President's Message

Controversy may not be the right word but there is a high degree of discussion about Juniors, their play, promotion and prizes in NHPA participation. The overall junior program in the NHPA is weak at best but the same can probably be said about every state program as well. There are those who say we don't do enough for juniors, others who feel our sport is not appealing enough to attract the younger set and even areas where junior pitching is seen as bothersome and therefore not encouraged or promoted. There are surely many more reasons and it is not my purpose to find fault—but solutions.

I have been pitching horseshoes for 40 years but yet I am still two years younger than the estimated median age of our membership which is 54. To be sure, the average age is declining, more so in recent years and that is a good sign. It may also point out one of the stigmas of our sport—a game for the older folks. We all realize that horseshoe pitching is not for everyone and the game does not offer the fast moving excitement that seems to consume so many youngsters these days. However, that's not to say that our sport isn't sometimes exciting and can't be made more attractive.

Fortunately, we are beginning to see a growing interest in our sport by the media and corporations who are potential sponsors. Any noticeable influx of money into the game will only serve to heighten media atten-

tion which in turn will create an awareness of the sport at all age levels. It's sad to say but the success of so many sports today is not only measured by, but contingent on, the amount of money involved.

Money for juniors has never before been an issue in the NHPA. We for years, had a practice of awarding only trophies and/or medals to our Junior World Champions. I know, because I was fortunate enough to win three such World titles years ago. This year we will give much larger and many more trophies to our junior participants than in my junior days and there will even be \$1400 in trusts. Granted, this is not a large amount by today's standards but it is a noticeable increase over the \$600 in total scholarships that were set aside for juniors just four years ago.

Progress is sometimes slow. At other times, it appears to be slow because only significant gains are noticeable or publicized. Whatever gains we have made with our junior program to date, have not been sufficient to attract a growing number of participants. While the NHPA is currently investigating the possibility of awarding cash prizes to our juniors and the impact this might have on their amateur status, it behooves the entire membership to work in their areas to promote programs and develop solutions for junior pitchers.

Dave's Court Report

For all those negative thinkers who said the three sanctioned event requirement would hurt World Tournament entries, I have news for you. A record number of 1486 pitchers have signed up for play at Spearfish and there are still a few problem entries to clarify as of this writing. Scheduling is going to be a difficult task and with only 36 courts available, we've got to pray for good weather throughout.

There are some other "firsts" to report about this year's World Tournament and those relate to media coverage and sponsor interest. While the contracts are not yet signed, we have reached an agreement in principle with Bud Sports and ESPN to provide television coverage of the event. There is also the possibility of a large electronic scoreboard being used on site and a professional video of the event being made through the promotional efforts of a marketing firm we are working with. In case you missed the previous an-

nouncement, St. Pierre Manufacturing Corporation has become a partial sponsor of this year's tournament and officials of that company will be in attendance at Spearfish.

Congratulations to Marion Lange and Phyllis Negaard who will be this year's inductees into the NHPA Hall of Fame. Marion, from Iowa, was selected in the player/organizer category while Phyllis, a four-time women's World Champion from Minnesota, was selected in the player category.

A lot of the nation's top pitchers are polishing up their game to make a run at the 1989 World Championship. Perhaps none have sharpened their game to the level of Walter Ray Williams, Jr. Walter playing in five recent Northern California events has maintained an average ringer percentage exceeding 87%. A 5th World Championship? Maybe!

Change the Junior Boys Program

The 30 foot rule should be removed from the Junior Boys Program for boys 13 years and older. Any boy, 13 years and older, should be required to pitch from 40 feet. Consequently, there would be two Boys Programs. I suggest that the program for the boys 13 years and older be re-named the Senior Boys, and the boys 12 and under remain the Junior Boys. An additional class for the 12 and under Boys should be formed at the World Tournament and any other tournament where the amount of entrants could support such a class.

Any normal boy of 13 years or older should be physically capable of throwing a shoe 40 feet. If he feels his shoes are too heavy, he can pitch a shoe as light as he wants, since there is no minimum requirement on the weight of a shoe. Rule 11 of the Official Rules states that a shoe "shall not weigh more than two pounds, ten ounces" — nothing about a minimum weight.

The Junior Boys Program, with few exceptions, has failed, since its inception in 1951, to produce top quality players. In fact, I think the 30 foot rule is the main reason why there is a lack of top quality players pitching in the sport today. Since 1951, the Program has produced 6 Men's Championships, but only between two players, Walter Ray Williams (4) and Mark Seibold (2).

In the May 1989 issue of *Newsline*, the Down Memory Lane column featured the Greatest World Tournament of All Time, held in Greenville, Ohio, in 1964. It should be noted that in this tournament 13 players pitched 80% or better. In the 1988 World Tournament, under ideal conditions, only one player pitched 80%. None of the players in the 1964 Tournament came up through the Junior Boys Program. In the 1988 Tournament, the one player did.

Obviously, the Junior Boys Program, which is our sport's farm system, is not working. The reason for this is the short-term-glory-era the boys enjoy.

Take the case of a boy, under the Program's present 30 foot rule, who is averaging 80% or better: he is the focus of attention whenever he plays in a tournament; he is accustomed to winning virtually all of his games, and is developing the wrong mental attitude for the transition to the Men's Division. Now, because of his age, he has to depart the Junior program and enter the Men's Division. His average drops significantly (sometimes in half) because he can't handle his shoe's turn because of the additional 10 feet; he is starting to lose regularly; he is no longer the focus of attention and as a result he drops out of the sport. I've seen it happen time and time again. This is not the fault of the boy but the fault of the Junior Boys Program, which has provided him with some short-term success and glory, but because of the Program's short-sightedness has ill-prepared him for the long run.

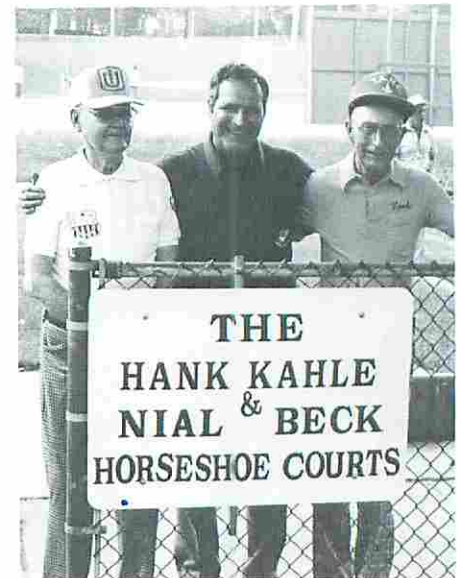
If this same boy started pitching from 40 feet when he was 13 years old, gradually increased his average, experienced losses along the way, and did not have to undergo a radical change when he became of age to enter the Men's Division, he would be able to better handle the pressures and develop the proper mental attitude and maturity to remain in the sport.

Of course, not all boys who start pitching at 40 feet when they become 13 years old will stay in the sport — other interests are developed, like girls and other sports activities — but I believe many more would stay than are staying under the present Junior Boys Program.

The elimination of the 30 foot rule for Junior Boys 13 years and older should be phased out over a 5-year period to allow for the boys presently in the program to continue and for the younger boys to prepare for the change, if there is one.

I will propose to the 1990 World Tournament Convention that the change take effect in 1995.

The story below was written to show the men honored that we are proud and grateful to them:

The Toledo Area Horseshoe Club members are grateful to the men in the picture. Through the efforts of Nial Beck and City of Toledo Assistant Director of Recreation, Tom Ravashiere, the Jermain Park (lighted) Horseshoe Courts were installed many years ago. Nial assisted in the installation. The two men also worked together in getting an abandoned city park shelterhouse converted into a heated winter 3 court facility with the City providing the heat and lights.

Nial and Hank Kahle kept the Jermain Park Courts mowed and manicured. The two men have also been the key people in keeping the winter courts in playing condition. Tom is still our contact person with the City, and a very good friend of horseshoes.

Nial has been playing horseshoes for about 60 years. During that time he has won one Senior Class "B" World Championship, and one Senior Class "C", and one City Championship. He has played 50 or 60 tournaments and has won more than half of them. He has placed 1st, 2nd in the Sr. Olympics often.

Hank started playing about 60 years ago, but not in any organization before 1976. He has won the Sr. Olympics of Northwest Ohio in his class seven times, with one Gold and one Silver from the State. Hank played in about 50 tournament and won about 30 trophies. He has placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd in his class in the World Tournament. He started a

morning league for the benefit of the night workers and senior citizens. Hank has been an officer in the Toledo Area Horseshoe Club for many years.

