# President's Message

---

**A**s we start the decade of the nineties, the future for our sport and association looks bright, perhaps brighter than at any other time in recent memory. Several things transpired in the eighties that gave the NHPA a series of gains upon which we have continued to grow and improve.

World Tournament cash and trophy awards increased by over 400% reaching an all time high of over \$80,000 in 1989. This figure is expected to exceed \$100,000 in 1990. Participation in World Tournament play also increased dramatically from an average of around 600 in the early eighties to an average exceeding 1200 for the last 3 years. In fact, two of the last three years now rank as one and two in entry records.

The NHPA formed an organized Game Related Product Sales group. This sales network of distributors under the direction of Ed Domey, who is National Buyer and provides a warehouse facility, has grown into a mini business with annual sales soon to reach \$200,000. The profit from these sales is all NHPA money and in 1988, a portion was used to purchase four computer systems which are now in use by key NHPA personnel.

Our computers have allowed us to improve the handling of data, from membership and *Newsline* subscriber lists, all the way to world tournament record keeping. We have a study underway that one day may bring us the development and process of maintaining all NHPA member averages in one central computer system.

Sanctioned tournaments and Sanctioned Club/League play are growing every year. These programs like many others, have been put under the direction of an NHPA Vice President. This not only gives a specific job responsibility to the VP, but ensures a better and quicker line of communication to the Executive Council on all matters relating to the running of programs within the NHPA. Other programs now under the direction of an NHPA Officer include Constitution & By-Laws, Grievance, Rules, Hall of Fame, Regional Directors and *Newsline* Publication.

Improvements in the way the membership is involved has brought many recent changes and a streamlining of our Constitution & By-Laws. The approval of the "Proxy Vote" at the 1986 convention has increased the scope of interest in NHPA affairs and brought a new level of fairness by allowing all states to voice their full allotment of delegates. The Proxy vote and Liability Insurance may be the two biggest single strides the association has taken in behalf of the membership. This magazine has taken on the challenge to function as a better communication source for the readers, and one day, the entire membership. It is the vehicle by which your voice and opinion can be heard by others. Use it!

Membership in the NHPA nearly doubled in the last decade. With growth being the highest in recent years, there is no reason why we can't double again in the next ten years, or even less. Our association is now finding itself in a position much like that of a successful small business. We are suffering growing pains. Our communication skills have been sharpened, our responsibilities and goals better defined and our future remains bright. However, it is time to take a serious look at how we utilize our talents, how we do our work now and how we will do it in the future.

The amount of time devoted to NHPA work by some of the council is now well beyond what was necessary when the organization was smaller. In particular, your President and Secretary/Treasurer are putting in hours longer than would be expected in most businesses. With elected officers located all across the country, our business and communication is sometimes slow, even with our new computers. Phone and mailing expenses seem to increase monthly as the entire council is asked to give more of their time to the organization. Perhaps in the case of the Vice Presidents, I am to blame for their additional hours because I am the one who assigned them specific job responsibilities. However, I believe a Vice President should be more than just a title. Like the President and Secretary/Treasurer, the membership should be able to see the job function and responsibility of VP's so interested members can measure their qualifications to the job as the offices come up for reelection.

Sometime in this decade, I believe we will reach the time to reconsider the method of how key officers are selected to the organization and how/where they will work. We are already close to needing a central NHPA office in which key officers and personnel will work and members can visit. This is only in step with every other successful sports association. When that time comes, offices like the President and Secretary/Treasurer, which may well have different titles, would be hired positions rather than elected. They would be filled on the basis of hiring the best qualified for the salary offered, far different than electing a basic volunteer as we do today. In a central NHPA office, there would be more efficient use of staff and common office equipment, more professionalism, a better image and more direct lines of communication for the membership.

While the idea of a central office may be several years from being a reality, it is not too soon to give serious consideration to a better and more growth related method of compensation for the current NHPA officers. I may very well present some thoughts on that to the delegates in 1990.

