



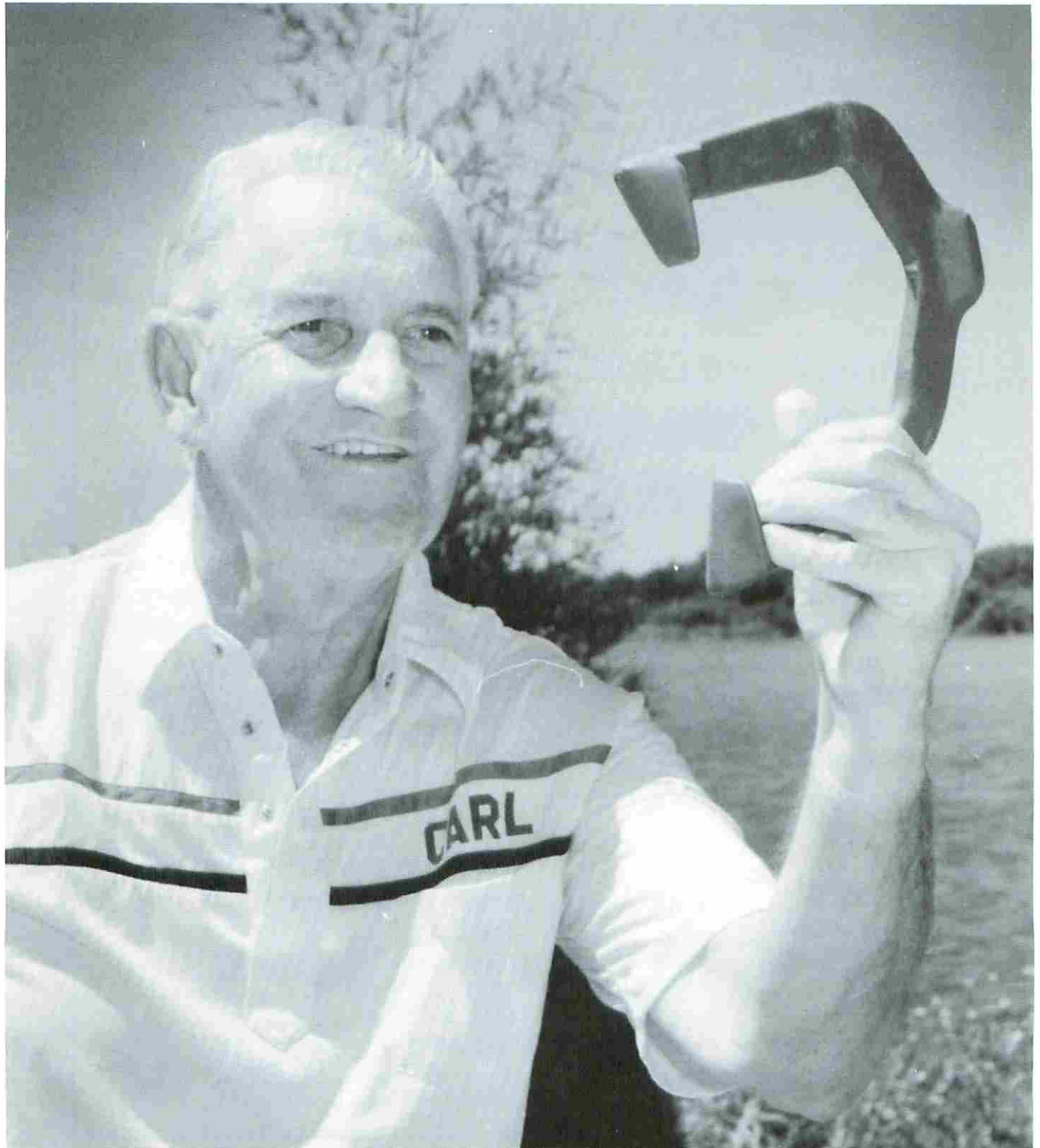

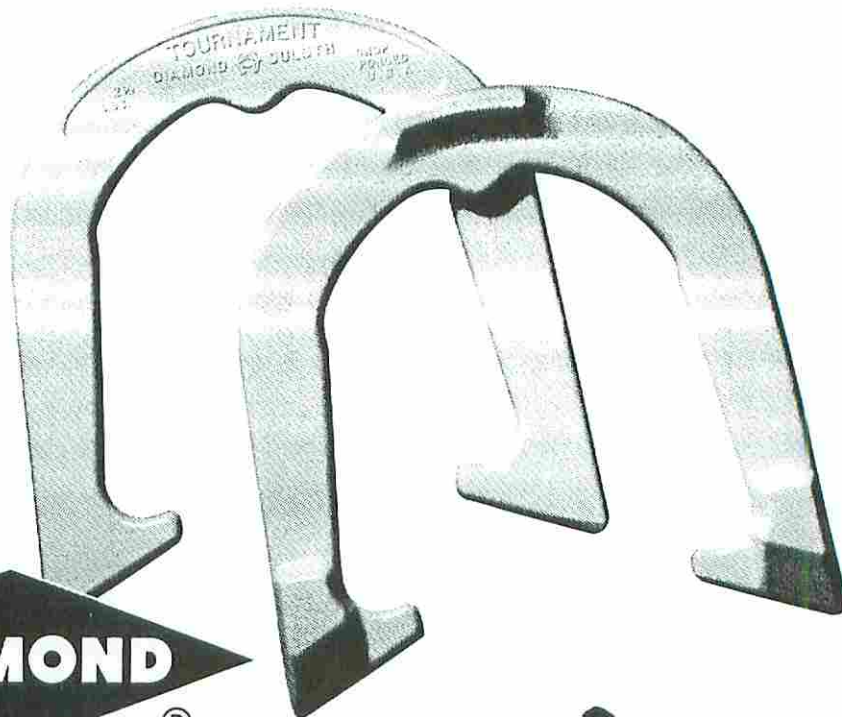

President's Message

This column is normally the last one prepared for each *Newsline* issue. I try to hold it for any last minute things that might be newsworthy, but for the most part I stare at the blank computer monitor with a case of writer's block. Rarely do I have a subject in mind beforehand. This month is a little different in that a couple of things may be worth talking about. At least some of you might be interested.

The delegates in convention will be confronted with a lot of different items this year. Your NHPA officers will be in the middle of several hot topics, but I guess that's to be expected. One of them has just surfaced and I've been advised that it is circulating the country. It involves a letter written to State Officers from the 1990 World Tournament committee that indicates some funds may be missing and leads one to wonder if the financial commitments will be met. The answer and final details will probably not be known before the tournament but I can assure you that the Georgia people and your NHPA officials are working hard to smooth out any wrinkles. With 1064 entries, we want all to know that the individual class prize money remains unaffected by any potential financial problems of the host. Championship classes could be affected but to what extent if any, can only be determined at the last minute, probably at the tournament itself.

