

We are also planning for the "Swamp Guys" to attend for a visit as well.



About the venue

The Monroe Civic Center is the largest event facility in Northeast Louisiana and is fully air-conditioned. The horseshoe pits will be housed in the Arena (32 courts; 46,025 sq. ft.) and the Conference Hall (14 courts; 14,000 sq. ft.). These areas are entirely indoors and are connected. Kentucky Blue Clay will be used. On top of the usual concession stand options, this facility offers Louisiana fare—like jambalaya and gumbo. Located directly off Interstate 20, this location is convenient to get to from area hotels, RV parks, restaurants, and attractions.

Plan Your Stay

Fairfield Inn & Suites and Quality Inn & Suites are our host hotels. They are both located in West Monroe approximately 5 miles away from the Monroe Civic Center. Located directly off the interstate, it is a 9-minute drive to the venue. Near this hotel are the Hampton Inn, Hilton Garden Inn, Home 2 Suites by Hilton, Holiday Inn Express, LaQuinta Inn, and Comfort Inn. Other great hotel options include the Courtyard by Marriott, Towne Place Suites, WoodSpring Suites, and Wingate Hotel & Suites, just to name a few.

The Monroe Civic Center has 72 RV hook-up locations at a nightly rate of \$25. Nearby are the Ouachita RV Park, Pavilion RV Park, Bayou D'Arbonne Camping Park, and the lke Hamilton Expo Center.





Things to Do

All four of these restaurants feature a stunning view of the Ouachita River. We highly recommend the sunsets. Other great local spots are Johnny's Pizza House, Fieldhouse, Javi P's, 2Dudes Brew and Que, and Waterfront Grill. For sweet treats, try Butter A Louisiana Bakery or The Creamery. For a cup of coffee, visit Corner Coffeehouse, Dreux Coffee, The Coffee Bean, or Standard Coffee Co. And many more!

Do you have Hall of Fame Candidates?

In my article for the World Tournament edition of Newsline, I mentioned that I was able to conduct face to face meetings with HOF Committee members this year at Winnemucca. That hadn't been possible for me since the 2018 World Tournament. There were actually 11 of the 15 committee members in Winnemucca, so it was a nice surprise to be able to see so many of them in person. We got a lot of discussion accomplished and then I came home and a few weeks later sent the entire committee a list of things we had decided that we might want to pursue further. This gave the members who were not able to be in Winnemucca a chance to chime in on some things that had been proposed. The list was not long and when we were finished, we had come up with 2 changes in our procedures which are not earth shaking, but I want to alert as many people as possible.

We have changed the eligibility window for the Historic Era Player category and candidates for it will now be eligible after not having participated in any adult World Championship Finals Division for at least 30 years instead of 35 years. This moves a couple of people from the Player category to the Historic Era Player category on the list of nominees. The updated list is posted on the website along with an updated Nomination Form.

We have also made some slight changes to the point system that we use for voting. Our ballots contained five lines for each category with point values of 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1. This added up to 15 points that were possible for a committee member to divide among 5 candidates in that category. A committee member is never required to fill all 5 lines on their ballot in any category if they choose not to do so, but most always do. With 15 members voting in a category, there were 225 points available and to be elected a candidate had to receive at least 20% of points available, which would have been 45 points. On occasions we have committee members or a relative of theirs on the ballot, so they are required to abstain from voting in the category where their name or the name of their relative appears. In that case, that changes the amount of points available, but a candidate will always need at least 20% of the total points available in order to be declared elected.

The new point system we are going to try works the same way, but the five lines will now have point values of 8, 5, 3, 2 and 1 for a total of 19 points. The reasoning for this is that it was felt that the person we place at the top of our list, and who we feel is the most deserving, was only getting one more point than the next person on the list. The person who is placed in second place will also now have a little more support than the persons on the last three lines. This may enable the committee to not have years when we don't elect anyone from some categories. With all members voting in a category there will be 285 total points available and a candidate will need at least 20% or 57 points to be declared elected. We do have in our SOP's a procedure that enables us to use a second ballot if nobody is elected in a given category for 2 years in a row. If we do that, only the five candidates with the most points in that category are put on the second ballot. We feel that this new voting system may help avoid ties on the 2nd ballot, which would be helpful. I will point out that each committee member votes independently and in secret. I collect the ballots and do all of the tabulating. The committee members see how the other members voted only after the election process is completed. I try to cast my ballot and send a copy to a designated person before any other ballots arrive. That way it can be verified that I did not change my votes after seeing how some other members voted. We try to conduct the voting as honestly as possible.

