## TO HOLD ANNUAL ROCK RIVER VALLEY OPEN ON LABOR DAY

The sixth annual Rock River Valley Open Tournament will be held at the Lawrence Park courts at Rock Falls, Illinois on Labor Day, September 4. Qualifying will start on Sunday, September 3 at 2 p.m. until 10 p.m. and resuming at 8 a.m. Monday, September 4, closing at 12 noon, CDST. All entries will pitch 100 shoes for qualifying with the privilege of an additional 100 shoes on payment of an extra \$2.00 fee, and resuming qualifying within 15 minutes. Tournament will be sanctioned by State and National associations which requires contestant to have a 1961 N.H.P.A. card. Cards will be available at courtside. Ellis Griggs of Plainville, Illinois will be the defending champion.

There will be two classes with 16 men in each class. Class A with 16 men divided into two groups of 8, likewise with Class B. Qualifiers will be alternated into each class so that all groups will be evenly matched. Winners of each group will play for the class championship. The runners-up in each group will play-off for 3rd place in each class. Trophies will be awarded to top two men in class after play-offs. Wilma Long and Vivian Holmquist will be head scorekeepers with Bill Portner acting as official umpire and referee.

These same courts will be the scene of another tournament on September 2 for players within a radius of 60 miles of Sterling-Rock Falls. The Iowa and Wisconsin lines will be the north and west borderline and extending 60 miles to the east and south. Qualifying starts at 8:00 a.m. and closes at 12 noon. Round-robin play begins at 1:30 p.m.

## EARL WINSTON STREAKS THROUGH LAMAR OPEN

Earl Winston, West Central regional director, stepped up the tempo in the recent Lamar, Missouri Open, to a point where he was completely out of range of the rest of the field. He averaged 74.7 percent for the afternoon which included a scorching game of 84.0 percent. W. J. Lilly came up with 8 straight doubles to take honors in that bracket. The Elkins-Lilly game was the longest with 94 shoes pitched. Jack Brouse of Lamar came through unscathed in the Class B division with 7-0.

The award was presented by Mrs. Mary Stokes, widow of the beloved Arch Stokes, former N.H.P.A. President in whose memory the Stokes family makes the award each year. Mrs. Stokes and her daughter Maureen and granddaughter Becky made the trip to Muncie from Utah for the second straight year and attended every session.

Previous winners of the Stokes award are Elmer Beller (Calif.) in 1958, Arch and Katie Gregson (Calif.) in 1959, Harold and Mary Craig (Ind.) in 1960.

This was the first tournament in many, many years which Arch and Katie Gregson have missed and everyone hopes they will be back next year for the event did not seem complete without them.

Other special awards went to Cliff and Elsie Tomlinson of the Muncie, Ind. Club in recognition to the local person or persons who contributed the most to the success of the tournament, and to Dale Dixon of Iowa who has not missed a tournament in 40 years. This latter award was in the form of a surprise from the players themselves.

Elmer Hohl of Canada received the Neatest Dressed Player award and it is noteworthy that he wore an N.H.P.A. T-shirt throughout the tourney. Trophy for this award donated by Ellis Cobb, News Digest Editor.

## HAROLD RENO OF SABINA, OHIO, 1961 WORLD RINGER CHAMPION

Harold Reno of Sabina, Ohio and a member of the Ohio Buckeye association, was crowned the new ringer king of the world at the recent World Tournament which closed July 26 at Muncie, Indiana. He had 34 victories against 1 loss which came at the last night when he was defeated by Ted Allen of Boulder, Colorado, and a former world champion.

It was the first championship for Reno, who was undefeated until the last and final match of the 35-game round-robin match. Allen, who has held the world title 10 times, also went into the last night's session undefeated but dropped 3 matches before he met and defeated Reno.

