

As the 2014 pitching season comes to an end for many Charters, I hope everyone had a great season of horseshoe pitching. I know many Charters hosted their State Tournament Labor Day weekend. Congratulations to all State Champions and those participants who competed.

Don't forget to do your part and keep looking for new pitchers to grow your local clubs. If we want this sport to continue to be successful, it takes members to promote it. Remember it truly is a family sport where everyone can enjoy the outdoors and pitch together as a family. For more information on available promotional items, please contact Tina Hawkins.

Just a reminder, elections are open for President, 1st VP, 3rd VP and 5th VP positions. Per the By-Laws, incumbents running for a NHPA office must announce their candidacy in writing to be received by the President and the Horseshoe Pitching E-Newsline Editor no later than February 1, 2015. NHPA members who want to run must announce their candidacy in writing to be received by the President and the Horseshoe Pitching E-Newsline Editor no later than April 1st, 2015 per the new By-Law change taking affect January 1st, 2015.

Each year the NHPA votes to award an individual to receive the Arch Stokes award. This is the NHPA's most prestigious award and is awarded to an NHPA member who has done the most during the preceding three to five years to promote, foster and build the sport. We also vote to award an NHPA Achievement award to a member who the Council feels has worked at promoting and growing the sport of horseshoes. For Charters who feel they have members worthy of being nominated to receive one of these awards, please contact me and I will send you a nomination form or you can find it on our NHPA website. The deadline for the Stokes Award is March 31, 2015 and the NHPA Achievement Award deadline is, March 1, 2015. One other nomination for members to consider is the NHPA Hall of Fame. If any of you have an individual who

you feel is a candidate, please contact myself or Vicki Winston at horshuvicki@socket.net for a nomination form. Nomination forms must be received by Vicki Winston by January 31, 2015.

The 2015 World Horseshoe Tournament will be held July 13–25, 2015 at the Kansas Expocentre located in Topeka, KS. The NHPA trailer has already arrived from Buffalo and plans are being finalized for the preparation for this event.

As part of my duties as World Tournament Coordinator, I attended the "Connect" Sports Marketing Convention August 22-24, 2014 in Orlando, FL. This conference is an opportunity for us to showcase our event to a wide variety of cities throughout the country. This year's conference was held at the Marriot Hotel located at Disney World. Over 200 planners attended this conference with another 200 sponsors.

During the three day conference, I had over 47 appointments with various Tourism and CVB groups. Throughout each day, there were also educational seminars held to train organizers in the field of planning and executing their events. Once again, the interest in horseshoes and the prospect to bid for the world tournament remains high. It was interesting to hear stories from the various Tourism and CVB groups on how the economy has affected their budgets. Some regions of the US are doing great while others are struggling to maintain.

From this conference, I am happy to report the following locations have expressed an interest in bidding for the 2017 World Tournament. These locations include Knoxville, TN; York, PA; Charleston, WV; and Tri Valley, CA. We also have many other locations which have expressed a high interest in bidding after Tina attended the S.P.O.R.T.S conference September 8th-11th at Annapolis, MD. Some of these locations include Toledo, OH; Athens, GA; Chicago, IL; Rockford, IL; Pocatello, ID; Dutch, PA; and Casper, WY. As you can see we have a large interest in sites wanting to bring this event to their city.

I will be attending the 2014 TEAMS (Travel, Events, and Management in Sports) Conference in Las Vegas November 10-13, 2014. I look forward to these events as I believe they benefit the sport of horseshoes. Not only to draw interest in sites bidding, but also raise awareness to the various sports marketing groups from all over the US that horseshoes are played at a competitive level.

For the Regional Directors, you may be contacted by your local CVB/Tourism group as I provided them your name to start the communication. I have encouraged them to team up with their local horseshoe clubs before starting the bidding process as I have found that teams comprised of both horseshoe and tourism groups seem to be more successful during the bidding process.

I want to wish everyone the happiest Holidays, stay warm and keep pitching.

This critical and important task is necessary to ensure that all games are played under comparable conditions nation-wide. Specifications and guidelines are found in the RGS book. I would encourage RDs and clubs to work together to manage and mitigate any possible issues that may arise during this process. We are in hopes of having this project completed by the end of June 2015.

Idaho - David Spears



Minnesota - Gene Gross

Our Bloomington, Minnesota courts were the host site for horseshoes for the 2014 Minnesota Senior Games. To qualify for the 2015 National Senior Games to be held in Minneapolis, St. Paul and Bloomington one must qualify in a 2014 State Senior Games event. While horseshoes in these senior games is not an NHPA event, I thought it might be useful to report on this activity.

