


President's Message


Lets Hold an AWESOME World Tournament!

Winnemucca to host 2021 World Horseshoe Pitching Championships

Winnemucca, Nevada (July 19, 2021) – The 2021 World Horseshoe tournament is coming to Winnemucca after being canceled in 2020 due to the COVID-19 virus. The event will be hosted at the Winnemucca Events Complex July 19-31, 2021. Admission is free to all, with competition 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. daily. A total of 750 athletes will be competing with entries from the United States and potentially South Africa, Norway, and Canada (depending on border restrictions). There will be nine World Horseshoe Champions determined by the 31st with over \$180,000 awarded in the nine divisions (Women, Men, Senior Women, Senior Men, Elder Men, Junior Girls, Junior Boys, Cadet Girls and Cadet Boys). COVID -19 protocols will be followed.

Competitors for the Women's Champion include Marlene Ray (TN) who won the first two tournaments in the Horseshoe Tour and is looking for her first title. She will be joined by her twin sister, Maxine Griffith (TN), 2018 champion, who won the third Horseshoe Tour tournament, Joan Elmore (TN), nine times World Champion looking to tie the world record this year for most Women's titles and Shalee Cason (FL), a four-time Junior Girl's champ. Among the other competitors will be Theresa Howe (MA), who captured the Ringer Classic title this year. Jill Molineaux (RI), Karen Graham (NY), Amy Francis (OH) and Penny Steinke (WI).

The Elder Men's title has a nice field of pitchers with Al Ross (OK) currently pitching over 80% ringers, Russ Phillips (WA) as the 2011 champion, Roger Vogel (KS) who was the 2017 champion in Utah, and Jim Ellison (AL) who was the runner-up for the championship in 2019, and many other who are anxious to win the title.

The Senior Women's class is led by Sheila Shepard (CO) as the defending champion seeking her 8th title. (She qualified in 2020 for the NHPA Hall of Fame and will be inducted this year) Among those joining her will be Helen Laumbach (NM), currently the second ranked Senior Woman this year, Sharon Chiddister (IN), who recently won a Ringer Classic class title, Denise Haye (MO), Diane Luiz (N-CA), Laurie Lampkin (KY), Barbara Carson (AZ), Mary Fimbres (AZ) and Julia Charlton (IN).

Competition looks to be strong in the Senior Men's division with Ken Fraser (NY) and Rick Howe (MA) in the mix. The 2018 champion and candidate for the NHPA President position is Gary Roberts (OH) and he joins the group. Jacob Fimbres (AZ) will be looking to capture his first title win. Fimbres won the Valley of the Sun tournament early in February. Other contenders are Denny Wilson (PA), Mark Seibold (FL), and Ken Jones (NM).

As with many of the classes, the Youth divisions are lower in numbers due to the virus complications we have all been facing. They are, however, ready for the World Tournament and to join with their friends from past years. Riley Malino (CT) will be a first timer in the Junior Boy's competition as the defending Cadets Champion. Walker Forrester (OK), also a previous Cadet World Champion will be strong competition. Alex Francis (OH), Leon Wolken (MO), and Aaron Hanes (NC) are all looking to win the title as well. Sarah Chaffee (WI) is the defending Junior Girls Champion from 2019. Lizy Jordan (CT) and Kaile Trujillo (NM) are hoping for an upset for the title. Hastiin Begaye (N-CA) is a high ringer percentage pitcher seeking the Cadet Boy's title this year. The new division, Cadet Girls will be looking for a new title holder as well. Evelyn Espinola (N-CA) and MacKenzie Rassmussen, (MN) are two of the top competitors.

Looking to take on his 25th title in the Men's Division, is Alan Francis (OH). He was recently awarded *Ringer Classic* Champion for the Men's Division. He is a force in horseshoe pitching and is easily the most consistent pitcher in the World. His current average is 90.48%. Looking to break a record for oldest man pitching the full distance of 40' at 80 years of age is Gale Greene (VT). Matt Fuller (WA) also joins the group as the 2010 Junior Boys World Champion and currently the 3rd ranked Men's pitcher in the world at 82.34% ringers. Tyler Howard (KY) is also in the mix as one who defeated Frances in 2018 twice but took 3rd that year. Dan Watson (AL) and Gary Bearpaw (OK) are two of the best Men pitchers that throw a "flip" shoe in the USA. Holding the record for all-time standard PBA Tour career titles (47) in bowling is Walter Ray Williams Jr. (FL). Walter joins the Men's Division as the 8th ranked Men's pitcher.

