

I received your notification of your candidacy for NHPA President on 31 May, 1985.

After no one had announced his/her candidacy in the May issue of the Digest, the Executive Council made the decision to comply with the Constitution. Art. VI, Sec. 7, pg. 14 plainly states:

Section 7. Issues pertaining to future World Tournament sites, Candidates for Office, and changes in the Constitution and By-Laws shall be submitted to the News Digest for publication several months prior to the National Convention.

Your announcement can in no way be considered to have been submitted 'several months' prior to the convention's. If it appears in June issue, it will have been a notice of approximately 45 days.

It is also noted that your message stated: "I intend to continue my NHPA Game Related Distributorship..." I wish to point out that this is a direct 'conflict of interest' and in any good organization it is not authorized or allowed.

I have re-polled the Executive Council after receiving your announcement. The Council voted to stand by its decision.

#### NHPA PUBLICITY COMMITTEE REPORT

HORSESHOES AND BOWLING — Our sport will gain recognition if we have more members in our NATIONAL ASSOCIATION. We should strive for 25,000 to 50,000 membership, rather than the 7,000 to 8,000 members we now have.

As the NHPA Publicity director, I am submitting a plan to the Executive Council for approval, to associate the NHPA with the ABC National Bowling Association.

The plan would be to work with the Bowling Association to come up with ways and means of increasing our membership. Perhaps we can learn how the Bowling Association increased its membership dramatically during the past several years. Perhaps they have a professional promoter that could help us.


I met with three officials of the National Bowling Association in Northampton, Mass. on April 16 this Spring. They were on tour of inspection in the East. They listened to my plan to use bowling centers for publicity for our sport. They were not negative to my plan of getting permission to post notices on bowling alley bulletin boards in the Spring of the year. The notices would concern organizing local horseshoe leagues, notices of all state tournaments, etc. I suggested that horseshoe leagues could convert into bowling leagues during the cold months. Local NHPA members would be asked to work on bulletin boards in their areas, and place NHPA Flyers in the bowling centers.

It is possible that the Bowling Association would mention our plan in their National magazine, or newsletters. I have the name and address of their Public Relations Director, but I will not contact him until the Council approves the plan.

I hope a meeting can be held in Lafayette during the 1985 World Tournament, with the NHPA Publicity Committee, sponsor committee, membership committee and all interested members, to try and put the plan into action. Any suggestions along this line should be sent to Bernard Herfurth, NHPA Publicity Dir., 17 Fort St., Northampton, Mass. 01066.

The Bowling Association officials agreed that Walter Ray Williams should be a great asset to our sport as a professional bowler and a top-notch horseshoe pitcher. Perhaps Walter Ray will help with these plans or offer suggestions.

#### DAVE'S COURT REPORT

PERFECT GAME AWARD PROGRAM APPROVED: A few months ago, I reported that an attempt was underway to determine who had pitched perfect games in sanctioned play. Concurrently, Carl Steinfeldt was asked by Glen Portt to head a committee to recommend guidelines to be followed and how a perfect game should be recognized. While not a member of Carl's committee, I nonetheless did have the opportunity to submit some thoughts on the matter. I am privileged to say that Carl recommended by proposal and the NHPA Council has given its approval to the following program:

#### COURT REPORT — (Continued)

Recognition of a perfect game pitched in sanctioned play will begin for as few as 10 shoes. This minimum will provide for those possibilities of a 30 or even 21 point game if the tournament was NHPA sanctioned. Official recognition will be in the form of a special patch designed to cover 5 categories as follows:

 One Star perfect game
 10-18 shoes

 Two Star perfect game
 20-28 shoes

 Three Star perfect game
 30-38 shoes

 Four Star perfect game
 40-48 shoes

 Five Star perfect game
 50 or more shoes

The patch design is currently underway. We hope to have them ready by the 1985 W.T. Banquet. So, if you have

pitched a perfect game and haven't written me, do it now. Don't miss out.

LONGEVITY AWARD PROGRAM — I am also pleased to report that the NHPA Council has approved a Longevity Award. This patch award will be given to those who have been NHPA members for 10, 15 and 20 or more years. Final details and patch design are yet to be decided. However, administration of the program will probably be at the local level with the individual clubs making an award claim to the State Secretary. Thanks should go to Northern California member Fred Lavett who suggested the idea to NHPA Pres. Glen Portt.

#### NHPA PROMOTION COMMITTEE REPORT

The June issue of Bowler Digest carried a 5 page article "Walter Ray Wiliams Just Call Him 'Deadeye'" His PBA biography sheet reads — Outside Occupation — horseshoe tournaments.