Most *Newsline* readers are aware of a couple of proposals that would increase the subscription rate to \$15.00 annually. One just proposes a regular increase while the other adds the increase to the \$7.00 NHPA dues and says that all members shall pay \$22.00 annually for dues & magazine. I hate to ask the membership for any kind of increase, but for some things there is just no other way. In this case, there is another option I intend to bring up in convention.

Some say — reduce the costs by eliminating the results.

Others say keep the results and increase the subscription rate. In my mind, if only the 25% who now subscribe are to get *Newsline*, then the other 75% of the members who don't get the magazine shouldn't have any voice in the cost of a subscription. If all receive it, then all the delegates should have the right to vote on the cost. The other option I have in mind could leave the subscription price at \$12.00. We can do this by publishing six regular issues of *Newsline*, one every other month, for the most part, without results. These regular tournament results would not be eliminated but would go into 2 special "results only" issues. By cutting back, from 11 to 8, the number of yearly issues, I estimate we could break even at a \$12.00 subscription rate. More details at convention time.

The 30 and 40 foot controversy has grown to be the biggest issue in our organization. I have empathy for both the 30 and 40 foot pitcher in the issue. The 30 footers in all categories make up a total of only about 20% of the NHPA pitchers. While the minority, these 30 footers are entitled to a place to competitively pitch. With their small number, this has generally meant participation in "mixed classes" and that is where the rub often comes in. Many 40 foot pitchers don't like mixing and won't do it. Some have even dropped the game because of it. Other 40 foot pitchers take part in mixed tournaments but are not comfortable when playing 30 footers. There are many reasons for this and most have been covered several times in *Letters to the Editor* or the *Reader Forum* columns of this and previous *Newslines*. It's not likely that a solution will be forthcoming soon but I had to think some the other day when I was reminded that five years ago we had very little mixed pitching and five years ago we had no loud controversy.

Is it time to consider a different approach??? Food for thought!!!

■ Finally, a little feedback on some money tournaments. The information as we now have it would rank the following mentioned events as the five best in prize money for 1990. If you know of others, let me know. 1st, Stone Mountain \$80,000+; 2nd, Las Vegas, \$25,000; 3rd, New England Championships, \$12,000; 4th, Bellingham, WA Invitational, \$10,000+; 5th, Ohio State Fair, \$10,000.

■ Winners of the 1990 Stone Mountain raffle drawing have been announced. 1st prize of two Delta round trip tickets within the U.S. went to Jerry Dale Sr., of Marietta, GA. 2nd, \$100.00 to John Thodium of Toccoa, GA. 3rd, \$50.00 to Glenn Jamieson of Pleasanton, CA.

■ The Toro Company of Minneapolis has been obtained as a sponsor for the 1990 Valley View Open, scheduled July 14-15 in Bloomington. All class winners will be awarded a security outdoor lighting system plus cash. A new 8-25 riding lawnmower will be awarded to any pitcher hitting a perfect game. Thanks to Gordy Schmidt, tournament director.

■ St. George, Utah, October 15-26, will be the site of the World Senior Games sponsored by Huntsman Chemicals. Last year 1540 participants were involved, many of them in the horseshoe pitching competition. If you are age 50 or above and would like to participate, contact Dennis Ohms, Horseshoe Director, 801-586-7996 by the October 1 deadline.

■ Word from Iowa is that the groundbreaking ceremonies for the Putt Mossman Indoor Arena was to take place on June 3rd. World Champion, Alan Francis was scheduled to attend. Bob Walters, RD for Iowa has been a leading force in the promotion of this planned facility.

■ The City of Las Vegas sent me a letter of appreciation for the efforts of Don Weaver who recently finished up his 4th year as a director of the City's Corporate Challenge. Started in 1986, Don planned and directed the horseshoe pitching activities which has grown from 18 corporations

in the first year to 83 corporations in 1990. It was a giant task and as usual, Don Weaver's expertise proved to be an invaluable asset. By the way, Don is once again working with the Hacienda Hotel on some special events. Horseshoe pitching may be back there in 1990/91.

■ The Southern California charter has started a search for a unique and innovative logo to represent their association. Imaginative and creative designs are being sought from SCHPA members. Contact Carolyn Webb at 619-765-1396 for details.

■ The 21st annual Carolina Dogwood Festival horseshoe tournament had 150 entries from 12 states taking part at the Statesville courts on April 21st. John Bogardus of New York and Renee Cowan won the men and women's championship. 6 pitchers from the Walters family of Troy, Ohio took part but quantity honors went to the Hix family of Virginia who entered 9.

■ The 9th Head-of-the-Mon tournament in West Virginia attracted 105 pitchers but due to very heavy rain, only 71 were able to compete. Play had to be shortened but Jim Knisley was able to successfully defend his title. Grace Rugg of Pennsylvania dethroned Fran Carnahan in the women's division.

■ Despite expectations to the contrary, only one 1992 World Tournament bid was received. It was for \$50,000 from Columbus Recreation and Parks, Columbus, Ohio. More details at the convention.

■ The W.T. Dinner and Awards Banquet should be a nice affair on the lake at Stone Mountain. This year we will induct into the Hall of Fame, Debby Michaud and Merlin Potts as players, Mayne Francisco in the old-time player category and L.D. Long as a special elect. The Stokes Memorial Award will go to Don Koso while achievement and recognition awards will be presented to Bob Dunn, Cathie Loucks and St. Pierre Manufacturing Corp.

1. This is a joint July/August *Newsline* issue. The next publication will be in September and will be a complete World Tournament recap.

2. All tournament results received by June 1st are printed in this issue. Since we miss a month before the W.T. issue, it means that some four months will pass before we can again begin to publish results. State Championships normally occupy the November and December issues and with the volume of results now being mailed in, it's no secret that we will be way behind. Look for another special "results only" issue around November. It's the only way we can get caught up. If your results are submitted in the proper form, by Class, double-spaced with tournament name, date, location and sanction number, they will eventually get published. Remember, we want only that info along with Win/Loss and percentage. More information will probably reject the entire thing. No Doubles events.

3. Check your mailing label on this issue to see if your expiration date is close at hand. A bright highlighted date on your label indicates action should be taken now.

Don't wait around and miss an issue or two. Get in the habit of renewing at least 60-90 days early. If you wait until a month before your due date, you will miss an issue for sure.

4. If you see an order blank in *Newsline* and want to order but don't want to cut out the page, just take it to the nearest place that makes copies. Copy the page, fill out and send it in.