There were 21 sports in the Minnesota Senior Games and over 1.500 seniors participated. We had 32 seniors pitching horseshoes. It is divided by five year age brackets for both men and women over 50. So the brackets were 50 - 54, 55 - 59, 60 - 64, etc up to 91-95. Most of the 32 pitchers were from Minnesota, but we did have a few from North Dakota as you do not need to qualify in your home state, only in one of the 50 states. Most of the 32 were NHPA members as I and several other Bloomington Club members who entered knew many of the participants.

This event differed from horseshoe tournaments we were familiar with in several ways. We pitched 30 shoe games using Count All with no handicap. Each game winner received a five point bonus score for the game. The bracket winner was the person with the highest total Count All score including the bonus points. So it was not necessarily the person with the most wins, but the one with the highest total score. Some of our pitchers wondered where the 30 shoe games came from, but perhaps someone in the Senior Games Rules thought that seniors should be somewhat limited in the total number of shoes pitched.

It was different too by pitching in the five year brackets, as you could be pitching against others you would not normally be competing such as those with much higher or lower ringer percentages. I pitched in the 75-79 bracket and one of my competitors was Sig Armitage, a 70 % thrower and the Minnesota State Elders Champ. He was fun to pitch against, but of course he easily beat me. I did finish in 4th place in my bracket which barely qualified me for the 2015 Games.

Other winners and qualifiers included Jean McNichols, Laurie Kelley, Janet Rudd, Kenneth Giles, Marvin Akkerman, Harold Shrader (age 92 and oldest competitor), Michael Demars, Joe Martin, Jerry Werk, Gerald Hokkala, Larry Miller, Dick Hall, Brad Heth, Jim David, William Danielson, Clem Gilbertson, Wilbur Kemp, Harold Bishel and Wayne Hohenstein.

Sara Otto and Robin Constance of our Bloomington Club ran this

event and did a great job. Robin also competed and qualified for 2015.

One final comment, 14 of the 21 sports had a National Sport Chair for the National Senior Games. Horseshoes does not. I have recommended that the NHPA assign someone to take on this task.

New Hampshire - Tom Booth

The New Hampshire Horseshoe Pitchers' Association held their annual State Championship tournament and meeting on Saturday, August 16, in Nashua, NH.



Dale Gregory was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a Player. She was presented the Award for her outstanding achievement of winning the State's Women Class A Championship title five times. Dale's first title came in 2004, with a five wins and one loss victory and averaging 55.95%. Then in 2006, she took a second title with a 59.88% average. In 2008, a third title was won with a record

of no losses and pitching 53.41% for the tournament. A fourth title was captured in 2010, with five wins one loss and averaging 61.03%. And in 2011, Dale won her fifth State's Championship title with six wins no losses and a tournament average of 65.03%. Dale lives in North Haverhill, and has been an active member of the NH Pitchers' Association for over eleven years.



Tim Comeau was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a Player. He was presented the Award for his outstanding achievement of winning the State's Class A Championship title twice. His first title win came in 2008 with a 63.64 pitching percentage. Then in 2011, Tim won his second title with seven wins no losses and pitching 63.52 for the tournament. Tim is married with one son, two grandchildren and lives in Epsom, NH.

New Jersey - Bill Mac Intyre

A smile and a handshake start and end your game on a pleasant note. Tournament Directors always appreciate help to tidy up the courts after you've enjoyed pitching on them.

Anger and disrespect are unwelcome guests at tournaments.

- (excerpt from Shoes News, Volume 39, Issue #8, August 2014) Where are the future Horseshoe Pitchers (by Editor Jerry Clark) I'm sure the horseshoe pitching fraternity has been asking this question for at least the past couple decades. Many years ago when America was largely an agricultural society with many family farms that had been handed down from generation to generation, the families were large and closely knit. Grandpa had taught dad or mom how to pitch horseshoes. Then dad taught the boys and girls how to pitch, and I'm sure this went on and on until the family farms were sold off to large agricultural corporations and most people moved to larger towns and big cities to find jobs. Consequently, the children in each succeeding generation have less and less familiarity with the game we love so much. The question remains, where are we going to find the future pitchers, if the game is going to survive? Some would say the youth are still the best hope for the future. The problem is the young people are entering the



busiest times of the lives; College, moving away from home, jobs, getting married, having children, and all the cares and concerns of busy family life. Maybe we can reach middle age parents whose children are grown and out of the house. This is a possibility. More than likely, this group has very little horseshoe pitching in their past, most having grown up in big cities. Another possibility is seniors. They may have more time on their hands and may be familiar with the game from their youth. The answer I believe, is not any single group, but a combination of all of the above. We need to use all the influence we have in our extended families and circles of friends to share what a blessing and benefit playing horseshoes has been in our own personal lives and individually, bring others along. Teach them how to play, teach them the rules and etiquette of the game, and as we gauge each one's interest and enthusiasm, invite them to our practices and competitions. If each one of us would introduce just one new person to the game each year, our numbers would grow tremendously.

