President's Message

How do you spell communication? NEWSLINE might be the reply of an informed horseshoe pitcher. Certainly that has been one of my goals since the introduction of this new magazine. It's still an unknown to many of our fellow members and that presents a challenge to all current readers. COMMUNICATE by showing *Newsline* around at your tournaments, at your club play, at your meetings or just a gathering of players out for some fun at the local park courts. Schools, libraries, senior centers and recreation departments are other good sources to leave *Newsline*.

To help you get copies to show around or start a historical record keeping of back copies, we have a special offer. In most months, the printer runs extra copies, sometimes a hundred or more, sometimes only 50. These extra 1989 copies are in storage. \$2.00 a copy is the normal price for a specific back copy that is sent by first or third class mail. However, if you just want some copies and don't care what months are sent, I will make 2-4 copies available for \$1.00 each with further copies at 50 cents each. For requests of multiple quantities, I will endeavor to give you an assortment of different issues subject to available stock. They will be sent by third class mail or UPS, depending on the quantity. Remember, unless you want only one issue @ \$2.00, you can't specify the month. Help communicate with back *Newsline* copies. Send your request and payment to: Newsline, 13656 Thoroughbred Loop, Grass Valley, CA 95949.

For your information, we started 1989 by mailing the January issue to 2475 subscribers. We ended the year by

mailing 2726 copies in December. The quantity varies every month as new subscribers are obtained, some drop and others forget to renew on time. The September mailing was the largest with 2755 copies while March was the smallest with just 2330. Overall, we produced ten regular and one special "Results Only" issue. These eleven issues combined for regular mailings of 28,562 copies or an average of 2597 per issue. In addition, late renewals accounted for a further 300 back copies being mailed out.

If you look at the monthly average as being the approximate number of *Newsline* subscribers, multiply that by \$11.00 (average price paid), you arrive at a total of \$28,567 in subscription revenue. Add to that about \$7500 in ad revenue and we have a total *Newsline* income of about \$36,000. The eleven issues of *Newsline* costs us a total of \$49,560. Our loss was some \$13,560, or about \$5.22 per subscriber.

These figures are strictly those of the Editor and do not include miscellaneous income or expenses that goes through our Secy./Treas. His fiscal year end report will give the actuals but they will be in the proximity of mine with adjustments considered for my calendar year report versus a fiscal year that ends March 31st. The bottom line is that we need a rate increase for *Newsline* subscriptions. This should come as no surprise as the former *News Digest* also lost money. The Delegates at the 1990 convention can expect some alternative proposals to make *Newsline* a more cost effective communication tool. Please keep an open mind!

■ Within two years, we lost two NHPA Vice Presidents from the same family, Gene and Mary Van Sant. In their honor, I have established the "Gene & Mary Van Sant Memorial Award". This award of a beautiful plaque will be given annually to the Regional Director who best displays the attitude, work ethic and initiative of an RD in fulfilling his/her duties upholding the image and extending the recognition of the NHPA.

■ Congratulations and welcome are extended to Maui, Hawaii. A new NHPA Charter has just been issued as that island presented us with a fine Constitution and By-Laws and a \$450 check for 50 new NHPA members. Much of the hard work was done by the new Maui President, Maile Sombelon.

■ Donnie Roberts recently made a visit to Michigan where he met with Charter President Fred Smith and officials of the Easter Seal Society. They plan to have a big fund raising tournament May 26-27 in the Wonder Dome in Woodhaven. This is your chance to pitch in an impressive facility and at the same time, support Easter Seals. ■ Let me say thanks again to the Lake Worth, Florida Horseshoe Club and in particular, Herman and Louisa Wieser. They sent to Cathie and I, a beautiful engraved

plaque as a remembrance of our visit to the White House and in appreciation of our work for the NHPA.

■ It happened, or nearly happened, in Yuma, Arizona. On December 8th, four Marines from the nearby Marine Corps Air Station set out on a Horseshoe Pitching Marathon. Their goal of 100 hours was to set a new Guinness Book World Record by shattering the 96 hour record for continuous horseshoe pitching. Donations and pledges were taken for the American Red Cross. Pitching for the most part in strong winds and temperatures just above freezing, the four Marines abandoned their run about 8 hours short of the current record. Surprisingly, none of the four young men were aware of the NHPA when they started with their picnic shoes. However, some of our members made contact and offered support for a second try.