5. Contributions to *Newsline* from readers are always welcome. We don't publish everything but most find their way into print. Remember, try to type and double space your articles.

Dear Dave,

There is a proposal for consideration by the delegates at the 1990 NHPA Convention, to change the NHPA membership dues to \$22.00 and include a subscription to the *Newsline*. The primary focus of the motion is to consider the value in having all NHPA members well informed, up to date on all current issues and aware of upcoming events. This is especially important

(and critical) as our membership continues to grow, and now exceeds 15,000 strong. There is another advantage in this motion, in that separate subscriber files need not be maintained, and the efforts of not having to be resubscribing would be a convenience to members and a savings to the organization. Information and communication to members must remain the primary consideration of this proposed change.

Still there will be the underlining distraction of some members viewing the increase in price of NHPA membership. There really is no increase to those who already subscribe. The essence of the motion is to say that all NHPA members will subscribe to our publication. It is about time the association matures and adopts this policy.

There is a difference between a horseshoe pitcher and an NHPA member. An NHPA member is not only a horseshoe pitcher, but also appreciates the heritage of our sport, and is committed to preserving and improving our sport for future generations. The true NHPA member has voluntarily subscribed

to the *Newsline*. Those same members do not maintain a self-serving attitude of what the sport provides to them, but also consider what they can provide to the sport. A true and valuable NHPA member will see no problem in being involved, in being informed and up to date on current communication. Anyone who views their NHPA membership solely on the price of membership fee, may not be a valid NHPA member and we should not let their negative influence determine the outcome of this vote.

Dear Dave,

I first pitched in a Missouri State Tournament in 1923 and I won the World Intermediate title in 1967. I was *there* when they first talked about getting the game on TV and saw their countenance fall when they failed. I believe that TV must present a program with action and one that the public can understand. With that in mind, I present a novel idea for horseshoe pitching on TV.

I would have larger classes eliminated down to eight players, with the finals to be played in round robin fashion. Each player would use four horseshoes. Ringers would count 5 points, shoes within 6 inches would count 1 point. A game would be 60 shoes, so a possible perfect game would be 300 points.

The horseshoes would be returned on an endless conveyor belt by a judge at the other end, who would also call the score. I am enclosing a diagram of my idea, although I realize you would not have space to print this in *Newsline*. An endless belt could serve two courts, similar to a ball return in bowling.

The pitchers would flip a coin or horseshoe for choice of first or sec-

Reader Forum

Dear Dave:

Much has been said and written about the mixing of "30-ft." and "40-ft." horseshoe pitchers playing against each other on the same court. Some agree with this, and others do not. Some hard feelings exist over this issue. Nothing concrete has been resolved.

Please take a few moments to read my comments, and a possible solution to make it all equal. The first thing that has to be done is to determine just how far we are throwing the horseshoe. We have always casually called it as 40 feet for the full-distance pitcher because the stakes are forty feet apart; and "30-foot pitchers" because they are 10 feet closer.

The foul line is 3 feet ahead of the stake, and probably 99% of us step forward those 3 feet to the foul line in delivering the horseshoe. So, now we are saying that the "40-foot pitcher" is throwing the horseshoe 37 feet. Same thing for "30-footers" really throwing 27 feet. I maintain that the "40-foot pitcher" and the "30-foot pitcher" are in fact, throwing the horseshoe 5 feet less than 40 feet, or 30 feet. This can easily be proved, as I did, in your own living room.

I took our living-room pole light (those lights that go from the floor to the ceiling) and made believe it was a horseshoe stake. I measured back 5 feet to an imaginary stake, placed a ruler down at that. Then I stood at the ruler (just as I would if it were the opposite horseshoe stake) and made my regular delivery of the shoe. I wanted to see how close the horseshoe would be to the pole light before it was released from my hand. I stepped forward the 3 feet, went through with my arm swing, and I'll be darned if the horseshoe didn't hit the pole light, and broke it. At this point, my wife came bearing down on me, and told me to take my cotton-pickin' experimenting outside and use a rake or shovel handle instead of a pole light.

Well, I did find out that my arm swing does extend out a good 2 feet forward from the foul line, and I think that most of us do also. This means that the horseshoe is in the air 35 feet for a 40-ft. pitcher, and 25 feet for a 30-ft. pitcher.

I drew a bunch of circles representing distances of 40', 37', 35'; and 30', 27' and 25' to try and find out the degree of accuracy from the starting point to the target at these various distances.

I don't know if you, or the rest of us horseshoe pitchers, realize just how precise and accurate we must be to hit a target 40' away. If you tossed a marble 40' and you were 1 degree off-target, you would miss by 8.3776"; at 30 feet you would miss by only 6.2832". At 37 feet, and 1 degree off, you would miss by 7.7493"; at 27 feet, you would miss by 5.6549". At 35 feet, 1 degree off, you miss by 7.3304"; at 25 feet, you miss by 5.2360". In order to miss the target by only 1/2" at 40', you would have to be within .06 degree. Now, that is being accurate!

But, we aren't tossing marbles, and we don't have to be within 1/2 inch of the target. But we *do* have to be accurate — accurate to 2 1/2 inches.

you have to be within 2 1/2" accurate in order to make a ringer.

Well, Dave, the more I wrestled with those circles and all those figures and calculations, the more frustrated I became, and I suddenly was aware of the unfairness of one pitcher throwing 10 feet farther than the other pitcher, whether it is 40' vs. 30', 37' vs. 27', or 35' vs. 25'.

I realize that we have compensated for the *human* physical elements by allowing certain people to pitch from a distance of 10 feet closer than those we deem to have no physical incapacities. I have no quarrel with that whatsoever. It is good that we can keep them pitching, whatever it may be — age, strength, gender, physical handicap, or whatever — but, we haven't compensated for the degree of accuracy or inaccuracy, that also comes into effect for the 10 feet distance involved.

I called our Oregon Horseshoe Pitchers Assn. president, Elmer Otnes, to see if I could talk to him about this, and to see what he thought about it, and maybe we could figure something out. The next day I drove from my home in Woodburn to Elmer's home in

The 2 1/2 inches comes into play because, after deducting the one-inch thickness of the stake from 3 1/2-inch opening of the horseshoe,

Oregon City, and we discussed it from all angles. Neta Otnes, Elmer's wife, asked if "something could be

ond pitch. The player that pitches first will also choose which side of the peg he wishes to use for the first 30 shoes. The other pitcher will pitch from the opposite side for the first 30 shoes, at which time they will change sides and the opponent will pitch first for the remaining 30 shoes. There should be an electronic scoreboard located behind the pitching area, as per my diagram.

