Shriver of West Virginia Cans 6 Wins To Take Van Buren Open (Pa.)

The Van Buren Open tournament, held at the Van Buren Horseshoe Courts in Vanport, Pa., yielded some surprises for pitchers and fans alike.

For the first time the tournament held a Women's Class which was taken by Ruth Hangen of Buffalo, New York with a fine 71.8 percentage. Edith Werth, also of Buffalo, finished second with a 49.6% average.

The tournament committee wants to have separate classes next year for women of high and low abilities. Consequently all women are invited to enter.

In Class A, Howard Shriver of Wadestown, West Virginia upended defending champion Oscar Engle of Pittsburgh, Pa. Shriver held Engle to second place by defeating him 52-46 in a very close game. Shriver averaged 76.4%, although Engle edged him here with a 79.4%.

Class B competition saw Jack Rainbow of Monaca, Pa. set a personal high average ringer percentage of 72.5% while also taking the class for the first time. Carl Elder of New Castle, Pa. finished a distant second with a 61.9% average.

Ed Blum of Darlington, Pa. gained Class C honours by defeating Ray Slocum of Akron, Ohio in a playoff. Blum finished at 60.6% while Slocum averaged 54.9%.

Nick Wohar of Daisytown, Pa. won in Class D, at 43.0% and William Meador, of Youngstown, Ohio placed with a 48.7%.

Class E was won by Al Stahlback of Aliquippa, Pa. who won a four way play-off to take his class. George Combs of Pittsburgh, Pa. was second.

Class F was taken by Ted Corbett of New Castle, Pa., Clarence Shenton of Chester, W. Va. was second.

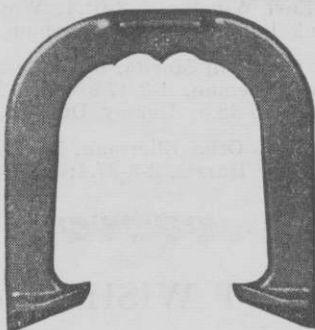

In Memoriam

Roy Kimmell of Albion, Ind. passed away in August after a long illness.

Roy was a founder and former officer of the Avilla Horseshoe club and had been active in horseshoe circles of northeast Indiana for many years.

His first tournament game was in 1927 at Old Settlers Day in Columbia City, Ind. and his first opponent was Bob Pence, now the NHPA Secretary-Treasurer who was also playing in his first tournament.

Sympathy of the NHPA is extended to the members of his family and the Avilla Horseshoe Club where his loss will be keenly felt.

Tennessee members were saddened by the passing of Hubert Davenport. Mr. Davenport died recently of a heart attack. Hubert was one of the great horseshoe pitchers in Tennessee and was champion in many tournaments. He was a former State Fair champion and threw a 3/4 turn with a high 70% average.

In one tournament between Mr. Davenport and D. Lebow "another Tennessee great" there were so many four deads that the clay was pushed down around the stake that the top shoe was even with the clay.

Mr. Davenport was always ready to help the beginners in horseshoe pitching. We in Tennessee will really miss such a fine gentleman and sportsman as Mr. Hubert Davenport.

Members of the New England State Associations were shocked at the sudden passing of Philip Smith of Oxford, Maine while competing in the 1968 New England Tournament on September 2nd.

Phil was a familiar figure down through the years as he travelled to all parts of New England playing in various tournaments of the sport he loved, and was a very strong pitcher. He was a member of the Maine Association, Lewiston-Auburn Club and N.H.P.A. Wherever Phil played, his smile, pleasant disposition and true sportsmanship won him a host of friends.

The sympathy of the Maine Association, the Lewiston-Auburn Horseshoe Club, together with other players throughout New England is extended to his loved ones in their hour of bereavement. Phil Smith will be sadly missed wherever he was associated.

We learn also of the passing of Martin J. Poppe, 867 Nassau Road, Uniondale, New York, after a long illness. He was a very active member taking part in many tournaments held in the eastern states. His tournament title came on May 31, 1967 when he captured the Lois J. Kolb Memorial Open tournament at Middlesex, New Jersey.

To his bereaved family, the sympathy of the New York state association together with that of the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association is extended in their deep loss.

The Hillsboro, Ore., Horseshoe Club was saddened at the passing of Carl D'Hondt in August of this year.

He was a great friend, a booster, always doing things. During the past few years he was unable to play, but constantly worked for the club.

The last tournament he saw was in a wheel chair.

He is sorely missed not only by the Hillsboro club, but also the State Association Members.

This will be a singles handicap league, based on a 50 shoe, count all game. League nites are Wednesday and Thursday, with Tuesday a make-up night. Starting time 7:30 p.m., not to run later than 11 p.m. No game to start after 10:30 p.m.

A board will be set up listing all matches and handicaps of participants. Harry Schmidt volunteered to maintain this board and all necessary records.

Scheduled matches are not firm; you may play anyone you have not yet played, who is in attendance the same time that you are. You may arrange a match with anyone not played towards the end of the season by calling them and setting up a convenient time. You have the use of the courts anytime, including weekends by payment of League dues.

League dues are \$25 for the season, and open use of the courts. This figures less than \$4.20 per month, or one dollar a week. Even beats bowling.
