2019 in Review

Now that 2019 is complete, it was a very busy year overall. We continued the Membership program by creating an incentive to new members by giving out new membership bags that consist of the Bag, T-shirt, and NHPA Ink pen. The program was announced and the information was posted in several locations by using various sources of media to get the word out.

As of 12/31/2019, the NHPA has 507 new members with 29 states reporting those new members for 2019. There may be more new members, but these are the members that received the membership bags. Congrats to all of the charters that participated. Please continue recruiting those new members and send us your lists.

The NHPA is continuing the program for 2020, so make sure that your charter secretaries send's us your new member information if you choose to participate regardless if you participated in 2019. If charters want to retain your adult and junior/cadet members, please remember that the new members need to feel "welcomed" and we want them to "Come Pitch with us". Remember, "Our Shoes Fit Everyone". We had several charters that did not participate for various reasons in 2019, so hopefully they will change their minds and get on board.

If your charter has new members, please wear your shirts proudly and take photos of your group or individuals and place them on the "Official" NHPA Facebook Page showing this logo on the page.

Here are the details if your charter would like to participate.

- We will require the new members NHPA Card number for 2020. The New member must have competed in a minimum of 2 NHPA sanctioned events (of course we encourage members to participate in more tournaments) before receiving a new membership bag by year end. If you feel that the new member will complete 2 events, go ahead and send me the information. It will be up the charter to hold on to the gift bag until the requirements are met. We will check the Natstats for the tournaments that have been completed and turned into Natstats. My email is: laurie_r@bellsouth.net so send me your list.
- State Secretaries will send me an email so that I can keep a spreadsheet of the bags for tracking purposes in order to justify the costs, the council will receive the report. I will mail out membership bags back to each state secretary which include a "Thank You" note directly to the individual for joining. In order to help personalize the note for your new member, I will need the name of your club and the new member's name.
- State secretaries and or promotion officers in your clubs may choose to add their own gift (but not required), brochures or any other information or items to the package and distribute the bag.
- On your list, please include the T-shirt size and color and NHPA Card Number. The colors are Grey, White, Pink, Yellow, Orange, Dark Purple, Navy Blue, and Safety Yellow.
- Shirt sizes are S-3X, if you need a larger size it will be a special order from my vendor, so get those into me first so that I can get those ordered in advance and send the entire order together. No Youth Sizes are available.



World Tournament Bidder Progress Report

We are getting back to North and West/Midwest sections of the US with cities bidding for 2023. The NHPA is very popular on the sports events conference circuit. Four such conferences are attended by NHPA representatives each year for the purpose of promoting the association and seeking the most appropriate venues for the World Tournament - and every timeslot for appointments is always filled each day.


This year, the NHPA officers realized very quickly how dramatically the marketing of all sports and the general way of doing sports business have changed in the past few years. A combined total of 248 appointments were made for all 4 conferences E - SPORTS (Formerly NASC), CONNECT, S.P.O.R.T.S. and TEAMS.

This year, there were a total of 10 cities that showed an interest in submitting a bid and we successfully have a guaranteed total of 4 out 10 bids submitted.

These cities are:

- Grand Island, NE
- Lansing Michigan
- Steven's Point, WI
- St. George, UT

The other cities, for several reasons, either waited until the last minute to submit or could not get the funds in time before the deadline or the venue was not completed to do a site visit. These same cities will be looking to submit a bid for 2023. The official deadline for these cities to submit their contracts and bid fees is January 1st of each year for consideration 2 years out.

History of Sanctioned Leagues

To appreciate the history of Sanctioned Leagues (SL), one must look at the overall history of organized horseshoe pitching. Horseshoes seems to have come from the game of quoits and the two games were intertwined in the early 1900's. The horseshoe pitching world was a man's game with various rules and measurements such as stake height and pitching distances. The first World tournament is credited to have occurred in 1909 and continued sporadically with various rules until the mid 1920's. The women's group was added in 1920 and the exact format of theses early tournaments is sketchy at best. The NHPA was incorporated in 1921 and the various groups of horseshoe



pitching organizations were consolidated into the NHPA in 1925. There is a Boys champion listed for 1924 and then is not mentioned again until 1951. The Senior Men started in 1960 and the Junior Girls and Intermediate Mens divisions started in 1967. The Elder's division started in 1982 followed by the Senior Woman in 1989. Cadets were added in 2003. The rules have changed and been added to over the years and will continue to change as situations occur and new ideas emerge. The early rule books were two or three small pages long, but I digress.