### THIRD ANNUAL MONTANA STATE TOURNAMENT

The third annual Montana State Horseshoe Tournament will be held on the Double Ringer Courts at Wibaux, Montana on Sunday, September 3 and Monday, September 4 (Labor Day). Qualifying for "Classing" players will be held from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. on the 3rd. Tournament play starts at noon that day.

This tourney is open to all N.H.P.A. members in the State of Montana. There will be an award to the player pitching the highest qualifying score as well as an award to the ringer champion, a sportsmanship trophy, and two to four awards in each class (depending upon the number of entries).

Entry fee is \$4.00 except that all who qualify in Class A will pay one dollar additional. Entries must be received in Wibaux not later than August 10th.

### GARY ROBERTS IS NEW JUNIOR KING

Gary Roberts, 14 year old Lucasville, Ohio lad is the new National Junior champion. He was runner up last year and two years ago his brother Donnie won the title at Murray, Utah.

Gary is a real champion and pitches the men's distance of 40 feet. He defeated Larry Brewer of Muncie for the title after the two had tied in the round-robin. In the playoff Gary won the first and third games, 50-4 and 50-34 while Brewer won the second tilt 50-38. Gary tossed 117 ringers out of 194 shoes in the playoff for an average of 60.3 percent.

A field of 24 Juniors entered the event and they were whittled down to eight finalists in group play. Rain and wind handicapped the players at various times.

Last year's champion, 13 year old Hal Brown of Indiana was eliminated in the preliminary round-robins. Since last year he had moved back to the 40 foot distance which resulted in a drop in his ringer performance.,

## THE 1961 WORLD TOURNAMENT STORY

Harold Reno, the one and a quarter reverse turn artist from the Buckeye state methodically pitched his way to the 1961 World title at Heekin Park in Muncie, Ind., July 18-26. His only loss came in the final game with Ted Allen after he had already clinched victory with 34 straight wins.

Reno won further honors when he was voted the Sportsmanship Trophy by the players, a great tribute to a great champion.

Don Titcomb of California was unable to defend his title because a recent change in jobs made it impossible for him to attend.

Reno, Ted Allen of Colorado, Elmer Hohl of Canada, Floyd Toole of Arkansas and Curt Day and Gene Brumfield of Indiana were undefeated the first night of play. Day, Brumfield and Toole dropped a game on the second night and Hohl on the third night. Allen and Reno matched win for win until the final night although Ted had some shaky moments. On the final evening of play Allen lost three games when Floyd Fowler of Indiana, Floyd Toole and Elmer Hohl all tossed terrific games at him.

Four world records were broken. The game between Paul Focht of Ohio and Floyd Toole going 178 shoes to wipe out the record established by the two left handers, Titcomb and Steinfeldt, last year at 176 shoes. Focht won 50-48 with 154 ringers to Toole's 153.

Ralph Maddox of West Virginia who finished in third place tossed 3016 shoes in his 35 games for another record. His game with Ted Allen which went 166 shoes in which there were 52 "four deads" including 10 straight, was a tournament feature.

Ted Allen as runner up broke two World tourney records with 2478 ringers including 1073 doubles in his 35 games. He had one string of 54 consecutive ringers.

Elmer Hohl, the popular Canadian, took fourth and was awarded the "News Digest" Neatest Dressed player trophy.

Curt Day of Indiana in fifth place authored the highest single game performance when he hit 93.8% with 45 out of 48.

Bob West of Oregon had the highest ringer percentage for a losing player when he registered 119 ringers in 138 shoes against Paul Focht for 86.2 percent. Bob finished 8th.

Gene Brumfield hit 58 out of 62 against West for 93.5%. He had an 80.4 percent average in 9th place overall.

Roger Vogel of Illinois, now in the Navy stationed at Norfolk, Va., finished in 10th spot.

Graydon McFatridge who finished 11th and his brother Harold gave the 36 man group a brother combination.

Earl and Leland Wiges of Iowa added a father-son combination to the championship field, "dad" losing to his son 50 to 15 when they met, but finishing ahead in the final standings.

