

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT . . . DAVE LOUCKS

Congratulations to all the champions and participants of the 1986 World Tournament in Ainsworth. Our hosts worked very hard to prepare and keep things moving during our stay. The hospitality was second to none. Only the weather was a bit uncooperative with a couple of days very hot and some rain that forced slight changes to the pitching schedule and a one day extension of the tournament.

A very successful and well attended (about 275) Banquet Dinner and Awards Ceremony saw four deserving individuals inducted into our Hall of Fame. We are very fortunate to have all four in attendance, Henry Knauft, John Rademacher, Sol Berman and Donnie Roberts.

The Stokes Award went to Bob Champion of Colorado. Special Achievement Awards were presented to the Eastern Nebraska HPA, the Ainsworth Chamber of Commerce, Don Weaver of Nevada, George Engelmann of Iowa and Pete Moon of Australia. Special Presidential Awards were presented to Al Hodge and Walter Ray Williams Jr.

The Convention was very well attended. We had 218 voting delegates representing 40 State Charters and Canada. Six of the seven proposed amendments to our Constitution and By-Laws were passed by the delegates.

1. **ARTICLE II, Section 3, Delegates**...added the statement that the Charter spokesperson must be a current subscriber to the NHPA News Digest. The vote was 186 Yes, 32 No.
2. **ARTICLE II, Section 4, Delegates**...The Proxy Vote passed 178 to 40.
3. **ARTICLE II, Section 7, Delegates**...related to the Proxy Vote, each Charter will now be allowed to vote its maximum delegates providing it has a spokesperson in attendance. The vote was 201 Yes, 17 No.
4. **ARTICLE VII, Section 17, Tournaments**...All future bids for a World Tournament must be in the hands of the NHPA Secretary by the 15th of April. All bids will be published in the News Digest by the July issue. All bids must be for at least \$40,000 in cash and trophies. The vote was 165 Yes, 53 No.
5. **ARTICLE IX, Section 6, Compensation Allowance**...The amount allowed Vice Presidents is increased to \$400 annually. The VP chairman of RD's and the Publicity Director are to receive a \$400 allowance. The NHPA President will receive \$100 a month. The vote was 196 to 22.
6. **ARTICLE IX, Section 7, Publications**...The 12 month subscription cost of the NHPA News Digest was raised to \$12.00 for non-members; \$11.00 for a member and \$10.00 for a household with 2 or more related adult members. The vote was 196 Yes, 22 No.

Although it received 144 votes in favor and 74 against, the proposal to separate the country into three regions and rotate the World Tournament failed. It failed by a mere

2 votes of getting the 146 or two-thirds needed to pass.

Congratulations to Pleasanton, California who won the delegates support to host the 1988 World Tournament with a bid of \$40,000. The city of Huntsville, Alabama presented a letter bid of \$30,000 and John Davis, President of Sports Enterprises presented a \$75,000 bid for a Horseshoe Palladium soon to be opened in the Akron, Ohio area. The vote was California 118, Ohio 87, Alabama 3. Only a majority vote was needed to win since this does not affect our By-Laws.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 1986 WORLD TOURNAMENT

Mark Seibold of Huntington, Indiana reigns as the 1986 World's horseshoe pitching champion following an impressive and undefeated record over 32 solid competitors in the 65th W.T. Championship held in Ainsworth, Nebraska.

Seibold, a 32-year old star, who went through all finalists with steady, relentless play, left little doubt he was the best when he out-pitched 24-year old Kevin Cone of Alta, Iowa in the next to last contest 40-26 to take a two-game lead with only one to go.

Defending champion and leading money winner on the 1986 PBA bowling circuit, Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Stockton, California, dropped one game in early play, and fell to Seibold, 40-24 and to Cone, 45-34 in the final seven games to close with a 26-5 record and third place honors. Williams finished just less than four percentage points ahead of 1984 champion Jim Knisley, Bremen, Ohio. Other top ten pitchers and their records were Alvin Perry, Hanover, Virginia (24-7); Jesse Gonzales, Los

Osos, California (23-8); Ben Weidrich, Oregon City, Oregon (23-8); former champion Don Titcomb, San Jose, California (22-9); Merlin Potts, Leonardville, Kansas (21-10); and Dave Hughes, Bloomington, Minnesota (21-11).

Seibold is no newcomer to the championship circuit. He won the World junior boys title in 1966 and 1969 and followed with the men's crown in 1979. He has been a serious challenger for the world title since graduating from the junior ranks.

Seibold won \$2800 for his efforts, part of the \$32,237 purse offered to the top finalists in all but the junior boys and girls classes. Cone was awarded \$1700 and Williams collected \$1200 for third.

Thirty five games over 87.5 percent ringers were pitched by the 32 finalists during the four day championship series, headed by 97.6% games by Cone and Williams. Seibold had nine in that top 35 and closed with an overall 82.8 percent. Cone had 79.8 average and Williams 80.2, which was 4.7 less than his 1985 championship performance.

Phyllis Negaard, St. Joseph, Minnesota won the women's world title edging defending champion Deborah Michaud of Raynham, Massachusetts by one game. It was Negaard's fourth world title having won all the marbles in 1979, 1982 and 1983.

Negaard's 14-1 record and 79.3 ringer percentage was featured by an opening gave victory over Michaud, and an easy 40-11 win on the final game while Michaud was losing her second to Canada's Sharon Paddock.

The two top pitchers each collected eight games over the 80 percent mark with Michaud pitching the top three during the 15-game finals. Her 90.5 single was tops on the list of 34 getting 80% or more.

It was tough going for defending champions during the 11-day affair, with as many as six new champions being crowned. In addition to Seibold and Negaard the following class winners were: Glen Henton, Maquoketa, Iowa, a repeater in the Men's Intermediates; Willard Napier, Seal Beach, California, Men's Seniors; Johnnie Millican, Huntsville, Alabama, 70-plus division; Tony Hankins, Goshen, Kentucky, Junior Boys; and Sandy McLachlin, Dresden, Ontario, Canada, Junior Girls.