Gary Kline, author of the "History of the World Tournament, 1909-1980" has been reappointed NHPA Historian and is one of the 15 members on the NHPA Hall of Fame Committee. Gary is a walking encyclopedia on horseshoe pitching. It's my hope that he will occasionally contribute some interesting articles for *Newsline*.

1992 World Tournament interest is heating up. Inquiries have been received from Columbus, OH, Kansas City, MO and Dubuque, IA.

Good friend Glen "Red" Henton asked to be relieved from his position as head of the NHPA Grievance Committee. I have appointed 4th VP Bonnie Seibold to chair this Committee of three. Bonnie has selected George Bradfield of Georgia and Don Weaver of Nevada as committee members.

President Bush spent Thanksgiving at his Camp David retreat where the press reported he played several games of horseshoes. He won two matches against his guest Willard Heminway and then did the same against two of his staff. His games were followed by a traditional dinner of roast turkey, stuffing, cranberry sauce, sweet potatoes, green beans, salad and pumpkin & pecan pies.

1989 marked the first showing of NHPA Hall of Fame items, courtesy of the Iowa State Fair, where space for our exhibit was provided free. We have now been advised that the Fair Board would like to continue and even expand the exhibit for 1990. Thanks go to Earl Winston for his efforts in this regard.

NHPA Chaplain, Jerry Holt has accepted a new pastorate moving from Oklahoma to the Atlantic So. Baptist Chapel in Atlantic, Iowa.

Have had several recent exchanges of correspondence with our friends in Canada, in particular, Ed Murray, President of Horseshoe Canada and Rob Richey, President of Nova Scotia Horseshoe Players Association. There are some real fine people and pitchers in Canada as anyone who attends our World and Las Vegas tournaments can attest. Horseshoe Canada had a very successful year with the Canadian Championships being held in Nova Scotia for the first time. Diane Cantin, one of the world's best, won the Women's title for the sixth time with a ringer average of 88.0%. Going undefeated in 17 games, Diane had one game with 18 straight doubles and another, 24 shoe, perfect game. The men's title went to Clayton English who averaged 70.25%.

# Reader Forum

## Dear Editor,

In response to some articles in the October issue, the idea of canceling points in horseshoes, like ringers, seems out of context with horseshoes. The old saying "close only counts in horseshoes" is and should remain the same. Let's not detract from the game, instead let's add to it. If anything changes, let's change ringer pct. to point system as in 40 or 50 shoe Count-All. Ringer pct. can be deceiving according to the number of shoes thrown, where points reflect your true averages. Count all is great for a less ringer pct. pitcher because he receives credit for what he pitched in reality and this encourages him to try again. The art of pitching a shoe (perfectly pitched shoe) per Sol Berman has no more bearing than one who throws a low line, 3/4 reverse. If it hits the stake and stays, it deserves the credit. I have had many perfectly

pitched shoes hit the stake and rebound out of the area for no points. Should I get points for style? Next they will want to take the base hits out of baseball and count only home-runs or take the spares out of bowling and count just strikes. Horseshoes has a certain intangible like other sports, let's not ruin it. The Ohio Governor Horseshoe Tournament has a great scoring system that we should look at for many of our larger tournaments.

Many people compare bowling to horseshoes and even though there are many similarities, one must remember that in bowling you ROLL the ball, not pitch it like a horseshoe. The effort is not needed as much to lay a 14# or 16# ball on the alley for a maximum of 20 balls a game, or 60 in an evening series, compared to pitching a 2#8 shoe approximately 350 to 400 pitches in a tournament. That is why men, women, children have the same place to start in bowling. Also in checking with a Professor of Mathematics at SUNY College, I'm told that 2 people throwing an object (one from 30' and one from 40') both averaging the same percent from their respective distances, with no wind, that NEITHER one has an advantage EXCEPT in a mental state of preparedness. If your concentration is not there, you probably will lose. The averages truly speak for themselves. In closing, Guys, Girls, Children, let's get back together. Close only counts in Horseshoes means not only scoring but the relationship that we have as a group.

## Letter to Editor,

Re: Horseshoes close and within 6" from stake—scoring close one or cancel both.

