



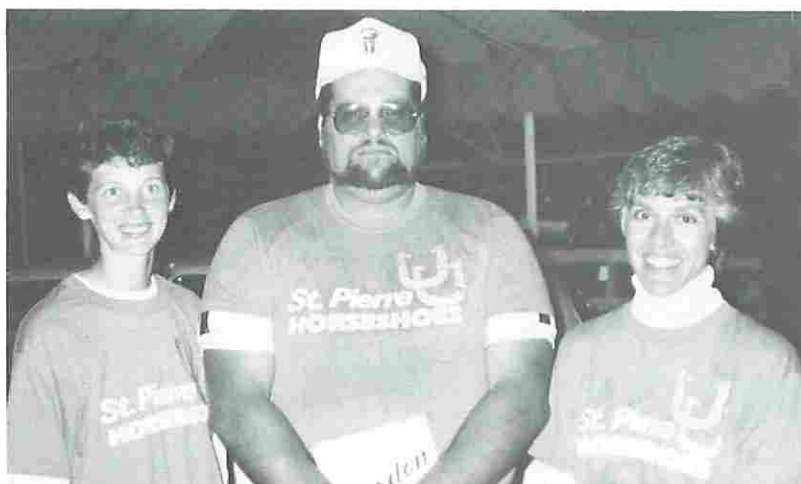

# President's Message

---

For many, the pitching season is winding down with the coming of cold weather or, it may have even ended with the conclusion of your State Championship. Unless you are one who resides in or travels to a warm southern state, the winter without horseshoes may seem very long. If you can't get to the Las Vegas event, or the Valley of the Sun in Mesa or to some indoor pitching facilities, the old horseshoes may already be gathering rust while you take a "wait until next year" attitude.

Well, just because you have stopped pitching doesn't mean that you have to leave the game. *Newsline* can keep you informed and up to date on horseshoe activities around the country all year long. Don't let your subscription lapse and wait until that first Spring event to be reminded. History seems to indicate that when we put the shoes out of sight, many put the game out of mind. For the betterment of our sport and the growth of our association, we can't let that happen. We must stay informed and *Newsline* offers all horseshoe pitchers that opportunity.

When the first issue of *Newsline* was mailed in January of this year, we had just 2362 subscribers. The October issue was mailed to 2737 subscribers, an increase of 375, or nearly 16%. In raw numbers, this

doesn't seem like a great increase in readership but when another fact is considered, I have to be somewhat pleased but at the same time, concerned.

My concern is over the computer report which shows that in the last nine months, more than 500 names have been dropped from the subscription list. Many have been dropped because of duplication or address errors on the old Digest list but the bulk, for some reason, have just failed to renew. I realize that the new bulk mail format does not allow us to include a personal renewal slip when a subscription is about to expire. We are asking each reader to check their mailing label and remind themselves to renew. Not paying close attention to this detail has probably caused a big percentage of the lapsed subscriptions as most people are very busy with many activities during the summer months. The NHPA could generate a special list each month to remind readers that their magazine issue is about to expire but we are just not staffed to do this. Besides I don't want to believe that it takes that much effort to get people to act on such a simple matter. All one has to do is check the expiration date on their *Newsline* label and send in the renewal in advance. In an effort to assist, *Newsline* will continue to publish reminders.

## Dave's Court Report

This November issue is primarily devoted to the publication of State Championship Tournament Results. As we went to press, some 20 Charters had still not reported their State Championship despite many printed requests to report all tournaments within 30 days of play. This issue may not include all those State results that were in hand as I am trying to maintain some sense of balance—news articles to results—in each regular issue of *Newsline*. For those not printed herein, most, if received, will be in the December issue.

Tournament Results are a catch-22 proposition. Some readers tell me they hate to see them in *Newsline* while others say that results are their prime interest. Personally, I think the World, State and special event tournaments warrant space but that the run of the mill tournament is just so much old unnecessary news. It is virtually impossible to stay current with results. With the World Tournament taking 72 pages last month and State Championships taking the bulk of the November and December issues, regular tournament reportings

are way behind. I will publish a special "results only" issue of *Newsline* within a few weeks and it will get us close to being caught up but, caught up only to the point of when we went to typeset with it, nearly 60 days before it gets into the mail to you. And, I know that when the "results only" issue reaches you, a big portion will be set aside without reading as they are nothing more than old tournament results, yesterday's news.