The Toledo Area Horseshoe Club was successful in having the courts at Jermain Park named "The Hank Kahle and Nial Beck Horseshoe Courts" to honor them for their contribution to the game.

To the Editor,

Having pitched and promoted horseshoe pitching all my life, I have some thoughts on certain aspects of the game as it is now played.

Not all junior pitchers are able to play the game the way we have the rules set up. We have assumed because someone said 50 years ago that 30 feet was the correct distance for juniors and women, that it should stay that way. I cannot agree with this.

Youngsters 6 or 7 years of age are not equipped to pitch shoes 30 feet. They should be allowed to pitch a distance they can handle, be that 15, 20 or 25 feet and any new court installations should have provisions for these bantam players. I also recommend a sand or loam court for these little players because in my promotions and work with them, I have found that clay tends to scare them. A couple of such courts would also be useful for the general public who might be in the area for a picnic or fun outing and find clay discouraging.

I also feel that we may have been wrong to let men move all the way up to 30 feet at age 70+ when they couldn't handle 40 feet any more. Yes, they should be allowed to move up but just to the next closest distance they can handle. While some have moved up a little, most have taken advantage of the full ten feet and now pitch as good, if not better, than ever. What about the pitcher who is under 70 years of age but suffers from arthritis or other medical problem? They are obliged to pitch in pain at 40 feet while their need to move up a little is more valid than some of the 70+ pitchers.

Perhaps as NHPA President Dave Loucks has sometimes suggested, maybe the game should have one common foul line and let all adults pitch from their comfortable distance behind that line.

Dear Mr. Loucks:

The situation regarding mixing 30' and 40' pitchers is one of great concern, especially for the 40'ers. For some reason, oddly enough, the 30'ers do seem to enjoy it and some voice displeasure when placed in a 30' class as opposed to pitching mixed with 40'ers. I understand this happened at the last Hacienda tournament in Las Vegas. Not all 30'ers agree as several have told me during a match that they consider they have a "built-in" advantage on 40'ers.

I think we all agree that horseshoe pitching is a game of *skill* and that tournaments are held to match and compare that *skill* with others. Sure we compete because it is fun and we enjoy it. This love for the game and the fun we derive from it are, as in any sport, based on everyone adhering to the same standards with no blanket advantages or disadvantages being allowed. Sex, age, color, class or creed have nothing to do with it.

There are some women who pitch from 40', for example, and should be allowed to pitch in 30' classes without regard to sex. A possible exception might be the world tournament where it is desirable to determine the top pitchers of both sexes.

The crux of the concern is that it doesn't require as much skill to make a ringer from 30' as it does from 40'. I doubt that many would challenge that. For those who do, why not let everyone choose the distance they like best and erase pitching distances from the rules? Sure, there would be a variety of percentages, but it should be evident that a 50% pitcher at 30' and a 50% pitcher at 40' cannot be compared as of equal *skill*. That's what we do when we have mixed classes. The discrepancy is increased by other factors involved. For example, lucky pitches increase as the distance is reduced. This shouldn't be considered insignificant as only one point often is the difference in a game.

There is really no way their respective skills can be compared on a fair basis by competing with each other, because distances are not the same. As one pitcher put it—no 30'er can claim greater skill than a 40'er they "out scored" because they didn't start out with measurably equal skills. The 30'er doesn't have as high a degree of skill as the 40'er, even though ringer percentages may be equal.

If there were ways of determining just what degree of skill is involved in making ringers from 30' as compared with 40' we could make these mixed classes a fairer test of skill. One proposal suggested is to have engineers calculate how wide the opening should be to equalize that factor at 30' and at 40'. Even though that would have an equalizing effect, other factors involved remain. How about a 40' ringer scoring 4 points as compared with 3 points for the 30'er?

We have arbitrarily assumed that the ringer percentage is the only factor involved and that pitching distance is immaterial. I think we can do better than that. If that is true, it seems again that any distance a pitcher fancies could be construed to result in a true test of skill. It actually is only a test for skill in relation to the distance involved, not shorter or longer.

Barry Chapelle stated: "Given proper conditions, a game between two pitchers of the same percentage is essentially an even game, regardless of age, sex or distance."

Am not sure what he means by "proper conditions." I suppose "an even game" means that it is a fair way to determine which one has the greater *skill*. I don't think it does for the reasons previously mentioned. If "an even game" means otherwise, pure chance comes into play. When chance alone is considered in a mixed match of equal percentage pitchers, it should be evident that the shorter distance pitcher has a decided advantage over the longer one. To demonstrate this more vividly, pitch a couple of shoes from 50' and then a couple from 20'.

The target has a certain size from a distance of 10'. At 20' its relative size is one-half, etc., as distance is increased. This principle is involved and recognized in many sports. In basketball there's the 3-point shot since more skill is needed. No comparisons are valid for skill when 2-point and 3-point percentages are quoted. Their skills are not equal, even though their percentages may be the same. Other sports also take distance into consideration in competition.

We pitch horseshoes for fun and relaxation. We want our sport to grow and gain recognition and stature. It is doubtful that mixing distances makes for more "fun" or enhances the appeal for our sport. Should we all pitch

from the same distance so we can all enjoy the same degree of "fun"?

Uninformed spectators do often watch tournaments. At a mixed tournament they can't figure out what kind of a contest they're watching—with some of each sex pitching 30' with others pitching 40'. They often ask if it isn't easier for the 30'ers to make ringers and if it is, why don't all contestants pitch at 30' to make it a fair contest?

Have there been any unbiased polls taken? I understand a poll was taken by someone involved with the Las Vegas Hacienda tournaments. The figures have not been published, as far as I know, but it was said to be quite in favor of not having mixed classes. I hope my "source" didn't give me a bum steer!

This topic is a rather "hot potato" and can lead to hard feelings among good friends who may agree on everything else. All sides should have their "say" and should be allowed to defend their positions by stating what they think makes their position the right one. Isn't that the accepted way?

When someone says we only pitch horseshoes for the fun of it they're pretty much right, but it doesn't follow that "anything goes" or that "everyone" has to pitch regardless of the rules and regulations. It can result in wondering who's having the most "fun."

A favorite old come-on is to authoritatively and loudly admonish a simple question with a statement such as "be a good sport" or "you're not a good sport." This usually means they don't agree with you (at least in public) and therefore the question has no merit. Terms such as "selfish" and "chauvinistic" can fall into the same category, implying, don't ask embarrassing questions.

It is not surprising Barry Chapelle's poll of the charters got the results he stated. Does it actually reflect the feelings of all the pitchers represented? It has been my observation that many pitchers, the majority of those I've talked to, don't like mixing and would much rather not have to pitch a mixed match. Most are reluctant to voice their opinions in public, having experienced snide remarks that were loud and vituperative. I know because I've been there!

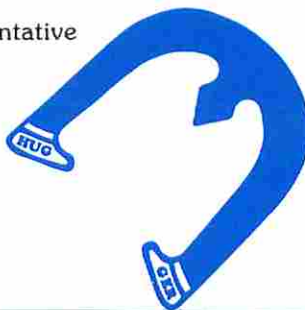

The Toll of Time

ERNEST G. GRAHAM

Every now and then a special person comes along who affects the lives of many in a positive way. In the NYSHPA, such a person was Ernest G. "Ernie" Graham. For eight years Ernie was the Sec/Treas of NYSHPA and in that was generally the first NYSHPA officer a new horseshoe pitcher met when he or she applied for a National and State card. This was a good start for many players as he radiated the warmth and friendliness that is true of nearly all who participate in this great sport of ours. But Ernie's contribution goes back a lot further and a lot deeper than that as he was one who promoted and participated in the sport with a great deal of vigor.

In his home town of Camden, NY, Ernie saw a great potential for organizing the sport for the benefit of his friends and neighbors. He installed 8 courts in his back yard and started leagues back in 1975. As the interest grew, a beautiful piece of land was acquired near his home and with the construction of 20 courts situated amongst the pines, the Pine Grove Horseshoe Club was founded by Er-

nie in 1977. This site has been the home of an annual Open tournament and three State tournaments with the most recent State Championship held there in 1988 with, of course, Ernie involved as Assistant Tournament Director.

In 1983, Ernie was presented with the Steinfeldt award for outstanding contributions to the NYSHPA and was subsequently elected to the NYS Hall of Fame in 1986. In his interest to keep up to date, Ernie recognized the advantage of computerizing the ringer percentages of the NYS pitchers and arranged to have the position of computer analyst added to the NYSHPA by-laws. Later he learned to perform his duties as league secretary on his own personal computer. There are many members of the Graham family involved in the sport including his wife "Dutch", sons, brothers and daughter "Sandy" Lyke who is a former NYS Junior Girls Champion.

