There is something about a New Year that energizes people, creates vigor, enthusiasm, and makes people look ahead with optimism for the New Year. We along with all of you are looking for a bigger and better year in horseshoes in 2008.

The Executive Council has scheduled their winter director's meeting for February 8-9th. Since Dick Hanson and I visited York, PA in September, we will not be going back there for our winter meeting. Last year we held our meeting in Ardmore, OK. While there we kept our eyes on the sky, the roads and airport runways, because there was a big ice, sleet, and snow storm going on while we were there. This year we have decided to hold our winter meeting in a warmer climate. We will hold our 2008 winter meeting in Myrtle Beach, SC.

The agenda for our meeting looks like a full two days of business. Some of the things we will be discussing and making decisions on are the 2008 World Tournament. Also, now that our new Hall of Fame building is completed with 16 indoor courts, we will be discussing what kind of

NHPA tournaments and how many we can hold there next year and for years to come.

Another discussion will be about rubber mats to go on the floor at our World Tournaments. While Dick and I was visiting the 2008 World Tournament site in York, PA last fall, I was talking to the Director of the York Fair Grounds about what to put on the floor to protect the concrete. From this conservation, I found out that there was a rubber product being made at a company just up the road, about 25 miles from York, that makes a rubber padding that

was developed and is being used to cover floors where horseshows or other equestrian events are being held. I have been in contact with this company several times and have received samples of the material. We have since purchases two rolls of the rubber padding and we are testing this material at an indoor court facility in MN. So far what we have heard from the pitchers that have pitched on this material sounds good. Some of the comments are; looks great, feels good for your feet and legs, and the grip is perfect, 100%. By the time of our winter meeting we should have enough testing information on this material to make a decision as to whether we will purchase enough of this padding for sixty sets of our world tournament indoor courts.

We will keep all of you informed in the next issue of Newsline on what new business and decisions took place in our meeting.

Again, Happy New Year to all and I am looking forward to seeing each of you on the courts soon.

NHPF NEWS VIEWS & DONATIONS

It's a new year and a few months after the opening of the National Hall of Fame in Wentzville, MO. I hope that all of you enjoyed a Happy Holiday Season and that some of you included the NHPF in your year-end gift giving. The Hall of Fame is a beautiful facility that all NHPA members should be proud of, enough so to periodically contribute to its upkeep by sending a cash donation or purchasing an engraved brick in the Jack Freeman Memorial Plaza just outside the front entrance.

After 12 years of writing articles in this magazine and sending three mass mailings to the membership to raise funds for the building project, one would have hoped that a bigger portion of the membership would have gotten involved. However, to date, only slightly more than 1,100 people or families have sent in a personal donation. The number represents less than 10% of the NHPA members. Fortunately, several Charter associations and clubs along with the NHPA have been very supportive, some much more than others. I believe this would be a good time to acknowledge a few who have been outstanding in their support. Thanks in large part to them, the first eleven months of 2007 brought some \$55,000 in individual contributions, the most since the NHPF was founded. Let me mention and give special thanks to:

California, the #1 State in total dollar contributions over the past 12 years.

Missouri, the #1 State in contributions for 2007 and #2 overall.

California, the State with the most individuals and clubs who have contributed \$500 or more.

Missouri, the State that has ordered the most engraved bricks.

Minnesota, the Charter that is #1 in dollars contributed by the actual Charter Association.

Emerald Horseshoe Club, Eugene, Oregon, the #1 club in dollars contributed.

Dogwood Tournament, Statesville, NC, the #1 contributing tournament.

The NHPA itself has been the overall largest contributor to the NHPF. Each month the NHPA contributes the interest it earns on its money market account and fortunately, the convention delegates have for several years voted a \$1.00 per member contribution. In the years since the NHPF was formed in 1996, eight individuals or families have contributed more than \$2,500 each. 31 people, 8 clubs and 10 charters have exceeded a \$1,000 contribution level. Twenty-three donors have sent in contributions ten or more times with Art Moran of Minnesota leading the pack. Art has sent in a check an astounding 108 times.

