



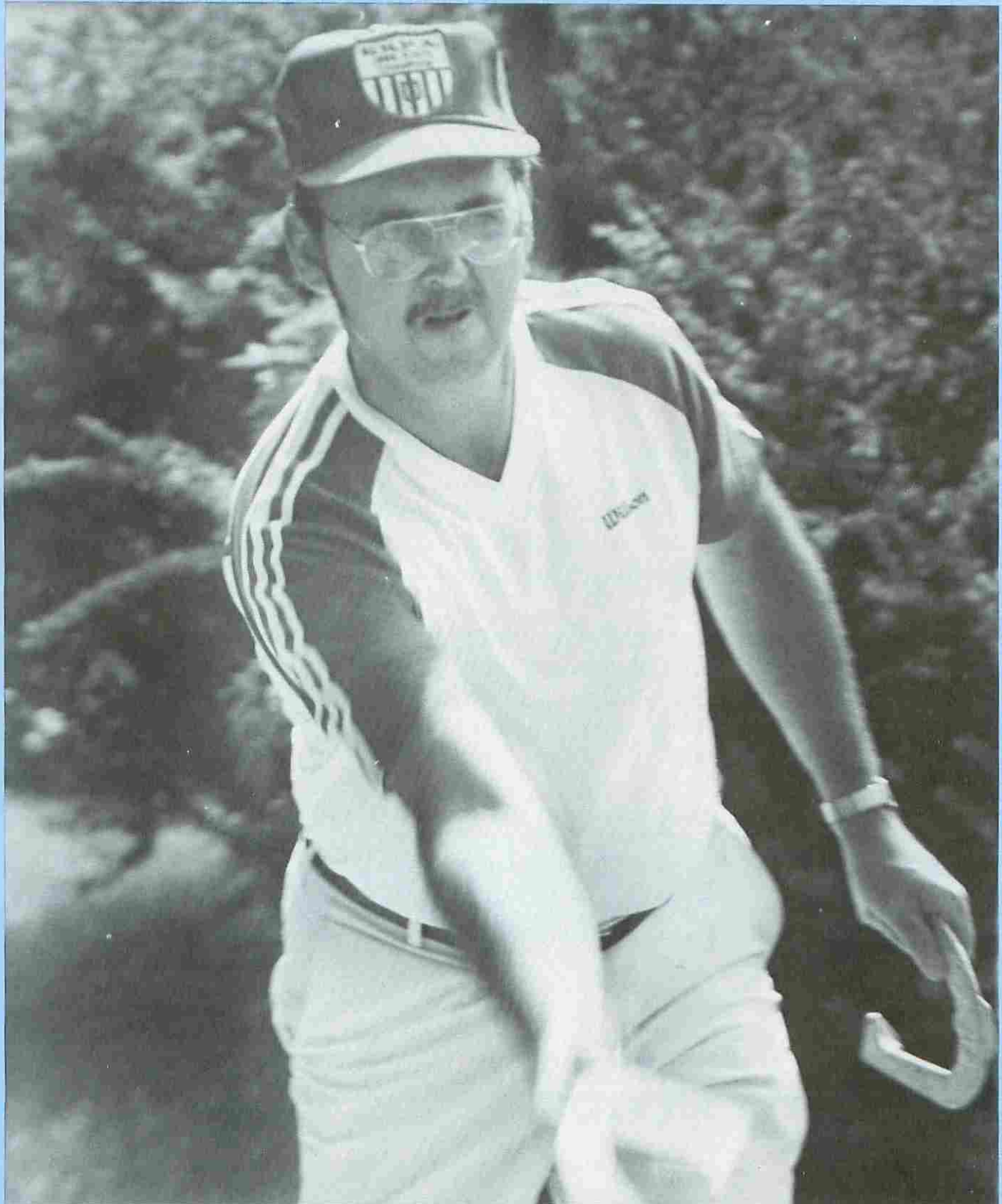

# President's Message

In just over four short months, the NHPA family will once again meet in our annual get together more commonly referred to as the World Tournament. This gathering of friends and serious horseshoe pitchers is always an exciting time as most arrive with high expectations only to leave with their winning goal unachieved.