It is sad to report that Ernie died after being stricken at home on June 1st, 1989 and it will now be up to others to carry on the good work that he started and performed for so long. He will be greatly missed by his many

friends in Camden and around New York State.

RUEL DOUGLAS SOWARD

Memorial services were held Wednesday, June 7 at 4 p.m. in Lake Isabella. Mr. Soward passed away at Mercy Hospital, Bakersfield, June 2. He was born September 16, 1911 in Ada, Oklahoma and resided in California since 1942. He was a retired carpenter. He and his wife, Edyth founded and built the Lake Isabella Horseshoe courts and club in 1985, which is associated with the National Horseshoe Pitcher's Association. He was President of the local horseshoe club for five years. He was also a member of the CB Sideband Club and was known as "Grasshopper". He was an avid fisherman and sportsman. Survivors include his wife of almost 58 years, Edyth; daughter, Cheryl Pederson of Sequim, Washington; son, Charles; 6 grandchildren; 8 great-grandchildren and 1 great-great-grandchild; two sisters of Ada, Oklahoma, Viola Dew and Beatrice Ellis and sister Billie Ruth Harr of Bakersfield.

The policy of trying to accommodate everyone, regardless, in an attempt to increase number of participants is somewhat counter productive. There are now pitchers who have quit pitching in mixed tournaments and others who limit the number they enter.

I don't presume to be a great authority on this subject but think I should state my views and the reasons behind my conclusions. I do compete and think our game is great. I have no relatives who pitch horseshoes, but I don't think that has anything to do with it.

Nine Old Men Toss Iron By The Ton

Nine old men live in the Iron Age in Cloverdale, California. To verify this statement please note the following facts compiled by Earl Conaway, statistician for the Cloverdale Horseshoe Club situated on Highway 101 some 85 miles north of San Francisco.

These nine Cloverdale Senior Citizens, all retired from a lifetime of constructive activity, continue to demonstrate their remaining strength by pitching iron horseshoes at iron stakes three afternoons a week in the City park. All for fun, they say, but more probably to signify they can still do it.

Would you believe in the last eight years these nine old guys have thrown 988,700 horseshoes; 2,471,750 pounds of iron which can be unbelievably converted to just under

1,231 tons...how many truck and trailer loads is that?

The deteriorated condition of these horseshoe pitchers is expressed by the fact that of a near million shoes pitched, only 247,704 were ringers, a little less than one fourth, but they consider beneficial exercise high reward for their efforts. "Horseshoe pitchin's good for your health," so it has been said.

Well, in pitching nearly a million shoes, these fellows jointly amassed a mileage back and forth between stakes of 3,745, equal to a stint from ocean to ocean, calculated West to East, without concern for getting back. Judging from statistics of longevity, these guys probably will all be "gone" long before they pitch themselves back to home base in California.

Regional Director's Report

Wanda Archer, Regional Director for **Wyoming**, reports they have added two new clubs to their tournament schedule for the year. They are in Gillette and Sundance, Wyoming. This adds two more sanctioned tournaments to their schedule bringing the total to twelve. Six years ago they only held four tournaments in the state so they are growing. Wanda would like to hear from some other states as to how they figure the players' averages. Currently they use a yearly average, from State tournament to State tournament. They have tried many ways, and have found little difference any way they figure it. They are open to any suggestions that will improve their state and tournaments. The big news from Wyoming is that Douglas, Wyoming has submitted a bid for the 1991 World Tournament. This would be held at the Wyoming State Fairgrounds in Douglas.

Art Felgenhauer, Regional Director for **Illinois**, informed me that he is very involved in teaching the sport of horseshoes to youth groups and organizations throughout his area. During the past year he has contacted a number of Park District Directors in Northern Illinois, the Illinois Association of Park Districts in Springfield and the Illinois Parks and Recreation Association in Palatine. Art has submitted to them a horseshoe program for adults and children alike and hopes they will include this in their individual park recreational activities. He keeps busy attending ILSHPA Executive Board and general membership meetings, as well as attending and running horseshoe tournaments. He has designed a form for his tournament directors to request their sanction tournament numbers, which gives him all the important information needed, as well as a form for them to submit their tournament results for *Newsline*.

Bob Walters, Regional Director for **Iowa**, tells me that they will have 50

sanctioned tournaments this year, quite an improvement over past years. They are getting ready for the Iowa Games, to be held August 4th and 5th, 1989. One of their members, Opal Harms, is putting together a scrapbook and preparing items for the Iowa Hall of Fame. She needs newspaper clippings about Iowa pitchers, tournament results, as well as news items about different players. Bob has been working with the State Training School for Boys in Eldora with their springtime sports program. It seems the staff is really interested and the horseshoe courts there get quite a lot of use. They plan to have classes to teach horseshoe pitching at the City Courts in Eldora. They will charge \$10.00 for six sessions and give material and the manual "Art of Pitching Horseshoes" to each participant. They want to teach a class next fall on the 12 courts of the Putt Mossman Indoor Arena. With this indoor facility, classes could be taught throughout Iowa through Community Colleges Education Programs.

Don Koso, Regional Director for **Nebraska**, is recovering from a cracked bone in his neck from a fall at home. He says it will take more than that to keep him from his promotion work for horseshoes, it just slows him down a bit. When you buy an NHPA membership in Nebraska, you not only get a State and National Membership, you also receive a one year subscription to the Nebraska Newsletter which includes a schedule of the sanction tournaments as well as the fun tournaments to be held. You get a vote in all State and National meetings and they keep the statistics of sanctioned events for you. Nebraska is hoping for a good State turnout at the World Tournament in Spearfish. Last year at the ENHPA annual meeting the membership voted to have a ballot printed in the newsletter and by giving your signed ballot to someone who will attend the State meeting,

you may vote without attending. The annual meeting will be held on August 12, 1989 in Lincoln, Nebraska.

Clint Bryson, newly appointed Regional Director for **North and South Dakota**, reports that things are moving right along for the World Tournament in Spearfish. They have been working on the courts for the World Tournament as well as the courts in Belle Fourche, which is only ten miles from Spearfish. These could be used as practice courts if necessary. For the 1989 season, South Dakota will hold 20 sanctioned tournaments, four of them are East River and sixteen are West River, (the state is actually split in half by the Missouri River). North Dakota has come on strong recently with four sanctioned tournaments to qualify for the World Tournament. They will sanction their State tournament for the very first time this year.

Marion Hawley, Regional Director for **Northern California**, reports they will hold a total of 109 sanctioned tournaments this year. So far they have gotten off to a good start with a minimum of rain-outs. There is a new club in Reedley that has held four very successful and well attended tournaments. The co-ordinators for Thousand Trails in the Northern California area have been appointed. They are Holland Payne for the Sacramento Area and Norm and Fuey Herring for the Sonoma County Coast area. Northern California will host the California State Tournament over Labor Day week-end at the courts of the YOLO club in Davis, California. This will be the first time the state tournament has been held on the 26 courts of the YOLO club.

Kentucky is under the direction of Regional Director **Omar Blacketer**. All of the horseshoe tournaments in Kentucky are sanctioned. They got off to a bad start this year because of snow, rain, cold and wind. Their derby tournament had wind, cold

and snow, but Ron Powell, Kentucky State Champion, managed to pitch a fantastic 82.6% to top all pitchers. The Oldham County meet had cold weather and wind, but Lois Webster and Ron Powell teamed with Sue Snyder and Dale Henry of Indiana to win the Team World Tournament at the Pitching Palace. Kentucky boasts of having 182 men, 28 women and 13 juniors as NHPA members for the 1989 season.

Chuck Arnold, Oklahoma's Regional Director, writes that Oklahoma has started the year off fast and furious with a full slate of tournaments. Some of the tournaments will be held in conjunction with the State's Centennial celebration. They extend an invitation to anyone who may be traveling through the state this summer to stop and be a part of the celebration. Leagues and tournaments are in full swing this year, with pitchers in hopes of getting their game in shape for the World Tournament in South Dakota. They are looking forward to that time and truly believe this one will be one of the best World Tournaments yet. The Yukon Club received the bid for the 1989 State Tournament and will host this tournament over Labor Day weekend.