I have toyed with the idea of having two publications. The regular *Newsline* issue of articles, comments, special features and events and, a second "results only" publication that could be printed quarterly. This however would require two separate mailing lists and basically double the workload of financial bookkeeping, computer input and output and routine handling associated with putting out each issue. There appears to be no easy solution to the dilemma but reaction to the forthcoming "Results Only" issue may give us an indication of the direction to follow. As always, your comments are welcome.

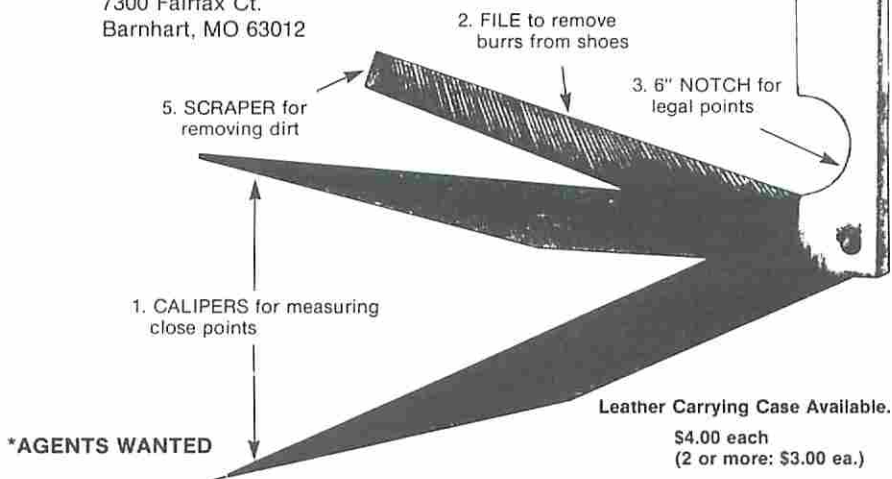

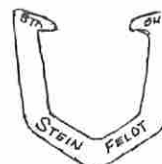

# Regional Director's Report

**Len Lipovsky**, Regional Director for **Minnesota** reports that the Minneapolis Horseshoe Club has been experimenting with Doc Berman's suggestion of a few years ago, that was where close shoes, within 6 inches, are of equal value and cancel other close shoes. It has eliminated a lot of digging for shoes and a lot of caliper type measurements. It has saved lots of time and effort.

In Minnesota they have gone with 5 person teams pitching 40 shoes rather than 4 person teams pitching 50 shoe games.

Both of these ideas seemed to meet with the approval of most pitchers, especially the shoe cancellation. They had a total of sixteen Sanctioned Tournaments this year as compared with the normal two or three. They are looking forward to

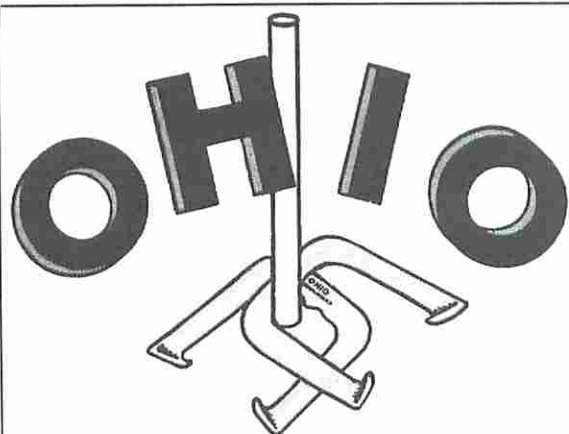
more in 1990. They have crowned their State Champions, and again this year they are Dale Lipovsky and Phyllis Negaard.

**Phil Zozzaro**, Regional Director for **New Jersey**, reports that in 1989, the State of New Jersey has held thirty successful and well-attended tournaments in places such as Clifton, Flemington, Middlesex, Newark, Vineland and Washington. The tournaments were all run by New Jersey clubs and the State association. Their state championship was held at the State Fair in Farmington. Class A had sixteen players, all other classes had eight players. Undefeated Louis Durando became this year's new Men's State Champion. For the third year, the New Jersey Association directed the horseshoe pitching tournament for

the 1989 Senior Garden State Games. This year they were held at Brookdale College in Lincroft, New Jersey. It was very successful and well attended. The West Essex Handicap H.P.C. voted unanimously to become an NHPA sanctioned club in order to take advantage of the insurance coverage and awards program. It seems that more people in New Jersey are becoming interested in horseshoes and the NHPA because of the affinity that President George Bush has for it.