The old saying, "it's not whether you win or lose but how well you play the game" certainly can apply to horseshoe pitchers at a World Tournament. Sure, we generally remember the top pitchers and those that put winning before all else. But more than them, we remember the new friends we made because of their friendliness and a genuine attitude that the joy of play is more important than the outcome of the game.

Each World Tournament is as different as they are similar. Unfortunately, some pitchers cannot understand or do not wish to accept change. It makes them uncomfortable; puts them out of their element. These pitchers are generally those who put winning before all else and they are unhappy because they somehow feel that a change will reduce their chance of winning.

But, in each World Tournament as in life, there must be some change if there is to be growth. Spearfish will be no exception as the locale, number of courts, entries and maybe even the weather will dictate some change from what was experienced last year in Pleasanton.

The most noticeable change so far is the requirement to have completed at least three sanctioned tournaments in the past year to be eligible for entry into the 1989 World Tournament. While this requirement was approved by a large majority of the delegates, it's surprising to see, eight months later, a small segment of pitchers still fighting the issue. Rather than schedule more sanctioned events as most have done, they apparently view the rule as one that was instituted for no other reason than to keep them from participating. Certainly, that was not the case. The World Tournament, with prize money now approaching \$75,000, needed more than any other tournament, a set of prerequisites for entry. Let's hope that all fellow pitchers will come to understand and accept this fact, and in so doing, will schedule more NHPA sanctioned events in their area.

## Dave's Court Report

In case any of you many still have doubts about the growth and recognition our sport is about to obtain, let me share some very good news with you. St. Pierre Manufacturing Corporation of Worcester, MA has agreed to become a major sponsor of the 1989 World Tournament. Working with the National Horseshoe Pitcher's Association, St. Pierre will put their name and dollars into the July 17-30 event to be held in Spearfish, South Dakota. Our sincere thanks to the St. Pierre Manufacturing Corporation for this significant contribution to the sport and our most prestigious event.

Contained in this issue of *Newsline* is the 1989 World Tournament registration form. If you read it carefully, you will notice that we have allowed another bit of time for you to pick up the required 3 sanctioned events. The time frame has been moved back to May, 1988 giving another whole month in which you may have pitched in a sanctioned event. There were some Charters that had limited sanctioned events last year but did have a big Memorial Day Tournament. Those can now be counted but remember, it's for this year's entry only. For 1990, the time frame will be as stated in our Constitution; June 1, 1989 through the mailing of your registration form.

Last month in this column, I indicated that complimentary copies of the first *Newsline* issue were being mailed to all charter presidents and secretaries who were not on our subscriber list. I was very disappointed to learn that 13 state secretaries and 20 presidents were not current subscribers. How in the world can officers in a state keep their membership properly informed of current horseshoe events, rule changes and the like when they fail to get our prime source of communication, *Newsline*?

The New Rules committee is already hard at work. Chairman Chapelle has sent his committee two communiques covering five different rules, their interpretation or proposed changes to them. Future issues of *Newsline* will carry details on the work and decisions of this important committee.

Hope you enjoyed the first issue of *Newsline*. There were many changes from the previous *News Digest*, the most noticeable being the size, color on the front and the fact that it wasn't in a first class mail envelope. In coming months, more new columns will be introduced in *Newsline*, nothing spectacular, just items I hope you enjoy. By the way, don't look for color every month. It will be used only when I feel the cover or feature warrant it.

This all came about when two of their members watched horseshoes being pitched at the Indiana State Fair. The Corydon Club pitches over water in a building that is convertible from closed for winter, to open for summer. Jim plans to talk to spectators more at the state fairs in the future and promote the game of horseshoes. Miller's Horseshoe Retreat plans to hold a sanctioned tournament in 1989. The club has 8 lighted courts and offers lots of activity for the whole family. You can obtain a complete print-out of all the 1988 Indiana Tournament results from Jim Shilling for just \$3.50.