Bob McCharen, Regional Director for the states of **Texas and Arkansas**, reports the Greater Houston Horseshoe Pitchers Association has been busy with the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo tournament held for the eighth year. There were over 200 men's, women's, junior girls' and junior boys' doubles teams representing 57 counties in Texas and 11 metro areas in Houston. This is a big media event in Houston and horseshoe pitching received some good exposure. In April a successful Senior Olympics was held for the Houston area and the participants qualified to enter the National Senior Olympics in St. Louis, June 19-24, 1989. The 1989 schedule for Texas includes 23 tournaments at the clubs throughout the state. The State Championships will be held in October at Bastrop. **Shorty Fry, ARD for Central Texas**, reports two new clubs that have formed, one is the Central Texas Horseshoe Club in Waco, and the other is the Bryan/College Station Club in Bryan. The Austin club is in the process of building new courts in Manchaca.

Louis Parker, ARD for West Texas, reports that the Tumbleweed club in Lubbock has been upgrading their courts at Buffalo Springs Lake and will be having league activities in the spring and summer. Most of the local clubs along with the Texas Association have made President Bush an honorary member of their club or association. The Arkansas tournament schedule begins in May with 8 sanctioned tournaments. Last year Bob ran a series of questions in the Texas Newsletter, some crazy, some not so crazy. He asked if anyone had ever been married on a horseshoe court? Louis Parker responded: Friday evening, June 29, 1984, Roberta Looney and Louis Parker were married at the horseshoe courts in Northwest Lubbock, on the rim of a canyon which is soon to be Texas' newest State Park. The next two days marked the 9th Annual Tumbleweed Invitational Doubles Tournament. Both the bride and groom competed in that event, but on opposing teams. Can you top this?

Sue Johnson, Regional Director for Arizona, tells me that in February an

afternoon was set aside for children and adults in Tucson to aid them in learning the correct procedures and rules for pitching horseshoes. The instructors were Nathan and Jeff Williams and Rob Britain. Free hot dogs and cokes were served. They will establish an evening for interested children this summer and give instructions. This year at the Valley of the Sun, three people were inducted into the Hall of Fame. They were Gary Minnick, 7-time State Champion and Jean and Orville Thomas. Jean is the clerk at the Mesa tournaments and Orville is a pitcher. The State Tournament was held in Yuma and as usual the Yuma club did an outstanding job. A time in October was set aside for a joint meeting for the Yuma and Arizona charter officers to go over the rules regarding the State Tournament. The Tucson and Mesa clubs will try and hold more sanctioned tournaments. One of their goals for the coming year is to try and interest young people and more non-pitchers to keep score, there never are enough score keepers.

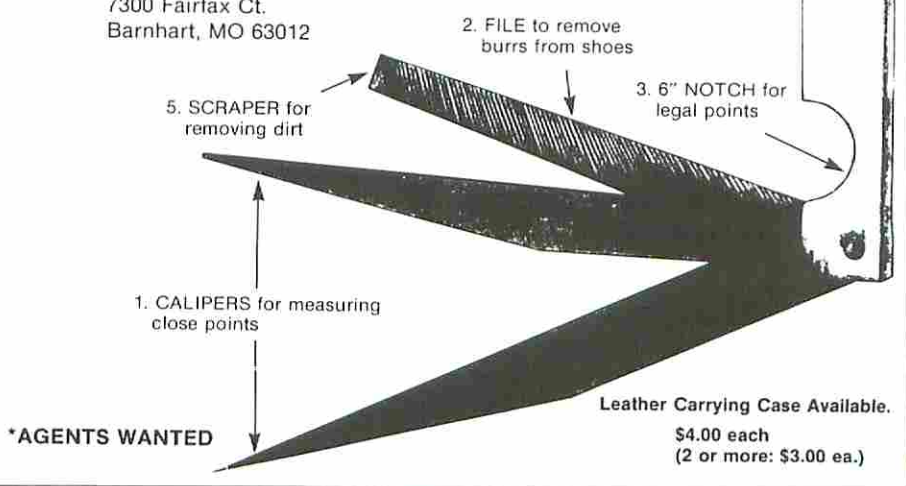

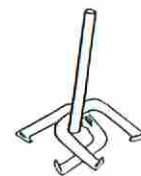

CANADA

Horseshoe Ontario held the 1st Annual Elmer Hohl Ringer Classic on May 27-28 in Wellesley, Ontario. It was a tremendous success with nearly 100 pitchers taking part under the guidance of Jean Markle who was Tournament director. The weather was good and the play very competitive. In an exciting play-off game for the tournament championship, Mike DiMartino of New York defeated Stephen Hohl. The participants were honored to have Hilda Hohl on hand to make the trophy presentations.

Horseshoe pitching is an old, well-established game in Canada. It was played by early settlers, but it did not become an organized sport until the mid-1920's. The first "Official" Canadian Championships were played in November 1929. The Royal Winter Fair and the newly formed "Dominion of Canada Horseshoe Pitchers Association" was in charge of running the tournament.

There were classes A and B in the doubles, and you had to enter with your own partner. There was one class in the singles...the Dominion Championship, and it was for men only. Billy Struthers of Sarnia, Ontario was Canada's first official champion—that was 60 years ago.

COLORADO

The fastest growing sanctioned club in Colorado is the Woodward Governor organization. They have 22 new members in 1989 and 92 who have pitched the last four years.

Rich Pintor, who was seventh at the World last year at Pleasanton, captured all four season preliminary indoor tournaments during April and May.

Gene Sandoval and Beverly Bartle won the mixed doubles "Four Dead" bowling tournament held in April. State CHPA treasurer Virginia Sandoval has the top women's series with a 553.

CONNECTICUT

Beginning in 1970 the current State Champion, Norman Rioux, has won 16 titles including nine straight to the present time. His highest percentage over the years was 75.9 in 1975. Sam Lane has won five championships, William Crofut claims five, followed by Don Weik with four. Guido Georgetti, Dwight Smith, Ralph Hillburn and Willie Paradis each have collected three with Sherm Green, Walter Bagley and Dominic Majewski claiming two.

Single winners have been W.T. Cowles (1928), who won the first one, Irving Wood, James Bessey, Jr., Clarence Lavers, John Dudek, William Doyle and Arthur Tyson. In 1972 Tyson had the second highest tournament percentage with 75.8.

FLORIDA

Carl Steinfeldt defended his Florida State Championship title against 11 challengers in Orlando April 22. Carl won all five games in group A-1 and then defeated Elmer (Dutch) Swartz, Group A-2 winner, in two straight in the scheduled three game playoff. Carl averaged 72.5%. In the acceptance speech at the banquet Carl stated that this win had particular significance to him because this was his 10th straight title, a milestone which tied John Rademacher's 10 straight. John, a member of the FSHPA and NHPA Hall of Fame, won his 10 championships prior to the forming of the Florida organization in 1976.

Herman Wieser of Lake Worth as the Seniors Champion. He averaged 55.0 in winning five straight. He also won the handicapped pitching in the Seniors group.

Richard Warren of Naples was elected president of the NSHPA. Richard appointed Jim Pelkey of Bradenton, to fill the spot vacated by his election as 2nd vice president. Sparky Hill of Beverly Hills was elected 3rd vice president.

ILLINOIS

The Association was awarded a plaque by NHPA for the largest increase in membership in 1987. The 240 increase brought their total to 592, including juniors. The increase came when the State tournament was held in an area where members joined to participate in the State. The membership dropped to 444 in 1988, but may recover in 1989 since the tournament will be held further south in the state, nearer the larger concentration of pitchers. The only states with more members in 1988 were California, Indiana, Missouri, New York and Ohio.

INDIANA

In the Steve Rathburn Memorial Tournament at Stroth, the Class A winner was Clarence Bellman, 6-1,

69.5. Other winners were Roy Hunt (Ohio) 7-0, 50.7 in Class B; Dan Harris (C), 7-0, 46.8; Mary Lemaster (Virginia) D, 6-1, 48.4; Rosemary Rathnurn (E), 6-1, 36.6; Ron Fispatic (F), 6-1, 34.3; Dale Neace (G), 7-0, 35.1; Fern Napier (H), 4-1, 25.7.

Lois Webster (KY) won the Class A Harrison County Ringer at Corydon with a 6-1, 80.38%. Lois finished 9th in the World last year. Other winners were Martha Chanley (B), 9-0, 63.2; Larry Morris (C), 6-1, 55.9; Barbara McMonigle (D), 6-1, 53.7; Doyle Mailranz (E), 6-1, 46.8; Dennis Zollman (F), 5-2, 42.1; Guy Drbord (G), 6-1, 38.0; Louis Basinger (H), 6-1, 33.2; Dwayne Wiseman (Jr. A), 55.7; Jim Whitman (Jr. B), 15.3.