With present rule, the closest shoe—no measuring is necessary; in the cancellation method, the one questionable of being within 6"; does need measuring—which is additional; so rather than shorten the game (as I have been reading in the *Newsline*) it would lengthen it.

In the article, *Casey Jones*, Nov. '89 *Newsline*, at the 1948 World Tournament Jones and Fernando Isais were tied at 49 to 49—the game would have gone on, had it not been for the closest shoe scoring, deciding the outcome. With their good ringer percent and the point cancellation method, that game would have been lengthened. Even in lower class pitching, games would be lengthened, as the points would keep canceling, rather than scoring closest one.

In considering changing rules in our game, remember, just because the idea is "new", does not mean it is better. First there should be analyzing from different points of view—no decisions made until all are considered. If changes are needed, they should be through NHPA, so rules will be uniform.

I do not advocate games be either shortened nor lengthened, but that rules should be, so as to allow pitchers' competitive talent, to go to its potential.

With the point rule change, the quotation "close only counts in horseshoes" would no longer be true!

It seems essential to keep the game exciting, as now. With such rule change, the "air of excitement" of scoring only closest shoe, would be lost—one should be careful to leave the suspense of game intact.

I've heard of young boys getting excited and entertained over seeing that occasional spark from shoe hitting stake—we know that will remain!

## Dear Editor,

December's issue contained an interesting article by Glen Portt. The suggestion to make the foul line at the starting point rather than the current ending point, makes a lot of sense. This change would create two favorable results; 1) Accidental fouling by pitchers would certainly be avoided, 2) Officiation and enforcement of the rule would be consistent



and less controversial.

To refer to our current rule as stupid, may not be fair. Those that established our fine sport, deserve much credit. Trial and error will prevail, and only through time and experience can certain things improve. This may be a proper time to reconsider the foul line rule.

The author could have done us a favor by providing a specific proposed rule to consider. Possibly the following would be a rule for the Rules Committee to review. "The foul line shall exist at the 40 foot line (stake) for 40' pitchers, and at the 30 foot line for 30' pitchers. At least one foot must remain behind the foul line until the shoe leaves the pitchers' hand."

Now, let's move the foul line even with the stake as Mr. Portt suggests. Players stand behind the foul line, step as far over as they please. "Aha!" The pitcher has one or both feet slightly over the foul line before stepping. Is this not a foul? Or why else would we call it a foul line.

The fact they have been trying to change the foul line, as Mr. Portt says, for 50 years, only proves to me they can't find enough support to do so.

The winner is decided by total points at the end of the tournament. Ties are decided by sudden death in ten shoes. This gives the poor player a better chance. Whoever started the cancellation didn't know horseshoes. I think if they go to count-all way of

The new magazine format is great. I like your idea of having a special results edition or section. I think a lot of pitchers like to see their name in a national magazine...even if we're not a top winner!

Concerning the controversy on 40/30 pitching distances, it seems to me that the principle of "pitcher option" has a place in our game. We allow some degree of choice in the weight of the shoes we pitch, why not some flexibility in the distance we throw? I think having a min/max range of 30' and 41.5' would be good. Each pitcher, regardless of age or sex, could then range within this set distance as a matter of personal choice. It would be interesting to observe whether or not pitchers migrated toward the 30' minimum and if pitchers in general improved their overall ringer percentages. My personal feeling is that we would see little overall improvement and

pitching you would have more players than you could handle. I do think this is the way to get more players.

May I give you my opinion of the 30/40' pitchers as this seems to be the biggest problem involved with horseshoes? Personally, I don't believe to mix is the same game. But, I like to pitch so much that I will not let it stop me from playing. What I would like to see done is to go to "Handicap Horseshoes." I think it might help the problem but there is nothing that will be a 100% way to solve the issue.

In Handicap horseshoes, as I envision it, anyone at any age or sex may pitch from a distance between 30 and 40 feet. This becomes a separate game from regular horseshoe which is pitched at 40' only. People declare which game they want and when you buy your card, it specifies which game you play. This way, everybody has a choice and can make their own decision. You could even have this play in State and World competition. One champion in each. Perhaps few will agree with this but I think it would put the burden on each individual.