In the mid 70's, much like today, membership growth was a major concern. Based on the large number of horseshoe manufactures, horseshoe pitching was very popular throughout America but not so much through the NHPA. The father of sanctioned leagues, Russell Gadoury of Massachusetts, wrote an article in the November of 1976 Horseshoe Pitcher's News Digest suggesting the sanction league process as a way to publicize and grow our sport. He wrote that the NHPA had a "tournament mentality" and that the high cost of dues and lack of any benefits for pitchers hurt the membership process. He stated that half of the current club members were not NHPA members. He went on to suggest that the NHPA needed to change its priorities which at that time was the belief that "the skill of our best pitchers is the best way to sell our sport". He listed three solutions, here are his words.

"What are the new priorities needed? They are three. First, reduce the price of admission (dues) to a more acceptable level. Second, expand the Awards Program. Three, get the NHPA involved in league play, leagues that have weak pitchers as well as good ones. The Awards Program is the carrot to attract league pitchers".

He went on to be appointed the first NHPA League Coordinator. In that role he designed the awards, wrote the first Red Book, set up the record keeping system, managed the distribution of awards, and acted as advisor to clubs forming leagues. The Sanctioned League Program started in 1978 with 13 clubs from eight different states. Some 806 pitchers participated that year. By 1982, there were 92 clubs from 29 states and 4064 pitchers were involved. Six of the original clubs are still active and last year there were about 100 clubs from 40 some charters with over 4000 pitchers involved. In the late 1990's those numbers were doubled and each year, hundreds of new pitchers come through the program.

It goes without saying that sanctioned leagues provide a way for clubs to introduce horseshoes to the masses without the intimidation factor of "no skills". Most leagues are "count-all" and handicapped and most new pitchers are comfortable with the format and can score points and win games. Yes, it is not the "tournament mentality" of old and no, it doesn't sit well with the great ones. But it continues to be a great way to grow our sport. Leagues can be run by any rules (check with me on this) or formats and with our new membership methods, people can try us out for little or no cost. If you aren't running leagues, you should be. They are easy to set up, fun to pitch in, and I am always available (ya right) to help out. The Sanction Request form is online or give me a call and we can get you going, it works.


From the desk of the NHPA Secretary/Treasurer

It's All About the Numbers

With the stepping down of Mel Yockstick, I have been asked to take the position of NHPA World Tournament Statistician which I have proudly accepted. Let us first acknowledge all the amazing work that Mel has done over all these years, setting the stage for the next person to have a much easier task of maintaining what has been created.

I wanted to introduce myself and share a little bit of my background with the game we all love.

I will be starting my 44th year in the NHPA with the upcoming season of 2020. I was very fortunate that my father introduced me to this great game of horseshoes at the young age of 12 years old. I found out at an early age that I had the ability to pitch ringers at a pretty competitive rate.

I attended my first World Tournament in 1978 at Des Moines, Iowa making the Junior Boys Championship Class with my first appearance.

I was able to win two Missouri Junior State Titles before moving on to the Men's Division, and just in the nick of time as a very young Alan Francis was nipping at my feet the last two years.

During a four year stint in the United States Navy I was able to pitch a couple of times in places such as Norfolk, VA, Salisbury, MD and at Balboa Park in San Diego, CA. With an Honorable Discharge in the Summer of 1987 I was back home in Missouri and attended the World Tournament in Eau Claire, Wisconsin and with very little pitching in the last four years my game was not what it once was prior to leaving for the military.

It was at that point I believe I was at a cross road, I could have very easily walked away from the game with the discouragement of my pitching. The upcoming Missouri State Tournament was just a month away and it was there that my true horseshoe path was set.

At the 1987 Missouri State Tournament the President of the Association, Wayne Henderson, asked me to become the Missouri State Statistician. I accepted his appointment and basically started at ground zero regarding stats and history of the MOHPA. This was a time where there were very little records kept, no internet, no emails, no cell phones. It was the true grassroots of starting from scratch. But I was so lucky to have a mentor and a living, walking, encyclopedia in the sport of horseshoes with the late great Earl Winston.

Earl and I hit it off immediately and started working on building our stats and history of the MOHPA dating back to 1921. He would spend countless hours at the library scanning microfilm and either making copies and mailing to me via the US Post Office or we would talk on the phone at night for hours at a time.

I now look back at those times and though I was much younger and did not appreciate maybe as much as I should have, I know now that those were some very special times in my life to be able to just take in everything Earl was sharing with me.