Secretary Robert Reid mailed out over 700 copies of the Indiana Schedule.

KENTUCKY

Like most State Tournaments, the Kentucky State will be held over the Labor Day weekend. Nineteen tournaments are on tap during the year. Danny Webb of Alexandria is the president of the KHPA. John Hankins is the secretary-treasurer. The Regional Director is Omar Blacketer. The Kentucky Indoor Champions for 1988 were Bill Henn, Bellevue, 8-1, 65.9% for the men; Debbie Cooper, Hopkinsville, 5-1, 61.7%; and Brian Collins, New Castle, Junior Boys, 7-1, 32.3%.

LOUISIANA

Emanuel Wilson of New Orleans squeaked out a one point win in a playoff to defeat Jack Atchley of Harahan for the Championship trophy in the mixed singles Spring Open. Clem Gomez of Marrero came in as a last minute replacement to win the Class B title. Julie Trahan, Metairie, won Class C in playoff against Liz Camardelle of Waggaman. Jerry Maddox, Harahan, also went the playoff route to win Class D over John Dorsa and R.C. Smith. Jean Lugo had a perfect day to win the Class E award.

In the Skip Greco Open mixed singles, Dick Kula, Harahan, went 7-0 and 48.2% to win the tournament Championship honors. He also had high game of 67.9. John Wilson, Marrero, hit the winners circle after a dry spell to win Class B. He avenged an earlier loss to Bonnie Luke in a playoff. His high game was 47.5. Charlie Bradley of Gretna was 5-0, 26.0 to win Class C. It was remarkable since he was still recuperating from a slight stroke last winter.

Ray Furey and Karen Thayer won the Class A division of the Fairbault West Mall Tournament in April. Dick David and Bill Bartusek copped the Class B crown, and Larry Barclay and Alvin Barclay won Class C.

Minnesota boasts 34 state sanctioned clubs.

NEBRASKA

Cathy Carter of Iowa defeated Dale Seybert in a playoff to win the Class A Nebraska City Arbor Day Open. Won-lost records were not available for this tournament, but Cathy had 63.0 to Seybert's 58.7. PROFILE

Diane Lopez

In the work force Diane Lopez is a quality engineer. On the horseshoe court Diane Lopez is a quality engineer. That tells the whole story of the 42-year-old grandmother, who seemingly startled the world of horseshoe pitching by winning the 1988 Women's World title on her first try at Pleasanton, California. It really wasn't any surprise to many of her followers from the Golden State.

For a "flipper" with a distinct style, Diane has come a long way in her short four and one-half years as a horseshoe pitcher. Of course, pitching has been in her blood for many years since she was a slow-pitch softball pitcher for 10 of her 16 years in the sport. She retired two years ago when horseshoes took too much of her spare time.

The 1988 World Champion first hit the courts in 1983 when she was invited by her softball coach and friend Brian and his wife Debbie Dunavan to a party at Debbie's parents ranch in Templeton, California.

"After trying the 'turn' several times, Brian suggested that I pitch the same way I pitched softball, a reverse flip with the knuckles on top. It worked."

"I started pitching horseshoes from 40 feet, but later moved closer. My rapid approach was developed while pitching batting practice when I had to throw to 10-12 batters in quick fashion. This rhythm was important and has proved to be successful through the years. Pitching fast gives me little time to think about what I am doing."

Diane is a three-time California State Champion, winning the title in 1985, 1987 and 1988. She carried winning percentages of 78.6, 74.2 and 78.6. Her startling 83.4 in the World Tournament was second to Sandy McLachlin's 85.0. Sandy

finished second last year one game behind Diane's 14-1 record. McLachlin had set a tournament record of 88.2 in her winning performance at Eau Claire in 1987.

Like the men's World champion, Jim Knisley, Diane lays off the sport for about two months or so during the winter. However, as soon as daylight savings time rolls around, you will find her in the backyard court two or three times a week for one hour sessions "engineering" her Imperials at horseshoe stakes.

Pitching her first tournament in San Luis Obispo, Diane was entered in the 45-50 percent class. She moved up after the first day's play where she eventually was paired against another California top "flipper", Jesse Gonzales.

"I was terrified," she said. "Jesse shot between 75 and 80 percent, but the loss made me more determined and more serious about horseshoe pitching." Today Lopez is in position to match her male counterpart ringer for ringer. Their game matches in California tournaments are always masterpieces.

Diane was impressed with another California star, Sharon Paddock, when she faced last year's third place finisher in her first State tournament in 1984. Diane finished

second and became even more determined to be Class A. Her three titles in the next four years is evidence of her success to reach that level.

"I had high hopes of finishing in the top five at Pleasanton, but had no idea I would capture the championship. I did know, however, that I had to work hard to be in the top five. There are so many excellent pitchers in the field, and I had no idea I could win on my first try. Sandy did it in her first try as a 17-year-old pitcher in 1987."

Diane is the mother of two, Tim, whose 2½ year old daughter Breana is the only grandchild, and Christina, soon to be 21. Tim's chief hobby is collecting baseball cards.

In high school Lopez competed in softball, tennis, soccer and basketball. She enjoys the outdoors, loves to travel and go camping. Her relaxation and hobbies include crocheting, sewing and knitting. From her accomplishments, Diane really "tends to her knitting" when she is throwing ringers in competition.

Yes, Diane Lopez is a first class quality horseshoe pitcher. When not ringing the stake, she works in Goleta, California, 54 miles from home, for the Santa Barbara Research Center, a subsidiary of Hughes Aircraft Company. As a quality engineer, she conducts functions in support of developmental systems and production programs. She prepares and implements project quality plans, test of inspection procedures, coordinates quality activities with program management, engineering and administrative areas.

This is all "Greek" to most of us. All we know is that Diane is a quality horseshoe pitcher, who will be going after her second straight World Championship in Spearfish, South Dakota in July.

RULES

BY Barry Chapelle

Just a few words to let you know that we are keeping busy. Several proposals are in front of us. In all honesty, if 70+ elder men had to pitch 40 feet, a lot of our problems wouldn't exist. But the reality of the situation is that we have allowed these gentlemen the right to pitch less than 40 feet if they so desire and we're not sure what to do with it. Most charters are allowing mixed pitching or at least advertising in advance which events are mixed. At this time, I believe that is the best procedure. The main thing right now is to allow participation to all of those who have a right to participate, regardless of age or sex. At the current time, we have 5 proposals that deal with mixed pitching and pitching less than 40 feet. We are still working on the rule regarding playing off ties and are studying the possibility of counting a shoe that measures as a three-pointer a ringer. We have a proposal to cancel single points just like we cancel ringers, and we are working on the definition of what constitutes an altered shoe. A lot of these things will be finalized by the next issue so I can give a better progress report. Thank you for your support. I hope to see many of you at Spearfish.

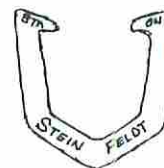

Fertile Horseshoe Grounds

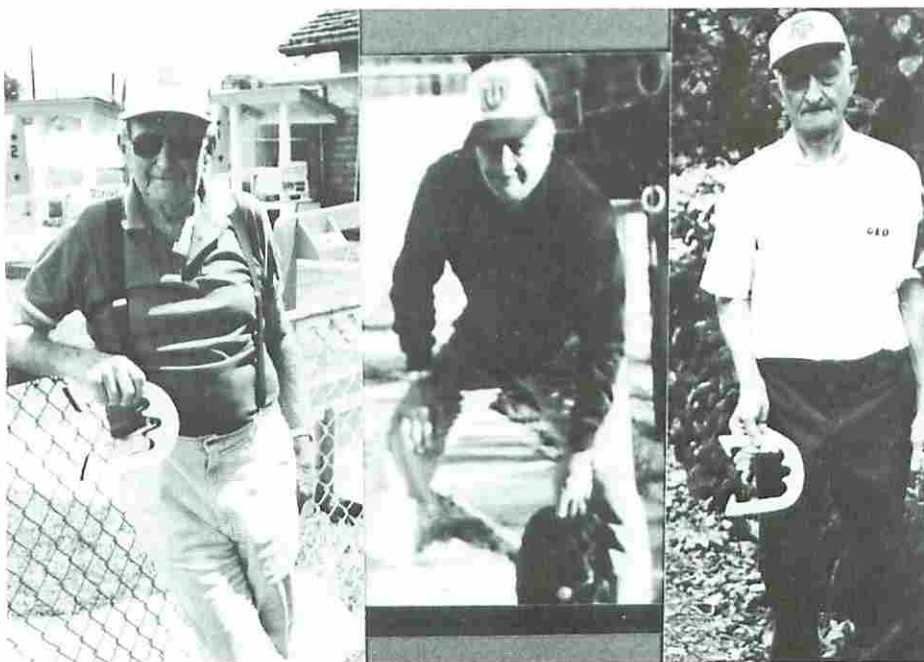
Three Northern California Senior Citizen horseshoe pitchers recently have designed new pitching shoes, each totally different from the other. The hope is unanimous that these shoes will lead to more ringers by those who throw them; apropos of knowledge that shoes perform no better than the pitcher's ability to throw them.