■ At the Las Vegas Showboat tournament a pitcher with a familiar name from Iowa was seen to deposit his horseshoes in a big trash barrel after a particularly bad game. I wonder if he later snuck back to retrieve them.

■ For you Tournament Directors, results of "Doubles Tournaments" are not normally published in *Newsline*. We have too many regular events to publish and team percentages have little value in NHPA record keeping.

Soul of a shoe

Two long-time pitchers taught me the sport of horseshoes about three years ago. They patiently explained the rules of horseshoes in careful detail stressing the importance of the foul line, equipment specifications, and good sportsmanship. Then they stepped back and quoted a philosophy.

"This is an individual sport! It will only be through your own efforts of discipline that you will improve!"

After three years and some 185,000 pitched shoes I still consider myself a novice but one that has become a force to be reckoned with. My new self-confidence is beginning to progress beyond the local level, but what I see and hear around me gives me serious concern for the future of the sport and the image that the NHPA wants to portray.

It is with fresh eyes that I have experienced all the disciplines of the sport fall into a quagmire of interpretations and opinions. 30 footers verses 40 footers — foul lines that are moved by the release of the shoe and shoes that do not conform to specifications. All these arguments are nothing but a rationalization for taking advantage of your own lack of effort, discipline and sportsmanship. A ringer is only three points and you can cheat and lie but can you really lie to the soul of that shoe.

The value is in your own efforts of discipline and honesty because this game is not about pounding the game of the guy next to you but about the soul of your own shoes to ring loudly and clearly.

Regional Director's Report

Sam Finfrock, Assistant Regional Director for **Arizona** (Yuma) went to Quartzsite, AZ on January 21, 1990 and certified their 16 new courts. They have a tournament February 2-4, 1990 and are expecting in excess of 200 entries. Good Luck.

Dale Boss, Regional Director for **Colorado** reports that Colorado now has a Hall of Fame building. The Denver Club has indoor courts at a sports club in Commerce City, CO. They will hold their first sanctioned tournament there in April 1990. They report that they have all their percentages on computer now, thereby eliminating "Sand Baggers". 1989 State Champions are: Men-Paul LaCrosse, Women-Janie Thompson, Juniors-Joey Myers. Congratulations to all.

Jim Shilling, Regional Director for **Indiana** reports another successful season for Indiana. State Champions are: Men-Mark Seibold, Women-Sue Snyder, Jr. Girls-Dana Taulbee, and Jr. Boys-Aron Robinson. Congratulations to all. There are 33 sanctioned tournaments scheduled for 1990. They have indoor courts at Auburn, Whiting, Corydon and Stroh (Rathburns). These all offer sanctioned tournaments during the winter months. David Herring was elected to the Indiana Hall of Fame.

Chuck Arnold, Regional Director for **Oklahoma**, reports that membership is up. They had a record number of tournaments, and people in OK are excited about horseshoes. When the media found out President Bush pitches horseshoes, they wanted information on horseshoes. One reporter was surprised when informed that horseshoe pitching is among the hardest sports. The thing about horseshoes is it gives us an opportunity to compete, to be put under pressure, to have to concentrate for 45 minutes, and the first one to lose concentration is usually the one that loses the game. The reporter left understanding that horseshoes is truly a sport and not just a recreational activity. Thanks, Mr. President, for your example. 1989 State Champions are: Men-Jerry Holt (3rd title), Women-Linda Frederick (4th title), Jr. Boys-Michael

Davidson (2nd title), Jr. Girls-Pamala Morris (1st title), and Senior Men-Ed Moody (1st title). Congratulations to all.

Bob McCharen, Regional Director for **Texas**, reports a record 268 entries for the 1989 State Tournament at the Lost Pine Horseshoe Club in Bastrop, TX. **Louis Parker**, ARD in **West Texas**, is reporting a new club in Crosbyton, TX and they held a "Charity Tournament" during their annual "Festival and Fish Fry" during this summer. **Jeff Gaston**, ARD in **North Texas**, reports a new club in Waco, TX. The Kilo Bay Club will be hosting the 1990 State Tournament on Oct. 19 & 20, 1990. Jeff Gaston was elected into the Texas Hall of Fame also. Congratulations. Waco, TX was the site for the 1989 Doubles State Tournament and will host the 1991 Singles State Tournament. A record 30 tournaments are scheduled for 1990.