Possible ways to grow our game and make more people in our communities aware of horseshoe pitching:

1) Every club hosts at least one non-sanctioned tournament or

"teaching day" a year for their local community. They must seek ways to advertise this event through flyers/newspapers, etc., well in advance of the date. Start adversities when the club starts practice and hold your event later in the summer. Example: advertise as a community tournament sponsored by your club.

- 2) Each sanctioned tournament would have a "novice" class (handicapped or not) with new or inexperienced pitchers only. They could pay an entry fee and prize money would be paid out. Possible all would pitch from 30 feet.
- 3) An Open Doubles Tournament where each club members brings an inexperienced pitcher. Each game the new pitcher gets rotated to another experienced pitcher. Wins and losses are only kept for the new pitchers. An award could be given to the pitcher with the best win/loss record, and also to the pitcher who scored the most individual points.

I have no idea what the insurance ramifications of the suggestions are. Ultimately, I believe people will participate only if they are truly interested. Therefore, our job is to do everything we can to get them interested.

NHPA RULES AND BYLAWS by Dan Sanders

FINAL REMINDER... As you may remember, 2015 is the year for considering and voting on proposed RGS changes. Our NHPA Bylaws state that, "All member-proposed changes to the NHPA Bylaws and RGS Book shall be submitted in writing to the respective Committee Chairperson (currently Dan Sanders) and shall be post-marked no later than December 31st of the year preceding the appropriate Convention (this next year in Topeka, KS). Several 'reminders' have been made since the World Tournament in Buffalo, and by the time you receive this Newsline issue, this date may already have passed. But if not, there is still time for you to submit your suggested changes. Please submit any proposed changes in writing to me (by US mail or e-mail) by the end of December, and as follows: Please include the current RGS wording, your proposed change to that wording (with any new wording underlined and/or italicized), and also the reason(s)/rationale for this proposed change. Please find my US mailing address and e-mail address listed on page 2 of this Newsline Magazine. A copy of the RGS Book text can be found on our NHPA Website, or it can be requested from your State Secretary or by contacting Dick Hansen, NHPA Secretary/Treasurer.

As a follow-up to the above... I have already received several PRC's (Proposed RGS Changes) from our membership (many thanks), and expect more before the December 31st deadline. I'd like to inform our membership about how these PRC's are 'processed' by me and our current Rules Committee members. Upon receiving PRC's, I may be contacting the authors to clarify any questions, and may suggest changes of wording, etc... though the Committee reserves the right to make minor changes, so long as the intent of the PRC is not altered. I will then be presenting these PRC's (usually one at a time) to our Rules Committee members... for discussion and possible revisions. This will be followed by individual Committee voting... on whether or not this PRC is something we feel should be decided on later, by

Charter voting delegates at the NHPA Convention in Topeka, KS. Those PRC's approved by our Committee will then be presented to our NHPA Council members at our January meeting; for final approval. Generally, our NHPA Council accepts the Rules Committee recommendations. Also, FYI, the current Rules Committee members are: Dan Sanders; Chairman from OH, Jerry LaBrosse from MN, Debbie Michaud from MA, Ron Kohn from MI, Rich Altis from MO, Coyce Allen from TX, and Gail Sluys from CA. Many thanks to these veteran NHPA members for agreeing to serve on this most important NHPA Committee!

Charter Clinics on Playing Rules & Judging... an Update - As you will recall from my last Newsline article, Judging Clinics were recently offered at the 2014 World Tournament at Buffalo, NY and were deemed to be very successful, and were also well-attended! These clinics included a 'classroom session' where 20 selected True/False -Yes/No questions were selected and used as a basis of discussion in a 'classroom' setting... for court situations that are more likely to occur during the course of tournament play. A power-point presentation was also developed and was very useful visual aid during these clinics. In addition, several table-top 'pit models' were available and used for demonstrating and discussing the correct use of several specialized measuring tools. It has been suggested and recommended that every pitcher should attend one of these clinics, whether or not they ever plan to become a judge. Since the WT, several of these Clinics have been held by several of our Charter 'teachers' (some during State Tournaments), and other Clinics will be offered during this coming year and before our next World Tournament in Topeka, KS. And so... if you ever have an opportunity to attend one of these Playing Rules & Judging Clinics, please do! Check with your Charter Officers and/ or RD for additional information.