The media day is set for July 16th and the "Warm Up" tournament will be held on Saturday, July 17th and is free to the public. The Hall of Fame banquet will be Sunday, July 25 beginning at 5:00 p.m. at the Winnemucca Convention Center. Tickets will be on sale on site once the tournament begins. Welcome to the 2021, World Horseshoe Pitching Tournament.

League Updates

As we begin to get back to pitching horseshoe in most parts of the country, I find more leagues are being pitched and are being sent in. This seems to be a good time to let league directors know where we are on league procedures. The paperwork is the same as always, you send me the final stats and the patch order form. The eShoe program has changed the process for membership and tournament data entry and allows us to have up to the minute information and pitching averages. While it is possible to input league data directly into to eShoe if you know how, please note that I am the only one authorized to enter league data. Certainly, I would enjoy less work to do. But here is the thing, If the league data does not come to me, I cannot



track awards, "Top Ten" stats, junior scholarship records nor league longevity. None of these things are currently able to be tracked by eShoe. The eShoe program was never intended to replace the Sanctioned League Director's position or to track the necessary needed data. It is hoped that the league phase of our software upgrade will enhance HSMaster's ability to run and track league data. Hold on to that thought, it is phase three of the NHPA's master plan to re-write HSMaster.

Specking of longevity, all leagues that did not have leagues in 2020 were automatically given a waiver for that year. There is no need to send me the form "Request a New Sanction League", just go out there get you league going again. If the league director duties were handed down to new personnel and they need help, be sure to have them get in touch with me. If you are still having problems holding this year's league, let me know your situation and we will work it out.

The annual Sanctioned League Team Tournament is still scheduled for October 2nd and 3rd and will be held in Wentzville, MO as usual. The facility has been closed for many months; however, it looks like it will be fully opened by the tournament date. Stay tuned for updates and the flyer will be sent out in an eblast soon. Get your teams together and let me know of your interest. If I have trouble fielding 20 teams or the facility is restricted in any way, I will have to cancel this event again. Once again, the three person teams can be made up of pitchers from any league and from any state. Call me for details.

This is short, which is probably desirable to most readers, but I am in the process of moving again and will be a beloved Buckeye by the time the World Tournament rolls around. Just when I thought I could drive to the WT in a few hours, I will have a two-thousand-mile trip again, bad timing, I guess. I will try and enter league data and send out patches the best I can but I expect some delays. See you at the 2021 World Tournament. It is going to be awesome! I will be giving out the "Sanctioned League Director of the Year" award for both 2019 and 2020. I have not decided how to handle the "Longevity" awards with all the 2020 waivers, but the waivers should not penalize the leagues.

In the last issue of "Newsline" I held a raffle to encourage members to check out the updated NHPA webpage. I was disappointed with the number of responses but understand and hope that it was just the effort to look up the answers and not that the article was not read. So, I will extend the raffle to the World Tournament and see if any more participants send in answers. This adds the burden of looking up the last "Newsline" article to find the quiz. At any rate, do check out the webpage and see what you think. A lot of effort was put into this project and is still happening. See you at the WT, look for another Buckeye!

World Tournament Check-in Procedures

As we get closer to the world tournament, I want to wish everyone safe travels and many ringers. The setup team started setting up the event on July 12th. Taking an empty arena and setting up fence lines, placing mats, unloading the trailer, mixing clay, setting up the boxes, putting up fencing, paint cans, water buckets, shovels, and much more. The transformation doesn't happen overnight, like I wish it would, this process takes at least a solid three to four days. Thank you to all those who are coming early to set up and thank you to those that would stay after to tear down.