Jack Adams, Regional Director for **Canada**, reports that 1989 was the 60th year of organized horseshoes in Canada. Halifax, Nova Scotia held the 1989 Canadian Championships. The winners were: Men-Clayton English, Ladies-Diane Cantin, Jr. Boys-Edward Neeb, Jr. Girls-Koralee Malinowski, Sr. Men-Howard Weitzel, Intermediate Men-Irvin Finnie, Intermediate Ladies-Mary Archer, and Sr-Sr Men (30 ft) -Arnold Hogg. Diane Cantin pitched a perfect game in game #8 (24 of 24) and had a tournament record 88%. The 1990 Championships will be held in Portage, La Prairie, Manitoba on August 9-12, 1990. This is 20 years after the National Championships were last held in their province.

Norman Rousey, Regional Director of **Alaska** reports that they have 4 indoor pits built by the American Legion of Peters Creek, AK. They can now pitch year round. Jack Pennick and State President Carol Lane have been instrumental in starting a league in Anchorage during the summer. Alaska now has 68 NHPA members.

Sue Johnson, Regional Director for **Arizona** reports that the Yuma Horseshoe Pitchers Association par-

ticipated in the Cibola High Sports Fair on March 22, 1989 and the Yuma High Sports Fair on May 17, 1989. Two horseshoe courts were set up and instructions were given on how to play horseshoes. Approximately 60 to 70 boys and girls participated at each high school. As a result, 14 youths participated in the 1989 Arizona State Horseshoe Tournaments hosted by the Yuma Horseshoe Club. In Tucson, the Parks and Recreation Department is spending \$60,000 on new non-reflecting lights, bleachers and asphalt between the courts. This will be completed before the 1990 Arizona State Tournament in Tucson in April 1990.

Marion Hawley, Regional Director of **Northern California** reports that they scheduled 109 tournaments for 1989 of which 102 were played with approximately 50 entries for each. The California State Tournament was held at the Yolo Country Club in Davis, CA, with over 200 entrants. The tournament was run by Jerry Smith, NCHPA 3rd Vice-President. The yearly NCHPA business meeting was held at Stockton, CA on October 28th. NCHPA officers for 1990 are: Don Titcomb, President; Billie Sue Pennington, 1st Vice-President; Casey Sluys, 2nd Vice-President; Jerry Smith, 3rd Vice-President; Ken Brown, 4th Vice-President; Gail Sluys, Secretary/Treasurer; Carol Casados, Women's Representative; and Glenn Jamison, Statistician. Southern Area Assistant Regional Director, Genevieve Lavett is in the process of forming two new clubs at Fresno and Salinas.

Arthur Felgenhauer, Regional Director of **Illinois**, reports that the Kinderhook Horseshoe Club built nine new clay courts during the 1989 summer season. Jim Spidle is the Assistant Regional Director for that region. They held the 2nd Annual Lloyd Fuhrman Memorial Tournament at these courts. They are planning a mixed league and a new singles league for 1990.

Clint Bryson, Regional Director for **North and South Dakota**, reports that both states had good State Tournaments. South Dakota had 23 sanctioned tournaments and North

Dakota had eight sanctioned tournaments in 1989. Marvin Hackett, North Dakota Secretary, said he expects more in 1990.

Marie Wetzel, Regional Director of **Pennsylvania**, reports that the Marion Center Horseshoe Club hosted the 1989 State Tournament. The 1988 State Champions retained their titles: Men - Glenn Burris, Women - Grace Rugg, and Juniors - Fred Powell Jr. They hadn't hosted the State Tournament there since 1985. One of their big goals for 1990 is to interest young people in the sport of horseshoes.

Donald Jones, Assistant Regional Director of **Wyoming**, reports that the Afton, WY Recreational Department has been contacted about building horseshoe courts. Also, a letter was sent to the Governor asking him to come to the State Tournament and toss out the first shoe and partake in the opening ceremonies.

HOW WELL DO YOU KNOW THE RULES?

What Happens Now?

A pitched shoe hits foul, rolls into the pit and dislodges an opponent's ringer. What is the ruling?

