

New Horseshoe Courts In Reno-Sparks, Nevada Area

In the latter part of 1971, plans were in the beginning stage for eighteen permanent clay courts in the Reno-Sparks area. This is in addition to the eight clay courts located at Anderson Indian Park in Reno, Nevada.

With newly elected President of Nevada State, Carey Weaver and the cooperation of the Sparks Park and Recreation Department, land was allotted to the Horseshoe Club at Stempeck Adult Park, which is located on 18th street

in Sparks, Nevada.

The local horseshoe clubs donated money and they also held a Spaghetti feed which brought in additional money, and on Saturday, November 11, 1972 work was begun on nine courts. Some of the material was donated and several of the players showed their true horseshoe spirit and gave up their days off to work in the rain. A hot lunch and plenty of coffee, donated by the wives of the workers, kept them going all day.

The nine courts are just a start, and by early spring, nine more pits will be ready for the Nevada State Open Horseshoe Tournament, which will be held May 26th and 27th, 1973. League play will also be held at the new courts ac-

cording to the President of State.

Congratulations are in order to all that participated in making these new courts a reality.



COVER PICTURE... The Minnesota state Horseshoe Pitchers' Association tournament this past fall was the first Minnesota state meet ever played in an indoor facility.

The three-day men's competition, with over a hundred contestants, was played on 12 indoor courts in Duluth, Minnesota's new Wheeler Field recreation field house, a 100-by-200-foot, \$110,000 steel structure built to accommodate hockey and tennis as well as horseshoe pitching.

The building was constructed as a cooperative project by the city of Duluth Parks and Recreation Department, using city sales tax revenue, and by the Duluth Amateur Hockey Association.

1973 No. American Plant City Open Won By Elmer Hohl At Plant City, Florida — January 4, 5 and 6

Elmer Hohl, the World Champion, subdued all comers with ease in the 1973 North American Open held at Plant City, Florida fairgrounds on January 4, 5 and 6th. Forty-four pitchers took part during three days of summer-like weather. Qualifying rounds were pitched in groups of six, playing a round robin match of 50 shoes per game. The Greater East Hillsborough Chamber of Commerce, sponsor of the event, called this a tremendous success and it is hoped that it will be an annual affair in the future. Cash prizes and trophies were awarded in all classes with the winner receiving \$600.00, 2nd prize \$250.00 and 3rd prize \$150.00. Lights were installed for this tournament and the local club is looking forward to future night pitching events. Eleven states and Canada were represented and good crowds were on hand all days.

1973 And 1974 World Tournaments