HORSESHOE PITCHING FACTS AND

FOLKLORE by Bob Dunn, NHPA Historian

A National Championship

This is the final paper issue of Newsline and a bit of a melancholy moment for me as I have written an article in nearly every Newsline issue ever printed. Newsline began in 1989 and in 1990 being appointed the National Junior Promotion Director, I began writing the Junior Window and have had a series of articles of one sort or another in Newsline ever since.

This Facts and Folklore series began in 2004 and has had an enjoyable run for over ten years. Oh, this is not the final Newsline, nor my final article. Of all the articles written in this

series, this will probably be one of my favorites. Not so much that it is might be an interesting article, but the fact that it took over 20 years to write.

Some twenty-five years ago, I was wandering through an antique show at Brookdale Mall and came across an old rules brochure, the kind included with the sales of pitching shoes years ago.

The exact age of this Octigan horseshoe brochure was not clear, but it was obviously old and featured hookless pitching shoes.

It took a few years before there was enough knowledge to determine that it preceded the sale of the Octigan Company to St. Pierre, which dated it prior to 1932.

While the brochure provides considerable information to horseshoe collectors, i.e. Standard shoes and the original Leader shoes, the big puzzle was the final page and the photo of a \$1,000 trophy and the mention of the American Horseshoe Pitchers Association and an annual national championship.

That is where the mystery lied and where the 20 years of research began. There could have been a misprint and actually meant the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association, but we know today that no world or national tournaments were hosted by the NHPA from 1930 through 1932. It was not a misprint, but considerable research was not turning up any information on an AHPA. Finally this year, the tournament was identified, the dates, the location and the winner of that \$1,000 trophy. And story of the 1930 National Championship. The so here is the setting is Lincoln Park in Chicago, September 27, 1930, and this is the brief coverage that was afforded the event by the Chicago media:

HOSIERS WIN TWO TITLES IN HORSESHOE MEET

"Jimmy Risk of Montpellier, Indiana, yesterday won the national

amateur horseshoe pitching championship at Lincoln Park and a pair of Hoosiers, Henry Pergal, of Dugger and Orville Harris of Saxonville took the doubles title back to Indiana.

Pergal also finished third in the singles, with Milton Tate of Moline, Illinois, second. Bessie Schneider of Chicago won the women's singles and paired with Zite Schupan of Chicago won the women's doubles. Otto Fulner of Chicago and R.L. Simonds of Wilmette, Illinois, were runner-up in the men's doubles."

This certainly is a brief article for a national event and no other article could be located that gave the entire roster of

> participating players. Even though the other competitors mentioned were championships class pitchers in their own right, that additional information would have been a strong indicator of truly how authentic this national title was for Risk.

> Risk also got a little hometown press with this article:




"Jimmie Risk, Montpellier, Ind., won the National Amateur Horseshoe Pitching title in the men's singles

when competing in the first annual tourney sponsored by the American Horseshoe Pitching Association.

Milton Tate, Moline, Ill., and Henry Pergal, Dugger, Ind., captured second and third respectively.

Risk has been state champion of Indiana for the past four years and has been barred from further competition at the Indiana State Fair."

HORSESHOE PITCHING FACTS AND

FOLKLORE by Bob Dunn, NHPA Historian

Arlo Harris pitched in the initial AAU National Horseshoe Championships in 1937. He earned a bronze medal by placing 3rd in the men's division and then teamed up with brother Orville to take 3rd place in the men's doubles.

Orville Harris qualified three times in World tournament competition:

And Arlo qualified twice:

And so ends our tales about the American Horseshoe Pitchers Association, the 1930 National Amateur Championship and those involved. No record on a following tournament in 1931 or 1932 could be found even though Jimmy Risk claimed a three-year reign of the title, but then, who knows what another twenty years of research might turn up.

Historian Jottings By Bob Dunn

At the 2014 Membership Convention held during the 2104 World Tournament in Buffalo, New York, I addressed the delegation regarding the books that are now being published on the sport of horseshoe pitching. Previously, as publicized in Newsline is the "AAU National Horseshoe Pitching Championships," and coming off the presses about October of this year is "The Lee Rose Story." Here is a synopsis of my notes.