The foul shoe shall be removed from play, but *all* other shoes must stay where they are. The rule says that disruption caused by a foul shoe cannot be repaired or replaced.

During a game, a stake becomes dislodged from its original position or breaks. What is the proper procedure to follow?

If the stake becomes dislodged or breaks on the impact of the fourth and last shoe of an inning and both contestants agree as to how the inning should be scored, it is OK to score that inning. However, if they cannot agree (or are unsure of the proper scoring), or if there is/are one or more shoes left to be pitched in the inning, the inning shall be voided and repitched. The tournament committee may move the game to another court or complete it at a later time as conditions permit.

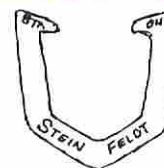

Ted Allen

Ten-time World horseshoe pitching champion Ted Allen passed away at his home in Boulder, Colorado, Wednesday, January 24, 1990. His health had been deteriorating for several months. He was 81.

This was one of Ted's favorite pictures.

Taken at one of the rodeo shows, it shows the portable box he carried with him at all times.



Allen's name has been synonymous with horseshoe pitching since he broke into World competition during the Chicago World's Fair as a 24-year old phenomenon, winning the title on his first try. Starting in 1922 he had been the pitching force in Colorado, winning 10 state titles. He could have won many more had he chosen to compete statewide after he entered the World Tournament arena. He had also won California and Oregon State Championships.

Ted competed in 31 World Championships, and in the first 19 he won 10, finished second five times, third and fourth twice. After he dropped to seventh in 1960, his percentage hovered around the 80% mark for five more years before he slipped down the ladder. However, Ted continued to compete even though his ability waned in those later years. An injured shoulder certainly didn't help.

He was a tough competitor, depending on ability, confidence and top physical condition to carry him to victory through the long rigors of World action. He continued to exercise after his pitching days in 1973 by taking two horseshoes in each hand and swinging them like dumbbells.

During the heart of his heyday in pitching, Ted designed his own shoes in 1938 and began producing them until his death.

Ted Competed in Thirty-One World Championships.

1933 was the magic year for Allen, the year he arrived on the scene, and through the years made an everlasting impression on the sport of horseshoe pitching. At that tender age of 24, Ted defeated five-time World Champion Charlie Davis, 50-27 and 50-28 in a two-out-of-three playoff.

Ted's seventh World Championship was won in 1955. This had to be his most convincing by far. He had seven 90 percent games, four of them over 95%. He had 12 other games over 85%. The Allen Legend was growing and he would eventually be named the "Babe Ruth of Horseshoes." Although short in height, Ted stood like a giant! It was said of him in 1956, "This great pitcher of the 1 1/4 turn has become as fine wine — getting better with age."

One of the memorable wins for Allen was the 1940 game against Guy Zimmerman, who was destined to become the 1954 World Champion. Trailing 21-3 at Des Moines, the defending champion rallied to win, 50-48, shooting 26 and 20 straight ringers during the middle of the game.

During the first 19 years beginning in 1933, Allen or California's Fernando Isais won the World title, except for 1954 when Zimmerman went undefeated to take the championship.

During World competition, Ted held many records. Four remain unbeatable at this writing. He tossed 72 consecutive ringers in a game against Cletus Chapelle in 1955, compiled 771 victories in 989 games in those 31 years. His 187 ringers in 200 shoes and 87 doubles also in 1955 will stand forever since this type qualifying is not used today. His all-time world average was 79.46.

The four closest present day championship class pitchers and their victory totals are as follows: Jim Knisley 488, Mark Seibold 459, Don Titcomb 450 and Walter Ray Williams Jr. 297.

Ted Allen, World Class horseshoe pitcher, horseshoe manufacturer, performer at

rodeos, theater, sports and horse shows, exhibition and trick shot pitcher, was inducted into the National Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame as a charter member in 1966 and the Colorado Hall of Fame as a charter member in 1982. He was "on the road" for 40 years.

"I had to make a living and horseshoe pitching was my life"...

"I had to make a living and horseshoe pitching was my life," Ted had said. He strutted his ability four years in a row in Madison Square Garden and the Boston Gardens, and several times was booked in the middle of the program with the Roy Rogers and

Gene Autry extravaganzas.