I believe that the average length of a 40 point game at Spearfish in 1989 was 58 shoes. Using this system I have envisioned, where walking between pegs is eliminated, I believe a game can be played in about 12 minutes. While one set of shoes was being returned by the endless belt, the pitchers would already be pitching their other set of shoes.

As I have passed my 85th birthday, I have no desire to pursue these

ideas on my own. I only wish to pass along my suggestions in hopes that someone would be willing to pursue them in some way to make our sport more saleable to the TV media.

Dave,

Age-old scorekeeping is fundamental to any sport. To keep score for a horseshoe game is unique, for it differs from recorded data of many other sports: A ball is seen to go through the hoop; a homerun is followed into the stands; a football clearly goes between two posts, but what does a horseshoe do? Can many spectators see for sure what the pitched shoes scored? No, let alone the scorekeeper; he must rely upon hearing the call from a pitcher up to 50 feet away. Does he hear it correctly? A diligent keeper of the score will verify by voice or hand signal. He writes on his pad, but did

credit go in the appropriate column, for the pitcher who called the score? Did his writing carry through to mark on all three sheets? Yes, pitchers are at the mercy of record keepers!

Scorekeeping is a skill as demanding as that of pitching itself. What would be the value of keeping score if it were not to be recorded correctly? Hence, reliance on the official recorder is an important fundamental of the game, fullheartedly accepted by all who call the count.

Older, experienced pitchers perform well in this chair behind the fence; are fully reliant through experience and integrity, and available to instruct new pitchers in this all-important aspect of the game.

DON'T FORGET IT! Scorekeeping is a reciprocal function — I'll keep score for you — you keep score for me!

done" to keep things even to make up the difference of the accuracy aspect of the 10 feet distance. Elmer then suggested that perhaps the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " opening of a horseshoe, now allowed, be reduced for those pitchers who throw 10 feet closer, when playing with someone on the same court, pitching 10 feet farther.

It was as if a lightbulb just lit up in my head, and I said, "that has got to be the answer to this problem". So I drove back home and decided I would try and figure this thing out. It took me quite some time, because while I'm working on this problem, I still have to take care of my other chores, such as playing golf, working jig-saw puzzles, playing pool, plus my afternoon naps.

But I think I have come up with the answer. I discarded all those circles and degrees charts (they weren't getting me anywhere), and drew up some charts, which I realize are too much for reproduction in *Newsline*. Nonetheless, let me give you an idea of what they show.

Chart #1 shows the difference of the shoe opening between 40 feet and 30 feet — $3\frac{1}{2}$ " opening for 40', and $2\frac{7}{8}$ " opening for 30', a difference of $5/8$ " ($10/16$ ").

Chart #2 shows the difference be-

tween 37 feet and 27 feet — $3\frac{1}{2}$ " opening for 37'; and $2\frac{13}{16}$ " opening for 27'; a difference of $11/16$ ".

Chart #3 shows the difference of the shoe opening between 35 feet and 25 feet — $3\frac{1}{2}$ " opening for 35', and $2\frac{3}{4}$ " opening for 25', a difference of $3/4$ " ($12/16$ ").

Chart #4 is a combination of the first three charts. The $3\frac{1}{2}$ " is really reduced to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " because the stake is 1" thick, so in order to make a ringer, you would have to pitch a perfectly open shoe no more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ " accurate from 40', 37', or 35' — depending on how far it is determined that the horseshoe is pitched.

The 40 ft. vs. 30 ft. is easy to figure, as it comes to exactly 75%, and I came up with a simple fraction of $2\frac{7}{8}$ " opening at 30 ft., compared to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " opening at 40 ft.

The 37 ft. vs. 27 ft. is not so easy, as it comes to 72.97297% — 72.97297% of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " = 1.8243242 "

Add 1" for stake = 1.00

Shoe opening at 27' = 2.8243242 " or ($2\frac{13}{16}$ "). Re-tooling a horseshoe die, or mold, to obtain the $2\frac{13}{16}$ " opening can be done. I talked to the people at Deadeye by phone, and was told it can be done, but that "they wouldn't like it".

The difference of the shoe opening would apply *only* when one pitcher is throwing 10 feet closer than

his/her opponent on the same court.

The 35 ft. vs. 25 ft. was also not too easy, but it came to an opening of $2\frac{3}{4}$ " for a 25' pitch which I figure is the distance now pitched by most "30-footers".

That's about it. If you have read this far, I appreciate you taking the time to do so. I spent a lot of time, and did a lot of figuring on this problem. Perhaps it can be brought up and discussed by the Executive Council, Rules Committee or delegates. Perhaps it can be improved upon somehow. At least, I made an effort to correct, what I believe to be, an inequity of the 10 feet differential of our sport of horseshoes.

I really think that a "can of worms" has been opened. With the "battle of the sexes" upon us, and women being entitled to do what men do, I'm sure that *one day* a 70-year-old woman pitcher will declare that she should be entitled to pitch 10 feet closer than under-70 women pitchers, already at 30 feet; and also be entitled to pitch 20 feet closer when pitching against under-70 men pitchers at 40 feet.

Woe unto us! Somebody could get hit in the head with a horseshoe!

I sure do like the look and the size of *Newsline*, and will be sending my renewal subscription very soon.

History of Horseshoe Pitching

In 1907, some winter visitors to St. Petersburg, Florida began to amuse themselves by pitching horseshoes in the sand on a lot next to the Poinsettia Hotel. There were just two courts with the pegs 35 feet apart and 3 inches above the ever changing top level of the sand. Folks seemed to enjoy this winter pastime in the south but in late 1909, the courts were moved twice, ending up in a vacant lot next to the Allison Hotel.

Until this time, no pitcher had ever heard of or given serious thought to controlling the delivery of a shoe so it would fall open toward the peg. It was to be the winter of 1909, on the lot next to the Allison Hotel that this would change.

In a doubles game, Dr. F.M. Robinson, Poughkeepsie NY and O.T. Battles, Chardon, Ohio, were partners against two men from Rochester, New York. In the game, the four shoes would sometimes bury themselves so deep in the sand, that they would be covered and out of sight. While the game was in progress, Battles, upon digging out of the sand the shoes Dr. Robinson had pitched, spoke up with the ardor of a man that has just made a new discovery when he said: "Doc, your shoes all come fork to." This had not been previously noticed even by the doctor himself. The other pitchers then began to question the doctor to find out how he did it. His reply was that he really didn't know except that it seemed to come natural to him to release his shoe so that it fell open toward the peg with a one and three-quarter turn. The doctor held his shoe with this first finger around the heel calk as all other players did at that time.