My message was to request each delegate in attendance to help sell the books by contacting local libraries and request to check out the books. If the libraries do not have the book available, then request they purchase the book. What drives the libraries' decisions is the input and requests by their patrons.

Each time the book is checked out, the request is monitored and will help move the library to purchase these books and future books on Horseshoe pitching. That exposure will not hurt our sport.

One reason you should consider buying the books yourself is, once the publishing costs are recovered, the proceeds go to the NHPF. The AAU book was three years of research and a year to write it. I personally do not make a penny on the book. The Lee Rose Story took three years to write. I will not make any money on the project. These and future book are written in hopes that they will be fundraisers for our sport through sales to the NHPA membership, horseshoe clubs and libraries.

I would like all charters to run announcements in your charter newsletters, so our entire membership knows about these books, know that they available and how to buy them. Some charters have even put an announcement on their website.

All clubs should consider buying a copy or two of each book to use as door prizes or awards at your season ending awards banquets. You might even raffle one off and raise some funds for your own club's benefit.

He was born May 9, 1951, in Ward, West Virginia to Thurman and Madeline (Hudnall) Rice.


He is survived by one daughter, Jennifer A. (Anthony Mullins) Fye; two sisters,

Robert (Bob) Champion 1917-2014 Boulder, Colorado



Bob Champion (NHPA and CHPA Hall of Fame member) passed away October 4, 2014 (96 Years Young) at his home in Boulder, Colorado. He is survived by four children and five grandchildren.

Bob was born October 13, 1917 in Oberlin, Ohio. After graduating from Oberlin High School, he worked for the Oberlin newspaper selling advertising during the day and writing sports articles in the evening and on weekends. He worked from 1939 through 1970 as Sports Editor, Advertising Sales and Manager in the Oberlin area.

Bob was a veteran (Staff Sergeant) of the Ohio U.S. army 166th Infantry during World War II (1941-1945). Bob served his time at Camp Shelby in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, Texas City, Texas, Fort Ord, California and Fort Hood, Texas. Bob also wrote sport stories in the Amy paper during his tour of duty.

Bob moved his family to Colorado in 1970 and worked for a paper in the Denver area. In 1975 he retired from the newspaper business and started working part time at the Iocal Bowling Alley. Bob worked at the Brunswick bowling lanes for 30 years until the end of 2006. In 1980 he was introduced to the game of horseshoes at the Ted Allen Horseshoe courts in Boulder, Colorado and became a league and tournament pitcher. He soon became the "Double Ringer" editor for Colorado. Bob said his favorite computer was his manual Corona typewriter for 26 years. Bob promoted Colorado horseshoe pitching in the State and around the U.S. through his writings. Bob also developed the Colorado Hall of Fame program as well as getting a trailer house to store Hall of Fame memorabilia. The Colorado Chapter has been blessed to

have Bob as a member for 35 years. In 1992 Colorado sanctioned the first State Doubles Tournament honoring Bob Champion by having the doubles tournament named after him.

His Colorado State Awards:

1). 2006 World Champion, Elders Class-J. Bob received Guinness World Record Certificate as the oldest person to win a Class Championship at the World Horseshoe Pitchers Tournament 2006 at the age of 88 in Gillette, Wyoming. 2).1999-Colorado Horseshoe Presidential Award. 3). 1997-Decade of Service Award. 4). 1992-Ted Allen Memorial Award for Service. 5). 1986-Colorado Hall of Fame for Service. 6). Four (4) time Class State singles and Doubles Champion.

You also know Bob through his many jobs with NHPA—Publicity director (Ten years) has completed several world news clipping scrapbooks for the CHPA Hall of Fame. He initiated (1986) the Press Headquarters at the World, furnishing pitching records for the World Programs since 1988, published an annual Media Guide from 1986-1998 and created the Charter Chatter from States for the Newsline.

NHPA Awards: 1). 1997 NHPA Hall of Fame for Promoter/ Organizer. 2). 1993 Presidential Award. 3). 1986 Stoke Memorial Award for Service. 4). 1983 Achievement Award for Newsletter Publication- Double Ringer.

Bobs hobbies included: Golf, Basketball, Softball, Bowling, Horseshoes, Big Band Music-was a drummer, Theater, Fishing, Collected many US Stamps and Golf Balls (over 1,500).

The NHPA and Colorado Horseshoe Pitching Association will miss Bob's special presence and know that he will long be remembered as a driving force in the development of many programs that horseshoes pitchers enjoys today.