Ted did not always pitch Allen shoes. In his first Colorado State Tournament in 1921, he used a pair of hand-me-downs from his father — brand name unknown. He won his first state title the following year at the tender age of 14. Allen used Mossman shoes in the late 20's, pitched Gordons in 1933 and 1934, then changed to Lattore's in 1935. The early 1920's found Ohio's making ringers for the youngster.

In the 1950's it has been noted that over 75% of all World Championship entries pitched "Allens"...and a large percentage of today's pitchers might be using them if he had been able to fill orders.

At 81 years of age, failing health slowed his output of horseshoes to the many pitchers who had ordered them. On Tuesday, the day before he passed away, Ted related to me that he had diabetes and had two mild heart attacks, which showed up on the autopsy.

Operating out of his home at 145 Linden in Boulder, Ted had said he was about 1000 orders behind in producing his shoes. One must know one thing — his business was a one-man operation. He ground his shoes outdoors, painted, packaged and mailed them from Boulder. A few times he received grinding help from his nephew, Jack Stevenson from Kansas and Ken Raymond from Wyoming.

As soon as close relatives can find Ted's will, a decision will be made concerning the future of the Allen Horseshoe.

To be in the company of the "Giant" has been a great feeling. Our long and frequent visits to Furrs Cafeteria in Boulder were always memorable experiences. Many of the experiences he related would have been a part of the book Ted wanted to write. He never could find the time.

Let's take the liberty to suggest a title for his memoirs and remember Ted Allen for things he did accomplish. The title could be *Ringers*.

Las Vegas Open

Blow some whistles, toot some horns. The Las Vegas Open rang in this horseshoe year with a splash.

438 pitchers, a new big number, made all events at the Showboat resemble mob scenes. Most all of the entrants and their guests, conservatively 600, freely attended the welcoming cocktail party gratis loading up on hors d'oeuvres and drinks while the classes were being formed behind the scene.

Donnie Roberts said, "Relax", things are moving along. Meanwhile, he explained a few ground rules. The portable courts were a compact 2 by 2½ feet of "Klean Klay" (synthetic) about 2 inches deep. Shoes contacting the rubber front or back would count. Only the shoes off the concrete would be ruled foul. Upset your opponent, he suggested, bounce a ringer off the backstop. As Roberts entertained the troops, twenty-some handicappers were feverishly setting up the seed for 18 mixed classes of 24 to 25 pitchers each. From "A" thru "R", we were told, all classes would be paid the same through 12 places.

When the classes were posted and we finally could get close enough to the board, we discovered the handicap throughout the middle classes was almost non-existent, ranging from a zero at the top to a two, sometimes a three at the bottom of each twelve player section. The top and bottom classes were a different story. There the handicap varied to as much as twelve points per section. Is that why class "A" is hard to crack?

Monday morning the clinks, clanks, and sometimes the clucks began for real. Scorekeepers were no problem. At two dollars per forty shoe game many were willing to share the chore offsetting their own scoring expense or returning to the casino with bulging pockets. For three full days, 7:00 a.m. to plus or

minus midnight, pitchers worked their way through all 36 sections, playing sets of five, six, or seven games.

Walking past half-a-hundred bingo freaks and the quarter pumpers at 6:00 a.m. is a confusing experience. Who's crazy here? Certainly anyone tossing a curved piece of iron at another straight piece of iron from a distance of 30 or 40 feet and then expecting them to engage more often than not is a gambler of the first order. There are 'players' and there are pitchers and oft the twain are the same.

The Thursday finals was an easy day. Some dropped their only game: some went all the way. It was pitching under new pressure. Those fortunate enough to get near the top rungs were pitching for big money...

Wins and losses determined advancement. Total points earned settled the many ties. From the multi-colored result board we found who was in the top six: They would go into a ladder play-off. The next six cashed for \$50 each but no further play.

The Thursday finals was an easy day. Some dropped their only game: some went all the way. It was pitching under new pressure. Those fortunate enough to get near the top rungs were pitching for big money - \$75 or \$100 a game; the same money as class "A". Handicaps were re-adjusted based on the pre-lims and further proved the deciding factor for the ladder finals.

The "A" ladder: sixth seeded Dave Loucks outpointed Bonnie Seibold in the first match. But Billie Sue Pennington took Loucks on the

next rung. Pennington continued, winning her next two matches over Diane Lopez and then Vicki Winston. Number one seed, Nate Williams stopped Pennington in the final game. The award checks would read: Seibold, \$100; Loucks, \$110; Lopez, \$125; Winston \$175; Pennington, \$250; and Williams, \$350. Consider "A" only as an example. This day each of these six top finishers had a counterpart in seventeen other classes.