From that time, other players began to take notice and practice holding their shoes on the side with the opening toward and from them and every other conceivable way in order to try to control the shoe's opening. As far as can be determined, this was

the beginning of the controlled open horseshoe which is an art now known to some degree by every good pitcher.

In the fall of 1910, the horseshoe courts alongside the Allison Hotel were again moved, this time to Williams Park. There, the Sunshine Pleasure Club had organized play for devotees of horseshoe pitching, rogue, checkers and dominoes. This club was believed to be the largest and oldest horseshoe pitching club in existence at the time. It had 13 clay courts with concrete around the pitchers' box and paving between the pegs. There were also 25 sandy loam courts. For years after, all but two of the National Tournaments held in the south were played on these courts.

Through the efforts of the members of the Sunshine Pleasure Club, the National League of Horseshoe and Quoits Pitchers was organized on February 26, 1919. This formation was

during the National Tournament in St. Petersburg with the representatives of 29 different states in attendance. Credit goes to Harry G. Haynes, Akron, Ohio and Dr. E.C. Beach of St. Petersburg, who were especially active in perfecting the organization which was given a charter under the laws of the State of Ohio, June 27, 1921.

On May 10, 1921, the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of the United States was also incorporated in the State of Ohio, headquartered in Akron. A year or two later, these two national organizations were consolidated under the name of the latter.

At the National Convention in Lake Worth, Florida, on February 26, 1925, the name was changed to the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association of America, which is now the only recognized governing body of the sport in this country.

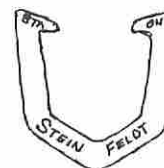

Analyze Your Pitch

We've all learned to our dismay that throwing ringers is hard to do. But how hard is it? After some analysis I've concluded it's surprising anyone can throw a ringer at all.

Accuracy consists of three parts: lateral error, distance error and error in the turn or flip. I think the most difficult one for a pitcher to control has to be lateral error, which is the easiest to analyze. In order to score a ringer, how much angular error can be allowed? A horseshoe has up to a 3½ inch opening, so a deviation of approximately half that amount, either to the right or to the left, will cause a miss. Assuming the point of release is at the foul line, 37 feet from the target, the answer is less than ¼ of a degree to either side of center -13.5 minutes of arc to be more exact. This assumes that catching half of the stake with the tip of the shoe still results in a ringer and that the shoe is flat and open. If the shoe is tilted or not completely open the cosine of these angles must be taken into account, making the accuracy requirement even more stringent.

For distance, I calculated accuracy for players who throw a high shoe (10 feet at the top of the arc) and a low shoe (6 feet at the highest point). For both cases I assumed that the shoe is released three feet above the foul line and that the target is the middle of the stake, 7½ inches above the ground. As a check of my calculations I compared results for the 10 foot height with Tim Bayerl's calculations on page 21 of the July/August 1989 issue of *Newsline*. My results are:

Vertical release velocity-21.2 ft/sec.

Horizontal release velocity-26.0 ft/sec.

Total release velocity-33.6 ft/sec.

Travel Time-1.42 seconds

These numbers differ slightly from Mr. Bayerl's because he assumed the point of release and the target were both at ground level. Our results are the same when these differences are taken into account.

In this case the question is: how much error in release velocity can be tolerated without overshooting or undershooting the stake? For the 10

foot pitcher I calculate that a 2.9% change in vertical velocity or a 2.6% change in horizontal velocity will cause a miss. That seems to be a pretty tight tolerance. For the 6 foot pitcher the tolerances in vertical and horizontal velocities are 5.4% and 4.3% respectively. This confirms Mr. Bayerl's observation that although a higher pitch is more efficient in terms of energy expended, better distance accuracy should be obtained by keeping the shoe low. By the way, my calculation accounts for the fact that a ringer scores whether the shoe is against the stake or the tips just make it around the stake. This factor is equivalent to adding a couple of inches to the length of the stake, making it somewhat easier to get ringers.

This calculation is a little simplistic in one respect: I assumed the aim point is the center of the stake so that the overshoot and undershoot error tolerances would be nearly the same. Most pitchers aim a bit lower which gives them more tolerance for shooting too high and less for shooting too low. But the, a few of us are above asking for a little help from a slide.

I haven't given much thought to turn, or flip. Crudely, since about a quarter of the shoe is cut away, a turner ought to have about one chance in four of having an open shoe, if the turn were random. By the same token, a flipper should have a 50/50 chance of having his shoe open. So flippers should get twice as many ringers as turners! We all know better than that. Obviously the turn and the flip are not random. At least we hope not.

Now that we know all about efficiency and accuracy we should be ready to enter the 70 and 80 percent classes: we have no excuses left for missing. But seriously, it is hard to throw a ringer, and I think this analysis demonstrates why. All the more reason to admire anyone who does throw 70 or 80 percent ringers -or 10 or 20 percent for that matter.

For A Healthy Pitch

The 1986 World Horseshoe Tournament was memorable in many nice ways, but the most memorable thing about it for some people was the HEAT! What can we do when there is a tournament on a hot, humid day? What SHOULD we do on those days, and is there anything we can do to prepare for it?

There ARE some things we can do to help us cope with the heat. First, however, we should learn to recognize the signs of heat problems. The initial problem with high heat and/or humidity is dehydration. This has been covered in a previous column. Just drink water, fluids, and plenty of it. Make that fluid cold so it cools you down from the inside and so it gets into your system fast. If dehydration occurs and it is not corrected, it can progress to heat cramps, heat exhaustion, or in severe cases, heat stroke. In the least, it contributes to muscle weakness and decreased work capacity.

Heat cramps occur due to loss of minerals and fluid from the muscles. Preventing this is easier than treating it - again, by drinking enough fluids before and during any event. Treating it consists of stopping any activity, resting in a cool place, and drinking MORE fluids. A normal meal should replace any of the deficient minerals. NEVER USE SALT TABLETS as they may actually cause further dehydration.

Heat exhaustion is more serious and must be tended to immediately. One of the problems with it is that the person affected by it loses some of his or her ability to reason and may insist on continuing the activity. The heart rate increases, the blood pressure decreases and the person may faint or feel lightheaded. They may feel the hair on their chest stand up and they may actually feel a chill. However, they are usually still sweating, sometimes profusely, which now only dehydrates them further. Treatment must be immediate and friends and family must be forceful in getting the person to stop what they are doing to rest in the shade. Cool compresses will help when applied to the extremities and

the person should not do much of anything for 24 hours.