Barak Wright...a native Californian, in his active lifetime was a builder of buildings, perpendicular and horizontal, and in retirement became greatly absorbed by his favorite recreation, pitching horseshoes. His enthusiasm led to the founding of the Ukiah Valley Horseshoe Club in the city of Ukiah. Today he serves as its Secretary-Treasurer.

As time went on, the conception of a PERFECT shoe (actually, a perfect shoe is a DREAM shoe) absorbed his attention, perfect at least, to match his waning firmness of step and swing. Not wanting to pitch thirty feet, his slightly lighter shoe compensates to serve him well. Sanctioned as it has been by NHPA, he is justified in creation of this shoe, cut from steel plate, not cast.

Pete Donoho...a native Californian, too, raised on a cattle ranch on Northern California's rough Mendocino Coast, rode range as a boy behind roaming, grazing cattle. He learned the hard way that man must be tough to survive. As if cattle ranching were not tough enough, Pete slipped into a cushioned seat of heavy construction equipment doing work where toughness is called for.

This rough-and-tumble fellow has a robust physique and a mind to match. A real horseshoe pitcher for only ten years, but Pete said, "As a boy, I threw shoes out behind the barn, big shoes off our work horse, Old Bill." A perfectionist by nature, he couldn't stand to lose ringers once thrown, and came up with a shoe of his unique design with calks

on reverse sides to give firmer landing at the stake and stay on...his old flip-thrown shoe was noted for its flipoff tendency.

Pete's stainless steel shoe, patented and sanctioned by NHPA, is serving his need adequately as well as others who throw the shoe.

George Greeott...another native Californian, has been an NHPA and NCHPA member for twenty-six years. Horseshoe pitching, his favorite recreation, has favored him well by winning California's B Championship in 1971-2; furthermore, he was nominated to NHPA's Hall of Fame in 1982.

In his fifty-year work life he operated his own ranch in a fertile valley north of Santa Rosa; prunes, apples and wine grapes were his yearly crop; sheep ranged hilly grassland.

In retirement George displays his artistic superiority in wood carving and small-type metal sculpture. His inventive resourcefulness lead to a patent on an internationally accepted, and used, farm tool. With this background one should not be surprised that he developed his GREEOTT GRABBER pitching shoe,

sanctioned by NHPA and already well proven in combat...Witness: Jack O'Connor told me with pride, "I threw my GG shoes to win Minnesota's State Championship in 1987 with 80% ringers. I'm throwin' better'n with anything else, and I fooled around with many other makes; I like their balance."

George beamed with self-satisfaction to express, "My aim in planning this shoe was to come up with a design that would serve better the greatest number of pitchers."

What a variety of backgrounds these three men represent! These fellows, all three of 'em, are imbued with the pioneering spirit of their ancestors. Each wants to produce a BETTER horseshoe; better for himself, better for other pitchers, hopefully better for many pitchers. Not one of the three has been a real pitching MASTER, and each has produced a different type shoe...? To fit our present age of advancing technology?

Legend in days of yore proclaimed... "Look to the sky for inspiration." Instead, today, these three men looked to the iron stake for their inspiration.

an award to a junior pitcher: present it at a school function. Make them aware that it is a sport that every student can participate in, regardless of size, gender or athletic abilities.

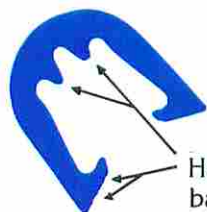

FLORIDA **BRADENTON H.S. CLUB #79-C-10**

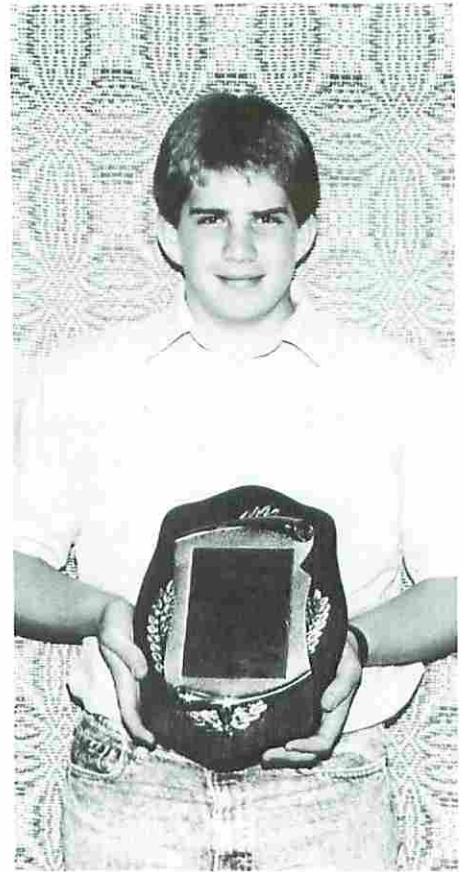

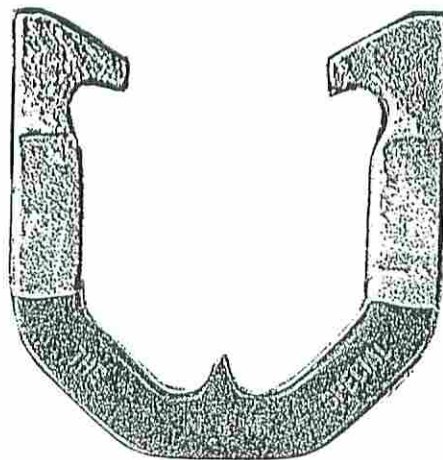

Horseshoe Mechanics

Mechanics is the analysis of the action of forces on matter or material systems. Utilizing mechanics and making a few simplifications, one can determine some interesting aspects of throwing an object such as a horseshoe.

A person need not spend much time at a horseshoe tournament to notice that everyone has their own "style" of pitching a horseshoe. Not only are there variations regarding the method used to obtain an open and flat shoe at the stake, but some players throw low and hard, while others lob the shoe high in the air. All these variations made me curious as to what is the most efficient pitch? Recently I sat down, pulled out some long forgotten physics equations, and arrived at some answers.

When throwing an object, it turns out that you get the most distance for a given effort if the object leaves your hand at a 45 degree angle from horizontal. Making a few simplifications, such as neglecting wind resistance and assuming the horseshoe is "launched" from the base of one stake and lands at the base of the other stake (a reasonable assumption since the release point is several feet in front of the stake and also 3 or 4 feet above the ground), I calculated the following as the most efficient pitch:

40 foot throw:

Y = height shoe reaches at center = 10 feet
V = velocity at release = 36 ft/sec = 25 mph
VH = horizontal velocity = 25 ft/sec = 17 mph
T = travel time to stake = 1.6 seconds
E = energy given shoe = 50 ft-lbs

30 foot throw:

Y = 7.5 feet
V = 31 ft/sec = 21 mph
VH = 22 ft/sec = 15 mph
T = 1.4 seconds
E = 38 ft-lbs

If you throw lower or higher you expend more energy and impart a higher velocity to your shoe as follows:

40 foot throw:

Y = 5 feet	or	15 feet
V = 40 ft/sec		37 ft/sec
VH = 36 ft/sec		21 ft/sec
T = 1.1 sec		1.9 sec
E = 62 ft-lbs		54 ft-lbs

30 foot throw:

Y = 5 feet	or	10 feet
V = 32 ft/sec		32 ft/sec
VH = 27 ft/sec		19 ft/sec
T = 1.1 sec		1.6 sec
E = 40 ft-lbs		39 ft-lbs

Energy is measured in foot-pounds (ft-lbs) in the English system. One ft-lb is equal to 0.0003241 Calories (kilogram calorie). It's interesting to note how many (or how few as the case may be) Calories of energy are used in a horseshoe tournament.