Donnie Roberts, co-director of this tournament and everlasting NHPA emcee, also conducted at the awards banquet introducing Don Weaver, the workhorse and other co-director who received much of the credit and most of the accolades. Don Gregson, California president, warmed up the banquet laying a little rap-beat on us confirming that California craziness. He was accompanied by some of the 102 fellow Californians who made the trip. We listened to Ed Quigley from out East who remembers more funny horseshoe stories than he had time to tell. He's a witty and entertaining man.

Roberts then called up to the forefront, 216 winners to collect their cash awards. About half of the entrants split up over \$25,000! Trophy plaques sponsored by St. Pierre, maker of American horseshoes, went to the top six in each class.

Some were not present to accept their awards. Three hundred party people were present following through and finishing this tournament in style. A \$25 ticket included the cocktail hour and banquet dinner served at the table. Maybe \$25 is heavy bread but someone had to pick up the tab for the "welcome" party held four days earlier.

Squelching all rumors, Weaver assured the audience that the Las Vegas Open tournament is a go for 1991 but the particular Glitter-town resort has not yet been chosen. Save up your nickles; this is a good one.

GEORGIA ON YOUR MIND

The 1990 World Tournament plans are all in place and the wheels are in motion to make the Stone Mountain tournament a real record setter.

Our promotion and advertising organization is putting the final touches on our campaign and local media is already beginning to anticipate the Atlanta happening for 1990.

Fundraising is always an issue before every World Tournament and our souvenir program is expected to produce a significant portion of the commitment. The tournament committee needs the support of the friends of horseshoes which are always nearby with their generous donations.

As we introduced at the Las Vegas Tournament, we would like to recognize these loyal supporters of horseshoe pitching with a special note. The artwork that has been commissioned for the front cover of the program is being painted by a locally noted artist whose paintings have drawn up to \$5000 in local galleries. The original painting will be awarded to one of the "Friends of Horseshoes" who care to donate \$35 to the tournament fund. This painting will have special significance to the 1990 tournament and will be awarded to the lucky "Friend" at the banquet ceremonies.

Speaking of banquets, we are planning to have a buffet dinner at the park Lakeside Center with the paddlewheeler "Grady" providing scenic trips up and down the picturesque lake beside the mountain during the cocktail hour before the banquet. Details will be provided in

subsequent issues of *Newsline*.

Hotel accommodations in the park area are ample but in order to get your choices it is recommended to make your reservation applications as soon as possible. As of January, 90 rooms have already been booked with reservations for 201 persons.

Camping facilities are filling up rapidly. Since the park is open to the public and July is the travel season, we urge you to make your plans as soon as possible.

Approximately 200 campsites have already been reserved by horseshoe pitchers. 120 sites with hook-ups remain and these will be filled rapidly.

Our raffle drawing for the round-trip airline tickets will be held April 7, 1990 and there's still time to get your \$1 tickets.

Folks planning to fly to the 1990 World Tournament can take advantage of significant discounts on our sponsor airline.

Delta is offering discount travel tickets for air fares to Atlanta. Arrangements can be made by calling Delta Air Lines toll free 1-800-241-6760 and making your reservations. Use the Delta Air Lines Code #U0675 to identify the tournament.

Plan to be in Stone Mountain, Georgia, July 23 to August 4 and bring the family. There will be lots to see and do.