**Jack Adams**, Regional Director for Canada, reports that Canada enjoyed another successful year in 1988. At the annual meeting, Edward H. Murray was elected President. The 1988 Canadian champions are as follows:

The championships were held indoors in Calgary, Alberta and the 1989 championships will be held in Halifax, Nova Scotia, the first time the championships will be held in the Atlantic provinces. The 1990 championships are scheduled for Portage La Prairie, Manitoba, 20 years after their last championships were held there.

Horseshoe Canada is saddened by the passing of two of their Hall of Famers, Bert Snart and Ken Drury. Ken passed away one week after he was inducted into the Hall of Fame Canada.

An important highlight of the 1988 Canadian season was the trip to France by Andre Leclerc to introduce the sport of horseshoes at the 2nd International Games Festival in September, 1988, hosted by the Aquitaine Sport Pour Tous Association in Villenave d'Ornon, near Bordeaux, France. Twelve delegations attended from: Belgium (French community), Belgium (Flemish community), Benin (Africa), Canada, DRG (East Germany), FRG (West Germany), France, Great Britain, Israel, Luxembourg, Poland and Portugal.

*PHYLLIS: That's true.*

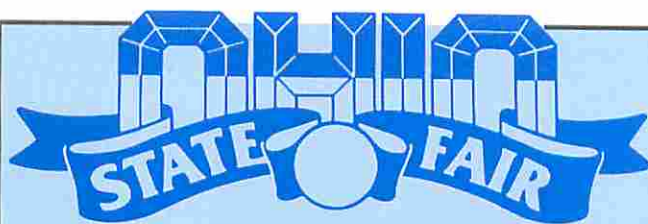
*SHARON: I didn't beat Diane.*

Based on 200 entries, the estimated purse will be \$9,500, plus trophies and other awards will be presented.

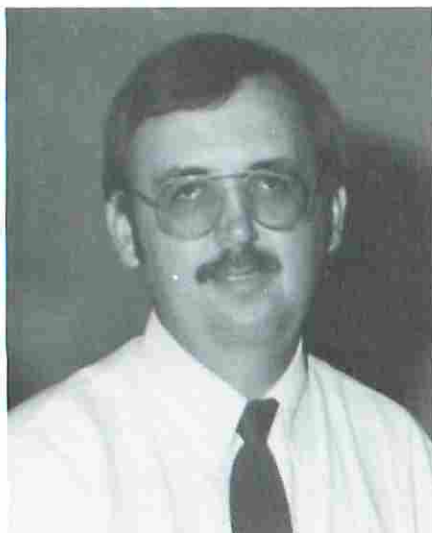

## Profile

# Jim Knisley

**Y**ou won't find the reigning men's World Champion horseshoe pitcher in the top five finishers during the winter months — no Las Vegas Tournament, no Valley of the Sun in Arizona, or play in one of the numerous indoor facilities in the mid-west area. This is relax, recreation and work time for Jim Knisley, the 1988 NHPA World Champion from Bremen, Ohio.

Known for his high and effortless  $1\frac{1}{4}$  turn with his Imperial horseshoes and his good nature and politeness on and off the courts, the young 46-year old veteran of horseshoe pitching wars spends the Winter months playing billiards and working at his job, laying out sheet metal for the insulation of nuclear power plants. Unlike many pitchers "Gentleman Jim" separates himself from pitching half a year. Like many northern states, they have bad weather six months of the year in Ohio. Popular indoor facilities are available, but Jim likes to let his game go down and build it back up.

Who can argue with a World class pitcher like Jim Knisley, who through the years has proved his winter relaxing system works...at least for him. Jim believes one should come to a tournament confident, and be prepared before you get there...and he has the record to prove it.

Knisley has cracked the top five at the World Tournament 10 times, winning the "Gold" twice in 1984 and 1988. He has finished second four times. At Spearfish, he will be competing in his 26th World Tournament and 21st in the Championship

class. If his track record is any indication, he figures to be in the top six when the 12-day competition concludes and the men's title will be decided.