In other HOF committee news, since Gary Roberts will now be the exofficio HOF committee member by virtue of taking over the office of NHPA President, he has appointed Stuart Sipma to remain on the HOF committee to keep 15 members in place on the committee. We will not have any change in personnel to begin the New Year unless someone should resign.

Jerry Smith is a member of the Hall of Fame committee, a NHPA Vice President, and has also taken on the responsibility of being the NHPA Historian, along with his duties of being the NHPA Sanctioned League Director. This summer Jerry moved to Ohio, so now lives just a one day drive from the Hall of Fame building in Wentzville, MO. Bob Rogers, who designed the Hall of Fame and has volunteered so much work in the Hall of Fame room for so many years, is no longer available to serve as curator because of health reasons. Stepping into NHPA History

The responders earned tickets based on the number of right answers they sent in, including the bonus question. I then drew a winner from the ticket bucket and am proud the announce that a fellow buckeye won the drawing. Cindy Rose earned 4 tickets and her name was drawn. She will receive a pair of old hookless horseshoes. I do hope than many other readers did check out the webpage and were pleasantly surprised at the updates and the improvements. I wish to thank David Sidles for his work doing the updates and know that our new webmaster Blaine Scott, who also helped, will continue to keep it current and interesting.



As the NHPA historian, I have the responsibility to keep the Hall of Fame (HOF) displays up to date and interesting. With the pandemic, the facility in Wentzville Missouri has been closed for close to two years and many perpetual displays are out of date. I had planned to go to the HOF before the NHPA Sanctioned League Tournament (SLT) and figure out what needed to be done and how to best get it done. The old processes for the graphics are not available and a new process has got to be developed. With the cancellation of the SLT, I decided to go to Wentzville and attend the Grand Re-opening of the building and Quail Ridge activities. What a great tournament and I got my needed information.

While looking for some information I ran across a press release written for the media in 2007 about the original grand opening of the NHPA's Hall of Fame and Museum. I thought it might be interesting to read some history about the HOF and the state of horseshoe pitching 15 years ago. I am including the highlights of the release.

With a ringing success, St Charles County Government helped dedicate the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association (NHPA) Hall of Fame and Museum this morning at Quail Ridge Park.

Members of the NHPA, the National Horseshoe Pitchers Foundation (NHPF) Board, and the Quail Ridge Horseshoe Club were on hand to take part in the official dedication of the 23,000 square foot facility, which brings St. Charles County to the forefront in the sport of horseshoe pitching. It offers county residents and visitors an opportunity to learn more about the sport and to compete in a world class indoor horseshoe pitching facility.

With an estimated 15 million horseshoe pitching enthusiasts in the United States and several million more throughout the world, the central location of our county will help this facility to attract substantial visitation. Horseshoe pitching also enjoys tremendous support within the state of Missouri and throughout St. Charles County. The Missouri charter is the second largest in the nation and the Quail Ridge Horseshoe Club features more that 250 members. We anticipate large benefits to our local restaurateurs, hotel manages, and other attractions through the many visitors attending the local, state, and national tournaments this facility will host.

The NHPA HOF and Museum will feature many amenities to attract visitors and horseshoe pitchers to the facility. The museum area will include displays, memorabilia, trophies, and other items that detail the history of the sport that is believed to have begun in the second century as quoits. It displays pictures and bios of over 144 individuals who have been elected to the Horseshoe Pitching HOF and the Jack Freeman Memorial Brick Walkway Plaza. A world class pitching facility offers 16 indoor courts that will host leagues and tournaments in climate-controlled comfort throughout the year. The facility will be open several days a week and by appointment. Other features of the facility include food services, displays of hundreds of historical horseshoes, and sales of horseshoe pitching equipment and souvenirs.

Todays opening brings conclusion to a process that began in 2004, when NHPA member Joe Faron first initiated discussions with members of the St. Charles County Government and the St. Charles County Council. In November 2005, the Council approved Bill No. 2812 that officially agreed to house the Hall of Fame in Quail Ridge Park, and a groundbreaking ceremony began the construction process in May 2006. The facility was built by NHPF at a cost of nearly \$1 million and the County contributed an additional \$400,00 to build the parking lot and for landscaping near the park's entrance. The NHPF will lease the land encompassing the building for \$100 per year for 30 years (with three 10-year options to renew).