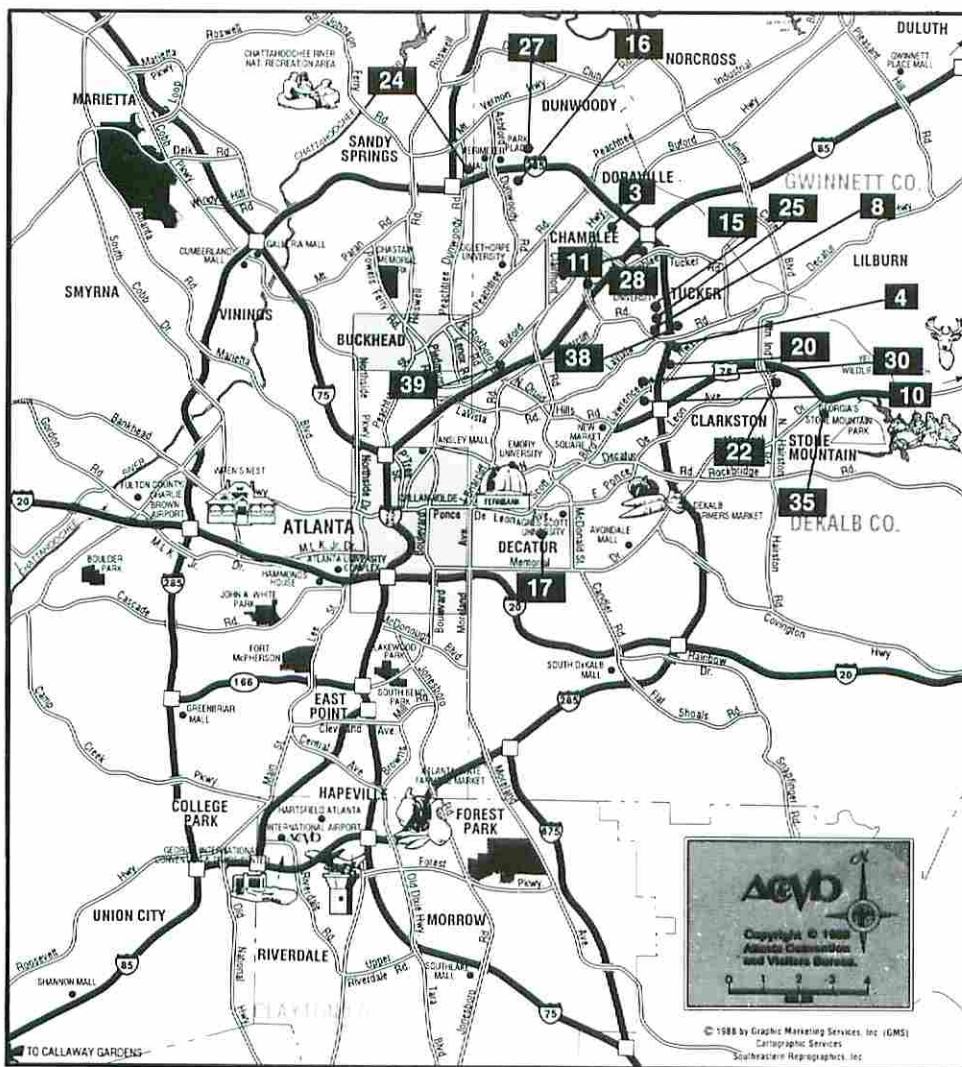

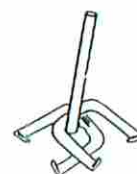

LEN LIPOVSKY

NHPA Regional Director by Bob Dunn

Len Lipovsky began pitching horseshoes at the young age of 10, in Boyceville, Wisconsin. Now some 52 years later, Lenny is one of the premier Minnesota pitchers. His early years of pitching were with shoes right off the horse, and it wasn't until 1966 that Len became aware of manufactured tournament pitching shoes and organized leagues. During the summer of 1966, Len noticed an announcement of a horseshoe tournament at Powder Horn Park in Minneapolis. The Lipovsky family, (including Renea and children Dale and Carole) attended the event, and the next year, Len joined the MGSHPA and the Minneapolis Horseshoe Club. Using professional pitching shoes made the sport much easier and Len averaged 50% ringers his first season of league play. He pitches Allen horseshoes, and now averages 65% with his 1 1/4 style.

Besides pitching in the Minneapolis and Bloomington clubs, Len has been an NHPA Regional Director for the past 8 years. Being semi-retired is helpful, for he is a very active Regional Director, attending many spring club meetings and

awards banquets, always doing a fine job of addressing the members and promoting the NHPA. Len also does a fine job for all state clubs, by having an article each month in the MGSHPA publication "Ringer Digest", communicating NHPA news and regional events.

Many may feel Len's claim to fame is being the father of three-time men's world champion, Dale Lipovsky. While being a fact, Len is quite an accomplished pitcher in his own right. To his credit are: a world class championship in 1981 (Class D), high place finishes the past two world tournaments in the Intermediate Division, and three runner-up trophies for Minnesota State Men's Championship. In the 1988 state tournament, Len placed 4th in Class A, with a 75% ringer average.

