Prioritizing Changes for the Future

The 2022 World Tournament is history. For many reasons, the participation was lower than usual, However, there were many great performances in all divisions. Sadly, some of the NHPA officers, participants, and family members fell victim to the new Covid variant during and subsequently at the tournament. I would like to thank our volunteers including Roger Vogel, Ron Smith, Clarence Lassiter, and Buddy Lampkin for their many hours of hard work. I would also like to



thank Fred Lane for his assistance with IT issues. Blaine Scott, who received the Presidential Award this year, was a valuable resource throughout the tournament. Ben Webb performed well in taking over Junior duties with very little time for preparation. Since that time, Ben has been appointed as Junior Director. Our NHPA officers should be commended for their hard work under stressful circumstances. Our hosts in Monroe went above and beyond to assist us during the tournament.

We are now looking toward the 2023 World Tournament in Lansing, Michigan. Above average participation is expected for this location. The Council plans to implement an exciting new format for this tournament. The specific details will be announced once they are finalized. The new format will guarantee an exciting finish to all Championship divisions. We have been busy negotiating and signing contracts for Lansing hotels.

Laurie Lampkin has been busy generating interest in bidding for the 2024 World Tournament. Several cities have expressed interest in bidding, The deadline for bids is December 31, 2022. It will be exciting to see which cities choose to place a bid.

I would encourage members to be thinking about rules and bylaws proposals that must be submitted prior to December 31, 2022. There has been considerable controversy over residency requirements for participation in State Championships. Many feel the current bylaw as it relates to residency is antiquated and needs changed. We will undoubtedly receive proposals to be reviewed by the Rules Committee. I have also heard from many women recommending that a shorter distance be established for elderly women who can no longer throw 30 feet. The state delegates voted to reduce the age for men to move to 30 feet at age 65 rather than age 70. The primary reason expressed for this change was that new retirees are much more likely to begin pitching if they can pitch from 30 feet. A side benefit is that we are now in concert with the Canadian rule

2023 Elder Men Rule Change—What the change means to you!

Men who have their 65th birthday anytime during 2023 can move to the Elders division and pitch behind the 27' foul line. Those who wish to move up can renew their membership for the 2023 card year as of October 1, 2022. Those wanting to change pitching distance will need to go through their charter secretary to change divisions. An individual cannot make a division change online.


How it reads in the rule book under Rule 1 – Pitching Divisions.

Section F- Elder Men (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become sixtyfive (65) years old).

1. Elder Men may pitch from any place on either the extended or full distance platforms and shall observe the twenty-seven foot (27') foul line. Elder Men must notify their Charter Membership Director, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares himself a short-distance pitcher, he must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time, he may switch back to the Open Men's division, but must remain in that division until the next year's membership card is purchased.



What happens when you change pitching divisions? All your full distance stats are wiped out. You will need to throw one hundred shoes to establish a new ringer percent witnessed by two NHPA card holders. This information must be made available to the Tournament Director within 30 days of the tournament that you wish to pitch in as a short distance pitcher (Elder) so he/she knows where to seed you in the tournament. If you are thinking about changing your pitching distance, be sure to give yourself plenty of time to establish your average before you enter a tournament.

This change will give you the opportunity to have more time to submit a rule change to be considered. I have received a few that I will be meeting with my Rules Committee to evaluate and present to the Delegates next year in Lansing Michigan.

We did receive a great response about the issue that was voted on by the delegates in Monroe and was sent by ballot to every Charter to change the Elders Division age from 70 to 65. We got a majority of the ballots returned and as reported by Jim Kinney, Jr the proposal PASSED. Now men can move to the Elders Division the calendar year they turn 65 if they want to.

2023 WORLD TOURNAMENT DATES: 7/17/2023 -7/29/2023



Change is Coming...Read On!!!

I ran for and was re-elected for another term as the NHPA 3rd Vice President. In to-day's world, for example, we have gender identification protocols which basically states, "You are what you say you are." Our rules say, "Men" and "Women" and were written well before today's definitions. The rules tell us where we can pitch from...well...you see the problem. We have spent time dealing with that for hours. We have a charter that just defied a simple By-Law that says that only a state's members can pitch in the State Tournament. Ninety-nine percent of the NHPA membership would just say, "Of course only an in-state pitcher can pitch in the State Championship." We have devoted hours of time to problems like these and they are not as simple as it sounds at first. Writing modern By-Laws and rules that are fair and up-to date takes hours of work and then they must be approved and passed by a delegate system that doesn't seem to care for change.

Speaking of change, expect the WT format to change big time. I am projecting that the following groups will pitch on Monday of the first week. The top ten Men's groups, the top nine Women's groups, the top 12 Elders groups and the top four Senior Men's groups. The first Saturday afternoon will crown all the adult champions during the last game of each group. The Juniors and Cadets will stay to the same routine. The second week will feature the rest of the field. We are projecting a large turnout to the tune of 1400. The final tally will cause adjustments to the above projection. This is not a maybe, we are changing the format. We will get the exact plan out in an eblast in the near future. We are also seeding the following top pitchers directly into the finals: eight Men, eight Women, eight Elders, Six Senior Men, and four Senior



Women. Come be a part of this great new arrangement, it will be exciting. Come to Michigan and experience this for the first time!!! It will be great to have lots of pitchers watching the championship games of all classes.

Things on my radar/to-do list for 2023



Bring your ideas and join the Cadets/Juniors



Officers and RD Meeting

• Barb Carson, 4th V.P., called the meeting to order. 18 states were represented.