We are excited to partner with the NHPA, The NHPF, and the Quail Ridge Horseshoe Club to present the Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame inside Quail Ridge Park. The Quail Ridge Park is conveniently located near the intersection of Interstate 70 and Highway 40/61. This offers a perfect setting for the sport of horseshoe pitching which can literally be played by anyone of any age.

The press release, which included other statements about the local impact, tells some of the history and hints at some of, but not nearly all of the trials and struggles that the NHPA and NHPF went though to get this facility built. It is my hopes that reading this will do several things: First, I hope that it perks an interest in minds of pitchers, new and old, to plan on visiting the facility and see our history and the people who made it happen. The HOF honors the great pitchers and equally honors the promoters and workers, all of whom contributed to our great sport. Secondly, I hope that seeing the financial numbers needed to get the HOF facility built emphasizes the value of our facility and helps us to understand what it might take to maintain including day to day operations plus the need to have extra reserves for repairs and normal wear and tear. You can support the NHPF with tax deductible donations and/or by buying a brick for the plaza. In a future issue of the Newsline, I hope to include pictures of the HOF and the brick plaza.



Valuable Horseshoe Definitions

Ringer...A method of scoring, mostly utilized by your opponent

Shoe...The device used by pitchers to score ringers and points, always designed with a large opening that fits around the stake on your opponent's shoe, usually with no opening at all on your own.

Cancellation...An option used by your opponent should your shoe accidentally encircle the stake now and then.

Double... the term for two rings in succession when thrown by your opponent; referred to as a "miracle" when you do it.

50 points...the total points scored by your opponent before you are allowed to shake hands with them and show what a good sport you are..

Pits...What you feel like when you get to shake your opponents hand and show what a good sport you are.



Ringers Heard Round the World...Part IV

The series for **2021** will highlight some of the most competitive World Tournaments we have ever seen in all divisions.

The Elder Men's Division began in 1982, this year's version was for men 75 years and older. In 1983 the 70 year old guideline was put into place. The other interesting change that was made in 1982 was the beginning of the 40 Point Era. The 50 Point Game was no more.

At the 1983 World Tournament there were two Elder Men's Championship Classes:

Elder Men's (70-74) years old Elder Men's (75 and over) years old

From 1984 and on it has just been the Elder Men's (70+)



There have been many very competitive classes over the years, 1995, 1996 and 2010 were strong, but in my mind none hold a candle to the 2012 World Tournament in Knoxville, Tennessee. No one averaged under 70% in the Championship Class. This class saw every player pitch at least one game of 79.5% or better, ten games over 85% and two hitting that 90% plateau. The highest game pitched came from Virgil Rife (OH) who threw 82 ringers out of 86 shoes for a 95.35% defeating Rich Altis (MO) who pitched 81.4%.

By the end of Day 1, Rich Pintor (CO), Virgil Rife (OH) and Bobby Fields (TN) were undefeated and looking strong. Not far behind was defending champion, Russ Phillips (WA) at 4-1. The longest game of the day came between former champion, Ed Arionus (TX) and Barry Chapelle (OR) at 110 shoes with Chapelle pulling out the win with a score of 40-28.


Day two kicked off with Fields dropping his first game, Rife loss his first two games and in the 8th round Pintor and Phillips took loses in their games. At the end of the second day Pintor was on top with a record of 9-1, Rife and Fields stood at 8-2 and close behind were Phillips and Altis with records of 7-3. A couple of long games were played the second day, Arionus battled in a 106 shoe game with Rife and won his second 100+ shoe match in this tournament. In the longest game of the class, Lawrence Hinton (MI) bested Herschel Walters (IN) in a 114 shoe marathon where both players averaged over 80%.

The stage was now set for day three for some epic battles for the *CHAMPIONSHIP*. The first game of the day added to the drama as Pintor was taken down by Tom Hall (FL) and Fields was beat by Walters. We now had Rife and Pintor together at 9-2 while Fields, Phillips and Altis were at 8-3. In round 13 the match that everyone was anticipating on this final day, Pintor v.s. Rife. Both players were on their game, but it was Pintor with an 81.71% game edging out Rife who pitched 79.27% with a score of 40-30. Now, it was Pintor's to finish, which he did by knocking off Walters and then pitched a blistering 89.06% game against Phillips to finally secure the title of "*World Champion*".