The second and third stops on The Horseshoe Tour have been completed. Congratulations to the Ringer Round Up winners in Bryan, Texas! 30': Marlene Ray (Tennessee) and 40': Jeff Finke (Texas) The Bryan Horseshoe Club came together nicely for the event after the rain delays and pulled it off. Congratulations to the Gaston County Clash winners in Lowell, North Carolina! 30': Maxine Griffith (Tennessee) and 40': Herb Rush (West Virginia) Although the local club of Lowell has dwindled, the CVB put on an excellent show! The Friday afternoon June Bug Doubles Champions in Lowell were: Class A: Allen Withrow (West Virginia) and Jan Beltran (Texas) Class B: Donna Massey (Texas) and Robert Bryant (North Carolina) If you go to the NHPA Official Facebook page, you will find the ending of the playoff game in Class B LIVE recorded that ended in four down and backs to finish! A great game to watch and witness! The next stop on the tour is The Rail Yard Ringer, September 11-12 in North Platte, Nebraska! Sign-up now! Regional Directors will be the team leaders in Shoe Check. The process this year will be the same as every year...to an extent. We ask that you follow the markings on the floor and abide by 6' social distancing rules. Please be mindful that some may not say anything but would like to be socially distant. The process will be as follows....

- 1) Check-in with your name, charter, and class. Please familiarize yourself with the pitching schedule and your class to make this process smoother.
- 2) You will be asked the brand of horseshoe you throw and how you throw it. Please be sure to tell the RD how many shoes you are checking in and if they are different brands. This helps with statistics and horseshoe manufacturers.
- 3) Your horseshoes will be weighed, any horseshoe that is over 2lb. 10oz. is an illegal shoe and cannot be pitched. As the player, you have the option for your horseshoe to be tagged and kept with NHPA during your pitching or be taken to the grinder and shaved to meet weight regulations.
- 4) Your horseshoes will be gauged for length and wideness. Horseshoes cannot exceed 7-1/4" in width and not exceed 7-5/8" in length. The opening of the horseshoe cannot be wider than 3-1/2".
- 5) Once your horseshoes meet those inspections, your uniform will be next. Your shirt must have at least your LAST name AND CHARTER lettered neatly on the back. You must be wearing closed toed shoes of some sorts.
- 6) You will then pick up your round robin card and head to have your class photos taken and to listen to the announcements.

You may have your NHPA card on your phone or in person (either will suffice). It is not necessary to have your card in hand, however it helps in the process. eShoe takes care of this process. 
















NHPA Rule Review-Appropriate NHPA Member Conduct

Rule 12—Appropriate NHPA Member Conduct

Section A - On the courts - An NHPA member, while in competition, shall make no disturbing noises or movements that would distract the opponent or contestants on adjacent courts. Other inappropriate behavior would include profanity, abusive language, obscene gestures, etc. The first offense shall call for a warning from the judge or a Tournament/League Official. PLAYING RULES 21 A second offense shall call for a forfeiture of the game being played. Any further offenses shall call for a forfeiture of all games. This member shall also be subject to a one (1) year suspension from the NHPA (see Bylaws for additional information).

Section B - Sportsmanship - Any NHPA member who indulges in heckling or unfair rooting, uses profanity or abusive language, makes obscene gestures, or exhibits any other form of un-sportsmanlike conduct toward the contestants, Tournament/League Officials, or other NHPA members who are in the area of the courts, may be subject to expulsion from the Tournament/ League and from the Tournament/ League site. This member may also be subject to a one (1) year suspension from the NHPA (see Bylaws and page 34 for additional information).

Section C - Dress Code - All contestants competing in a World Tournament shall have, as a minimum, their last name and State or Country abbreviation professionally lettered on the back of their shirts. Said shirts cannot be sleeveless. No cut-offs are permitted and closed-toe shoes must be worn. Further dress code restrictions may be imposed by the Executive Council if all entrants are notified no later than the mailing date of their pitching schedules. This Dress Code may also be adopted into any Charter Bylaws or may be enforced at any State Championship Tournament or at any local tournament, if announced in advance by the Tournament/League Officials. Contestants who do not comply may not be allowed to participate in the event.

Section D - Alcohol, Tobacco Products, and Illegal Controlled Substances - During the World and State Championship Tournaments, the use of alcohol, any form of tobacco, or illegal controlled substances while in the confines of the courts shall be prohibited for all contestants, officials, and scorekeepers. This rule may also be adopted into any Charter Bylaws or may be enforced at any local tournament, if announced in advance by the Tournament/League Officials. Violations may result in the forfeiture of games.