B.S. degree in physics from Cal-Poly at Pomona, Calif.

Williams has no national titles to show for his 6 yrs. as a PBA member. His PBA earnings thru 1984 stood at \$82,062. Thru 10-1985 PBA Tournaments, he averaged 212.4.

Williams isn't picking the winner of the 1985 World Championship but "I'm sincere in wanting to get my world title back," he vows. "I'll be there pitching."

And he'll continue pitching for that elucive first national PBA tournament title.

## In Memoriam

Ralph Forsstrom, of Hampden, Massachusetts, died very suddenly on April 30. He was active as an organizer and player since the early nineteen thirties. He was awarded the NHPA Hall of Fame, the New England and Massachusetts Hall of Fame plaques.

He was a tournament director for about 50 years in Massachusetts and the New England states. He was an organizer of the Springfield Area Leagues which still operate in the NHPA sanctioned league program. As a director he ran his tournaments in a very businesslike manner. He almost single-handed organized the sport in his area immediately at the end of World War II.

In the winter months he was always active as a bowler and as a bowler organizer.

Ralph worked as a printer and later as machinist. He was 75 years of age and retired in 1976. He leaves his wife, Nanette, a daughter, Beverly Coon, a stepson, Michael McMillan, a sister, Gertrude Forsstrom, and three grand-

He was very active as President of the Senior Citizens' Club of Hampden and was a member of the Lions Club.

Word has just been received that Virgil Bunge of 403 West Sanford St., Bunker Hill, III. 62014, passed away on December 1, 1984.

He was a long time member of the NHPA and Illinois State Association and was a great competitor in his early years. A very friendly and congenial fellow.

To his family the sincere sympathy of the NHPA and Illinois Association is extended in their hour of sadness and bereavement.

#### SCHUMMER HORSESHOE TOURNAMENT, MAY 19

The Pearson Memorial Center in Maquoketa, lowa is quiet. The Schummer horseshoe courts and scoreboards have been removed and only memories of the eventful day remain. If the beautiful room could talk, it probably would say "I've never seen anything like it in all my days."

That morning, beginning at 7:00 a.m., four complete horseshoe courts, with blue clay and the scoreboards to match (red, white and blue) were moved into the building, along with bleachers on both sides to accommodate the approximately 300 people that would arrive from as far away as Sioux Falls, SD to mingle with horseshoe folks from 7 or 8 other states.

Everyone came to see the Schummer Horseshoe System in action and they saw plenty of action from the World Class Players that participated.

Earl Winston, 1st Vice President, was on hand to do a great job of emceeing the vent. He introduced Nancy Henton Walker, who finished right at the top of the ladies division when she was 15 years old. Nancy sang the National Anthem. Ellis Cobb, News Digest editor and Ralph Dykes, former President of the NHPA, were on hand, along with several other horseshoe people from Illinois.

Those sitting in the bleachers were just a few feet away as World Champion, Jim Knisley showed them what he could do on the Schummer courts - a 95% game!! Horseshoe greats Vicki Winston, Jim Knisley, Phyllis Negaard, Kevin Cone, Teri Powell and others put on a fantastic exhibition for those present.

The format was a double round robin for the four men and four ladies, each in their own class. The ladies shared equally in the prize money with the men. Jim Knisley, reigning World Champion, won the men's division, while Phyllis Negarrd and Vicki Winston tied for 1st place and split the money in the ladies division.

Just what did we prove by having these fine players come from hundreds of miles to Maguoketa to be the first to introduce the Schummer Horseshoe System?

We can move indoors or outdoors in just a matter of minutes. 1.

2. We must have more than adequate courts when games in excess of 80%7 were pitched.

- 3. The games all ended practically at the same time. (Great for TV and tournament directors) With the Master Board and the regular scoreboards, the entire tournament could have been played without a single scorekeeper or even a pencil.
- Spectators had the opportunity to cheer and applaud while the players were all moving together not while some players were in the process of pitching their shoes.
- The Red, White & Blue courts and scoreboards, along with the neatness of the players, was most impressive to the viewing audience.

Of course, there were many things we did not have the time to prove:

- 1. The handicap system that is an important feature of the Schummer System. Simple and easy to understand and better than any other sport can offer.
- 2 The various games that can be played — all part of the system.
- 3. The fine Classfinder Policy. (To assure contests of equals)
- The Five Star System which would give us all we could ever want in TEAM PLAY and also encourage all players to do better.

It was a brand new ball game for these players, but not one complained or created any problems whatsoever. They were truly pros and deserve a great deal of credit.

Our sincere thanks to all in attendance and those that helped in any way to present the initial introduction of the Schummer Horseshoe System.




