

Goldsmith Ropes Three To Win "Rodeo Days" Meet At Garberville, Calif.

During the weekend of July 19th and 20th our club was asked to assist the city of Garberville to conduct a horseshoe pitching tournament while they conducted their "Rodeo Days."

We held a meeting with their committee on Saturday, the 19th of July. The only area they had was an open field, and the sun was at its best, about 100 degrees. We suggested that they search for an indoor area and we would provide our indoor clay courts. A large building supply warehouse was located on the main street of town. The owner was contacted and he agreed to the use of his building, this building is about 80' x 100' with a 20-22' ceiling. This worked out fine, we set the courts up at 9 A. M. and qualified the pitchers until noon. Because we only had four courts we divided the groups into 4 men in Class "A", 4 men in Class "B", and 2 men in Class "C". The "A"s pitched 50 point cancellation and Class "B" and "C" pitched 50 shoe count-all with handicap.



Mr. Gandy made many friends around the country through his highly competitive pitching. He was one who adhered to every rule explicitly and played hard to win but by the same token was a true sportsman when he lost.

In his last competition, which was the Kansas State meet held over the Labor Day weekend in Topeka, he finished in third place.

He was a great credit to the game and keen wit and friendly manner will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

To his loving wife, Irene, who travelled to many tournaments with him, and family, the sincere sympathy of the Kansas State Association together with that of the National Horseshoe Pitcher's Association is extended in this, their hour of sorrow.