In his first competition in the Championship Class, Jim was the newcomer star of the show finishing second with an 82.8 percent behind Canada's now famous Elmer Hohl. That was his highest World percentage until he nailed an 83.8 in a sixth place finish in 1977, his top closing figure in World competition. Since 1981 Jim has finished in the top five in the World with a top of 83.5 in 1981. His eight year average is 80.4.

Knisley now has a total of 463 All-Time World Championship victories and is seventh in the standings. Because no one with more victories is still pitching on the championship level, Knisley will move up the ladder. Ted Allen of Boulder, 10-time World Champion and a pitcher in 31 World Tournaments, has 771.

"You have to love the game", said Knisley, a 12-time Ohio State Champion. He finished second seven times in the Buckeye Championships, and has won the title the last seven years, nine out of the last ten.

Jim started pitching horseshoes in Bremen at age 15 in 1958. He learned the game on his own dirt court. In 1960, he built a clay court at his parent's home and in 1961 he graduated from high school and began organized horseshoes in the Columbus city league in Sunshine Park. He organized the Bremen Horseshoe Club and built four lighted outdoor courts. In 1962 he attended and watched his first World Tournament at Greenville and joined the NHPA.

The rest is history.

Knisley, who was inducted into the Ohio Hall of Fame in 1983, the youngest player ever inducted, and the NHPA Hall of Fame in 1987, is fortunate to have a family that understands his competitive nature. "A lot of wives wouldn't tolerate it," said Knisley, who has been married 14 years. "When I'm not competing at a tournament, I'm relaxing in the motel."

Horseshoes is not a game of luck, which perfectly suits a steady player like Jim Knisley. In bowling, for example, you have to be lucky as well as good. "In horseshoes, if you throw a ringer, you throw a ringer. If you miss, you miss. Everybody has to have just the right attitude," Knisley said. "And you stay in the same routine."

Just watch the Champ sometime and you will be convinced that the same routine is the way to go... Jim has won over 300 trophies, most of them donated as Tournament prizes.

But I'll bet the "Big" ones are on the mantel in his home.

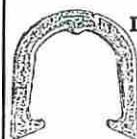

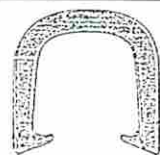

# Sanctioned Club/League News

By Bev Born

It is my belief that there are a certain amount of areas in this program that may be confusing to some. In my first few columns, I will try to clarify some of these by discussing at least one problem and suggesting a possible solution.

There is more to being a sanctioned club than just receiving a certificate of sanction and being assigned a number. It would seem that some do think this is all there is to it, as after they have received their certificate, this office does not hear from them again.

There are a few things that every club must do every year — not every other year or every 2 or 3 years — but *every year*, regardless of whether the club is total NHPA, total CL/LG-Only or of mixed membership.

#### **The first and most important:**

An annual complete membership report is mandatory - listing all names and addresses of all members and all card numbers - *mandatory!* I've had to return numerous reports for card numbers. This is an added expense,

in both time and postage, for you and me. NHPA and CL/LG cards are issued, as verification of membership and must be listed on reports.

**Solution:** When your members sign up each year —

1. Ask to see their "full" NHPA card - write down the number.
2. If they do not have an NHPA card, collect their dues/ins. fees and issue them a CL/LG card - write down the number.
3. Allow no one more than 2 or 3 weeks to pay these fees and do not issue them a card, until they have paid.

Doing this up front will make it a lot easier than trying to run everyone down later. Then when you are ready to send in your first member report you will have all the information to do so. This is very important, as these reports should be sent in just as soon as possible after your league/season begins. Keep it in mind, that the insurance on your CL/LG-Only members - is not valid until their names are on record in

this office showing that they have paid for the current year. End of Problem No. 1. If anyone has something specific that you would like covered, please let me know.