# CASEY JONES

*One of the greatest pitchers ever...never won a world tournament.*

**W**henver we hear or see the name 'Casey', most of us think of 'Casey at the Bat'...which first appeared over 100 years ago in the San Francisco Examiner. This classic has been republished yearly. Critics are not able to account for its persistent life and have spent over a century pondering it. We all know the story. With two out and a man on second and third, Casey, mighty Casey, was at bat. The last stanza tells it all...

*Oh, somewhere in this favored land the sun is shining bright,  
The band is playing somewhere, and somewhere hearts are light,  
And somewhere men are laughing, and somewhere children shout,  
But there is no joy in Mudville—Mighty Casey has struck out.*

Wisconsin's Casey Jones "struck out" several times in his quest for the World's Horseshoe Championship...but, he will go down in our history as the greatest pitcher who ever lived *who never won a world tournament*. He quit pitching when he was in his prime...only 36 years old. Why? Let's start at the beginning.

As early as 1930, the people of Waukesha knew they had a "comer." Young 12-year-old Casey Jones, pitching from 37' was ringing the stake with amazing accuracy. He was just a tousled hair kid, all 80 pounds of him, soaking wet. He was so small he was described as "pint size"...and had to wriggle all over and throw a high shoe in order to reach the stake. He took an extraor-

dinary high back swing and a long step. As he grew older, he never broke the habit. It was often said of him..."Casey is the most consistent ringer man in the world in *quiet air*...but the higher the wind, the lower his percentage."

Many of the old timers laughed when they watched him, but it wasn't long before they were saying, "That Jones kid really has it!" Because of his age, Casey was not allowed to pitch in the Wisconsin's Men's State Championships...even though at age 14 he was throwing from 40'.

Casey developed rapidly. At age 16, he entered the Midwest Tournament at Des Moines and as old timers will tell you, *the competition there was as good as the World at that time*. Casey, the kid, won 31 straight games in qualifying and defeated C.C. Davis and Guy Zimmerman along the way while taking 3rd place...no easy feat.

1935 was a year to remember for young Casey. *First*, the Wisconsin HPA voted to let him compete in the State Championship. He won...and repeated this for a total of 19 times. In 1948, he threw a record 93.0% ringers...a mark which still stands. *Second*, he competed in his first World Tournament, placing 5th. *Third*, Ted Allen came to town! Ted Allen! Age 27, winner of the '33, '34 and '35 World Championships! Ted Allen, the unbeatable...and Casey was chosen to pitch against him. The old timers said, "Hey, the kid is good...but he won't be able to stand

the pressure Ted will put on him. Ted has ice water in his veins...no way will Casey beat him."

The Waukesha Journal reported the match held before 5000 spectators..."Ted Allen, World Champion horseshoe pitcher, caught a tatter Sunday at the Auer Avenue playground in young Casey Jones who hung on 80% ringers to win the first match 50-42. The champion, however, put on the pressure to take the next two, 50-37 and 50-43." (The old timers were right...but not by much...as the scores show.)

From 1936-39, there were no World Tournaments. As Gary Kline relates in *The Official NHPA History of the World Tournament 1908-1980*... "The Midwest National Tournament was held during those years and featured all the great stars of the game." Casey competed in '39 placing 3rd with an 81.0% average. In 1940, the World Tournaments started again and Casey was there with an 80.5 and a 4th place finish; in '41, he placed 3rd with 79.8.

At the outbreak of WWII Casey, now 24, immediately enlisted and saw action in the South Pacific as a Navy Aviation Ordinance Specialist...serving until discharged in 1945. In 1946, he returned to W.T. horseshoe pitching...the first time a W.T. had been held since '41.

From 1946 through 1948, Casey Jones pitched about as good as any human can pitch...yet he failed to win a World Championship...losing by one game each year...even in 1948, the year he set the world record of 87.5% for an entire world tournament. It was no wonder the top players referred to him as 'Hard Luck Casey'. Let's take a look at those 3 heartbreaking years.

