Welcome to a New Year of Horseshoes

As you might imagine, preparation for the 2022 World Tournament is occupying a lot of our time. At the present time, Laurie Lampkin and Barbara Carson are in Monroe, Louisiana to complete a site visit to assess any potential problem areas. It has been 11 years since we were there and fortunately there have been great improvements in the IT capabilities at the arena, a problem area last time. We do not want to leave anything to chance.

Simultaneously, efforts to interest other cities in hosting the 2024 World Tournament are underway. Laurie Lampkin has done a great job in this regard. Laurie and I will be attending the Connect Sports Spring Marketplace 2022 in Puerto Rico where many cities will have representatives present to explore potential event opportunities. Keep in mind that Connect Sports will be paying our travel expenses. No NHPA funds will be utilized. Laurie and I will also be visiting a potential bidder for the 2024 World Tournament in Ocala, Florida.

Obviously, the World Tournament's "day to day" operations are of great importance and require hours of planning. However, our long-term goal, involving the survival of our sport, is uppermost in our priorities. How do we stop the continuous decline in membership? How do we get substantial sponsorship? How do we get media coverage? How do we make our World Championship finals more exciting?

All Entries must be on this signed form and mailed with a **postmark no later than May 17th, 2022.** You may enter at anytime prior to May 17th, 2022. Entries received with a postmark after May 17th shall be put on a waiting list and entered into the tournament only as space is available.

2022. Entries received with a postmark after May 17th shall be put on a waiting list and entered into the tournament only as space is available. All adults must have pitched in a minimum of four (4) US/Canadian sanctioned events in the twelve (12) months *prior to May 17th*, 2022, in the same division you are entering. Only one (1) event is required for Juniors. Exceptions for US Armed Forces members and family and foreign competitors (other than Canadians) are outlined in Rule 11, Sec D.1 of the RGS Book. Contact NHPA for more information regarding qualifying exceptions. All averages used will be the average on record in eShoe/ CANSTATS as of May 17th, 2021. Anyone qualifying under an exception must have those scores recorded by the same date. All NHPA and any special tournament rules apply. Please see note regarding refunds. READ CAREFULLY: Any adult male pitching from the full distance platform may enter the OPEN MEN'S DIVISION regardless of age, just as any adult female may enter the OPEN WOMEN'S DIVISION. To enter the SENIOR DIVISION, you must be 60 years of age or older before the end of 2022. Any man that turns 70 years of age in 2022, is older than 70, or has an approved medical exemption may enter the ELDER MEN'S DIVISION. Entrants in the JUNIOR BOY and JUNIOR GIRL DIVISION must be 18 years old or less for the entire 2022 calendar year. CADET BOY AND CADET GIRL DIVISION entrants must be 12 years old or younger for the entire 2022 calendar year.

Note # 2. For class play, a minimum of 48 must enter this division or it will be canceled. All entrants will then pitch in the Open Preliminaries.

Note # 3 Junior Boys & Junior Girls divisions will be mixed for preliminary play. Cadet Boys & Cadet Girls divisions will be mixed for Preliminary play. For Championship play a min of 8 must enter this division or it will be canceled. The pitching schedule will be finalized by May 20th, 2022 and published on the NHPA website. If you indicated above to receive the schedule by mail, it will be mailed to the address you have listed above during the second week in June.

Please note: The NHPA reserves the right to disallow your participation for any of the following reasons; any errors on this form, if your records don't appear in eShoes or CanStats, any false or misleading information on this form, if the NHPA cannot verify through its established procedure the validity of any Medical Exemption, or for any other reason by majority vote of the NHPA Council. The NHPA also reserves the right to add qualified entrants and to make class participant changes after the deadline. No pitcher will be moved from class time or division, without notification, after final schedule has been published.

Please know that if you are placing your order to wear these items during competition at the World Tournament you will need to follow the Rules laid out in the NHPA rule book. There is a dress code for the World Tournament. Please be respectful and make sure you follow the rules and guidelines.

We ask that for score keeping purposes and "Live" streaming on the cameras that you have a minimum of 1" lettering on the back of your shirts with your name and state (Abbreviated). This will be looked at going through Shoe Check.

We have been asked by several members from various charters to post the requirements for apparel wear during competition at the World Tournament. Per the NHPA Rules below:

The shirt vendor had been instructed to follow these guidelines as shown below. If the shirts or items purchased will "NOT" be used for World Tournament competition, then you can have them any way you choose.

