

Dear Joe:

Enclosed is a check covering the balance due from the World Tournament. We have stopped payment on the other check which appears to be lost.

As you know, Joe, the convention delegates at Des Moines, Iowa voted that you must have something more concrete for 1979 before the NHPA Executive Council can sign a contract with you. It will have to be in writing and acceptable to the NHPA Executive Council by January 1, 1979.

However, if you feel something is in the making and details cannot be worked out and signed by January 1 let me know. I would keep an open mind and give you the benefit of the doubt and try to get a 30 day extension. But you would have to really know without doubt it would be a concrete offer with a written commitment.

I realize it has not been an easy assignment to sell our sport to all News Media outlets; however, the NHPA has spent over \$25,000. with you in three years. This amount may be a drop in the bucket to your other clients but not to the NHPA. I admit you have to spend money to make money. But the majority of the NHPA membership (including the Executive Council) feel we have not received the national recognition we have expected in this length of time.

I know you have tried and some progress has been made. I am sure we both agree, "you can lead a horse to water but you can't make him drink." In other words, you can't force the news media - newspapers, television and radio to take the Horseshoe publicity from the wire service and pass on to the public.

Joe, whatever it's worth on behalf of the NHPA thanks to you, Dave and your staff for all your efforts in the past three years. Really and sincerely we appreciate.

### NHPA PROFESSIONAL TOUR

by Jim Woodson of Texas

The absolutely, positively best way to get a belly bending, knee slapping, gut busting laugh from a gathering of horseshoe pitchers is to suggest that organized pitching should make a major commitment to establishing, on a more or less permanent basis, four to six money tournaments a year for NHPA world class pitchers.

What breaks everyone up, of course, is that to suggest world class pitchers should compete for money within a framework of yearly scheduled events, is kind of hinting at, and sort of saying that horseshoe pitching should have its very own professional tour. A rather silly and foolish notion, considering the fifty year track record of the NHPA.

Nevertheless, there is now an idea moving around the NHPA that suggest a mini-tour of \$2,000 plus tournaments could be a very possibility. A modest sum, this \$2,000 base figure, to be sure; but a start upward to better things, also to be sure. The idea proposes finding twelve to eighteen locations across the country willing to host a monied pro event no more than once each three years. This translates to four tournaments a year if twelve locations are found, or six places each year if eighteen hosts come forward. Money to finance the tournaments would come primarily from NHPA members willing to purchase a \$30 family sponsorship ticket. Hardly a financial burden since the tour would be around only once every three years and payments could be spread out over this period. Grass root financing of \$30 pledges would easily guarantee a \$2,000 or \$3,000 base. Additional funds could be raised by low cost gate admissions, or by the traditional method of asking the local business community for support.

Aside from the obvious fact that internal dollar support would solve the NHPA age old problem of finding a steady and reliable source of income for financing tournaments, the \$30 sponsorships would also create a new breed for organized horseshoes—spectators with clout. Suddenly, there would be a cluster of tournaments supported by a paying audience, and tournament directors would be faced, finally, and at last, with coming up with a program that would satisfy a paying gate, rather than gearing the contest to please the competitors on the field.

Directors concerned with keeping the spectators interested and awake, almost certainly would rush to do away with the long, drawn out, oh so boring fifty point game; and even the kind of boring, fifty shoe game. In its place, so say the supporters of this idea for a series of professional tournaments, would be short and sweet, bang, bang, twenty shoe games, with the winner having to score last to win. This might distress the world class pitchers who seem to prefer the longer game of stacking four dead for a dreary hour before the game mercifully drags to a climax, but with the dollar dictating, the important thing would be to satisfy the onlookers who laid out of the money. Goodness, wouldn't an eight man, triple round robin of short games that peaked almost immediately, grab and hold the attention of the spectators. A string of four dead that crossed the twenty shoe mark would not be a preliminary skirmish to gain position—oh hum—but rather, would be sudden death overtime where every shoe delivered would be a potential killer weapon, or a suicide missile.

O.K. now, promise to keep a secret? The professional round robin would just be an excuse used to pay top world class pitchers to spend some time with local NHPA people. One of the great ironies of our time, if you will forgive this tendency for dramatics, is that horseshoe pitching reaches a small measure of respectability — in terms of crowds, personalities, and colorful activities — only once each year, at the world tournament. Unfortunately, this marvelous image of the NHPA is witnessed each year almost exclusively by the same narrow segment of veterans, the very ones who don't need special tournament enrichment and glamour to stay in the game. Meanwhile, back home and unaware of the color and excitment that is offered in horseshoes at a major league level, sits the casual NHPA member, that not so rare bird who seldom has an opportunity to mix with world class talent from around the country, and who is destined to flee from the drabness of the local NHPA in no more than two or three years.

These professional mini-tour events would be the road show that came to the people. In addition to the feature event, which would be opened to the general public for a small gate admission, there would be a multitude of exclusive activities for the holder of \$30 sponsorship tickets and their family. A pitching seminar conducted by the world class pitchers, for example. Then, a fun spirited, hoot and holler, pro-am team contest, with each five or six man team captained by a professional. Finally, and best of all, a marvelous post tournament party, where the \$30 sponsors, and their families, and the world class pitchers would all relax together, and get to know each other better.

So there it is, a nucleus of an idea that suggests the possibility for starting and financing a mini-pro tour for world class horseshoe pitchers with in-house financing and spectator recognition. In order that this concept does not pass from the scene without comment or action, it is suggested that the NHPA executive council and a representative group of world class pitchers meet at the 1979 World tournament to consider the possibilities.