1946. Ted Allen and Casey were tied in games won and lost, 21-1... with one game to go...*the game which would determine the World Championship*. In one of the great games of all time, a game that went 158 shoes, Ted, the ice man, had 139 ringers for 87.9%; Casey...137 for 86.7%...with Allen winning 50-44. *Records show that Casey had 911 ringers out of his last 1000 shoes!*

1947. Casey again finished second with a 33-2 record and an 83.0%. In the next to last game, he had to fight it out with the incomparable Ted...to determine 2nd place. This time he won with a 90.1% for 142 shoes. As he later remarked, "Ted's always tough...even when one is lucky enough to beat him." In this '47 event, Casey had 7 games over 90% and 8 over 85%.

1948. Heartbreak alley! Casey set a world record of 87.5%...but lost the tournament to Fernando Isais by one point. This is the way Casey remembers it..."We were 49-49 and threw 6 four deads. Fernando had a ringer and a shoe touching the peg. My first shoe was perfect. My second... 1/32nd of an inch short...which meant the championship. Both of us had over 87% ringers for 136 shoes."

I wanted to know more about Casey Jones...a man who (like Curt Day) has never been given enough recognition in our horseshoe world. I asked him several questions.

*Casey, your W.T. career spanned a time period of 1940 thru 1954. In '54, you were only 36 years old. You had a wonderful record. Why did you decide to give up pitching in the World Tournaments?*

I had to make a living. I gave up horseshoes for bowling because I was in the bowling business and could not do both. I had to put in exceedingly long hours. I just didn't have the time to pitch.

*You were, without doubt, the greatest horseshoe player who never won a world tournament. How do you feel about this? Is there any one or possibly more than one tournament which you feel you could have won?*

Well, I could have won all 3 years...'46, '47 and '48...but I didn't. Ted Allen and Fernando Isais were two of the greatest. They beat me when the chips were down...even tho' I shot 86.7% against Allen in '46 and over 87% against Fernando in '48. Yes, I'd liked to have won a world championship. Who wouldn't?

*Of all the pitchers in your era, who would you rate the toughest to beat? Why?*

Fernando Isais was the toughest...always 85% or better against me. It seemed that he could always win the big one when he had to and that's

what makes a champion.

*What brand of horseshoes did you use? Could you get shoes in dead soft at that time?*

I threw Ohio shoes and I always used dead soft.

*In recent years, only one or two of our top players broke the 80% barrier. In your 11 years of W.T. play, it averaged over 3.36 players who did. Can you think of any reason why the "Old Timers", as a whole, were better?*

I played against Isais, Allen and Zimmerman for about 10 years. They were all above 80%. The tougher the competition is, the better one has to pitch. Perhaps that is the answer.

*Casey, in addition to being a great horseshoe pitcher, you were also a great bowler. You may have more, but at one time you had thirteen 300 games and several 800 series. Do you still bowl? If so, at age 70, what average to you carry?*

I haven't bowled since '82 when I hurt my knee and had to quit.

*What was your best season's average? Do you still own and operate Casey Jones Lanes and Pro Shop?*

My best average was 233 for 81 games. I also averaged 231 for 51 games while bowling on Green Bay Television in a "King of the Hill" show. Mary and I sold our bowling lanes to our daughter and her husband and we retired in '81.

*Do you remember any special thing which happened in your career that you might tell us...humorous or otherwise?*

On the humorous side, in the 1949 W.T., Ted and I tied for 2nd place. Ted wanted to play another game for the \$50 difference in prize money. We were 47-47 when just as Ted threw a shoe, someone yelled 'miss' real loud. Everyone laughed...because the playoff was kind of a fun thing and some of the people were rooting for Ted and some for me. Ted missed the stake completely. He asked me to let him throw the shoe over. I did and he threw a ringer. However, I won the game a few pitches later. This may be the only time a player threw a shoe over at a W.T. after the tournament was over. On the tragic side, Mary and I lost our 19-year-old son, Chuck, in an auto accident. It was very hard for

both of us.

*Is there anything else our readers might find interesting in the life of Casey Jones? Do you still play horseshoes?*

Once in a while...just for exercise. I play a lot of golf and have been playing close to par. We live in Apache Junction, Arizona six months of the year and the other six months in Wisconsin.

