LEO LADEMANN COMMENTS ... "DON'T KILL THE SPORT"

By changing the fifty (50) pts. system to a lower score. In the "real old days" barnyard contests, when ringers were 5 pts., leaners 3 pts. and close shoe counted 1 pt., games could have been over in a "jiffy," as then the total score was only 21 pts. The reason was: If you'd top someone, that would count double for you, or ten (10) pts. Third ringer, fifteen (15) pts. for opponent, and fourth in your favor, twenty (20) pts. So the "idea" made sense, to pitch the shoe not first but last. One could win quickly in two pitches, up & back, to get the extra point. But, ringers were far and few long ago, not like nowadays. In the "gee & haw" era, by pitching first, you actually had a better chance to get one on the stake. More likely than not, the following pitcher's shoe would bounce off the steel already there. Not having any of those "fancy" hooks many manufacturers invented later.

When and how, I do not know, who did start the fifty (50) points cancellation; which I imagine was to get the most out of the possible 100 pts. First reaching fifty won. So let's do it again — CHANGE! Only, I believe, it is better for a person to get "credit" for all points. Regardless of who is on top or on the bottom of the stake. Both count totals, the same as qualifying rounds, yet pitching together. None of that "old doubling" stuff or "new cancellation" headache business. Modernize the Horseshoe Game, along with the designs! Each player should count all points, as well as the opponent. Alternating, after pitching to both of the stakes in a row. Not monopolizing the "mud pit" as is the case now. Those "jumping shoes" really play havoc when you're on the losing end. It would make an interesting match to see who could, by counting all points, get the most of one-hundred. The winner may well go over the coveted fifty, but the game would not be over yet! It would be a faster game for the high-ringers, and more points for the slower pace makers. Fifty even possible — play until broken! On second thought, I think it would be best to establish a tie-game recording — say, perhaps half (½) point. No sudden death play-off gimmick. Call it a draw!

This would not be a "handicap" scoring play, but the loser would get more merit for single points which now all go for naught/ also vice-versa when someone else has two ringers. No doubt, a few high-averages would suffer a little, and the "low on the totem pole" gain a bit. Still, what's fair for one, is for another — "when one is down" don't push them in the mud. Who knows, this fad might catch on for good.

Food for thought, "equalization" may help put horseshoes in the limelight. It needs "color" and I don't mean paint. There has to be a "see-saw" between contestants to make it appealing to spectators. With all points counting, a couple of them now then may mean all the difference in the world to an underdog; though the other party has a ringer. Otherwise, it's not true, close is not good enough — only in horseshoes.

On May 20th, 1977, I received a note from Professor's wife Vernelle, telling me of the passing away of her husband almost a month earlier. In the few short years that my family and I knew Professor we became great friends. We first met Professor at a Tournament at St. Clair, Mo., in 1973. This was the beginning of a short but lasting friendship, which will last forever in our memories.

One thing the Professor was famous for was his powerful tasty lemonade. No one, once tasting his lemonade could ever forget it.

One tournament in particular stands out in my memory, which was at Wellsville, Mo., on September 21, 1974. Ed. pitched in an 8-man Round Robin, but on this day things were different with him. Ed spoke to my wife about Vernelle being ill and that he was worried about her. Jane then mentioned to him that it would be nice if he could take home a trophy to Vernelle, Say no more. Ed warmed up out in the pasture in back of the courts, and when it was time for Class C to start, Ed proceeded to win all of his games. Then the personality of Ed came forth. He insisted upon straightening his hair and putting on a suit coat for his picture that would go into the newspaper.

Later on another picture in color was taken for his wife and children. This man was Edward Harris, better known as the Professor throughout the Tournament Circuit, so for all of his many friends who were wondering, what ever became of Professor, now you know. We here in O'Fallon, Mo., will miss him greatly for only once in a lifetime does such a man come along. With all sympathies extended to his family, we all say "FAREWELL PROFESSOR", until a later date.

Michael Vecchitto of Middleton, Conn. passed away June 19. He was Treasurer of the Conn. State Association since 1956. Before that he was Secretary-Treasurer for eight years.

Mickey was both pitcher and organizer having organized several horseshoe clubs in his part of Conn. Since 1967 his pitching has been limited to the Middletown League which he started in 1971. His great enthusiasm for the sport of horseshoes put him on two local television programs in the 1950's. He was still promoting the game by giving exhibitions in Connecticut whenever the opportunity arose.

For his organizing abilities Mickey was entered in the New England Hall of Fame two years ago.

He was Regional Director of the New England States in 1960 and the National Horseshoe Pitcher's Association Chairman of Regional Directors in 1961-1963.

To his loving wife and two sons the sincere sympathy of the Connecticut Association and that of the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association is extended in their hour of sadness.

The Northern California Horseshoe Pitchers Association recently lost a man of quiet dignity and a fierce competitor on the horseshoe courts. Martin Sistok passed away April 7, 1977 at the age of 78. He was a charter member of the Shasta Horseshoe Club of Redding, California. He was also instrumental in starting the three year old organization.

Martin suffered a stroke about eighteen months prior to his death. Although he was unable to compete he remained interested and active in club activities. His council and coaching was so valued by the club members that he was awarded an honorary life membership in September of 1976.

In his hometown of Alturas, Martin was "Mr. Horseshoes". He was instrumental in having courts built in the public park there and they were named in his honor prior to his death.

He was a three time winner of the Labor Day Open in Redding, California. This tournament will be known as the Martin Sistok Open starting in 1977.