### Arlington Iron Benders

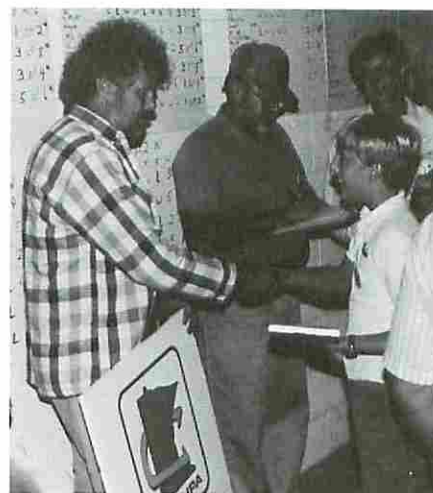
Sanction No. 85-C-77

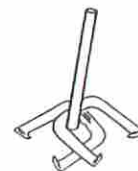

Quig sent a clipping out of the New York Times which said that President George Bush, an avid horseshoe pitcher, received a "Golden Horseshoe" as part of the 3rd Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Day Celebration of the Women's Sports Foundation. It was presented by jockey Julie Krone. The "guilted" horseshoe belonged to Winning Colors, who last year became the third filly to win the Kentucky Derby in 114 years.

## NEW MEXICO

Fred Romero has been elected President of the North Charter. Other officers are Jim Otterback and David Romero, Vice Presidents and Elmer C. Mason, Secretary-Treasurer.

In the South Charter New Mexico State Champion-

ship Gus Martin topped the Class A men with a 4-0, 64.0 record. Class B winner was Robert Hayes, 44.4. Other Class Winners are: C - George Johnson, D - Pete Gallosa, E - Mel Begay, Seniors - Orville Smith, Junior Class A - Billy Harris, B - Jaime Gallosa, Women Class A - Vickie Comstock (59.0), B - Dorothy Payne, C - Sissy Franzoy, D - Millie Arias E - Ernestine Baca, F - Connie Hayes.

Jessie Arias and Vickie Comstock won the Class A Doubles, Frank Haught and Joe Miramontes won Class B and Buz Bumgriner and Sandra Bass won in Class C doubles.

## NORTH CAROLINA

The date for the 21st Annual Carolina Dogwood Festival Open Horseshoe Tournament is Saturday, April 22 at 9 a.m. The event is sponsored by the Statesville Recreation and Parks Department. The event will be held at the Jack H Horseshoe Courts (24 and 6 practice) in Statesville. Dogwood awards are \$1400 in cash and 42 beautiful trophies. The men's and women's top class winners will receive clock plaques.

B.J. Thomas of Troy, the 1986-87-88 North Carolina Men's Champion won first place in the Top Class of the 1988 Statesville Autumn Open Tournament with an 8-1 record and 76.5%. Former three-time World Junior Champion Mark Dyson won in 1985.

The top women's class was won by Virginia Cholberg of Fredericksburg, Virginia. Lenwood Conner, Jr. of South Hill, Virginia won the Junior Boy's Championship. Other winners were Lenwood Conner, Sr. in Class A; Men's Class B: James Sumlin, Nebo; Ricky Bolick, Lenoir, Class C; Gary Cholberg, Class D; Harry Mills, Lashmeet, W.V. Class E; Buck Mann, Fairlea, W.V., Class F.

## OHIO

The first issue of the *Ohio Horseshoe* Newsletter was published in 1983. Back then, Francis Asher gathered the news and Donnie Roberts did the typing. Their Volume 6, Issue Number 1 in December 1988 lists some records of note for this hotbed of horseshoe pitching.

Paul Focht of Dayton pitched 45 years in the Ohio State Tournament. Jim Knisley, the current World Champion, has pitched in 24, and he still is a youngster. The All-Time victory list for juniors is topped by Dennis Riffle of Dayton with 27. Jerry Anthony of Arcanum and Gary Roberts of Pike County each have won 26.

Harold Reno of Sabina has the Class A Percentage record established in 1968 — a whopping 88.6. Gary Roberts tops Class C with a 73.8 in 1974.

The State Tournament in Ohio has been held in Greenville since 1957. They had 235 entries in 1987. The record was 252 in 1983 and 1986.

## OREGON

President Lowell Davis of the Eugene, Oregon Horseshoe Club, has attained another goal. He advanced to the top 32 at the World Tournament at Pleasanton and won 13 games. This was his fourth

world event. He started pitching in 1957 in Corvallis and wife Ethel started in 1976. Lowell has won three State Championships. He worked as a Timber Faller from 1946-1982, is a four-year Navy veteran. Both are retired. Ethel is the editor of the *Ringer Review* newsletter.

