# FROM YOUR PRESIDENT...DAVE LOUCKS

In 1987 we will be instituting some important administrative changes involving all State Charters. All State Officers have been sent notices so they should be prepared for these changes.

In the past, the NHPA Secy/Treas has been responsible for issuing tournament sanctions and certificates. This will now become a function of your Regional Director under the guidance of our 5th VP. All requests for sanctions should be sent to your appropriate RD. If you do not know who covers your Charter, send your request to the 5th VP for re-routing. Also tied to this are the results of your tournament. If you want them published in the News Digest, they must be mailed to your Regional Director. He will verify that the tournament complied with NHPA rules and then forward the results to the Digest for publication.

Most of you should know by now that the Digest subscription cost will increase January 1, 1987. The basic non-member rate will be \$12.00 with a \$1.00 discount allowed for each adult NHPA member in your household. However, to get the discount, your current year dues to the NHPA must be paid by the time of renewal. If you, as an example, were to renew in February but had not yet paid your 1987 membership dues, you would be considered a non-member at the time of renewal and the cost would be \$12.00. It is therefore important that you pay your State/NHPA dues early so you can provide our Secy/Treas with your NHPA card # at the time of renewal. Only in this manner can he verify if you are entitled to a discount on the subscription rate.

January also marks the deadline for submitting proposed changes to the NHPA Constitution and By-Laws. Any member may propose a change by mailing it to the Committee Chairman, Bob Malley, 30 Cliffside Dr., Daly City, CA 94015. Proposed changes must first be approved by a majority of the 8 person committee before coming before the Delegates.

Ruth Hangen, who has chaired the NHPA Hall of Fame committee for several years has resigned to personal family reasons. Fortunately, Ruth will remain a voting member and will therefore be available to assist the newly appointed Chairman, Barry Chapelle. Thank you, Ruth, for many years of unselfish service to the NHPA Hall of Fame.

Two areas of our country have decided to include horseshoe pitching in some large promotional events. In Kansas, late in October, FARMFEST 86 is scheduled to include a professional horseshoe pitching event with some \$6,000 in prize money expected. The promoters have requested the top 6 finishers from the World Tournament. As I write this, the proposed time is only about one month away. So, with a very tight schedule, let's hope this event can be pulled together in time to really happen.

In January, the City of Hollywood, Florida will be host to CanadaFest. The pro-

moters want to hold a horseshoe tournament that will attract some top pitchers and novice events as well. The chairman of Special Events has requested an NHPA sanction and plans to extend invitations to some of our better pitchers. NHPA officials are now working on the details in the hope that our sport will become part of the CanadaFest program.

# NHPA PUBLICITY REPORT

Publicity is communication...and communication is important if our sport is to become recognized. The National Horseshoe Pitchers Association Council, the publicity committee and promotion committee will make every effort to reach the top media outlets to tell our story and receive National coverage.

However, every Regional and assistant Regional Directors, tournament directors, league officers and state officers plus anyone conducting horseshoe activities should be aware that publicity and communication starts in every community. Every state and club should have a publicity chairman and historian. They should make an effort to contact area newspapers, radio and television stations now and keep them informed. This is important and takes very little time.

According to a list sent to me by NHPA Secretary-Treasurer Donnie Roberts, only about half of the states have newsletters. One wonders how some state officers communicate with the pitchers in their area. Recently this writer sent a letter and a copy of the DOUBLE RINGER, an independent non-profit newsletter covering Colorado, Wyoming and Western Nebraska to those listed. We asked if those newslet ters would like to exchange complimentary copies with our publication. Replies were received from Minnesota, Wisconsin, New Jersey, Eastern Nebraska, Illinois, Ohio, Arkansas and Canada.

Although the DOUBLE RINGER is a sixteen page printed newsletter, plus numerous supplements, we started as a four page publication and sent three free copies to establish our intent to aid in an informed membership. The early copies were financed by advertisements from six merchants. Since that time advertising and subscription fees have covered our costs. Mailing was first class for three years, but now bulk mail is used to reduce costs.

If you are interested in publishing a newsletter, here are a few suggestions:

- 1. Find a writer from members of your state organization. More if necessary.
- Seek advertising or assistance from businessmen members who would defray costs of paper, printing and postage. Maybe someone would run copies for you on the office printer.
- 3. Offer free advertisements to those helping at the start and then set advertising fees in the future.



#### DONNIE ROBERTS - ORGANIZER

One of the greatest organizers and promoters the NHPA has ever had is Donnie Roberts. Although Donnie has a fine record as a horseshoe pitcher, his super ability as a promoter and officer of the NHPA is exceptional.

