In addition, the nearby City of Cincinnati has expressed interest in hosting the World Tournament at the Duke Energy Convention Center. We will be able to view both sites during the Winter Meeting.

I look forward to working with all of you during the next three years. I am very aware of the complexity of the problems we face. However, I am not willing to give up on our sport, and I will put forth my utmost effort to make a difference. I will always be available to discuss issues and ideas. Announcing additional NHPA changes

As the New Year approaches, the NHPA Council wishes to remind everyone of the changes to our makeup and to state the obvious. The changes involve the NHPA and the NHPF.

The first change is at the Presidential level and is a first since 2010. Gary Roberts was unanimously elected President at the Winnemucca delegate meeting running un-opposed. President Stu Sipma chose not to seek re-election after serving for 11 years. Gary is a long time NHPA member, past Vice President, and from a family tree that is filled with World Champions (himself included 5 times), Hall of Famers (himself included), and NHPA workhorses (himself included). He brings an extensive knowledge of our history and our procedural processes. He sits on the Rules and Hall of Fame committees and has for quite a while. Welcome Gary Roberts.

The second change is also Presidential and concerns the NHPF. Long time NHPF President Casey Sluys has resigned effective January 1st. The Council has approved the appointment of David Sidles to replace the virtually irreplaceable Casey. Casey was a long-time Vice President of the NHPA and has served many years as President of the NHPF. Casey's list of accomplishments is extensive, in fact, almost endless. We wish Casey the best and know that he will always still be available to put his two cents in. David is a current NHPF Board Member and past NHPA Vice President and Secretary-Treasurer. He is currently the eShoe Director and is and has been a valuable member of the NHPA team. Welcome David. David and Gary's contact information will be on the webpage.

The obvious is the council's desire to thank Stu for his many years of service. Stu was elected to the NHPA Hall of Fame this year and his HOF biography shown below tells a brief story of his many accomplishments.

2021 – Stuart Sipma (North Dakota) Promoter/Organizer:

Stu has been very active in Bismarck's horseshoe organization serving in many leadership roles including President and Board of Directors. He is a strong recruiter of new pitchers and was instrumental in bringing the World Tournament to Bishop in 2000. He was the overall coordinator of the WT which was very successful. In 2003 he became the NHPA 5th VP and worked with the Rules and By-Laws committees helping to update and change both documents. Stu became the NHPA President in 2010 and remained there till 2021. Under his leadership, the NHPA progressed in many ways some of which include, adopting HSMaster as the official Stat program, the implementation of electronic scoring at the WT using HSScorekeeper, introduction of cameras making parts of the WT visible on the NHPA webpage, updating the webpage, and the introduction and implementation of the powerful software eShoe. The eShoe program has brought the NHPA into the modern era of both membership and stat tracking. Stu received the NHPA Stokes Memorial Award in 2008 and was inducted into North Dakota's HOF in 2003.

Stu was appointed to the HOF Committee and has said that he will remain actively involved in the sport he loves and has given so much to.


2021 NHPA TRADING CARDS




From the desk of the NHPA Secretary/Treasurer