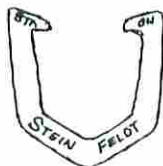

## Granville H. Palmer

Horseshoe pitcher, freshwater pearl expert and a member of the Indiana Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame, Granville H. "Granny" Palmer of Vincennes, died on December 4, 1989. Born July 7, 1911, he was age 78.

Palmer won many pitching competitions during his life, accumulating 653 trophies during his career. His many years of financial support and personal endeavor to help youth and adults get started in the great sport of horseshoe pitching can never be forgotten.

He was also an authority, dealer and appraiser of Wabash River pearls. As such, he was featured in National Geographic Magazine and in the documentary film, "The Pearl Fisher," which was released in 1986.

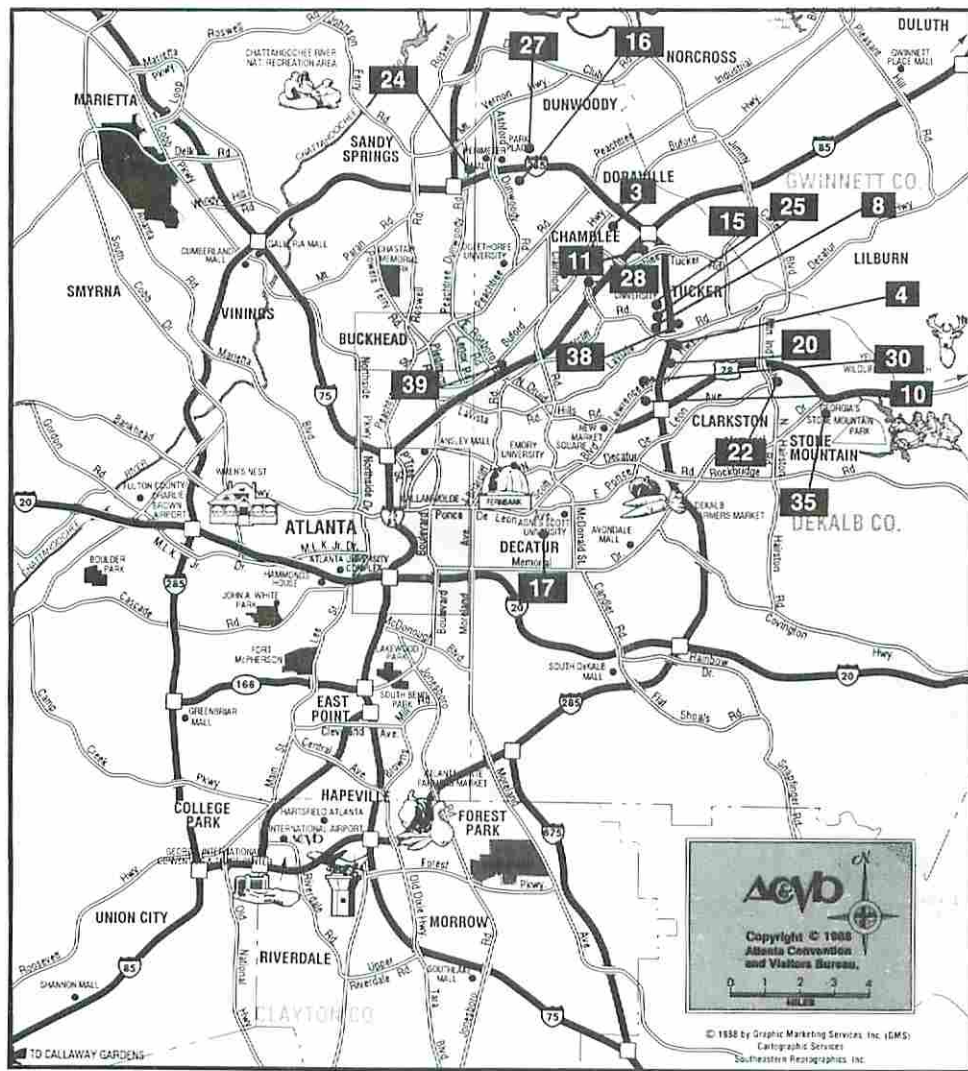

# Horseshoe Promotion in Japan

On November 8, 1989 at 12:20, we departed from San Francisco, non-stop to Osaka, Japan. Our group of horseshoe pitchers, pardners and guests numbered 37. This was an historic event, being the first time ever that a horseshoe tournament was conducted with the Japanese people. Our group was from Utah, California and Canada. We were bussed to Hashima City, 60,000 population and Gifu City, 400,000 where we were housed with our host families. The next morning we were greeted officially by a large group of town officials, exchanged gifts, and listened to many speeches.

At the horseshoe courts we were entertained by the Kindergarten 200 Band, complete with two groups of girl cheerleaders. All were in colorful uniforms and they would rate with most of our High School bands. We spent much of our time teaching the men and women to throw horseshoes. More than a thousand turned out to pitch and watch. On Friday, we pitched a tournament to show them how and Saturday we had another tournament with them mixed in. We were followed everywhere by TV cameras and reporters and could watch ourselves on television every night. The newspapers were very generous with our pictures. Japanese NHPA posters were all over town. Every day we met a new group of town officials, exchanged gifts, speeches, and were treated to another super traditional Japanese dinner.

We slept on the floor and used the floor level toilets that were separate from the bathroom. When taking a bath, you sit on a 6 inch plastic stool, lather and then dip hot water from a vat and pour it over you. We sat on the floor with our legs under the table and ate raw fish, rice and a hundred other dishes that I didn't recognize, with chopsticks, of course. You take your shoes off every time you enter the house. I

forgot once and got yelled at and then we all had a good laugh about it.