*Casey, in eleven W.T.'s, you finished 2nd four times, 3rd four times, 4th, 6th, and 10th against some of the best pitchers the world has ever known. You had an overall ringer percentage of 80.4 and a winning percentage of 82.96, placing you 5th in both categories on the all-time list. That's a record of which you can really be proud. But you called it quits at age 36! Carl Steinfeldt, the oldest to win a W.T., was 58 years 10 months old when he won; Elmer Hohl won 6 championships between age 46 and 58; Curt Day won 3 between age 49 and 57. I can only speculate on "what might have been" if you'd pitched another 20-25 years. Almost certainly you'd have won at least once in that period. You may have "struck out" in your quest for a world championship...but each time you went down swinging. You had regrets...but no excuses...the mark of a true champion. There are not many who can claim a place among our greatest. You can!*

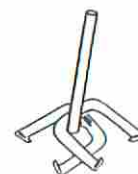

Walker Shaneyfelt from Owens Cross Roads near Huntsville, pitched 70.8 average in the Alabama State Tournament in 1989 to win Class A and establish a new tournament high percentage. The Class B winner was Bill Calhoun. Other Class winners were Ottie Reno (C); Mike Watkins (D); Debbie Tidwell for the Women and Shannon Segler in the Junior Class. Shaneyfelt had high games of 84.4 and 81.2.

Johnnie Millican, winner at World in 70 and over (30) in 1986, and Bob Stowe were inducted into the Alabama Hall of Fame for 1989. Other members in the "Hall" are Ottie Reno and William Nelson in 1977 and Ose Veese and Charles Gant in 1989. Stowe from Mobile won State in 1978, 1979 and 1980.

1990 Officers are Jack Henderson, president; Carl Baker, Debbie Tidwell and John Nichols, vice presidents; Jim Harria, secretary-treasurer. Membership in the state increased from 40 to 48.

Regional Director Bill Calhoun will be the coordinator for the 1990 Senior Olympics to be held in 1990 in Montgomery, April 28th for anyone 55 and older.

## CALIFORNIA

Since February R.J. Thomas of Sacramento has participated in 56 tournaments this year...and it may be some type of record. R.J. is in the low 20's class and has changed from a flip to a 1 1/4 turn. He says the turn is more challenging.

Walter Ray Williams, Jr. and Diane Lopez took top honors again in the State. 299 participated, 94 from Southern, 13 from Eastern and 192 from Northern groups. Rotated each year by sections, 1990 event will be hosted by the ESCHPA at Bishop, California.

The San Jose Club's promotion with the Santa Clara County Fair resulted in 14 new NHPA members. Club secretary Sy Sauer was on hand each of the 14 days of the promotion.

## COLORADO

Inducted into the Colorado Hall of Fame for service this year were CHPA President Keith Thompson and his wife, Janie, for three years treasurer of CHPA. Keith is a member of the NHPA Rules Committee and has been a force as president for several years. Robert Engel of Nunn was selected for pitching excellence.

A 48 percent pitcher, Janie rose to the heights to pitch a 68.4 average to upset defending Champion Virginia Sandoval for the 1989 Women's State title. Paul LaCrosse, 8-time State Champion regained his title defeating Rich Pintor in a playoff. LaCrosse closed the game with 28 straight ringers.

## GEORGIA

New officers effective October 1989 are Clayton (Bud) Kurtz, president; Claude Fender, vice president and Samya Giannetta, secretary-treasurer.

Sixteen newly constructed courts at Stone Mountain were the site of the 1989 State Singles Championships. Larry Morton of Columbus is the men's champion while Carl Steinfeldt's daughter, Betty, defeated 1988 winner, Iris Sandham for the women's title.

The 16 courts will be the practice courts for the 1990 World Tournament. They are clay with concrete approaches, set in the pine trees adjacent to the park coliseum.

## ILLINOIS

Pat Prestidge from Elgin, reported that he purchased a pair of Deadeye shoes during the State Tournament at Cahokia that were supposed to weigh 2 pounds, 10 ounces. They actually weighed 2-8. He recently purchased two more pairs that were marked 2-10 on the boxes. He found they weighed 2-6.

Pat revealed that it seems the discrepancy is more than it should be. It seems that distributors and manufacturers should be armed with accurate scales as an aid to NHPA pitchers.

## MAINE

Albert Lord, from Kittery, has won 10 State titles with his highest ringer percentage 79.7 in 1974. Merrill Barnes and Charles Gerrish each have won seven. Gerrish won his first title in 1931 and his last 29 years later. Gerrish also is from Kittery.

