want to see an increase. One thing I've noticed from the year-over-year reports is healthy new member growth in the past two years. The issue we're seeing that's causing the decline is our membership retention numbers. We are losing members at a higher rate than the new members are coming in, if we could raise our retention rates in 2026, we would have a good chance at seeing an increase this coming year in overall membership. I would encourage charter secretaries to send out a copy of the upcoming season schedule and even a letter to any member, or previous member you have an address for. Touching base with these members could be the little nudge people need to keep