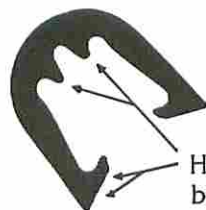
If none of the other stages are arrested, then heat stroke may occur. This is extremely serious and is characterized by hot, dry skin, inability to sweat, and mental confusion. The person must be taken to a hospital immediately but cold towels can be placed over all of the body in the meantime. The person will probably not be able to drink.

How can we prevent these problems from occurring? There are several things to do. You already have heard, many times, (but never enough) that you need to drink more than you think you need. More than that, we can get accustomed to the heat by GRADUALLY increasing our exercise in the heat. Our body actually changes to acclimatize itself to the heat. We cannot adjust to the sun so stay out of the sun if at all possible, just slowly increase your activity in the heat. Our bodies learn to sweat more, earlier, and the sweat

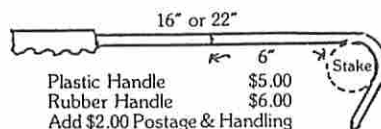
covers our body better as we adjust to heat. Our sweat also learns to conserve minerals and becomes more dilute as we adjust.

We should also wear light clothing, light in color and lightweight, to allow as much air circulation as possible. A light colored hat is helpful, especially if it is kept wet with cool water to cool our heads. We should also use a strong sunscreen which helps reduce our body heat tremendously. I hate hats, but the sunscreen goes on, the water goes IN and ON the body, the sunglasses that screen out the ultraviolet rays go on, and the clothes are light. It also helps if we are simply in good physical shape. If our bodies are in good cardiovascular condition overall, then we can withstand more AND we will probably be more in tune with our body, able to tell when we are beginning to have a problem.



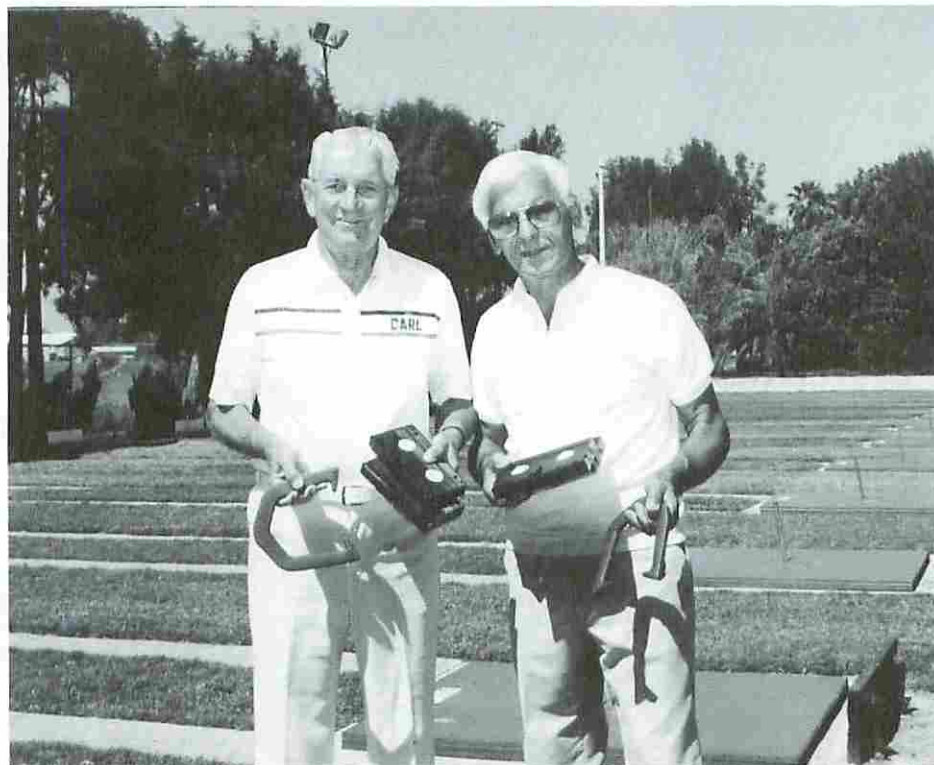

TIPS FROM THE TOP

Here are some tips and suggestions that have helped me maintain a high ringer average over the last 50 years.

Equipment: Make sure you have a horseshoe that fits your hand. Ask your friends that have different models to let you try them. You may like more weight in the front of the shoe or the rear. No two pitchers throw the same way.

Shoes: Make sure you wear a pair of walking shoes that have a good flat solid sole (not sneakers). If your foot on the last step rolls only a fraction it could throw off your alignment as much as four inches.

Relax: I would like to stress how important it is to relax. You have heard many pitchers say how they tightened up near the end of a game. What I do is just before I start my swing I exhale and let the air out of my body. If the air is in your body you are stiff and tense. By letting the air out before you swing you are loose

and limber. Watch a pro basketball player when he throws a foul shot. The first thing he does is let the air out of his body. The same thing is true for a baseball pitcher before he throws the ball.

The Swing: The three most common faults a pitcher has are as follows:

1. He holds the shoe up in front of him before he starts his down swing. The weight of the horseshoe makes his wrist and arm tight. Swing your arm back and forth a couple of times to make sure your arm is loose.

2. Don't start your forward swing until you start to step forward. It is best if you can have your swing almost at your side when your last step is completed.

3. When you start your swing, relax and bend your knees. With your downward swing and your knees bent it will seem like you are pitching 39 feet instead of 40.

Alignment: The most important part of the game. If you are a right

hand player, 9 out of 10 will miss to the right of the peg. Left handed player just the opposite. The reason for this is that the foot that you pitch off of is not lined up to the other peg. For a right handed player, if you miss make sure you miss on the left side of the peg. By that I mean if the spin of your shoe is coming in from the left you have three more inches to make a ringer. One of the greatest pitchers who ever lived, Elmer Hohl, had an imaginary peg of about 1 to 1½ inches to the left of the peg that he aimed at.

If you are pitching first, aim the first shoe about 1 to 2 inches up on the peg. If the first shoe is on aim 3 inches up on the peg for the second shoe. The same with the 3rd and 4th pitch. Always try to hit the peg first and come down on top of the other ringers. You will not lose as many ringers.

Concentration: The hardest part in becoming an "A" player is concentration. What I have done for the past 50 years to block the other player from my mind is to keep track of how many ringers you make every 10 pitches. Also, never talk to an opponent during a game. If you miss a ringer you have 40 feet to walk and think what you did wrong.

Other suggestions and etiquette:

The best way to practice is to use 2 pair of shoes. One pair is yours and the other pair is a player who is better than you. You will be surprised how many more ringers you will make.

Don't watch opponents shoes. When your opponent is pitching stand on the opposite walk and do not move your arms or body until the other player has completed throwing both shoes.

Don't wash the clay off of your shoes unless you paint them. Two or three coats of paint will deaden the horseshoe and you will not lose as many ringers.