I was also very fortunate to have worked alongside his partner and crime, Vicki Winston as she served as Secretary/Treasurer for the MOHPA for many years. We served side by side for over 30 years in one of the largest charters of the NHPA, back in the early 90's we would consistently have memberships between 1,000-1,200 members each year. We are not exempt from membership decline as our membership has declined drastically over the years but we are still holding numbers around 600 members.

I will be serving my 33rd year as the MOHPA Statistician this upcoming year. We have went from ground zero to maintaining our state database, countless winter, spring, summer and fall leagues, over 110 sanctioned tournaments each year, a full functioning web page with weekly updates of tournament results, updated tournament schedule, complete history of state records, awards and national awards and the use of social media with our own Facebook Page.

On my pitching level and the understanding of the World Tournament, I have attended 13 World Tournaments, making the Championship Class on eight occasions. I missed many of the tournaments due to the raising of children and having a family that is not a horseshoe pitching family. But Stats and History have always been my thing, probably because of those early days spent with Earl. I am a 2-Time Missouri Junior Boys State Champion and a 13-Time Missouri Men's State Champion

Most recently I was appointed and proudly serve on the NHPA Hall of Fame Committee.

My wife, Stephanie and I just celebrated our 29th Wedding Anniversary this past October. She is the true champion in our family as I know I am a bit high maintenance. Our son Tyler, after serving four years as a United States Marine, is now back home in Missouri with his wife Lonalyn and my Grandson "Beau". Our daughter, Brooke is a junior at K-State University in Manhattan, Kansas studying Music/Theater.

I am the Accounting Manager for Architectural Building Systems in Kansas City, Kansas.

I look forward to following in the footsteps and to continue to inscribe our stats and records into our history.

2020 A New Decade of Champions and Records...

Let's get a FLASH from the past starting with the last decade in 2010, The World Championships were held in Cedar Rapids, Iowa with 1,286 pitchers. Alan Francis won his 16th Men's World Title with a record of 19-1 and averaging 87.5%. Five Rookies made the field of the 20 man round robin; Bert Logsdon, Jerry Hoy, Bobby White, Don Davis and 2-Time Junior World Champion moving up to the Men's Division was Michael Bowman.

In the Women's Division also consisting of 20 pitchers in the Championship Class, we saw Joan Elmore win her 4th Women's World Title with a record of 18-1 and averaging 79.5%. Joan's only loss was to Maxine Griffith 36-40. Sylvianne Moisan could have forced a playoff game for the title if she would have won her last game. As it was, Maxine again took down one of the Big Guns. In fact Maxine Griffith who ended up in 5th place, had victories over each of the Top Three Finishers.

The Senior Men's Division was once again dominated by Ron Deckard not only winning his 4th Senior Men's World Title but that makes 4 In-A-Row with a record of 10-1 and averaging 71.1%.

The Elder's 30ft Men's Division was won by an individual that knows a lot about winning World Titles. Ed Arionus won his 4th Elder's World Title with a record of 12-1 and averaged 79.7%, Ed won his first World Title in 1991 in the Intermediate Men's Division, then he moved on to the Senior Men's Division winning World Titles in 1996 and 1999.

Senior Women's World Champion – Sheila Shepard winning her 2nd World Title – 72.6% Junior Boys World Champion – Matt Fuller winning his 1st World Title pitching 77.2% Junior Girls World Champion – Bethany Heinritz winning her 1st World Title - 53.2% Cadets World Champion – Noah Gabel winning his 1st World Title pitching 21.0%

link of the NHPA website. Please do not submit the nomination via e-mail. Submitting a nomination does not guarantee the nominee a spot on the ballot. The nomination will first be reviewed by the HOF Screening Committee. If the screening committee rejects the nomination for any reason, it will be returned to the sender. Only current NHPA members or NHPA sanctioned clubs are eligible to submit nominations.

The voting process for 2020 will begin sometime during the month of February whenever I get all of the voting materials sent out to committee members. We may have results some time after the middle of March. Voting is not an easy task and I usually give committee members at least 3 weeks to get their ballots back to me. With the publishing schedule that Blaine has set up for Newsline, I doubt that I will have election results ready in time for the March/April edition. It will probably be the May/June edition before I can announce in Newsline if there are any inductees in 2020. If there are, we will be inducting them at the banquet to be held during the 2020 World Tournament in Monroe, LA.

I will send Blaine the same list of HOF candidates that you can also find on the HOF link of the NHPA website. He may publish it in this edition of *Newsline*. If so, you will be able to view the names of the people currently being considered for the HOF. As of this writing, the last updated list was issued on 12/24/19. 