Floyd Fowler of Indiana was the first to take Allen's measure and he hit 40 straight ringers in the qualifying round. He finished 12th.

Last year's Class "B" winner, Wilbur Kabel of Ohio, took 13th and qualified as a "giant killer" by defeating Floyd Toole.

Other "giant killers" were Clarence Bellman of Indiana who upset Bob West; Herb Pinch of Pennsylvania who upset both Brumfield and Hohl; Ray Martin of Illinois when he took Focht 50-46; Dale Dixon of Iowa also a victor over Focht; Art Dugle of Illinois who took the measure of Brumfield; Francis Rogers of Iowa upset winner over Day; Bill Sollars of Ohio, winner over both Toole and Maddox; and Rod Hatton of Indianapolis who downed Hohl.

Hatton, the 23 year old red head from Indianapolis looks like a future great. He pushed Ted Allen to the limit in the opening round before losing 50-44 and pitched good shoes all the way through the tourney.

Jack Stout of Illinois, National A.A.U. doubles champ, also gave a good account of himself.

Steve Fenicchia of New York was the only player to break a shoe during competition.

Jimmy Kemple of Indiana qualified for the title play with 476 but withdrew.

Missing faces in addition to Titcomb included Carl Steinfeldt of New York who recently suffered a blood clot in his leg. Carl was on hand as a spectator. Truman Standard was prevented from attending due to his wife's illness. Kenneth Jensen of Michigan suffered a back injury two weeks before tourney time.

**VICKI WINSTON 1961 LADIES CHAMPION**

Vickie Winston of Missouri regained the World Ladies title which she had previously won three times under the name of Vicki Chapelle.

Vicki topped last year's champion, Esta McKee in the playoff in two straight games, 51-20 and 50-34, throwing 77 ringers in 126 shoes for an average of 61.1 percent. Mrs. McKee had 66 ringers for 52.3 percent.

Anna Lindquist of West Virginia defeated Sue Gillespie in the third place playoff 50 to 18 with 36 ringers in 58 shoes for 62.1 percent.

There were 12 entries in the Ladies division and the darling of the tournament was little 14 year old Sue Gillespie of Portland, Ind. who turned in a fine performance in her first competitive appearance, winning four and losing only to Mrs. McKee in the preliminaries.

**MINUTES OF THE 1961 N.H.P.A. CONVENTION**

The 1961 convention of the N.H.P.A. was held July 21 in Heekin Park, Muncie, Indiana.

President Reinhard Backer presided and the following officers were present; Vice-Presidents Paul Focht (Ohio), Elmer Beller (Calif.) and Mary Craig (Ind). Secretary-Treasurer Robert Pence (Ind.)

Mrs. Ann Geiting of the Muncie Park Dept. acted as recording Secretary. 64 voting delegates from 25 State Chapters were seated.

A moment of silence was observed in honor of members and persons affiliated with the N.H.P.A. who had passed away during the year. These included Edward Patnie (Ohio), Burleigh Warner (Fla.), Mrs. Allen (Colo.), Joseph Ruggles (N. Y.), Mrs. Margret Clear Calif.), Carl Herrington (Colo.), Charles Riley (Kan.), Russell Bennington (Ill.), Mrs. Edith Wise and Joseph Nichols (Ind.)

Minutes of the previous convention were read by Secretary Bob Pence and approved on a motion by Toole (Ark.) and Wilmore (Ind.).

The Ted Allen petition requesting official recognition of the 1934 World Tourney in Los Angeles was approved upon the recommendation of the special investigating committee which had studied the question.

Beller (Calif.), Chairman of the Rules Committee reported, and the committee recommended the addition of a clarifying note on the rule pertaining to the scoring of points in situations where opponents shoes were equal distance from the stake. The recommendation was adopted on a motion by Toole (Ark.) and Hyland (N. Y.)

