Other titles won are the Eastern National, 6 times, and the North American in 1967. He has also held the New York state title 17 times with a run of 8 in a row in 1964-1971.

Altho his wife, Bea does not pitch, she has been his faithful companion and observer for 33 years. His daughter, Betty, also pitches and has participated in World tournament play where she has finished first. She is presently secretary of the New York state association. His son Carl has also taken part in World tournament competition, as a Junior back in 1955 at Salt Lake City, Utah.

RALPH FORSSTROM of Hampden, Massachusetts, has been an organizer and promoter of the game in the New England area for some 40 years and served as secretary of the Massachusetts state association for many years, being instrumental in keeping the game alive during the lean years.

He was president and director of the Forest Park club from 1934 to 1943. He directed the Western Massachusetts and New England meets and helped run the World tournament when it was held in Keene, New Hampshire in 1965 and again in 1968. He also assisted at the 1972 World tournament at Greenville, Ohio.