He finds the sport of horseshoe pitching so great, for you are on your own and success is dependent on nobody but yourself. Len also stated he enjoys meeting and visiting with all the fantastic people. When asked what might not be so good in our sport, Len made another of his typical statements, "Nothing that can't be overlooked."

Sanctioned Club/League News by Bev Born

A decision on the big issue that has been debated, pro, con and otherwise for over a year now, has been made. It has been a very hard decision to make in some ways, although I feel very confident that in the long run the right one has been chosen which will be for the benefit of all sanctioned CL/LG members, all state associations and the NHPA as a whole. Like all major changes in our organization, there will no doubt be a period of perhaps unsettling transition, after which I believe it will be accepted and appreciated by the majority, as was the insurance and *Newsline* magazine.

I sincerely hope that all clubs will join or remain in the program and that this change will not become any club's reason for not joining or for having their current active sanction cancelled.

As of January 1, 1991, it will be mandatory for all sanctioned clubs to be comprised of total "full" NHPA card holding members. After January 1, 1991, the CL/LG (\$5.00) membership card will no longer be available or valid for pitching with or membership in a sanctioned club or league.

It is further hoped that every member of a presently sanctioned club will give this ruling an honest and fair try. Although everything will remain the same, as in the past,

for the remainder of this year (1990), the officers of all clubs are now being asked to inform all members of this coming change and to incorporate this new rule into their club's constitution and by-laws for 1991, thereby preserving their sanction and strengthening our great program and organization.

What I am really asking is that you will all continue your confidence and support of your national CL/LG director and the sanctioned CL/LG program, as you have so graciously done in the past.

So that all will be informed, a copy of this article will be sent to all sanctioned club/league directors.

The Toll of Time

ARTHUR E. ADAMS

Horseshoe Canada lost one of their legend names with the October 1989 passing of Arthur Adams, father of NHPA Canadian Regional Director, Jack Adams. Art was 95 years old and a charter member of the Saskatchewan Horseshoe Players Hall of Fame. He was also inducted into the NHPA Hall of Fame in 1981. Art was a strong promoter of the game and for many years, pitched exhibitions and trick shows. He was so well thought of, that three streets were named in his honor.

TED ALLEN

One of the world's greatest pitchers ever, ten times a World Champion died January 24, 1990 at his home in Boulder, Colorado. Ted was 81 years old. Felt by many to be the greatest pitcher of all time, Allen played in 31 World Tournaments between 1933 and 1973. In his early pitching career, Ted spent 24 years putting on pitching exhibitions in barnstorming tours across the

United States, Canada and Cuba. He even spent some time with the Barnum & Bailey Circus and pitched in Madison Square Garden. In 20 of his World Tournaments, he averaged above 80% with 1955 being his best. He won the World Title that year with a 35-0 record and 86.4% avg. Ted was a charter member of the NHPA Hall of Fame and also a member of the Hall's selection committee.

WILL GULLICKSON

Minnesota lost one of its Hall of Fame members with the January 1990 death of Will Gullickson in Mesa, Arizona. Age 62, Will spent 40 years as a sports writer and had taken early retirement due to heart problems, only five weeks before his untimely death. A champion of promotion and pitching in the Fargo, ND and Moorhead area, Will set up many tournaments and was coordinator of the 1967 World Tournament in Fargo, an event for which he received the coveted NHPA Arch

Stokes Award. He also served a term as a Vice President of the NHPA and President of the MGSHPA. Will was a member of the NHPA Hall of Fame selection committee at the time of death.

DONALD N. KADDY SR.

The Massachusetts and New England associations were saddened to learn of the recent death of Donald Kaddy Sr. who died at age 70 after being stricken ill in his Fitchburg home. A member of the State and New England Hall of Fame, Don was a former two-time Massachusetts State Champion and in 1968, won the New England States title. In World Tournament play, Don won the Class "C" title in 1965 averaging 65.3%. A WWII army veteran who received a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star, he went to work for the Fitchburg Police Department where he retired in 1984 after 20 years. Don leaves his wife Shirley, three sons, one daughter and 12 grandchildren.