The present Champion is Brian Simmons of Kittery, who has won three straight, plus a title in 1983. Doug Kienia from North Berwick won in 1979, 1984 and 1985 plus four straight in the Junior Boys division thru 1973. He won the World Title in 1974.

## MICHIGAN

Over \$6200 was raised by the MSHPA for the State Tournament with a record \$5407 returned in prize money. Membership in the state went from 200 in 1988 to 215 this year.

Michigan crowned their first 30 foot Men's State Champion, Ed Schultz. Dorothy Falk finally ended her quest for the Women's title.

Oz Williams took the Class A crown on a playoff win over his son, Tom. Both closed regulation play with 11-2 records, with Tom getting the high tournament game of 80.0%.



There were 112 men at 40 feet, 8 ladies, 8 men at 30 feet and 7 juniors. There were participants from 56 different cities, 83 returned from 1988, plus 52 new participants.

Tom Bracey from Jackson and Gerald (Dyke) Cowell were inducted in the WSHPA Hall of Fame.

#### MINNESOTA

Promoters Bob and Jean Lindbergh from Findley and pitcher Ray Tilli from Duluth were inducted into the Minnesota Hall of Fame last year. Other familiar names in the "Hall" are the late Frank Stinson, the first NHPA Junior Champion 1969; Art Holter in 1974; Will Gullickson 1979; Dale Lipovsky 1981; Lionard Lipovsky 1985; and Phyllis Negaard in 1986. Stinson, Holter and Negaard are in the NHPA Hall of Fame.

#### NEW YORK

Marie Zichella won the Joe Zichella Open Tournament September 9 at the New Rochelle Courts. In the tournament named after Marie's father, she won going undefeated and averaging 53.4 from 40 feet. She is one of the few women tossing from the men's distance. Her father is in the New York Hall of Fame.

#### NORTH DAKOTA

Fargo was selected as the site for the 1989 State Tournament...and it was a wise choice. It rained two inches the day of the tournament, but the Fargo courts had a \$75,000 roof over the courts.

TRIVIA: 12,402 ringers pitched in the State tournament—which adds up to 45.8 tons of iron pitched. Walking 50 feet for every two shoes pitched, figures that 173.5 miles were covered.

Jerry Black's four state titles in a row is the first time since the first State tournament in 1922. His 74.6% also is a new record.

#### OHIO

Ohio State Champion Jim Knisley is 133 victories away from the top win figure of 361 held by Paul Focht of Dayton. Harold Reno, Sabina is second with 258, Stan Manker of Lynchburg has 256 and Wilbur Kabel of New Madison is fourth with 249.

Harold Reno shot an 88.6 tournament percentage in 1968. The Ohio State Tournament has been held in Greenville since 1957. The highest number of participants was 208 in 1983. The first State was held in Lakeside in 1929 with 36 entries.

#### OREGON

This year the Oregon City Club placed roofs over eight courts. Class A pitcher Ben Weidrich was relentless in his efforts to get the city commission to approve the money for the project. Ben spearheaded the project and thanks to a lot of willing volunteers. All of the work was done by club members and friends.

The Iron Swinger writes: "The best thing we liked about the World Tournament at Spearfish is that it took some of the best pitchers in Oregon away from the Skinners Butte Open, our local sanctioned tournament. So that gives the rest of us a chance to win once in a while."

#### WISCONSIN

The WHPA inductees to the State's Hall of Fame for 1989 are Forrest Elmer Mitchell, who was the first Wisconsin State Champion in 1923, and Royce

Wrucke, last year's Senior Class champion. Royce has been pitching horseshoes for 70 years, an excellent competitor, having won at least 100 trophies in tournaments in ten states.

Walter Ray Williams, Jr. was in Green Bay recently for the LaMode Bowling Tournament. While there, Williams went to Brownsville for a horseshoe exhibition. The TV segment included an interview after he exhibited his skills with horseshoes.