We had our own royalty and entertainment. We had two Miss Utahs, the Tingey sisters from Salt Lake City. The Japanese men do not show affection to their women. The women will use any excuse to take a picture so the American will put his arm around them and give them a hug. I hugged more women in Japan in five days than ten years in America.

They drive on the left side of the road and outside of the downtown business district the roads are very narrow, no sidewalks and the houses are within two feet of the road. Almost all cars are white compacts. No junkers and the cars are always clean. No visible gas pumps anywhere, the hoses are lowered down from the ceiling. They drive like race car drivers and have very few accidents. The first time out I held my hand over my eyes. The busses are equipped with chandeliers, TV sets and telephones. The drivers wear white gloves. The public telephones are equipped to accept only cards that can be purchased for any amount.

All available ground is in rice patties, vegetables or fruit, even in front of the skyscrapers and banks. It rains almost every night and earthquakes are common. The people are hard working, honest, humble, courteous, considerate, polite, well-educated, very happy and have a good sense of humor. The crime rate is almost zero and you see no graffiti. Tradition is very prominent and the school kids wear identical uniforms, different for each division of school. The boys' and girls' uniforms are different in design or color. The senior boys and girls all ride bicycles to school equipped with umbrellas and baskets for their lunch.

After the horseshoe tournaments we were challenged to a softball

game. They showed up in full uniform including the umps. We had a few great moments of outstanding play, but they worked real hard to make sure that we won the game 23-17. They furnished us with a dozen new gloves, canned coffee, soft drinks, cookies, cake and individual wrapped towels. We lined up at the beginning and shook hands and did the same at the end with a bow.

We accomplished our mission to introduce horseshoe pitching with friendship and peace and a better understanding of our distant neighbor. Some people have said, "so what", and are still bitter with the Japanese. I say we had better take a good hard look at ourselves and our system and take a page or two out of their book before it's too late.

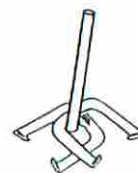

## CALIFORNIA

The Ukiah Horseshoe Club put on their annual two-day Scotty Turner tournament with 52 pitchers participating. Format of play followed much the same that has been proven successful in the Annual Las Vegas tournaments of late.

The 1990 Valley of the Sun Tournament in Mesa, Arizona will be Wally Shipley's 25th consecutive year in attendance. Dates are Feb. 12 thru 18th. He is adding \$250 to the cash prizes—\$100 & \$25 to the first and second place winners in the men's and women's Class A.