RULE 12 - APPROPRIATE NHPA MEMBER

Section C - Dress Code page 21

Section C - Dress Code

All contestants competing in a World Tournament shall have, as a minimum, their last name and State or Country abbreviation professionally lettered on the back of their shirts. **Said shirts cannot be sleeveless. No cut-offs are permitted**

and **closed-toe shoes must be worn**. Further dress code restrictions may be imposed by the Executive Council if all entrants are notified no later than the mailing date of their pitching schedules. This Dress Code may also be adopted into any Charter Bylaws *or* may be enforced at any State Championship Tournament or at any local tournament, if announced in advance by the Tournament/League Officials. Contestants who do not comply may not be allowed to participate in the event.

Dress Code – For State Tournaments and the World Tournament, the dress code requires that your last name and State or Country abbreviation be **professionally lettered on the back of your shirt(s)**, **which cannot be sleeve-less**. **Also, cut-offs and open-toed shoes may not be worn**. (See page 21, RULE 12, Section C)

Well, here we are in the slow season, right? I don't think so. My job as Sanctioned League Director goes year-round and the early part of a year is one of the busiest and most rewarding. I have just received the plaques and plates for the sanctioned club longevity awards and need to ship them out. These awards honor clubs who have continually held sanctioned leagues annually without a break in service. The plaques are given to clubs who wish to have them (having a place to display it) and have hit the five-year mark. Those that have plaques and continue to the hold leagues annually, get a plate every five years indicating their longevity. These clubs are the backbone of the sanctioned league program. The list of the many clubs getting awards or hitting the milestones was published in an earlier Newsline. Thanks to all the clubs and particularly the hard-working directors who support and run all these leagues.



I have also just calculated the honorees who are receiving Sanctioned League Junior Scholarships as provided for by the Redbook or Sanctioned League Operations Manual. An article on the scholarship recipients can be found under that heading in this Newsline. The big job this time of year is the Sanctioned League "Top Ten" awards. This year the "Top Ten" is very complicated and as usual I rely on two people to help me get through the process. Kevin and Pat Snelgrove do my software programing and in general keep me sane and certainly in line. I often get off the path and screw up the program in ways that are seemingly impossible to have done. Kevin and Pat have worked hard to make my job reasonably easy, and I thank them very much. This year's "Top Ten" is very complicated for two reasons. First, the list, as promised when I didn't do one last year because of the pandemic, is a combined two-year list. We had to figure a way to temporarily get the two years combined when the program is geared specifically to capture only one year's data. With Pat's help, I figured how to get the two years done correctly then ran into the second problem. The data from the 2020 season was contained in my "LeagueStats" program which was geared for interaction with NASTATS. The 2021 season's data, which Kevin masterfully converted, was geared to interact with eShoe. The eShoe database upgraded all the pitching categories to word terms i.e., Men, Women, Elders, Girls, Boys, Cadet Boys, and Cadet Girls. The NATSTATS program used letters and numbers for the categories, i.e., M, W, E or 30, G, B, and C or 9. In the computer world, these are like night and day. All this to say that January was a busy month and yet I am pleased to present the combined 2020 and 2021 Sanctioned League Top Ten lists. I am holding off ordering the plaques to give time for league directors to spot any errors.

I also am up for re-election this year and have been pondering whether to run again. In late January I decide to run again for the 3rd Vice President and have made the necessary notifications. I appreciate all the support I have received in the past and hope that it will continue. Here are the TOP TEN lists for 2020-2021. Congratulations to all the great pitching accomplishments and you too can get on board, join a league.

I wish to congratulate all the above listed Clubs and/or Leagues for their continued efforts to maintain places for horseshoe pitchers young, old, veterans, and rookies to pitch and compete. Leagues provide opportunities for people to begin careers or at least try out the sport of horseshoe pitching at a competitive level in a comfortable environment. Many of today's pitchers started pitching as card carrying members of the NHPA right in league play. Leagues are small or large, simple, or complex, and sometimes without borders. But one thing is common to all leagues, some person or persons are working long and hard to direct and maintain the paperwork so that the league is planned (schedule), fair (generally each player has a chance with an accurate handicap) and tracked (standings). They help format the league and see that the National Awards are received. They also see that pitcher's stats are sent to the National League Director (me) so that I can get them into eShoe. Many pitchers rely on leagues to help them qualify for entry into the World Horseshoe Tournament. Leagues are competitive and fun. Join or start one and enjoy what so many others presently participate in. Thank you to all the League Directors, the helpers, and to all of those of you who pitch in leagues. You are awesome.