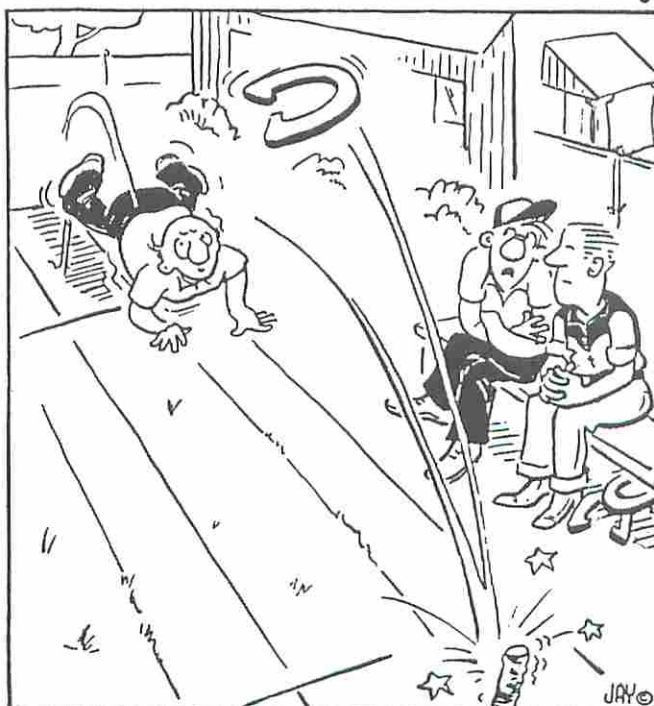

# Sanctioned Club/League News by Bev Born

League season for most of us has now come to another year's end. Hope it was a real good one for everyone, as it was for me. My pitching even improved, just a little, in spite of being so busy. Miracles still do happen.

League Directors have shown great improvements over last year, although some are still dragging their feet. If you belong to a sanctioned club and have not received your awards, perhaps you should ask the person in charge - WHY? I truly hope that there will be no members missing their earned awards this year due to the neglect of someone not doing their reports and that there will be no Sanction cancellations, due to this same fact. Perhaps better membership participation in this area would help. There are, at times, extenuating, sometimes beyond our control, circumstances for the person doing all of the paper work. Maybe you could

offer to lend a hand and not just take this person for granted. Although I must have one person to receive reports from and to send materials to, there should always be more than one, especially in the large clubs, that know how to do these reports. So, please, offer your assistance. I am sure that in most cases it would be appreciated.

We all get behind at times, as I am on this article, with intentions of making it longer and covering the forms and the proper way to complete them, but having been snowed under for the past sixty days, will cut it short and only cover one for now. All forms and explanations on these are in the Red cl/lg guide book, just seems that some do not read or do not understand them and will not correspond with me to clear them up. I am here to help you and learning things right in the first place would be a great advantage and time saver for all of us.

Top Ten form, even though they should all be in for this year.

1. Scratch scores **ONLY** are to be used for all figures. **DO NOT** include handicaps.
2. In count-all formats, **ALL** columns **MUST** be completed.
3. In ringers only or cancellation formats, the total season ringers and the total shoes pitched, plus all columns with the % indicated, **MUST** be completed.
4. In the columns that ask for Total Shoes, Points and Ringers, this means **TOTALS** for the entire season/league, not just for one game. This is also true for the Season Point Avg. and Season Ringer Percent Avg. **TOTAL SEASON**-Not one game.
5. High Game Points and High Game Ringer percent, is for the **SINGLE** highest game pitched in the complete league play.
6. Season Point Avg. and Season Ringer % Avg. is subtracted from High Game points/ingers avg. to get the High Over Averages.
7. Separate men, women, junior boys and girls and give the ages of **ALL** juniors.

To be considered for the mens, womens, boys, girls divisions, each pitcher **MUST** pitch at least thirty shoes per game. For the National Division, games **MUST** be forty or fifty shoe (not points) countall, cancellation or ringers only formats. Nothing under forty shoes per pitcher, per game will be considered, nor nothing over fifty shoes.

Forms not properly and completely filled out will be returned, if time allows, or discarded.

## HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW THE RULES

### What Happens Now?

A contestant pitches a shoe which hits the stake and breaks apart. One or both parts come to rest in foul territory. What is the ruling?

The rule says that when a shoe lands in fair territory and is broken into separate parts, the parts shall be removed and the contestant be allowed to pitch another shoe in its stead. Since the stake is part of fair territory, this rule shall apply. The rule would not apply if the shoe hit in foul territory first and then hit the stake (it would be a foul shoe), or if the shoe hit the stake, ricocheted to foul ground and then broke apart (also a foul shoe).