He also gives \$300 to the Wally Shipley Championship Doubles at Riverside and \$400 to the Wally Shipley Championship Doubles January 27 at Yuma, Arizona. Budweiser offers beautiful red jackets to the winners in addition to trophies by the YHPA at Yuma.

## CANADA

Clayton English of Manitoba and Diane Cantin of Quebec are the Canadian National Champions for 1989. 1988 World Champion Edward Neeb was the Junior Boys winner.

Cantin is the big news. In her eighth game she pitched a perfect game against Shirley Ann Fisher of Manitoba—24 shoes. This is Diane's 6th Canadian Women's title in seven years. Sister Angeline, Margaret Johns, Myrna Kissick, Sandy McLachlin and Doris Bilodeau have all tried, but her niece Sylvianne Moisan has been the only one to beat her. That was in 1988 in Calgary.

Diane's 88.0% in 1989 is another record, along with the perfect game.

## COLORADO

The Denver Metro Horseshoe Club won the third annual State League Championship, defeating North Weld Club, 7-2, in the finals. The last event was held at the Pitchin' Post in Commerce City, an indoor facility that uses the court boxes purchased from Eau Claire Club after the 1987 World Tournament.

Members of the winning team were Dave O'Dell, Ray D. McGrady and Keith Whittemore. Other teams competing were Strasburg, Boulder, Loveland, Fort Collins, Woodward Governor, Ault and Colorado Springs.

Tommy Lawson of Acworth finished first in Class A to win the Brooks Fall Fling at Alpharetta. It was a 50-shoe count all 80% handicap event. Claude Fender of Powder Springs was second, A.W. Wetherford of Braselton was third. J.E. Brooks of Alpharetta won the Class B crown.

## ILLINOIS

Tari Powell of Rossville and Bob Switzer of Peoria were inducted into the Illinois Hall of Fame in 1989. Bob has been the Secretary-Treasurer for the State for many years.

Tari has been the only World Champion from Illinois, being the Junior girl's champion in 1976 with 7-0, 57.3, and the Women's World Champion in 1984 at Huntsville, Alabama, 10-0, 80.6.

Tari and Cliff Baker are the 1989 State Champions.

## MINNESOTA

Phyllis Negaard added the State title again to her World Championship victory and induction into the NHPA Hall of Fame. Former World Champion Dale Lipovsky added another State title to his long string. Father Len finished fourth behind second place Dave Hughes. Jack O'Connor was third.

Bev Nathe, who was impressive at the World this year, was second at State. Phyllis closed with a 5-0, 74.80, Bev had 3-2 and 67.6.

There were 49 classes in the 1989 State Tournament. Vance Harren nosed out brother Chris to win the Boy's crown and Christie Cave topped the girls. Everyone hopes the Harren boys compete again at the World...they are super.

## NEBRASKA

Dick Hanshew of Scottsbluff was reelected president of the Western Nebraska Charter for 1990. In addition to his presidential duties, Hanshew runs two tournaments each year, one in May and one in August.

Other officers are Arnie Fankhauser, Chadron, 1st vice president; Glen Bale, Lodgepole, 2nd vice president; John Gardner, Scottsbluff, 3rd vice president; Darrell Robertson, Bridgeport, 4th vice president; and Frank Madison, Harrisburg, secretary-treasurer.

## NEW JERSEY

Lou "Sonny" Durando, the former Nutley native now residing in Lyndhurst is the New Jersey State 1989 Champion. This guy gets more rings around the stake than Wisk gets around the collar. He started pitching four years ago, and before that used to fly kites. The first year he was second in Class B, then was third in Class A, and finished second last year. He uses Clydesdale Deadeye shoes.



## OREGON

At the state singles horseshoe pitching championships Labor Day weekend, Leonard Christiansen went undefeated to gain a purse of \$50. Between this tournament and the Rogue River competition September 9th he celebrated his 75th birthday, and continues to work as a carpenter in Harrisburg from his lifelong home on Diamond Hill Drive.