40 foot throw (10 ft height):

$50 \text{ ft-lbs} \times 0.0003241 \times 350 \text{ shoes} = 5.7 \text{ Calories}$

30 foot throw (7.5 ft height):

$38 \text{ ft-lbs} \times 0.0003241 \times 350 \text{ shoes} = 4.3 \text{ Calories}$

Not encouraging information for someone who is dieting. Note however, this is the energy given the shoes you throw not the amount of Calories your body burns during a tournament.

It is interesting to note that a booklet I have recommends throwing shoes so that the high point of the arc is 7.5 to 9 feet (40 foot throw) above the ground. This is lower than the most efficient throw, but hopefully gives the player better distance control.

I doubt this information will do much to improve anyone's ringer average, but hopefully you found it interesting.

PITCHEROOS PITCH SHOES DOWN UNDER

Many of us met Pete Moon when he attended the 1985 World Horseshoe Tournament in Indiana. He was the first pitcher from Australia to participate in our world event. A recent effort was made to find out all about our sport "Down Under," and Pete was kind enough to provide a good deal of very interesting information that I hope you will find enjoyable.

Dear Donnie,

Your request to the Pitcheroos Horseshoe Pitching Club of Australia for a history of pitching "Down Under" is herewith enclosed. You sure set me quite a task, but an enjoyable one. The questions you asked me and my responses are now presented.

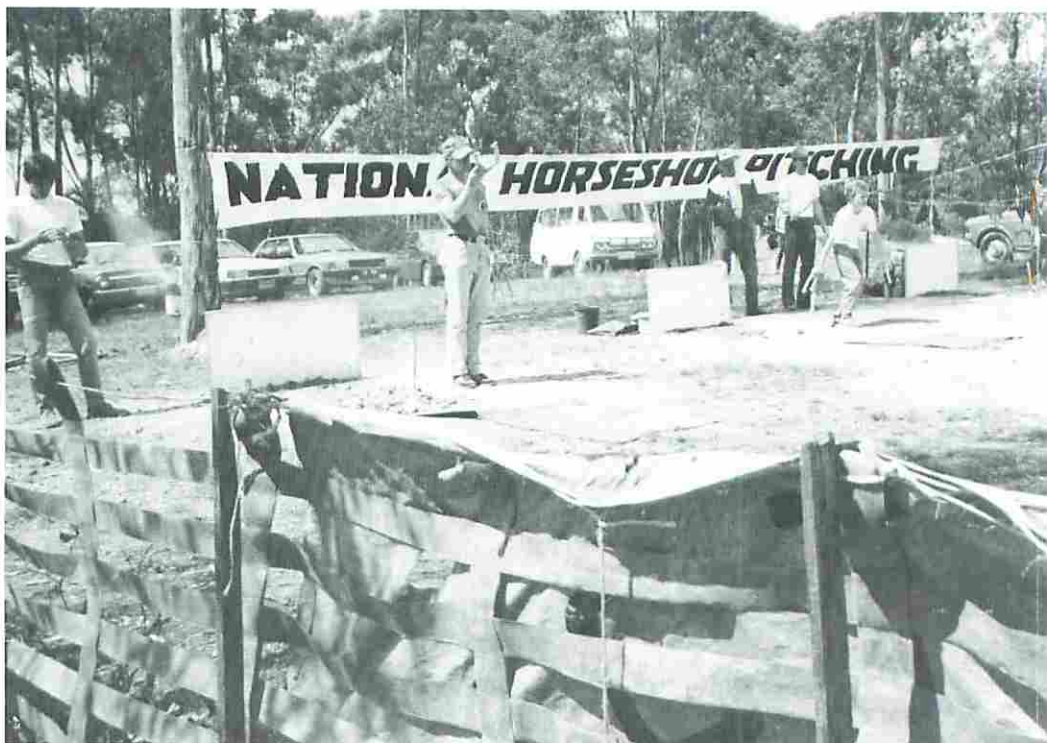
Q. Could you provide a general history of horseshoe pitching in Australia?

A. As far as I can ascertain, Australians have been pitching horseshoes since before the turn of the century (probably since about 1854), but until very recent times the sport was an ad hoc one with no formal organization whatsoever.

We really started "getting our act together" six years ago, but as you will appreciate, our first attempts were a little like stumbling around in the dark and they left a lot to be desired. Until then the sport was only played "village level," in isolated rural pockets across the continent, except for an annual event which was conducted at the country fair in Bendigo, Victoria.

In 1981 a National Horseshoe Pitching Association was formally registered in the Bendigo area and competitors at the annual country fair commenced playing under this banner.

I experienced some of the "village level" approach to the game as I traveled extensively throughout remote rural areas of Australia and witnessed people pitching solely for social recreation rather than for skillful competition. Games were usually organized at the rear of the

local hotel (pub) and 20 players and their dogs would represent a good sized gathering. These bronzed, bush Aussies scoffed at the thought of playing for trophies, they played for beer, and the thought crossed my mind on many occasions that the local publicans were shrewd rather than accommodating in allowing their hotel premises to be used for the games.

It gets very hot in our inland regions so contests tended to become very convivial indeed, and at times downright dangerous. Ladders for retrieving high flying shoes from hotel verandahs and roofs were commonly provided by the publicans because players caused too much damage climbing up the sides of the hotel in their big farm boots.





Up in Crocodile Dundee country, sand pits are the order of the day as clay would be baked rock-hard in a matter of minutes by the merciless northern sun. Besides the fact that shoes would ricochet off the baked clay, the game organizers figure it is easier and quicker to site their make-shift stakes in sand. Improvisation knows no bounds when a suitable stake is being sought and they use anything from crowbars to broken car axles. It was up in this area that, because of the intense heat, shoes were kept in a bucket of water in the shade during the many "time out" periods called by thirsty players.

Needless to say, the physical attributes of pitches varied considerably from town to town, as did the rules of the game. In areas where most of the players were big men the pitches were longer than standard, and the opposite occurred when the "average height" of players dictated otherwise.

One very interesting rule refinement I came across was the infamous "kangaroo pitch." This rule was evident in areas where soil conditions preclude the easy preparation of a proper pitch and embedded rocks and giant surface cracks constitute natural hazards of the game. These, combined with the odd empty "tinny" (beer can) or the odd bit of junk farm equipment carelessly thrown down in the variable width line of play are all taken in their stride by the boys from "Down Under"...they are counted as natural obstacles, and if a player is skillful enough to hit one of these hazards and his shoe bounces onto a stake, he not only scores a normal point but has the added personal distinction of having scored it from a "kangaroo pitch," i.e. one that hopped onto the stake.

This will give you some idea of the history of horseshoe pitching in Australia as it was, and still is in certain areas.

Q. How many pitchers are there in Australia?

A. We currently have about 800 pitchers Australia wide, all strictly recreational. This figure includes the "village level" pitchers mentioned and 3-4 hundred pitchers who have now adopted NHPA rules and regulations and NHPA sanctioned horseshoes.

Q. What major events are held for horseshoe pitching?

A. Australian championships are held in Bendigo, Victoria each year, plus State Championships in Victoria, Western Australia and Queensland, Northern Territory.

Q. What is the origin of the Pitcheroos? How many members are in the club? How do you feel about the club's association with the NHPA?

A. I first became interested in the sport of horseshoe pitching whilst serving in the Pacific and Japan during World War II. Upon my return to Australia in 1946 I became a typical backyard pitcher, much like the other Aussies previously mentioned. However, after suffering from a back injury for many years which seriously limited any physical activity, I realized in 1981 that I could pitch horseshoes for exercise with no ill effects and find a great deal of enjoyment at the same time. It was at this stage that I began to look about for other people whom I could introduce to the sport. By 1982 there were about 25 of us playing regularly at my home and we subsequently formed the "Pitcheroos." We stumbled along as a backyard club, increasing our membership to about 40 in 1984. This was OK for weekend fun, but we were making up the rules as we went along and we still had no outside competition, for as far as we knew at that stage we were the only people in Australia indulging in the sport. It was not until 1985 that we accidentally learned of the Bendigo group and their annual competition. In our greater expertise, we contacted the NHPA (Donnie Roberts) of America who kindly furnished us with a veritable wealth of information and assistance -not the least of which were the rules of the game.

This spurred us on with renewed vigor and by the end of the year we had increased our membership by 20 and were sanctioned by the NHPA (USA) in January 1985.