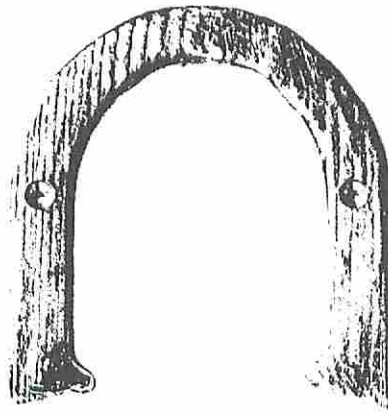

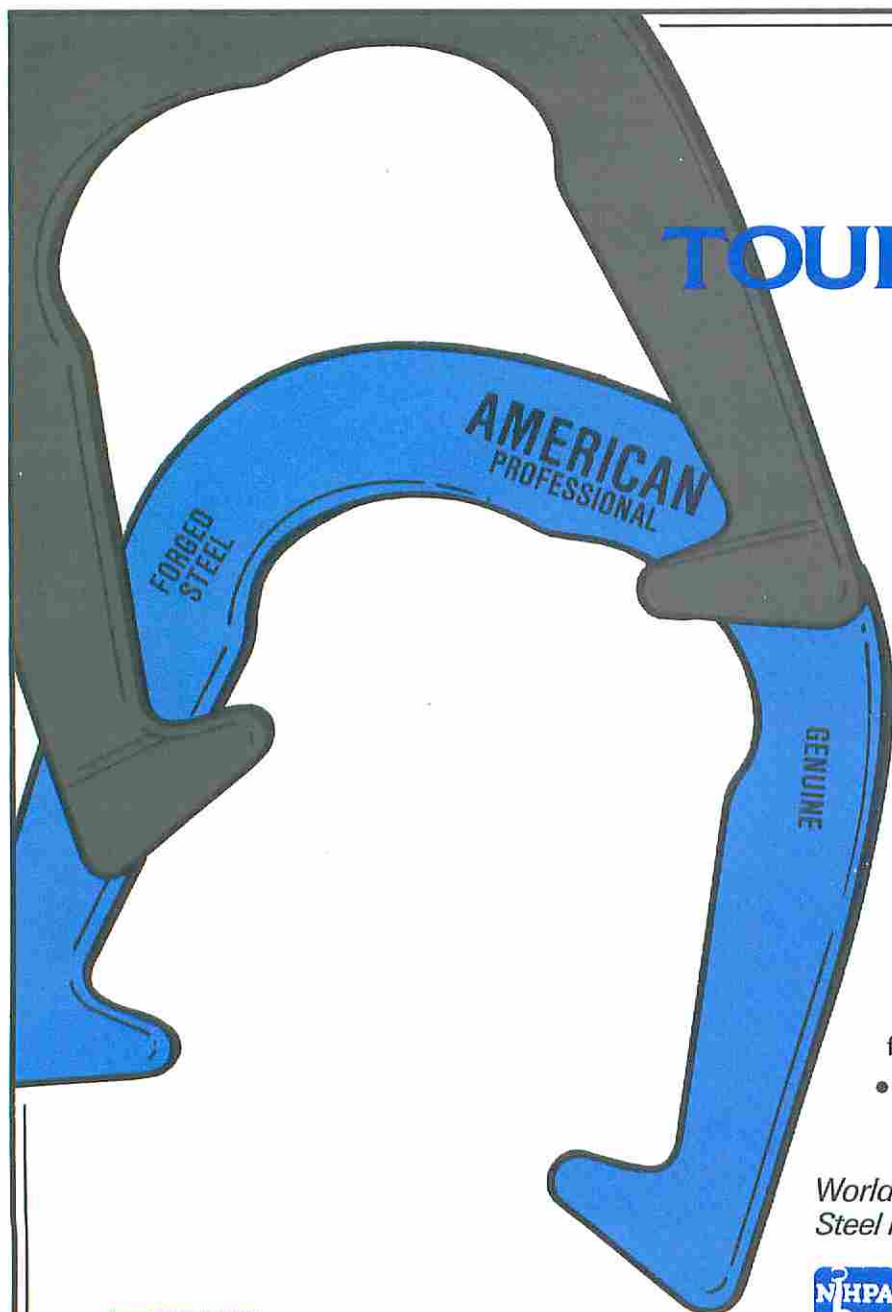