To Christiansen—who placed sixth in his age group last July at the 1989 World Tournament at Spearfish, S.D.—his 75-80 trophies for horseshoe pitching simply reflect his longstanding love of the sport. He won seven of eleven at Spearfish, and during his pitching days has garnered as high as 77.7.

Elder Class World Champion Spud Napier won the Rogue River Open in Class A 7-0, 67.8.

## SOUTHERN UTAH

Lorin Condie really hit the jackpot of horseshoe pitching in the Southern Utah area winning the SUHPA Championship at Cedar City, 6-1, 47.9; the Autumn Open, 7-0, 60.0; Kane Long Valley Open, 3-1, 45.0; and the Ray Ohms Memorial, 19-3, 49.1.

He ended up as the top money winner (\$261), with J.J. Steffen of Monticello finishing second (\$238.17).

The two top moneymen were also 1-2 in the ringer percentage for the year, 50.2 to 49.7 for Steffen and John Bracken.

Gabe Ohms was the top Junior in percentage with 42.0, and Penny Bundy was the most improved in the Juniors with an increase of 11.5.

## TEXAS

Roger Vogel went 7-0 (63.1) to win the Archie Roach Classic at Arlington in September, and Ken Jones 6-0 (58.0) topped all Class A pitchers to win the Tumbleweed Classic in Lubbock.

The Riverside Classic was won by Ken Jones 7-0 (56.0) while Diana Polak was the women's winner 4-1, 64.8.

## WASHINGTON

Following zone events for the Summer Centennial Games, these pitchers emerged as Gold Medal winners: Class A-Art Sperber; B-Skip Schilperoort; Class C-Darwin Platz; Women's A-Michelle Ives; Women's B-Joleen Broderick; and Handicap-Ivan Utt. In the men's Class A Hank Knauff was the silver medal winner and Mike Thorniley took the bronze.

Sperber added three more Class A titles to his long list—Capital City, 6-1, 68.71; Brumfield Open, 7-0, 66.77; Tacoma Turkey Shoot, 7-0, 69.31. Ben Wiedrich sneaked in ahead of Art to win the Pacific Northwest Open.

## WEST VIRGINIA

Our "future" holds many promises of new and better things to come. We hope to establish a research and development process that could lead to synthetic stakes to reduce the noise level of horseshoe

pitching, especially indoors. We could see different materials in the make-up of pitching shoes. We may discover new and better materials to pitch horseshoes into. Some of you may have an idea that we could explore or incorporate. Who knows?

Do we have some goals? Do we dare "dream"? Do we continue to expand? You bet! The NHPA Game Related National office is a fully staffed, computer equipped, FAX equipped modern office to serve you the "Horseshoe Enthusiast". We are currently approaching a quarter of a million dollar annual sales volume of business. We now have the capacity to handle a half million dollars in sales. Our NHPA telephone number is 509-865-9477, our FAX number is the same. My "dream" is to earn

enough money to help equip the National President and Secretary office with full-time paid people working for you. With your help we will achieve that goal. Just remember that only products purchased from an official NHPA distributor or sub-distributor contributes to the support of the NHPA.

If you read this article to this point you will, no doubt, get the message. I saved a little surprise for the end. The year 1990 will find NHPA game related people looking at tournament winners that are well dressed wearing "official" NHPA clothing. It could mean some extra money for you. 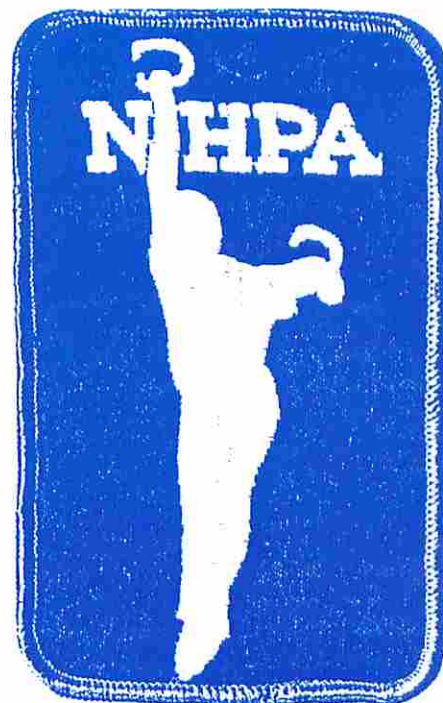