Some 670 bricks of the near 4,000 in the commemorative brick plaza have now been sold. If you haven't yet purchased a brick, make it a point to put it on your list of things to do in 2008. If you have already purchased, please continue your financial support and encourage your fellow members to buy a brick or send in a contribution. Not only will you be helping with the financial upkeep of the new Hall of Fame facility but also you will be assisting the NHPF as we strive to preserve the past and build the future of horseshoe pitching. RULES COMMITTEE

By the time you read this, the holidays will have passed. I sincerely hope that you all had a safe and happy holiday season.

In this article I would like to talk about a few things concerning the RGS book. It has come to my attention that there is an error in the printing of the first edition of the RGS. As you all know, many parts of the Bylaws were moved into the RGS book. The way we did this was to copy parts of the Bylaws from the version posted on the NHPA website. As it turns out, we discovered that the version we were copying from was not the latest updated version, therefore we transferred an error.

The error has to do with open tournament eligibility only, and does cover state and world tournaments. On page 28 of the RGS, which is Requirement 2, Section B – Eligibility, it states that tournament participation in **open tournaments** is restricted to contestants holding a current NHPA card, **and also to players who meet any imposed eligibility requirements**. This wording about addition requirements was removed by delegate vote at the 2004 convention, and is reflected in the 2005-2006 edition of the blue Bylaws book, for those of you who would like to check.

Therefore, what the rule states is that tournament directors cannot impose addition eligibility requirements for tournament entry, such as requiring a certain number of events to enter. This would only prevent new pitchers from entering tournaments. If anyone has any questions regarding this misprint, please feel free to contact me. The correction will be made in the next RGS book printing.

I have seen chatter amongst different charters about a few rules that I would like to briefly shine the light on. The first deals with an age old rule that has (and apparently still is) been controversial over the years. It deals with stepping over the foul line after releasing the shoe. On page 10 of the RGS, Rule 3, Section D.1 "The Pitcher" During the entire address and release of a shoe, the contestant must not start or step completely outside the platform with either foot.

This rule is being misinterpreted by some folks, and I would like to point out that the key word in this rule is "release". After the shoe is "released", the pitcher can step over the line, and many pitchers do. I saw a pitcher at the world in Nebraska whose momentum carried him clear up to the short distance foul line. He quickly would come back, reset, and pitch his second shoe within the allowed 30 seconds. Very distracting I agree, but also very within the rules. This rule will never likely be changed, so I hope every one of you who doesn't agree with this rule can find a way to accept it.

MARYLAND

The MDHPA is pleased to announce the two MD Hall of Fame inductees for 2007. Ann Anderson, five-time MD State Women's Champion, and the late Lester Hiebler, one of the founding members of the Baltimore Metro Horseshoe Club, who was actively involved in many areas of the sport for nearly 40 years, until the time of his passing.

Members of the FHPA (Frederick) are proud to have been featured in a recent half-hour production of the local Comcast Cable Channel 10 called "Sidelines." President Jane Barthlow, VP Jack Moxley, Tournament Director Wayne Mowdy, Secretary/League Director Diana Ratliff, Past President Will Mabry, Sr., 10-time MD State Champion Elbert Shifflett, and 80-something Senior Member Mr. John Key were participants in a segment about horseshoe pitching that ran 15 to 20 times per week over a three-week period. Hopes are high for reruns in the spring that may result in increased participation and new and/or renewed interest in the Club.

A points challenge was initiated by MDHPA officers in 2007 to encourage participation in sanctioned events in the state. The winner, Vicki Kunde, received \$100. Second and third finishers were Jerry Dean and Junior Daniel Freeman. Congratulations!

MINNESOTA

MGSHPA reports a healthy increase in both adult and junior membership for the year 2007! Many different recruitment methods were tried and some seemed to work. More new ideas are on schedule for 2008.

Assorted incentives were offered to clubs who increased their membership totals, and there was also some success recruiting junior pitchers through the school systems.

