

In Memoriam

Helmer Jallen of Fargo, North Dakota, one of the Upper Mid-West's most active horseshoe pitchers for more than 25 years, passed away on June 2. He was the holder of numerous trophies while pitching in the Fargo-Moorehead leagues and throughout North and South Dakota and Minnesota. 