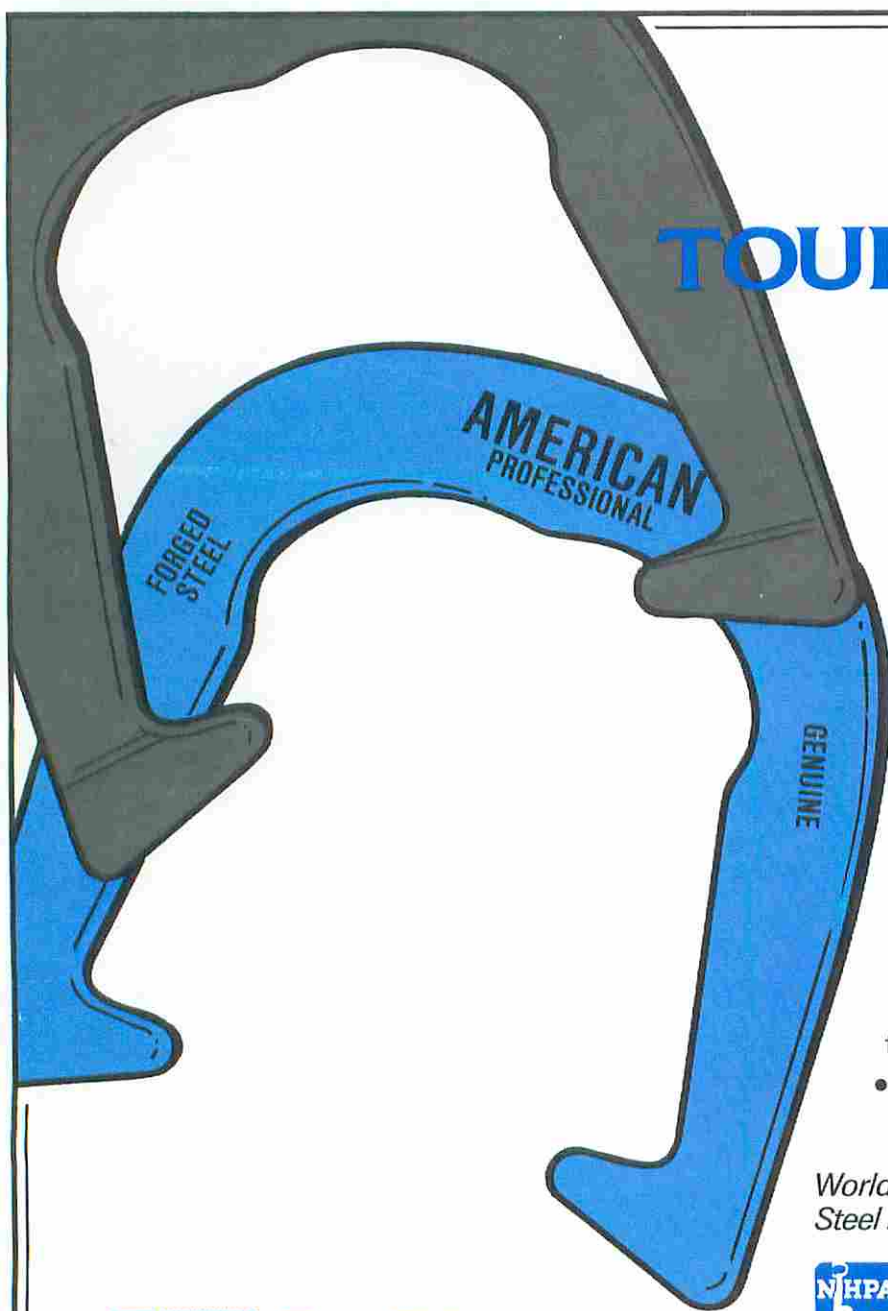