The "pitch and win" events have also netted some new members. Still, one of the best recruitment methods is "word of mouth" - inviting friends and family to try it out for themselves.

2007 was the first year for cash prizes to be awarded at the Minnesota state tournament, along with trophies. For the second year, "perpetual trophies" were awarded. Each of these trophies holds data tags for 12 years worth of state

tournament results. Many members have bought their own perpetual trophies to hold all their state tournament results.

The program has been a huge success and the savings has enabled the cash prizes. There are plans to try other ways to increase the prize fund, as well, hopefully, attracting more participants in the state event. Other ideas are in the works to expand the cash prizes as well.

MISSOURI

It is always exciting to report about the building of new horseshoe courts. As previously reported we have two new indoor facilities. There are two courts at Webb City and four at Laurie. Of course, we don't have to mention the 16 Quail Ridge indoor courts unless you have had your head in the sand!

The MOHPA is, also, excited about the addition of outdoor courts. Quail Ridge will have 16 outdoor courts. Clinton is almost finished with their six courts in Artesian Park which will be the home of the Golden Valley Horseshoe Club. Marshfield has completed 14 of 22 proposed courts in Rotary Park, south of the maintenance building - the Paradise Pitchers Horseshoe Club will call these courts home. The Paradise Club started at the courts that were on the property of the Exotic Animal Paradise in Strafford. That property was sold and the courts there were lost as a result. It is reported that the Rotary Club of Marshfield found out that the sport of horseshoe pitching had a good following and they stepped up and received a \$5,000 grant from Webster Electric Foundation to help build the courts.

Occasionally we have other towns with existing courts inquire about having tournaments or leagues. We offer our help and encourage them to do so. Hopefully, with the NHPF/NHPA Hall of Fame building and the activity there, we will get these towns and others to start having sanctioned activity.

OHIO

Many Ohio pitchers will be moving inside for the upcoming winter season. The winter tournament schedule includes 13 sanctioned tournaments at five different locations around the state. Sanctioned leagues are also hosted at each of these sanctioned court facilities.

The Ohio HPA will be purchasing 18 or more sanctioned portable courts in an effort to promote horseshoe pitching around the state. The courts will be bought through donations from clubs and individuals and will be made available for use in a variety of ways, such as horseshoepitching demonstrations, fair tournaments, or to promote new Winter/Summer leagues and tournaments in other areas of the state.

OKLAHOMA

The Oklahoma Horseshoe Pitchers Association recently inducted two new members into its Hall of Fame, David and Nancy Montgomery.

Nancy has been the secretary/treasurer of the OHPA for eight years. During that time, she has taken care of not only the state events, but also local events and leagues for the Yukon club.

Many of you became acquainted with David during the 2007 World Tournament in Ardmore, OK, and have seen the type of contribution he makes to the organization. His non-stop, get it done attitude exhibited during that event is typical David. He is a priceless asset and his shoes would be extremely hard to fill.

The OHPA is quite fortunate to have both David and Nancy among us and in a place of honor in our Hall of Fame.

Their induction took place at a prime rib banquet, prepared and catered by the Homer Cain family.

Many horseshoe pitchers consider the winter months to be "off season." That may be the case for some charters without indoor facilities - my own Oklahoma included.





WESTERN STATES HORSESHOE PITCHERS' JOURNAL



The last issue of this series talked about the start of the Pacific Coast Horseshoe Pitchers Journal. That organization began in 1931. By June 1932, the Journal still existed but the name had changed to "The Western States Horseshoe Pitchers' Journal." The same editors, M.C. Athey and L.E. Athey, were in place. Not all the issues are in the file, so no explanation for the name change can be offered.

The article selected for this issue is an interesting summary of a mail in tournament. Some pitchers have been identified in the article, all Western States pitchers that is...