Prior to his election as Secretary-Treasurer of the NHPA, Donnie served as a Regional Director. His service in the local and state levels spans 28 years. At the 1986 Convention at Ainsworth, Nebraska, Donnie was elected for the sixth time to the National Secretary-Treasurer position.

Donnie is a past recipient of an NHPA Achievement Award and the Arch Stokes Memorial Award.

Donnie was instrumental in allowing everyone whom entered the World Tournament to pitch, rather than a few. He brought to the convention floor a rough draft of our very successful current league program. In 1983 horseshoe pitching went to Las Vegas due in part to the hard work of Mr. Roberts.

Donnie is always helpful, courteous and polite to inquiries and requests for information.

Any that attend a World Tournament will confirm his ability to be in command of any given situation. He is so experienced, that it shows in the control he maintains. This hard working officer is an asset to the NHPA and very deserving to be a member of the National Hall of Fame.

#### SOL BERMAN - PLAYER/ORGANIZER

Sol Berman is a very good player and an excellent promoter.

He has been N.J. State Champion nine times. In 1976 he, with Al Cherry, became AAU doubles champion. In 1983 Dr. Berman became the Senior Class Champion (70-75 division).

In 1972 Sol was inducted into the New Jersey Hall of Fame. In New Jersey Sol has served in many State offices as President, Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer.

Sol Berman received the NHPA Recognition and Achievement Award in 1976. He has served as National Chairman of Change for Progress Committee, Chairman of Publicity and Promotion Committee.

In 1972 Dr. Berman wrote the section on horseshoe pitching for the *Encyclopedia of Sports* Medicine. He has written articles for the New York Times, Sports Illustrated, Women's Sports, Sports and Athletes as well as several medical magazines.

Sol helped organize the Middlesex Horseshoe Club which later hosted the 1971 World Championship and the AAU National Championships.

Since 1948 Sol has been collecting 16 mm film on horseshoe pitching and has prepared many films which are currently being used in promoting. He has been instrumental in taping the Hall of Fame Inductions and the excellent film *Legends of Horseshoes*.

In 1982 Dr. Sol Berman received the Arch Stokes Memorial Award. He is a man whose history shines with his contributions to the sport of horseshoe pitching.

#### JOHN RADEMACHER - PLAYER/ORGANIZER

John Rademacher is a very good horseshoe pitcher and a dedicated worker in promoting for the State of Florida and for the National Horseshoe Pitchers' Association.

John has been Florida State Champion ten times. Mr. Rademacher is a Class A pitcher and in his career has won 180 trophles.

In the 1968 World Tournament he pitched 80% ringers. In 1972 at Greenville, Ohio, John averaged 77.3%. At Eureka, California, John finished 5th averaging 77.4% ringers.

John Rademacher has been a great promoter in his home state of Florida. He has served as Secretary/Treasurer of the Florida Horseshoe Pitchers' Association for 10 years and he also served as Secretary/Treasurer of the Plant City Club, Florida. Mr. Rademacher also served as 2nd Vice President in the National Organization.

Throughout his career John Rademacher has been an excellent example of good sportsmanship. He has encouraged many young pitchers and given instructions and encouragement to a large number of beginners of all ages.

He has been the spirit that makes the difference between an ordinary performance and an exceptional one. With his gentlemanly attitude and ability John Rademacher has made his mark on the game of horseshoes.

#### HENRY KNAUFT - PLAYER

Henry Knauft pitched in his first State Tournament in 1949 and finished fifth. Since then he has been Washington State Champion eleven times. He pitches a 1-1/4 turn which is so natural for him, that few pitchers have a more perfect delivery.

Traveling to many tournaments with his wife Anita, Henry has pitched in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, British Columbia and many states that hosted the World Tournaments. Henry has also won the Northwest Championship ten times.

In 1951 Henry made the Championship Class of the World Tournament. In 1966 he placed 3rd in the Worlds' and in 1970, 4th with a percentage of 81.2% ringers. Several highlights are strong in Henry's World Tournament memories. Against Carl Steinfeldt he threw 91 ringers out of the first 100 shoes only to lose the game while pitching 85% ringers in 150 shoes. Then in 1966 he held Curt Day with 11 four deads while Curt was on 47 points. In 1970 Henry Knauft was the only pitcher to beat Dan Kuchcinski. Henry has had a 94.1% ringer game and 52 consecutive ringers.

In 1976 Henry was inducted into the Washington State Hall of Fame.

Henry Knauft is a legend amoung horseshoe pitchers in the Northwest and recognized as a worthy opponent by the best pitchers in the game today.

This great sportsman and competitor is an important addition to the prestigious NHPA Hall of Fame.




