

Elmer Hohl Captures Eastern National Title With 15 Straight

Elmer Hohl, the 1965 World Champion, went undefeated in the Class A competition to become the 1966 Eastern National Champion. Close behind was Paul Focht losing only to Elmer and Wes Kuchcinski. Elmer managed to compile a phenominal 83.3%, a new record for the Eastern. Paul was not far behind with an 81.1%. Tournament was played at Scotty's Courts, south of Washington, Pennsylvania.

Class B was won in a pitchoff by Joseph Wohar of Donora, Pa. by defeating Grover Anderson of Parkersburg, West Virginia. Glenn Brown, the only man other than Elmer to go undefeated in the competition, won Class C. Class D was captured by a relatively new man in the horseshoe game, Gilbert Fridinger. In Class E, the ever pleasant Dean Mayes from Pine Grove Mills, Pa.,

1966 Ohio State Championship To Be Held At City Park, Greenville, Ohio, Sept. 2-3-4-5

The Ohio State Championship Tournament for 1966 will be held at Greenville, Ohio, over Labor Day week-end, marking the 10th successive year on invitation of The Darke County Horseshoe Club and The City of Greenville.

All entrants must be Ohio residents, and except for the Juniors, hold a 1966 Ohio NHPA membership card. (Cards will be available at the courts.) Events are scheduled as follows:

ENTRY FEE & QUALIFYING—MEN: Entry fee \$5.00, qualifying (100 shoes) begins Friday afternoon, Sept. 2, from 2 to 9 p.m., and continues on Saturday morning, Sept. 3 until 12 noon, the deadline for entries.

CONVENTION: The annual meeting of The Ohio Buckeye State Association will be held Saturday afternoon, Sept. 3, as soon as possible after all entrants to the tournament have qualified.

MEN'S TOURNAMENT: Round robin begins with the lower classes Saturday afternoon, Sept. 3, after the convention, continues on Sunday, Sept. 4, and finishes Labor Day, Sept. 5. Classes will be arranged according to qualifying scores and starting time posted.

LADIES' TOURNAMENT: Saturday afternoon, Sept. 3, after the convention. Entry fee \$5.00; no qualifying; deadline for entries 12 noon, Sept. 3. Classes will be arranged by Tournament Committee. NHPA card required.

JUNIOR TOURNAMENT: Saturday afternoon, Sept. 3, after the convention. Age limit 16 years and under. No entry fee, no qualifying. Classes will be arranged by Tournament Committee. NHPA card not required. Entries close at 12 noon, Sept. 3.

AWARDS: Trophies and cash prizes in addition to NHPA certificates in the Men's and Ladies' division, trophies only in the Junior.

GENERAL: Glenn Riffle is the defending champion, and his son Dennis took the Juniors last year. Ruth Bennett is the defending Ladies Champ. The excellent courts and other facilities, plus the hospitality at Greenville has become traditional and provides for a most pleasant weekend. Waldo Hagy, who hails from Las Vegas, Nevada, out-reached and outringered Winnie with his low flying horseshoes to win the Class A Championship in Vancouver's first major tournament with a 60.5% ringer average on their new 16 courts located adjacent to the freeway in the George Marshall Recreation Park in Vancouver, British Columbia, June 4. Hagy, is perhaps the best known retired roving horseshoe ambassador

in the entire country.

Alvin Dye of Vancouver, who admitted pitching his best game in a long

time, surprised the beach-comber by tagging him with his 2nd loss. Clyde Riley of Oregon, with a 5-0 record and a 37.5% average for 5 games

won Class B over Oscar Myhre of Oregon who had an average of 41.4% and took 2nd place.

Gene Swartwood of Oregon with a 5-1 record and an average of 33.5% won Class C over Emmett Torrence of Tacoma in a playoff, after being tied in the regular round robin. Emmett was our last hope for Washington to get a trophy.

Dave Sturdevant of Oregon came through Class D with an unscarred

record of 5 wins and a 23% average to claim the Championship.

Since this was Vancouver's first tournament, well publicized, played on new courts in ideal weather, lots of good food served free smorgasbord style in a spacious dining room in the beautiful Recreation Building, it is quite obvious judging from the results of this tournament that all beginners and the picnic variety of horseshoe pitchers had a pretty fair chance of winning, besides having a lot of fun.

Van Sant, Hoosier Sharpie Blazes Hot Trail Through Red River Valley Open To Win Championship

Dead-eye Karl Van Sant of Cayuga, Indiana, shattered all-time records while winning the 18th annual Red River Valley Open horseshoe pitching tournament July 2 and 3, held on Oak Grove Park Courts in Fargo, North Dakota.

The 41-year-old carpenter averaged 79.3 per cent ringers while posting nine straight wins in the 10-man Class A division. It was his first appearance in the tourney.

The tourney staged at the Fargo Park District's Oak Grove Park courts was the most successful on record, and it is hoped that it will serve as a springboard to Fargo's becoming the site of the 1967 world tournament.

Robert G. Pence of Gary, Indiana, NHPA executive secertary and world tourney manager, spent four days in Fargo-Moorhead. He huddled with RRV Open officials and city officials over the possibility of the world tourney.

Pence expressed satisfaction over the 18-court layout as well as the other facilities at the park. He said he had never seen a court layout in a park so well shaded. Pence was also happy with the cooperation he received from the Fargo delegation headed by Will Gullickson, NHPA regional director, who is also assistant sports editor of The Forum in Fargo. Gullickson is directing the world tourney bid.

Van Sant was pleased with the condition of the courts and upkeep of the park area. He said he will defend his title here next year. The top qualifier with 256 points, Van Sant, drilled ringers with ridiculous ease. His tourney appearance served to ignite even more interest in the sport here.

Van Sant established an all-time tourney record with 437 ringers on 552 shoes. He pegged a brilliant 86.5 per cent ringers in his final victory over Howie Ganz of Backus, Minn. His closest game was a 50-33 win over Frank Stinson, Minnesota champ. Andy Paglarini of Hibbing, Minn., outpointed Joe Anzaldi of St. Paul for runnerup honors. Lloyd Warthwout of Aberdeen, S. D. won the Class B title.

Pence visited with officials at Kindred, N. D. during his visit here. Kindred, located 30 miles southwest of Fargo, is one of the leading horseshoe towns in the area.

The RRV League officials ended their first fund-raising drive for the world tourney bid July 3. More than \$1,200 was raised. Prizes awarded went to Marvin Otterson of Harwood, N. D., Bob Lofgren of Minneapolis and Jacob Jacobson of Hannaford, N. D.

The Fritz Sporting Goods of Fargo placed a display of trophies and pictures in its downtown window prior to the Red River Valley Open. The firm has supplied the tourney with trophies for several years.

A large sign reading "We're Pitching for the 1967 World Tournament" was displayed for league officials at the 61st annual Red River Valley Fair. A display of pictures and articles was on view throughout the seven-day fair, attracting the attention of many fair-goers.

shoe Pitchers Association.