SAYRE TOSSES 94% RINGERS

Get busy, you tossers and join the fun. In the May Journal we started what we termed a "pitching by mail" contest and promised to publish the best scores sent to us each month. Do you remember the rules? Here they are. Each entrant

pitches 100 shoes as many times as he wishes during the first week of each month. He takes the best 100-pitch score and sends it in to the Journal for comparison with other scores. There must be one or two witnesses to the score and if it is over 80% ringers it must be signed by a notary public.

And have we been getting results? The editor is positively popeyed from reading the marvelous scores sent in to the Journal! Tacoma's champ, Floyd Sayre, was playing in world-beating fashion when he registered 94 % ringers and 44 doubles ringers out of 100 shoes pitched! This equals Jimmy Lecky, champion of Arizona. Sayre's score was made June 9, 1932, and came to us fully signed and sealed by a notary.

Those of you who have tried to beat that old bugaboo, percentage on the 100-shoe pitch know that iron nerves are required to turn in a performance like Sayre's. Here's how he did it: He started out with 10 doubles in a row, followed by a ringer and point, then 5 more doubles, draped themselves around the peg, next came a ringer and a point, 6 more doubles, ringer and point, 2 doubles, 1 ringer, 11 doubles, ringer and a point, 2 doubles, ringer and point, and the last 16 shoes looped the stake without a miss for 8 more doubles. Congratulations, Floyd!

Joe Francisco of Portland chalked up 82 ringers and 31 double ringers in a 100-shoe toss during the first week of June. That's hitting the old style with clock-like precision, too, if you should ask. Frisco's score was witnessed by Cliff Esberg, president of the Portland Club, and LeRoy Bryant, state secretary, in addition to many spectators.

H.A. Long of Tacoma had his shoes in performing in great style, also. He threw 74 ringers and 24 doubles out of 100 shoes.

Evidently the idea of a pitching-by-mail competition has already been in force in other parts of the United States. D.J. Cowden of Adair, Iowa, who signs himself secretary of the mail-game-league of the United States, sent us a list of the best scores registered with him. We are printing

them below. He gives Jimmy Lecky credit for 92 ringers and 42 doubles, whereas in other reports Jimmy is credited with a record of 94 ringers. Will someone who knows send us Jimmy's authentic record?

Combining Cowden's report with those sent in to the Journal this month, we have the following 25 high scores for sharpshooters to beat, Get busy, everyone.

Take good note of some of the other names on this listing. Mossman- looks awful familiar. The name that is most amazing to me is O.W. Anderson. Anderson is credited with the formation of the Grand League of American Horseshoe Pitcher's in 1914. This organization held the first world tournaments that were won by Frank Jackson. Obviously, he was an accomplished pitcher also. And then, two of Frank's sons are also listed in this mail-intournament. Guy Ulig was a three-time Nebraska state champion, 1927, 1928, 1930. Harvey Elmerson was a nine-time Wisconsin state champion and was runner-up in the 1935 World Tournament. William Curts was the South Dakota state champion in 1929. Sayre was referred to as the Tacoma champion; he actually was the Washington state champion in 1925, 1926, 1927, 1931 and 1932. Ray Ashcroft was the Washington state champion in 1929 and 1930.

He was an avid pitcher and fan; he will be missed.



May those of you who pitch in winter leagues have a great season! I would like to wish a Happy New Year to All!



NHPA PUBLICITY AND PROMOTION

Volunteers Needed

The NHPA functions because of the people, its local clubs, and its charters; this all-volunteer effort makes the NHPA what it is today. However, finding volunteers has become quite a task. One has to wonder though why that is; when you volunteer doesn't it give you a feeling of satisfaction? Sure it does! When the things that you would like to implement into a charter or club happen because of your volunteering efforts it's certainly a satisfying feeling. Take for instance a smooth running tournament, a wellconducted meeting, and a group of new junior pitchers pitching in their first sanctioned tournament. When you see these things occurring because of your volunteering efforts it's enormously satisfying, knowing that you were, in part or wholly, responsible for this by simply donating your time and knowledge to make the NHPA an even better organization than it is.