Eshoe Overview

Eshoe is the new program the NHPA has implemented to track membership, renew membership, and sign up new members. This is an overview of how the program works.

Anyone can go the web page, www.nhpa-eshoe.com, you will see the NHPA logo and under this logo will be place called "Player Search". If you click inside the box you can type in a first and last name or a last name. This will take you to a page with all names associated with your inquiry. Their NHPA card number, member name, city, and state name will be displayed.

If you click on the name you are inquiring about it will bring up 8 subject titles associated with the member you are inquiring about. It will not give you any personal information about the member. This is the 8 subject titles:

- 1. Player The name of the member you have inquired about.
- **2.** Card Number The current card number for the member you have inquired about. This card number will be the card number for this member no matter what charter they move to withing the NHPA.
- **3.** Charter Name The name of the Charter the member is currently assigned to.
- **4.** Card Year The current year the member is paid thru.
- **5. Division** The division the member is currently assigned to in Natstat and also when pitching in any sanctioned tournament.
- **6. Membership Type** The membership type is
- 7. Ringer Percent This is the members current ringer percent from Natstat.
- **8. Qualified Events** This is the number of qualified events from Natstat.

While on this page anyone can print a card out by clicking on Print, located in the "Card Number" title. This will take you to a page that will display what the card you are printing out will look like and the information that will be on the card.

While on this page you can also renew a member if they are not current. If you click renew in the "Card Year" title it will take you to a page that will list all the titles just listed with the Renewal Fee, Paypal up-charge Fee, and Total Fee. At this point you will have three options to pay for the membership of the member you are inquiring about. PayPal, PayPal Credit, and Debit or Credit Card. All three sites are secure.

If you know any of this information to be wrong, please contact your Charter Membership Director.

Membership Directors will be assigned a username and password to track their members within their charter. Membership Directors can only see a member's personal information within their charter. This will only be one or two at the most. Membership Directors will be able to change contact information, add new members, renew members, or import players.

Horseshoe Rules for 1925

1.—Horseshoe Courts

Rule 1-Lay-out of Courts

Section a .- A court should cover an area of level ground of at least ten (10) feet in width and fifty (50) feet in length, and shall consist of two pitchers' boxes, containing clay with a stake in the center of each,

Rule 2-Pitcher's Box

Section a .- The pitcher's box shall extend three feet on either side to the rear and to the front of the stakeoutside measurements.

Sec. b.—The box shall be constructed of 2x6 inch or 2x8 inch lumber and shall not extend more than one inch

above the level ground.

Sec. c.—Where several or more courts are constructed, a 2x6 inch or 2x8 inch plank shall be laid the full length of such courts three (3) feet in front of the stakes.

Sec. d.—Top of the front plank of the pitcher's box may be protected by covering with tin, sheet metal or old

e.-For indoor pitching the pitchers' boxes must not exceed six (6) inches in heighth above the floor.

Rule 3-Soil in Pitcher's Box Section a .- The pitcher's box should be filled with potter's clay or any sub-

stitute of like nature.

Sec. b.—The clay should be at least six (6) inches in depth at the beginning of each game, and, at no time, shall surface of the clay be more than

one (1) inch below the top of the box.
Sec. c.—The clay must be kept moist
and worked to a putty-like condition
about eighteen (18) inches around the stake.

Rule 4-Position of Stakes

Section a .- The stakes shall be set in the center of each pitcher's box, shall incline two inches toward each other and project ten (10) inches above the top of the box.

Rule 5-Pitching Distance

Section a-The stakes shall be forty (40) feet apart, measured from the front at the point where the stakes

enter the ground. Sec. b-The regulation distance for women and boys under 16 years of age shall be thirty (30) feet.

Rule 6-Distance Between Courts

Section a-Where several or more courts are constructed the stakes adjacent to each other shall be placed a straight line not less than ten (10) feet apart.

II.-Horseshoe Equipment Rule 7-Stakes

Section a.—The stakes shall be of iron, one (1) inch in diameter and ap-proximately three (3) to four (4) feet in length.

Rule 8-The Official Shoe

Section a .- No horseshoe shall exceed the following regulations: 7\% inches in length, 7 inches in width.
2\% pounds in weight. No toe or heel calk shall project more than % of an The opening between the heel calks shall not exceed 31/2 knches-inside measurement.

Sec. b-No horseshoe constructed in a freak design will be considered a regulation shoe. The commonly accepted shoe shall be used as a model to determine what a freak shoe is.