NHPF Report

The Runner-up Series...Part 1



The series for 2022 will highlight those very few special pitchers that came so close but was just never fortunate enough to bring home that elusive *World Championship*.

Reviewing all the records and calculating "*Top-3*" finishes in world tournament play it was pretty evident who should represent the Men's Championship Class.

With a resume of twelve World Tournaments competing and finishing in the "Top 3" nearly seventy percent of the time, against the likes of the best this game has ever seen; Ted Allen, Fernando Isais and Guy Zimmerman.



A 4-Time Runner-Up & 4-Time 3rd Place Winner

Casey made his first appearance at the 1935 World Tournament being held in Moline, Illinois. Finishing in 6th place with a record of 17-6 and a ringer percentage of 72.22% competing against a list of horseshoe legends; Ted Allen, C.C. Davis, Frank Jackson and Jimmie Risk.

It would be another five years before the next World Tournament was held and it was obvious that Casey took this time to sharpen his skills.

The 1940 World Tournament was held in Des Moines, Iowa and this would begin the 4-man battle at the top for the next decade. Casey had a record of 25-6 and averaged 80.5% which would give him 4th place

Back to Des Moines, Iowa in 1941 and "*The Big Four*" were now the Big 3 as Guy Zimmerman did not participate this year. Casey only lost three games and finished with a record of 20-3 averaging 79.8%. Fernando Isais became the seventh man to win undefeated at that time. Ted Allen in a show of sportsmanship removed his jersey which read *World Champion* and offered it to Fernando.

It would be another five years before they all could compete again in a World Tournament, imagine what our records would be like if not for those eight years of no competition. 1946 in Des Moines, Iowa once again, this year will always serve as a remembrance of the NHPA's ability to survive any adverse conditions. Due to a steel and paper shortage during World War II, horseshoe pitching ground to a standstill and the horseshoe world came to an abrupt halt by 1943 where the membership nosedived to only 17 active members. Now down to just the two as Fernando became the sixth World Champion at the time not to defend the title. Going down to the last game and both Ted Allen and Casey had one defeat. This set up one of the greatest matches ever for the World Title – In this 158 shoe game, Ted tossed 139 ringers for a 87.97% and hard luck Casey pitched 137 ringers for a 86.71% only to lose the World Championship 50-44. As a record of proof to the NHPA's stability, from this year on a World Tournament would be held every summer of every year far into the future.

With the horseshoe pitching and NHPA in full stride, Salt Lake City, Utah became the beautiful site for the 1947 World Tournament including all of "*The Big Four*" back in action. For the second year in arrow Casey came up just short again finishing as runner-up.

1948 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin the home state of Casey, surely this would be his year. Enough cannot be said for the performance of Casey who set a brand new record for a complete tournament averaging 87.5%, the greatest losing effort in the history of horseshoe pitching! Hard luck Casey had stuck out again for the third year in a row.

Another year and another runner up position for the fourth time, 1950 World in Murray looked very similar to the previous year. Casey moved back up to the #2 spot and pushed Ted back down to the #3 spot. Fernando had done what he set out to do and people were wondering if he would ever let go of the World Championship.

At the 1951 World, Casey would dip down to 6th place with a record of 23-12 and averaged 77.67% but would bounce back in 1952 of more of the same thing working his way back up on the podium with a record of 32-3 and averaging 82.79%

I wonder if the grind of year after year of getting so close was wearing on him as in 1953 he dipped again all the way to 10th place with a record of 22-13 and averaged 74.48% Side note as I say all the way to #10, as he never in his career finished outside of the "*Top 10*".

He had one last run in him as in 1954, this was to be the last time "*The Big Four*" of Isais, Allen, Jones and Zimmerman would ever meet in the same World Tournament. This was Casey's last performance giving up at an early age the chase for that elusive World Title. The same was true for Zimmerman, who had the misfortune of having his car roll over his legs to end his great career.

Guy Zimmerman snagged his "One and Only" Title in his last attempt and Hard Luck "Casey" Jones was left empty handed but was there each year in the mix finishing "Runner-Up" four years, three in a row and "On The Podium" with a 3rd place finish another four times.

My thoughts are I was born in the wrong era, can you imagine being witness to "The Big Four"