The primary reason for the various positions within a charter are to assist with the administration of matters pertaining to an efficient organization. It takes a president to oversee and preside over the meetings a charter holds. This position goes hand in hand with the various vice-presidents and the secretary/treasurer. Things pertaining to the welfare of a charter are openly discussed with no previous bias. If that fact were to happen in each charter we would have an organization that was free of conflict, wouldn't we? Is this just a pie in the sky dream or could this become reality? Some differences simply need to be buried and we must all strive to build up the NHPA membership.

The NHPA is set up with the president, secretary/treasurer and five vice-presidents. Each one of the VPs has specific tasks that they attempt to accomplish. The various duties are listed on page three of this publication. It is recommended that each charter have a slate of officers with specific duties to perform, for instance, the annual schedule formation, the charter newsletter, the by-laws, publicity and promotion, teaching tournament directors and so on. These responsibilities do not necessarily have to fall on the NHPA Regional Director and the president's shoulders alone. If each charter had the people in place to

cover some of these items it would be a smooth operation. Here again, it becomes a volunteer effort on your part.

It is my belief that every member, at some point in his or her NHPA career should learn how to conduct a tournament. Rotating TD responsibilities can be done quite simply by merely listing what needs to occur prior to a tournament then guiding an individual through this process once. The following tournament you stand off to the side, ready to help, but at a distance, in case called upon to assist. Realizing that all charters are unique and all do not have clubs with specific members the afore mentioned may not be practical, but training one for the TD's job could happen anyway. We've seen far too many clubs and facilities fade away because the person who "knew it all", "done it all", "never received nor accepted any help", either passed away or became incapacitated.

Another thing that needs to happen in each charter is officers meetings, above and beyond the annual year-end meeting with the membership. If these were held every two months or so, updating each VP on his or her responsibilities, with a status report with minutes published to the membership, either in the newsletter, email, snail mail, or whatever other means you choose to distribute this information we could improve the communication among our charter officers by 100%. These meeting could provide the cohesiveness needed for a finely tuned group. Wouldn't it be great if we were all on the same page, of the same book, rather than in different libraries?

Finding volunteers with open minds and the willingness to create the scenarios outlined above is quite a chore at best. There are some charters that have a specific rule/ by-law against two members of the same household holding charter offices. If more people stepped up this would not even be an issue. Should a charter be put in the position of not having enough people to fill their officer positions or can two members of the same family hold office? Sure, you will hear that it could be construed as nepotism,

particularly if a president needs to fill an office that was suddenly vacated, and said president picks a family member. Believe me, it has happened. We have similar situations on a National level. My fellow National VP's hold charter positions of importance, thereby spreading themselves thin. Should they give up their charter duties when they assume a National level? I think yes, but here once again there is a lack of volunteers ready to fill these vacancies

The situations that have been presented in this article have all occurred at one time or another in my 13-year tenure as your vice president. Another disconcerting fact is not once in the six elections have I had a single opponent. We all strive for competition in this sport; why not have some competition in the officer candidates? There are numerous individuals capable of holding a National office; I'm convinced of that. Let's have some honest to goodness campaigning, with multiple candidates, not only on a National level, but within the charters as well. You simply need to have a statement of intent written and into the NHPA President and Newsline magazine by March 15, 2008 for a National office. See by-law Article 5, Section 8 as to whose terms are up this year. Never let the fact that you did not win in an election deter you from running again at another time, perhaps with a different platform, or even a different office.

Indoor Pitching

There are many indoor pitching facilities throughout the country, those of you who participate in a winter league or winter tournaments... are they full up? Are there empty courts that could be utilized by others? If your answer is that we have some empty courts you should continue to recruit new members to fill those empties. Don't let the winter months deter you from signing up new members to fill your courts. It's an ideal time of the year for indoor horseshoe pitching because there are no little leagues to compete with, very little soccer, and not too much for the kids to do, so bring them into your nice comfortable facility and begin teaching them the art of horseshoe pitching. They'll get hooked on a sport that they will be able to enjoy the rest of their lives.