The Emerald Horseshoe Pitchers Association also has a newsletter called the *Iron Swinger*. Lowell is the President.

## TEXAS

Memorial Services were held for Vic Holmberg, a respected member of the Arlington Iron Benders. Following a light stroke he was taken to the hospital on December 28, improved for a short while and when his lungs filled with fluid, he became weaker and died January 9.

Alton "Gator" Davidson is the President of the Central Texas Horseshoe Association. Other officers are Vice President Johnny Outlaw, Secretary Nelda Davidson and Treasurer Ronnie Gaskamp.

24 tournaments have been scheduled for Texas this summer beginning in March and ending in November.

Mike Stephens is the 1989 president of the Iron Benders. 1st Vice President is Al Heim, Arch Ferguson is the second Vice President, Ron and Jane Thomas co-op as Treasurer and Marvin Two Crow is the Secretary.

## WASHINGTON

Art Sperber, Promotion Director for the State has announced the "Exceptional Game Award", which might be adopted by other states.

To Win: Anyone who has a game 20% above his or her incoming percentage will qualify for the cash award. The complete fund, up to \$20 maximum per winner, will be paid out evenly between all qualifiers at each tournament. If no one wins, the fund will be carried forward.

FUNDING: The State will start it with \$10 and if you win your class or second or third, you will contribute \$1 from your winnings. Art asks that other winners help them and contribute \$1 from their winners cash, too.

## WISCONSIN

Debby Bestul, four-time Junior Girls World Champion from Eau Claire has been voted the 1988 Eau Claire Leader-Telegram's Female Athlete of the year. Debby was the Wisconsin Junior Champion seven times since 1982. She polled 49 of a possible 50 points.

Mark Stevens of Marengo, Wisconsin is the reigning state champion and has been for the last three years. He started pitching in the early 70's at 16 years of age. After flipping for two years he changed to a  $\frac{3}{4}$  turn. Thirty four years old, single and a security supervisor at the Louisiana Pacific Mill, Mark has always lived on the family farm in Marengo.

# Earthquakes

I like to write about things I know little about. But as far as earthquakes go...*I am an expert*. I was in Indiana in the summer of '86 when Glen Hoppes invited me to play in his club's weekly event. Curley and Bonnie Seibold were there. Just as I started to throw a shoe, there was a slight tremor...and the stake actually moved...*maybe a whole inch!* (Some people will do anything to win a horseshoe game!) So, after going through that terrible, frightening, harrowing, scary, chilling experience, I can now brag that *I am an expert*. I was there!

Earthquakes...and their tremors...which are felt for great distances have always intrigued me. So before going to California where it is *whispered* that the earth's crust has been known to move *slightly*, I thought I'd better do a little reading. I wanted to know which way to run.

I *thought* California had only one major 'fault'...the San Andreas...which leveled San Francisco in 1906. (A fault is defined as rock formations at great depths breaking apart...and the parts slipping against each other.) However, I learned there *is* another...the recently discovered Davis fault...lying below Hollywood and the City of Los Angeles. This is considered the dangerous one...because if *it* moves, *say goodbye*. Experts predict it will be deadlier than the one rated the worst of all time...the one at Lisbon, Portugal in 1755. In six minutes 60,000 people perished and Lisbon was no more.

Before the W.T., California rated earthquakes on the Richter scale of 1-10...with 10 being the most severe. It is now rumored that California may change to the NHPA scale of 0-40...with the most damaging being a 40...because there is absolutely no recovery from that. This thinking is caused by the discovery of 3 new quakes which did considerable damage throughout the U.S. and Canada. They were appropriately named the Diane Lopez quake, the Alan Francis quake, and the Steve Kuchinski quake.

The Lopez quake was felt in such far away places as Negaard, Mn.; Michaud, Ma.; and Cantin, Quebec. The Alan Francis shock wave leveled Knisley, Ohio...devastated Williams, California...and shook Seibold, Indiana. As if this quake wasn't disastrous enough, it was followed by the Steve Kuchinski quake which also hit and wreaked havoc with Williams, California and Seibold, Indiana...and Lipovsky, Minnesota.