The Steinfeldt proposal for alternating first pitch was defeated.

The Lee Davis plan for World Tournament qualifying was discussed and upon a motion by Davis (N. J.) and Chapelle (Oreg.) was referred to a committee of high ranking players for study with the provision that the committee's recommendation be voted upon at the next convention.

## CONVENTION — (Continued)

Motion by Davis (N. J.) and Allen (Colo.) that the top ten players qualify automatically for the next tournament was defeated.

Toole (Ark.) recommended that an appreciation fund be started for the groundskeepers at future World Tournaments. The idea met with unanimous approval.

Beller (Calif.) and Dixon (Ia.) made a motion that the tournament committee have a choice of the number of players in the championship division and that such a decision be posted six months in advance. The motion was carried, and President Backer stated that the provision in the by-laws pertaining to this question would be studied and rewritten if necessary for action at the next convention.

Following a discussion President Backer announced a committee would be appointed to study and make recommendations regarding a multiple membership fee system for N.H.P.A. membership and News Digest subscriptions with action to be taken at the next convention.

The financial report was given by Secretary-Treasurer, Bob Pence, who prefaced the report the present bank balance did not truly reflect the financial status of the N.H.P.A. as it included funds for the World tournament and a reserve built up to carry through the lean winter months.

Mr. Backer (Utah) declined nomination for re-election as President. McGrath (Ohio) and Beller (Calif.) nominated Harold Craig of Indiana. Beller and Hagy (Calif.) moved nominations be closed and Harold Craig was elected by acclamation.

The nominating committee nominated Elmer Beller (Calif.) 1st Vice-President, James Johnson (Ky.) 2nd Vice-President and Ben Trolen (Minn.) 3rd Vice-President. All were elected unanimously.

Maureen Cook (Utah), Mary Craig (Ind.) and Vicki Winston (Mo.) were nominated for 4th Vice-President. Mary Craig withdrew and Mrs. Winston was elected.

Meeting was adjourned on motion by Flynn (Mich.) and Focht (Ohio).

## WORLD TOURNAMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Estimates on the crowd attending the final night of play by newspaper men, park department personnel and athletic coaches from the Muncie area ran as high as 6,000 and none were lower than 5,000. It was truly a grand crowd of spectators.

Crowds during the early part of the tournament did not seem to be as large as the previous year but the final nights more than made up for it.

Clive Wahlin of Utah was unable to attend because of the illness of his mother. Bill Neilon and Paul Hoover of Indiana, both outstanding players, suffered accidents at work shortly before the tournament and were unable to participate.

Larry Lewandowski of Minnesota scored on court nine for the 15th consecutive year in the World Tournament.

The courts at Heekin Park were closed on Sunday morning and play was not scheduled until one o'clock. Mr. Backer (Utah) and Beller (Calif.) took a trip to Greenville, Ohio, some 50 miles from Muncie, to look over facilities and prospects for the 1962 tournament. Upon their arrival at 10:00 a.m. they were surprised to find W. O. Maxwell practicing. He explained that the courts at Muncie were closed and that he had to go somewhere to practice. **Question:** At the age of 81 does Maxwell still need practice that badly?

Graydon McFatrige (Ind.) established what is believed to be a record when he tossed his 200 qualifying shoes in 34 minutes. Did right well, too, for he posted a 500 score.

**HAROLD WOLFE WINS CLASS "C" TITLE**

Harold Wolfe of Cedarville, Ohio captured the first Class "C" event in World Tourney history without the loss of a game. Averaging well over 60 percent ringers he had one 81 percent game.

The players were divided into four groups with the winners advancing to the championship playoff. Merle Tirey of Illinois and Charlie McCammon of Muncie lost special games for the right to enter the playoff.

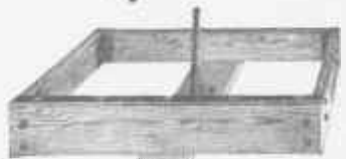