REGIONAL DIRECTORS REPORT

Tournament Patches

By the time you receive this issue of Newsline Magazine, the new 2008 patches should have been received by all Regional Directors who have completed and sent me their patch order forms. As "Team" events have become more popular in many Charters, we have added a "Team Champion" patch and a "Team Class Champion" patch which can now be awarded at team tournaments, if ordered by your RD.

Sanctioning of Courts

As you may already know, sanctioned courts are now required for all sanctioned leagues and tournaments, effective January 1, 2008. This will help to ensure that all individual NatStats ringer percentages are more valid and comparable for setting up competitive Classes at all local tournaments, state tournaments, and for the World Tournament. By now, most Charter court complexes have been checked/re-checked by your Regional or Assistant Regional Directors, and I would like to extend a big "thank you" to them for the extra time and effort that it has taken to complete all of this work! RDs are reminded that the Court Registration Form must also be completed and sent to me by the end of this year.

Questions from Regional Directors and Members

Among their many responsibilities, RDs are asked to assist tournament directors and to explain or interpret the rules when questions may come up. Several questions have been asked during this past year that have to do with the seeding of contestants into competitive classes. Before NatStats, tournament directors placed pitchers into classes for local tournaments based on some combination of records from earlier tournaments, current league averages, and/or a ringer percentage (sometimes questionable) sent in by the pitcher himself. Some of you may also remember that for most state tournaments and for the world tournament, pitchers were seeded into classes based on their qualifying

scores. Most pitchers are now in agreement that the current rule requiring the use of NatStats for the seeding of contestants (see Rule 11, Section D) is fair, saves time, and has eliminated most of the concerns about seeding that existed prior to the adoption of this system.


This same rule also states that the seeding of entrants into tournament classes is to be based on their current NatStats average at the time of the entry deadline. The rule applies for all sanctioned tournaments, but in at least one Charter, it has presented a problem for their State Tournament. It is expected that this rule shall be followed by all tournament directors/committees in 2008. If the rule presents a problem, the simple solution is to change the deadline for entry accordingly. The NHPA would also like to suggest that the entry deadline for tournaments should be made on a Thursday; one, two, or three weeks prior to the entry deadline, since NatStats is updated every Wednesday.

There has also been a question about whether or not a tournament director/committee can place a contestant into a higher class, upon their request. The short answer is "no", as this is not fair to other pitchers who may have worked hard to improve their NatStats average in an effort to reach a higher class. Therefore, each contestant must earn their way into the class where they are seeded, regardless of how well they may have pitched in the past, and should be seeded in their rank order. The only exception is the top seeding of a defending champion (not required) when their current NatStats may not be the highest ringer percentage within the top class. The only other situation that may warrant the placement of a contestant into a higher class is if an entrant has to drop out of the tournament before it starts, but after the tournament classes have already been set up. The tournament director may then attempt to find someone to take this pitcher's place, which is permissible if the replacement's ringer percentage is somewhere within the range of others in the class, or is lower than others in this class. This pitcher may also be pitching in a lower class during this same tournament.

It is also important for all Charter officers/members to understand that any new NHPA rule supersedes existing Charter Bylaws which, if in conflict, must be changed and followed upon the enactment of the new NHPA rule.

If there are any questions about this discussion of Rule 11, Section D, please contact me or our NHPA Rules Chairman Jerry LaBrosse. In the next issue, I will be discussing the forfeiture rule (see page 19, Rule 11, Section G). Please read through this rule. Are you in agreement with it? Some are not, but may not fully understand the rule or the history involved here.



NATSTAT

Happy New Year – everyone – I hope you had a good past season of pitching and look forward to a better and improved season in the coming year.

The end of 2007 has arrived and I am looking for any tournament and league results that have not been reported yet. If a tournament was cancelled during the past year I need to know that it was not played so I can enter the sanction # in Reported Events knowing that I am not still waiting for results for that tournament. As always – ALL LEAGUE results are to be sent to Lorraine Sternberg who will then send them on to Natstats. Don't hold on to tournament and league results for several months, send them in promptly so we can keep everyone's average as current and up to date as possible. That is why Natstats was developed. Many states do keep their own records, but for those pitchers that travel and pitch out of state, those states rely on Natstats to get a current average.