I Remember Levittown

A Profile on Carl Steinfeldt

1976...my first World Tournament. I was so excited and looking forward to seeing and perhaps meeting some of our horseshoe legends — Hohl, Day, Seibold, Henton, Zadroga, West, Maddox, and Steinfeldt. I introduced myself to Ralph Maddox in the hotel parking lot, stopped Curt Day in a hallway, and talked to Red Henton and Bob West on the courts. I pitched in the Intermediates, set a world record of 566 shoes pitched, had a 3-4 record, and averaged 67.0%. I was happy.

That is *not* why I remember Levittown. I remember it because of the final night of pitching...Aug. 8th. It couldn't be termed a 'nice' night...not at 2 a.m. in the morning. A chilly, damp fog had everyone wrapped in coats and sweaters. It was definitely not a good night...not for the two who had tied for the world championship. They'd be pitching off under a 'best 2 out of 3' rule in effect at that time.

I sat in the sparsely filled bleachers two seats right of a nice looking lady. The man next to me volunteered the information that she was the wife of the one throwing left handed. I looked again. She was tense...her hands clenched tightly together...her eyes riveted on the two players below. The game started. The lefty, even tho' throwing a creditable 75.7% for 74 shoes, was crushed by his opponent's incredible 89.2% ringers. I heard a small sob. Looking over, I saw the lady hastily wiping away a tear (possibly two) from her eyes. I heard her say, "Oh no. Not again! I guess it just isn't meant to be."

But it *was* meant to be. I didn't know it at the time but I was about to witness one of the great comebacks in the history of our horseshoe world. The second game was a cliff hanger...right down to the last two shoes. Score...47-46. Pressure time! Lefty, showing no crack in his armor, calmly threw two. His opponent, unbelievably, missed both, losing 53-46 to an 84.8% gem in 138 shoes.

One game each. One to go. I looked again at the woman. Hands still clenched, held high in front, up under her chin, almost as if she were saying a prayer. Perhaps she was, but her face had changed. It was brighter. Was that a ray of hope showing there? I thought so and also thought of the 100's of other women who have sat in the same situation, pulling and hoping for their sons, daughters, and husbands. Who was it said, "They also serve who only sit and wait?"

Game 3. Two great pitchers. One with 3 world championships; the 'other' hoping to win his first. He'd come so close before, finished second twice. It's now or never, he told himself. *I can* do it.

In a 114 shoe game, the 'other' reached deep into the reserve that champions seem to have, pulled out an 89.5% game to his opponents 83.3% and won, 52-31. After years of being one of the best, enduring one frustration after another, *Carl Steinfeldt*, at 58 years 10 months, the oldest man to ever win a W.T., had made it to the top. There was some woman over to my left, crying, and saying something like, "I'm so happy!" (Now why, after 37 years of watching every game her husband pitched, would Bea Steinfeldt cry...if she was so happy?)

There can be little doubt that this game was the high point of Carl's career. From his earliest W.T. days, his life has been filled with great games. Some he won. Some he didn't. He entered his first W.T. in 1953, the hey-day of Ted Allen, Fernando Isais, Don Titcomb, Casey Jones, and Guy Zimmerman — as tough a bunch of horseshoe pitchers a rookie ever faced. He finished 8th with a 23-12 record. In '54, he moved up to 5th during which he lost a memorable 146 game shoot out with Isais, 50-45 while pitching 82.8% vs Fernando's 84.2%.

It is probably safe to say that no one has more 'long' games than Carl Steinfeldt. In addition to the Isais game:

- 1960 176 shoes. Don Titcomb, 88.6%. Carl, 87.5. Lost.
- 1964 170 shoes. Elmer Hohl, 85.3%. Carl, 88.2. Won.
- 1965 138 shoes. Hohl again, 84.0%. Carl, 81.0. Lost.
- 1968 162 shoes. John Rademacher 87.0%. Carl, 90.1. Won.
- 144 shoes. Hohl again, 88.2% Carl, 86.8. Lost.
- 1974 130 shoes. Glen Henton, 83.1%. Carl, 87.7. Won.

Although there were many games in the 100-130 shoe range, those shown above are evidence enough to state unequivocally that here was a man who could pitch with the best, who *was* one of the best, who, although not always winning the big ones, was able to take the pressure time after time.

Carl Steinfeldt's life was not an easy one, particularly in the early years. As a boy, he was denied the pleasures of playing baseball, bas-

ketball, and football — games he truly loved. Osteomyelitis, an infection of bone marrow and bone structure was the villain. For years, Carl was a cripple, wearing a steel brace on his leg, waiting for the bone structure to grow back. Age 14! A year to remember! The brace came off. Not being able to compete in his high school sports, he turned to horseshoes and the beginning of a great career.

In discussing this with Carl, I mentioned it must have been tough 'babying' his leg all these years. His response? "Shed no tears for me. I had a 200 average in bowling and have broken 80 in golf. *I consider myself a very lucky guy.*"



Carl, your record for winning major events is pretty impressive — one W.T., 22 New York State championships, 10 straight Florida ones, 10 Eastern National titles, and 4 straight at the Dogwood festival in N. Carolina You've pitched against all the best. Who, in your opinion, was the best?

I had the good fortune to pitch against Allen, Isais, Jones, Zimmerman, Titcomb, Reno, Hohl, and Day. My vote goes to Zimmerman.

Guy had the easiest and greatest swing of all pitchers. He was one of the 'Big Four' (Allen, Isais, Jones), won the W.T. in '54 with 84.2% and in two others averaged 86.1% and 86.0%. His untimely death at age 53 ended a brilliant career.

I've known you for 20 years. You have the reputation (whether you know it or not) of telling it as it is. As a 60 year lifetime NHPA member, give Newsline readers some of your thoughts about improving our organization.

O.K. I have many I could give. Here, I think, are the important ones. *First*, put the foul line even with the peg. I have advocated this for 20 years. *Second*, junior boys and girls 9-14 years of age should pitch from 30 feet. Boys, 15-18, should move to 35 feet. It is too hard for them to go from 30 to 40 feet in one step. That's why we have had only a handful of juniors staying with the game. *Third*, play a 24 game round robin with no more than 5 games a night in the championship division. That is enough for W.T. play. *Fourth*, NHPA officials should be much stricter with the players. Players should not get lost for 10-15 minutes or longer between games. *Fifth*, all sanctioned league members should be full NHPA members. If pitching horseshoes in a fine organization is not worth \$10.00, we don't need them.