Only Knisley, Ohio was able to survive. However, it is reliably reported that Williams, California; Seibold, Indiana; and Lipovsky, Minnesota are already rebuilding and will be as good as new by July, '89.

Being an earthquake expert has certain advantages. I learned to stay out of their way. I *didn't* sign up for the Men's Open.



# Paul Carriere

**P**aul Carriere of Ontario, Canada, has had a busy life dedicated to the betterment of our game. His progressive leadership in many ways, parallels that of our own Don Titcomb. The *Horseshoe Pitcher's News Digest* of January, 1983, carried a story of comparison between these two fine pitchers.

Paul called himself the *Arctic Island Champ* when, in 1950 he lead a military construction crew to Cambridge Bay on Victoria Island in the Arctic.

Here he introduced horseshoe pitching to Eskimos...he had his men make boxes and weld iron pegs to center plates, then two old Eskimos stretched raw hides over the boxes to pitch on. On these he taught Eskimos (and his own Canadian military men) to pitch horseshoes. Eskimos learned quickly, he noticed.

Upon return from Victoria Island, he found, by accident, a horseshoe club in the east end of Toronto. He joined the club and in 1979 won its B

Class Championship and Pitcher of the Year award. In 1980, he won Class C Championship in Canada's National Games; in 1981 he took C Championship in the U.S.A. Open in Clearwater where he pitched two 72% games (tops for him). In 1984, Paul won Ontario's Tournament of Champions — Elmer Hohl wasn't there. Following this, he won Canada's Senior Men's National Championship, and three times after that, the Provincial Championship.

Paul works hard to strengthen Canada's horseshoe pitching associations. Three years ago he had a clinic and ran a seminar at the University of Saskatchewan at Regina. Without hesitation, he praises efforts of Jack Adams for promoting this sport in Saskatchewan.

Last spring, Paul conducted two organizational seminars and three clinics plus handling two districts of National Senior game participation programs.

As if his active participation in teaching programs wasn't enough to keep him busy, Paul, now retired, has just completed a *Horseshoe Pitchers Manual* after eight years research and three years rewrite. Each book is aimed at general public reading; a 'Come On, Let's Pitch Horseshoes' offer. Old timers will find it interesting as well, he says.

Paul sent out 160 news releases about their Canadian National, Provincial and World Tournaments, but it appeared none were accepted and published. Press officers all the way from Vancouver to Toronto said "No Union reporter...no Union photographer...NO NEWS."

"There is a hint that high funding of horseshoe tournaments could get an editor's attention as is the case in some other well-publicized sports," Paul concludes.

Paul's promotional work may not appear to be as successful as desired, but he feels "the legacy will continue, and nothing that is good and right is in vain".

## What Is The NHPA Complimentary Card Program? Dave Loucks

The NHPA allows each club in each Charter to have one complimentary card each year. This card, if you desire it, is obtained from your state secretary. It is just one of the regular NHPA membership cards for the specific year. With this card, you can allow up to 14 pitchers who are non-members to pitch in your sanctioned tournaments during the year. Their name is placed on one of the lines on the back of the card. 14 is the maximum you can allow for the year with only one tournament allowed per person. You can allow one or two or any number per tournament up to the maximum of 14 for the year. A non-member is allowed this complimentary participation only once.

They can never repeat.

There is no cost for this card but it must be returned to the NHPA at the end of the year and accounted for by your state secretary. The purpose of this program is to help you get new people interested in sanctioned tournaments. If they like them, they might then become NHPA/State members. This courtesy card cannot be used at State, Regional, National or World Tournaments. Participants should be awarded any trophy or cash prize due for their finish position. It is recommended that NHPA patches not be awarded to non-NHPA members. Complimentary participants are covered under the NHPA Liability Insurance Program.

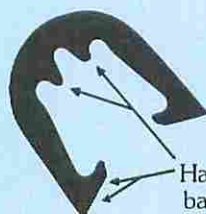