Section E - Cell Phones - During the World and State Championship Tournaments, the use of cell phones shall not be allowed by anyone on the courts. This rule may also be adopted into any Charter Bylaws or may be enforced at any local tournament, if announced in advance by the Tournament/League Officials. Violations may result in the forfeiture of games.

Section F - Protests - If a contestant does not agree with a ruling or decision, a protest shall be made to the judge or Tournament/League Official(s) at the time the problem occurs. If the problem cannot be resolved on the courts, the Tournament/League Official(s) shall make the final ruling on all protests. This ruling may occur after the game has been completed.

Ringers Heard Round the World...Part III

The series for 2021 will highlight some of the most competitive World Tournaments we have ever seen in all divisions.

While reviewing the top Women's Championship Classes over all the years, I had it narrowed down to nine different years (1987, 1988, 1992, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2008 and 2009). After crunching the class averages based on a 16 person class (as some of them had more pitchers), I then looked at the TOP 5 averages and then the TOP 10 averages. It was clear who should get this honor when the combined ringer percent of the Top 5 pitchers was 83.69% and the combined ringer percentage of the Top 10 pitchers was 80.61%, both leading all of the other eight years.



The 2009 Women's Championship Class was one of high percentages, long games and a few surprises. The ladies put on a great show.

After the first day of pitching, four women remained undefeated – Sylvianne Moisan (PQ), Joan Elmore (TN), Sue Snyder (KY) and Marlene Ray (TN).

On day two, Vicki Kunde of Maryland started off the day by providing the first major upset, giving defending champ Sue Snyder her first loss. Snyder pitched an 82.6% game, but it was not enough against Kunde's 84.8%. That left three undefeated until Marlene Ray's 12th game, a one-point loss – also at the hands of Vicki Kunde.

Day three saw Texas' Debra Odum give a scorching 89.5% game against Joan Elmore's 81.6% delivering Joan's first loss, leaving Quebec's Sylvianne Moisan as the sole undefeated leader. Elmore did not let Moisan hold the top spot for long, in round 17 she raised the bar with a 102 shoe marathon with a 91.2% effort to beat out Sylvianne's 83.3%. Game 17 also brought Sue Snyder's second loss to Tennessee contender Marlene Ray, who by that time had suffered three losses. Sue's third loss came in the next round to Sylvianne in the longest game of the Women's Championship play – 130 shoes. Snyder and Moisan both gave outstanding performances with 86.2% and 87.7% percentages respectively. This loss effectively eliminated Sue's chance for a repeat title.

Going into the final day, two ladies sat at the top of the leader board with only one loss each – former champions Joan Elmore and Sylvianne Moisan. Joan's last game would be against defending champion Sue Snyder, Sylvianne would play against Marlene Ray, who previously defeated Snyder and had pitched ten 80+% games and one 96.15%.

A loss for either lady could hand the title to the other. Wins by both would force a playoff. Elmore defeated Snyder by a score of 42-28 in Snyder's lowest percentage game of the event while Moisan had a tougher go against Ray's 80%. Sylvianne cinched the playoff berth with a 91.4% victory.

In the playoff game, Sylvianne, perhaps feeling the efforts of her previously pitched 1,384 shoes, had her lowest performance of the championship play with an even 75% game which couldn't stand up to Joan's 83.3%. After 60 Shoes, Elmore wrapped up her third World Title.

Ringers Heard Round the World...continued

The top seeded ladies brought out the best in their competition, drawing out some incredibly high percentages from their opponents. Fourteen games saw losing percentages over 80%. The highest losing percentage in a single game of 86.15% belonged to Sue Snyder in her loss to Sylvianne. Seventeen games were thrown over 90%, the highest being Judy Curtiss' 96.4% win against former Junior Girl's World Champion Shalee (Sebastian) Cason.

With these kind of percentages, no game was a "sure thing" in one of the most exciting ladies championships ever held. This championship should be even more special for Joan Elmore as she was also inducted into the NHPA Hall of Fame at the Awards Banquet. This was her third title in the past four years.


