#### NHPA PUBLICITY REPORT

**NHPA FLYER** — A 12 panel flyer has been compiled and is planned to include a copy in a future issue of the News Digest. Also copies of this flyer will be available at the Huntsville World Tournament.

**PUBLICITY APPRECIATION LETTER** — A form letter in appreciation of the publicity given the NHPA by the news media, Newspapers, radio, or television is now available to any member upon request.

**INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMACY** — Horseshoe pitching in Togo, West Africa is moving along very nicely. Twelve members of the African league marched in their Independence parade last January, displaying horseshoes and stakes as they marched. The parade was viewed by several hundred thousand spectators along the parade route. It will be remembered that the St. Pierre Mfg. Co. of Worcester, Mass. donated 12 pairs of shoes to help promote the game in Togo.

**REQUEST FOR PUBLICITY PHOTOS** — All members who pitched in the 1981 W.T. Championship classes were requested to send a black and white photo to the NHPA Publicity Director for future newspaper publicity. Several responded to the request.

SCHOOL PARTICIPATION — There has been some progress in having horseshoes in school sports programs, both in Junior High and in High Schools. Mixed tournaments were held at local courts with students being bussed to the courts. It is suggested that all clubs offer their facilities to the school programs.

**PITCH HORSESHOES FOR HEALTH MONTH** — This is the third year for this type of publicity. It was suggested that clubs and members give their local newspapers publicity during the month of horseshoe activity in their area. It was hoped that novice tournaments would be held to attract new members.

**SHOP RECREATION SPORTS** — Members are requested to contact their respective shop sports directors to send their names and addresses to the NHPA Publicity Director in that NHPA flyers would be sent to be added to their agenda.

**COMMEMORATIVE STAMP** — This is the second year that the membership has been asked to write a letter to the Postmaster-General requesting that our sport be honored with a commemorative stamp. All have been assured that their requests have been taken under advisement.

**NOVICE TOURNAMENT AT W.T.** — NHPA Publicity believes that novice tournaments be held in conjunction with the World Tournament at a future date. The main object would be to attract new prospective members. Such tournaments could be a daily event, during a time when major activity was not going on.

#### LAST MINUTE TOURNAMENT ENTRIES

As Publicity Director of the NHPA I believe it to be in the best interest of our sport to admit as many entries as possible in any given tournament. However, I realize that a tournament director has a difficult time and is very often short-handed due to failure of others to help. It seems a bit unfair to turn down last minute entries especially so, when there are courts that are not full.

For many reasons, a family man sometimes does not want to commit himself in advance of the tournament thereby coming in at the last minute. In cases like this with extra players on hand they could fill in where there may have been a cancellation. If a player has cared enough to come to a tournament he should be given every possible chance to play.

For example: If there are four extra players, men, women, juniors they can pay the entry fee and then be put in a special 50-shoe handicap class. They could play a double-round-robin to keep the players on the courts.

This is not an affront to any tournament director but just a suggestion in the best interest of our sport.





#### **REPORT ON PROGRESS OF WHO'S WHO BOOK**

On May 28, 1982 I received a letter from the publisher of *Who's Who In Horseshoe Pitching*, Cornwall Books, 4 Cornwell Drive, East Brunswick, New Jersey, 08816, signed by Thomas Yoseloff. I will quote the second sentence of his letter word for word, "The work on *Who's Who In Horseshoe Pitching* is now about 80% complete, and I am very hopeful that we will have this ready to go to the printer within a matter of weeks."

Many of the biographies paid for advance copies and I have sent all money to the publisher as agreed. I regret that the publication has taken so long but I am in the same position as the rest of you with nothing to do but wait. I do answer all people who write.

One final point worth making is that the NHPA is in no way responsible for putting the book together. I am not an officer or representative, so I hope none of you will blame the NHPA, or Ellis Cobb, or any of the NHPA officers for any delay in the publication.





## FARGO-MOORHEAD, MINN. TO BID FOR 1984 W. T.

Fargo-Moorhead will make an official bid to host the 1984 NHPA World Tournament Aug. 3 when the NHPA convention is held at Huntsville, Ala.

A tentative bid to host the 1984 tourney was well received last year at the convention held at Genola, Minn. If successful, the cities of Fargo, N.D., and Moorhead, Minn., will host the event for the first time since 1967.

Vince Lindstrom, manager of the Fargo - Moorhead Convention Bureau, will be at Hunstville to supply interested persons with information on the two cities and to assist in making the 1984 bid.

The central location of Fargo-Moorhead makes it accessible for those coming from all directions of the nation and Canada.