Thanks for your thoughts. Now let's talk about the future for a minute. You're now 73. Everyone knows that things get a little tougher as one grows older. You're the only man to win a world's championship in the Men's Open, the Intermediates, and the Seniors. Your 85.3% ringer average in the Intermediates is destined to be a W.T. record for a long time. This year at Stone Mountain, Georgia, you'll be shooting at Ray Hill's 76.6% record. How are your chances?

At this stage in life, Ray's record will be hard to beat, but I'll be there...trying.

Trying says it all. That's the story of Carl's life. No matter what the obstacles were, he never gave up. Yes, I remember Levittown...but most of all, I remember a man named Steinfeldt.

Sanctioned Club/League News by Bev Born

These figures are for 1989 only and include only those clubs that are still sanctioned and in good standing. Thought perhaps club directors and charter officers would be interested in seeing the figures. This will enable charter officials and regional directors to realize just how many pitchers there are in your state/regions that have not yet joined the NHPA and are missing out on the benefits of holding a 'full' membership and also that are not supporting their home states or the NHPA. With a total of 7427 sanctioned CL/LG members, not quite half of them are 'full' NHPA card holders, NHPA 3634, Non-NHPA 3793.

I am pleased to report that several of the clubs that have reported for 1990, have gone to total NHPA,

instead of waiting till it becomes mandatory for next year and others are being very positive about their clubs remaining in the program, by their members willingly accepting this change.

Nine of the original thirteen charter clubs are still sanctioned, this is terrific. Twelve years, will they make it to fifteen? We'll sure be rooting for them.

Twenty-two new 1990 sanctions have been issued as of May 1990 in sixteen states, which brings the number of states participating to forty-one. Just think, that if at the end of 1991, we would have these current numbers or more, all total NHPA, what that would mean to the growth of our great organization at both the state and national levels.

Floyd and I would like to take this opportunity to give our sincere thanks to all of you who showed concern, tried to call and gave your thoughts to us after the tornado that hit Shattuck on the 24th of April. To all of you that we have not talked with, we want you to know that the Good Lord was with us, as both our home and ourselves were spared. We had considerable damage to our store building, but also lucked out there, as it could have been so much worse. Some buildings on Main Street were completely demolished. The whole town and its residents, considering, all fared well, no deaths and only five minor injuries.

Toll Of Time

MELVIN UTLEY

Melvin H. Utley of Mt. Prospect, IL., was born August 12, 1915, and passed away March 23, 1990 at age 74. Survived by his wife Marge, a son Dean and a daughter Karen Utley Dewaard. He pitched in the men's championship at the World Tournament at Fargo, N.D. in 1967. He was the recipient of the Hal Lieber Award for outstanding first year entrant. He won 14 games with an average of over 70%. Posted victories over such top-notchers as Elmer Hohl, Floyd Toole, Ralph Maddox, Jim Solomon and Ellis Griggs. His high game was 84.2% against E. Hohl. He also had games of 83.3% and 80.4% against H. Anthony and H. Rogers respectively. He started pitching in Chicago in 1940 and played in tournaments for over 35 years. In 1968 he set a qualifying record for 100 S.P. with 82 ringers, 261 points. He had finished as high as 2nd and 3rd in the IL. State Tournament. Poor health curtailed his pitching in the last several years. Melvin pitched left handed with a 1¼ turn and a very smooth delivery.

World Tournament Horseshoe Trivia

■ In 1948 there were 36 90% games plus one 100% game. Tommy Brownell had three, Fernando Isaacs had four, Ted Allen had six, Guy Zimmerman had ten plus the 100% and Casey Jones had thirteen.

■ In 1960-61, Harold Reno had 38 straight W.T. game wins and if Ted Allen hadn't beat him in the last game of the last night of 1961, Reno would have reached 64 consecutive wins because he won the first 25 in 1962.

■ In 1979 Walter Ray Williams Jr. lost his last nine world tournament games. This was followed by a 41 game winning streak in 1980 and 81 and would have been 67 consecutive wins if he hadn't lost to Ben Wiedrich of Oregon by one point in 1981.

■ In 1988, the Williams brothers did a number on Richard Pintor of Colorado. Nathan beat him 45-1 while Walter won 40-0.

■ Harold Reno and Curt Day's longest games were against each other. In 1965, Harold beat Curt 51-48 in 180 shoes. Ringers were 160-159.

■ In 1981, Ronnie Simmons pitched six consecutive games of over 100 shoes.

■ In 1988, Merlin Potts and son Roger beat Bill Graham by the same 40-36 score.

■ Elmer Hohl's lifetime W.T. record was 657 wins - 123 losses.

■ In 1989, the biggest difference between entering percentage and actual pitched percentage was recorded by Walter Ray Williams Jr. and Jim Cooper. Walter finished 12.1% below his entering 88.1% while Cooper finished 13% above his entering 44.2%.

■ Jim Knisley got his 200th win in his 300th game.

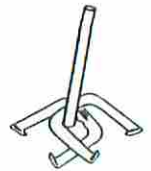

With the return of the snowbirds to their northern habitats, activity at the 16 Florida State Horseshoe Pitchers Association (FSHPA) courts has diminished but not ceased. Bonafide Florida resident pitchers, on April 21, 1990, competed in the CLOSED FSHPA



Championship tournament in Clearwater's Ed Wright Park.

Hosted by members of the Clearwater Horseshoe Pitchers' Club (CHCP), 87 quality pitchers vied for top honors in the Men's Div., Senior Men's Div. (70 yrs. plus...30 footers) and Women's Div.

Indomitable Carl Steinfeldt of the CHPC won, for the 11th consecutive time, the FSHPA Championship with a high game of 94.4 percent (17 out of 18 shoes) and a final average of 72.2 percent. Pitching his "Steinfeldt Sta-On" horseshoes, he established a new record, exceeding John Rademacher's record of 10 straight FSHPA titles. When commended for fantastic pitching at age 72, Carl said, "Don't let that get around." Ha! Like "Old man river, he just keeps rollin' along." The '76 World Champion has a long list of titles, to wit: '78 World Intermediate and '88 World Senior Championships; 22 times New York State and now 11 Florida titles. Furthermore, he's a triple Hall of Famer...NHPA, N.Y. and Fla. He's surely Florida's Mr. Horseshoes.

Paul Scheub of the Sarasota Horseshoe Pitchers' Club, who had been in the shadow of Steinfeldt for years while pitching from the 40 ft. distance, switched to the 30 ft. (FSHPA Sr. Div. distance) and clinched the Sr. Div. title with a high game of 82.4 percent and a final average of 74.8 percent. This was a handicap class.

The FSHPA Women's Div. was dominated by vivacious Marge Spray with a 60.8 percent average. The CHPC member took all honors in this handicap class.