> III.-Playing Rules Rule 9-Conduct of Players

Section a-No contestant shall make any remarks or utter any sounds within the hearing of his opponent, nor make any movement that does or might interfere with the opponent's playing.

Sec. b.—The penalty for violation of this rule shall be the declaring as foul both shoes pitched or to be pitched by the offender in the inning complained

Sec. c .- The referee shall be the judge of a violation of this rule

Sec. d .- No contestant shall walk across to the opposite stake and examine the position of his opponent's shoe before making his first or final pitch. Sec. e.—All contestants shall pitch

Sec. f .- Any player repeatedly violating rules or guilty of any unsportsmanlike conduct, may be barred from further participation in the contest.

Rule 10 .- The Foul Lines Section a.—The outer edges of the pitcher's box shall be known as foul lines.

Rule 11-Position of Players

Section a.—In delivering the shoe into the opposite pitcher's box a contestant may stand anywhere inside of the foul lines.

Sec. b.—If in getting a "toe hold" on the front of the pitcher's box the player's foot extends a trifle over the foul line this shall not be considered

Sec. c.—Bach player, when not pitching, must remain outside and back of the pitcher's box until his opponent has finished pitching.

Rule 12-The First Pitch

Section a.—At the beginning of a game the contestants shall decide who shall have the first pitch by the toss of a shoe or a coin. The winner shall have the choice of first pitch or follow.

Sec. b .- At the beginning of successive games between the same players the loser of the preceding game shall have the first pitch.

Rule 13—Pitched Shoe Section a.—The shoe is pitched when it leaves the player's hand.

Rule 14-Broken Shoes Section a.—When a shoe strikes in fair territory and is broken into sep-arate parts, it shall be demoved, and the contestant entitled to pitch another shoe in its stead.

Rule 15-Foul Shoes

Section a.—A shoe pitched while the player is standing outside the foul lines is foul.

Sec. b .- If a shoe first strikes out-side of the foul lines before entering the pitcher's box, it is a foul.

Sec. c.—A shoe striking any part of the pitchers box is a foul.

Sec. d .- Foul shoe shall be removed from the pitcher's box at the request of the opponent.

Sec. c.—A foul shoe shall not be scored or credited.

Rule 16-Interfering With Pitched Shoes

Section a .- No contestant shall touch his own or his opponent's shoes, after they have been pitched, until the final decision has been rendered as to the scoring values of the shoes

Sec. b.—Failure to comply with this rule shall result in both shoes of the offender being declared foul and his opponent shall be entitled to as many points as the position of his shoes at the peg should warrant. Rule 17—Measurements

Section a.—All measurements to de-termine which shoe is the closest to the stake shall be made by the use of

calipers or a straight edge.

Rule 18-Definition of a "Ringer" Section a .- A ringer shall be a shoe that encircles the stake far enough to permit a straight edge to touch both heel calks simultaneously.

Rule 19-Knocked off and Knocked on Ringers

knocks off his own or opponent's ring-er, such knocked off ringers lose their Section a. - Whenever a scoring value and the player making the ringer is not credited with a ringer.

Sec. b.—If a player knocks on one of his own or his opponent's shoes from a non-ringer position to a ringer position the changed shoe has scoring value and credit for ringer for its owner.

Rule 20-Moved Pitched Shie Section a.—When a thrown shoe moves a shoe already at the stake, all shoes are counted in their new posi-

Section a .- A regulation game shall consist of 50 points in all tournaments and matches.

Sec. b .- In a league the regulation game shall consist of 21 points.

Only one (1) event is required for Juniors. Exceptions for US Armed Forces members and family and foreign competitors (other than Canadians) are outlined in Rule 11, Sec D.1 of the RGS Book. Contact NHPA for more information regarding qualifying exceptions. All averages used will be the average on record in NATSTATS / CANSTATS as of May 13th, 2020.

Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPA and any special tournament rules apply. NHPA and CANADIAN entrants must provide identification by sanction card, or other form of ID, when checking in. You may enter at anytime prior to May 13th. Please see note regarding refunds. READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN MEN'S DIVISION regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION. To enter the SENIOR DIVISION, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2020. Any man that turns 70 years of age in 2020, is older than 70, or has an approved medical exemption may enter the ELDER MEN'S DIVISION. Entrants in the JUNIOR BOY and JUNIOR GIRL DIVISION must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2020 calendar year. JUNIOR CADET DIVISION entrants must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2020