When reporting results, please include all pitchers, U.S. and Canadian and their card numbers. I then send the Canadian results on to Canstats so they can include them in their records. There are many new pitchers scores reported without a card number for one reason or another. Those names are not entered into Natstats until such time I do get a card number. Some Leagues pitch for three or four months and the results come in with one or two people without a card number listed, or in many cases, a duplicate card number that I already have someone with that number. Those names many times don't get entered until I get a correct card number - so all league directors - PLEASE check each pitchers card and list a card number for each pitcher when submitting the league results. Anyone can go to the NHPA web site and check out NATSTATS - Charter - Reported Events and see what Tournaments and Leagues have been reported and what ones have not been reported to Natstats. If you see a blank sanction number for a tournament you pitched in, that means I don't have the results yet and your average may be higher or lower than it should be.

For some of the new pitchers, you can also go to the same place – NATSTATS and click on Individual Search and view and printout a copy of your individual pitching record. If there are any errors noted, contact the tournament director or Natstats with what the error is and maybe what the correction should be and we will do what we can to get your file corrected. Every now and then someone gets their average bumped up 20 or 30 points because of an error in reporting results which then will probably put

you in a higher pitching group with not much chance of winning any games. So let's correct any errors and keep everyone happy.

To all charter Secretary/Treasurers or whomever is keeper of the records – I need to know who your Jr Cadet pitchers are and also your Jr Boys and Girls. I don't have everyone's birthday listed in my files and I need to know when they change to the Junior or Adult Division. Also when you as a pitcher change to Elder (or short distance), you need to go through your charter officers to let them know you are changing. We do have some people that just move up and don't tell anyone then wonder why their average is off.

To all people reporting results – please list your Jr Cadets as Category 9 – not B or G. When results come in listed as B or G, and are a Cadet I then have to stop and check out what their actual pitching category is.

TOURNAMENT UPDATE

Bids are still open for the 2010 World Tournament and will remain open until March 15, 2008. I have been in close communication with four sites that plan on bidding for this event.

The NHPA has received two signed contracts from Cedar Rapids, Iowa and Little Rock, Arkansas. I expect the two others to submit theirs by the deadline. To my knowledge, the four bidding sites have not hosted the World Tournament and the proposed sites will be indoors and have air conditioning.

Leroy Law & Leo Buell, members of the Iowa Hawkeye Horseshoe Pitchers Association, Mary Lee Malmberg, Director of Sports Tourism, and Bryan Barney, Manager of the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena, will be presenting to the voting delegates the Cedar Rapids Ice Arena which has two ice hockey arenas. The NHL Rink (main arena) has seating for 3,850 spectators and would hold 24 portable courts. The other arena, the Olympic Rink, has seating for 350 spectators and would hold 26 portable courts. Practice courts, camping and motels are all within five minutes of the proposed site. They have proposed July 26th - August 7th, 2010 as their dates to host the tournament.

Meri Smith, Director of Events and Facilities for the Arkansas State Fair Complex, and NHPA member Bill Weaver will be presenting to the voting delegates the T.H. Barton Coliseum and the Dodge Hall of Industry as their two indoor facilities to host this event. The proposed dates are July 12th – July 24th, 2010.

Raul Cano, CVB Sales Director at Pocatello, Idaho, is proposing to bring the W.T. back to the Holt Arena. The Holt Arena was the site for the 2004 W.T. The proposed dates are July 12th – July 24th, 2010.

The last site who plans on submitting a bid is Canton, Ohio, however, at this time I have no further information. Keep watching for my updates in Newsline.

Hope everyone had a safe and happy Holiday. Don't forget to brush up on your pitching.

Last but not least, don't forget to get your reservations in early for the 2008 W.T. at York, Pennsylvania. The dates are July 7th-19th. For more information contact the York CVB at 1-888-858-9675.