I was fortunate enough in that year to be able to take advantage of the NHPA's invitation to participate in the World Tournament at Lafayette, Indiana. It gives me great pleasure to advise you that by joining this prestigious competition I was 100% successful in saving anyone else from the ignominy of being last! My tournament score, for the record, was one watering can, one shovel, and one scorekeeper's ankle. Actually, I felt like running to the nearest and fastest aircraft home, but the powerful hospitality and companionship of American pitchers and the American people in general gave me the guts to stick out the rest of the tournament proceedings. As I declared in a short article in the February 1987 issue of the *Horseshoe Pitchers News Digest*, I would like to one day meet up with the rather unfortunate scorer just to prove that he is quite safe now from Pete Moon's misguided missiles!

My visit to the USA was memorable in many, many respects, and the kindness, hospitality, and genuine helpfulness extended to me was absolutely unbelievable. I was bombarded with so much knowledge

about horseshoe pitching that I had to keep a tape recorder constantly on hand to ensure that no valuable advice was lost. In Lafayette, it took me only one day to make my mark in history and for the next 10 days I concentrated on trying to absorb more and more about the sport.

Following my return to Australia, armed with something like 20 years of experience crammed into my head and captured for posterity on tape, not only had my own game improved out of sight, but all other members of the Pitcheroos have been able to benefit from the assistance afforded me by NHPA (USA) members. With the best will in the world, we had tried very hard in earlier days to learn from the Horseshoe Pitcher's Manual, but it was not until after my return from the States that we were able to embellish certain points and full understanding of the manual could be achieved. The first hand knowledge I was able to bring back and apply to the words of the manual has now enabled us to use this book as our Bible.

Also, in my own modest way, I am now able to get out into the com-

munity in an endeavor to promote the sport as much as possible. I have had several articles published in our local newspapers and I have been addressing various schools, Rotary, and other service organizations, etc. about the art and joys of horseshoe pitching. None of this would have been possible but for the knowledge I gained in America.

In March 1986, six months after my return from the USA, the Pitcheroos obtained their Charter from the NHPA (USA). At the time of charter, our membership had increased to about 80. Therefore, to answer your questions succinctly, the Pitcheroos were officially formed in 1982, were sanctioned by NHPA (USA) in 1985, and received our charter in 1986.

In respect to our feelings about our association with the NHPA of America, I can only reiterate that without the unstinting assistance afforded to us by the NHPA, the Pitcheroos would probably still be confined to playing in my backyard using "Aussie Rules." We are playing regularly, using international standards, and our membership continues to increase. Our achievements since my return for the States are as follows:

1. We have built the first official court in the southern hemisphere.
2. We have established the first public court in Australia.
3. We have introduced throughout Australia the use of international standards governing all rules and regulations as laid down by NHPA (USA).
4. We have been accepted as a Member Association of the Confederation of Australian Sport, the governing body of all sport in this country.
5. We have researched and developed a range of pit mixtures for use in a wide range of climatic conditions, and it is our belief that the formulations for these mixtures are of sufficiently high a standard to be introduced on a world-wide basis. Prime factors inherent in all mixes are: (a) compatibility with prevailing climatic conditions, (b) stability of shoe lob, (c) ease of maintenance, (d) a marked reduction in the wear and tear factor on shoes.

The benefits we have received as a direct result of our association with NHPA (USA) are therefore clearly visible. The Pitcheroos are "off and running" and are expanding all the time. Our influence in the sport of horseshoe pitching in this country since 1985 is therefore demonstrably obvious and is in stark contrast to other clubs/associations who have not had the benefit of first hand connection with NHPA (USA).

Q. What is the age range of your pitchers?

A. 10 to 65.

Q. Do you have a mascot?

A. We had a duck but a dog ate it! Now we have our own dog and perhaps one day he will replace the duck!

Q. How often do you practice as a club?

A. Twice weekly.

Q. Do pitchers qualify for a class based on their average or some other method?

A. We are still too small for this. The only classes which currently exist are Juniors, Women, and Men, and tournaments are open to any player wishing to compete in his/her appropriate category above.

Q. I understand there is a problem receiving American goods because of an 80% import tax attached to all items valued over \$20.00. Have American shoes helped your pitchers?

A. Our rates of import tax vary according to the type of good being imported and the reason for importation, etc., and horseshoes certainly attract a high duty (and an even higher duty if they are not for one's own use), but nevertheless the American shoes have been like a "gift from heaven" to us all. They have changed the face of pitching in this country and no serious pitcher here would ever again consider using anything else.

In closing, I will say that I was absolutely stunned by the magnitude of the sport in America, and by the sheer wealth of information and assistance which was heaped upon me, and I was amazed at the degree of family participation practiced in this sport.

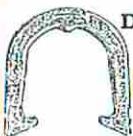

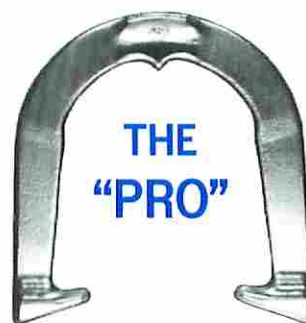

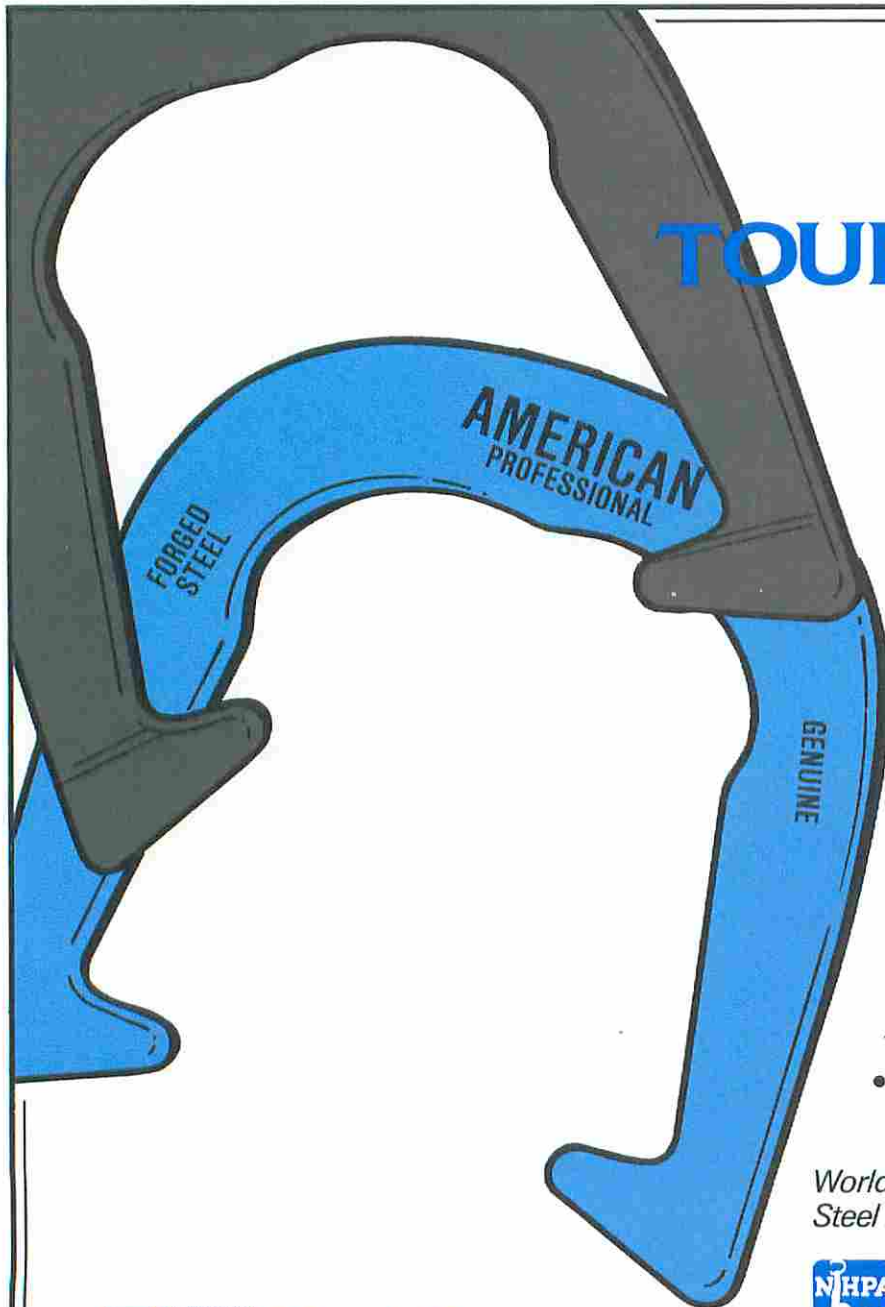