- Ellen Perry, NY, explained SHOP Sanctioned Horseshoe Online Pitching. It is posted on Facebook. Backyard courts are being sanctioned.
- Barb reminded all that in 2023 all courts need to be sanctioned again. The council is reviewing the present requirements and some may be changed. Notices will be sent out for any changes.
- Peggy Ogden, FL, asked about a new club that has just had their courts sanctioned do they have to be re-sanctioned? No, just fill out the paper work and send in. R.D.s can have an assistant to sanction courts, but must be signed off by the R.D.
- If grandfathered courts are redone, they then must meet the new requirements.
- The court sanctioning must be displayed at each tournament. The document is online in Word.
- Barb reminded all R.D.s that their main duty is to keep pitchers safe on the courts and to support the NHPA.
- Discussion was held on paying Jr. and Cadet tournament winners. Some states keep a trust fund until they turn 18 and some pay the kids and some pay the parents. The states by-laws determine how payouts are handled.
- Discussion was held on whether to take the year off patches so they could be reused. Many like having the year displayed. Barb will do another survey of R.D.s for their preference. Barb said to either throw away the present unused patches or send them back to her. Also turn in your 2023 order for patches in September as she orders all patches in October.
- Jerry Smith, 3rd V.P., gave an update on Sanctioned Leagues. It's going good but the pandemic really has hurt as 45 regular clubs did not have sanctioned leagues last year. Anybody can pitch in a sanctioned league even if they are not NHPA members use them as pacers. It is a great way to get new people started.
- The Sanctioned League Tournament will be held this year in Wentzville, MO on October 1st and 2nd.
- All were encouraged to be positive promoters and supporters of the NHPA.
- Meeting was adjourned at 3:15 p.m.

Have you checked out eShoe lately?

The NHPA council has been busy in 2022 with the new administration and new ideas. A few pitchers have expressed their interest in some changes that may be beneficial to the NHPA. One of the changes we discussed at the world delegate meeting was passed allowing men to pitch from 30 feet in the year they turn 65 years old. There are other issues that are actively being worked, but this is one of the most recent.

The eShoe program is working fantastic thanks to Kurt Whaley, David Sidles, and all the people who help run the program. There have been a few minor changes to help with the information presented in the program. One of the items added is the



Featured Events. If you go to www.nhpa-eshoe.com you will be able to click on Featured Events and it will take you to the 2022 World Tournament results. This is one thing Kurt and David have been working on to make the eShoe program interesting and informational. Along with a Player Search option the tool bar has Stats and Events. If you click on Stats it will take you to a list of all the charters and the list of the Top 100 Men, Women, Elders, Boys, Girls, and Cadets in the country. There is also an option of a complete file of pitchers and their stats. You then have an option to click on a charter of your choice. This will give you all the Stats for the pitchers in the charter you choose. You can print out the stats or Export the stats into an excel spreadsheet. Also in the tool bar is an option to chose Events. If you click on events this will give you a list of events scheduled for all the charters. You have an option to choose a charter with a from date thru a to date. This will give you a list of events either already played or that is going to be played. There is a trophy to the left of the event date. If you hover over the trophy, it will let you know if the event has been reported or not. If it has been reported, you can click on the trophy and it will have the results of the event. These are some tools in the eShoe file to make all pitchers experience great. There are a lot more features in eShoe that only your charter officers have access to. I can say the NHPA has never had this capability to access a player or event in the past. It is truly a tool that has brought the NHPA to the next century of tracking a sanctioned pitcher or an event in any charter.

The 2022 World Tournament has come and gone. We had some great pitching and some new records that were broken. There were a few things that came up to make it very interesting. Some were not great, but most made it a great experience. We had a fantastic team of officers and volunteers who stepped up when they were needed. I want to personally thank everyone who helped make this tournament a success. The NHPA officers will take what they have learned from the world tournament and apply it to the 2023 world tournament in Lansing, Michigan. We are looking forward to Lansing being another great experience for all who attend.

Records are made to be broken!


The 104th National Horseshoes Pitchers Association World Tournament was just completed in West Monroe, Louisiana and broken they were.

For the tenth consecutive year "The GOAT" – Alan Francis from Defiance, Ohio pitched his way to the top of the mountain once again earning him his 26th WORLD TITLE pitching 658 ringers out of 774 shoes for an over-all average of 85.01%. The final match of the tournament was the deciding factor against Kitchener, Ontario Canada's very own Drew Becker as they went 104 shoes with Alan missing only ten shoes the entire game. The nickname bestowed on Alan cannot be denied as he now has won eighteen of the last nineteen World Titles.



A record that has stood for 60 Years now was matched when 15-Year Old, Sarah Chaffee from Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin departed from the Junior Girls Division and pitched with the Championship Women. With a perfect record of 15-0 and pitching 806 ringers out of 932 shoes for an over-all average of 86.48% she now joins Sue Gillespie from 1962 as the youngest to ever win a Women's World Title.

Bob Gray from The Villages, Florida won his 1st Elder's 30ft Title averaging 76.41% Rick Howe from Gardner, Massachusetts was crowned Senior Men's World Champion with a 72.76% Sheila Shepard from Westminster, Colorado earned her 9th Senior Women's Title averaging 64.29% Derek Reynolds from London, Arkansas captured his 3rd Junior Boys Crown with an 81.67% Kalie Trujillo from Cuba, New Mexico won the Junior Girls World Title averaging 52.72% Eli Sullivan from Crozet, Virginia won the Cadet Boys Division while averaging 69.05% Crystal Knighten from Deatsville, Alabama was crowned the Cadet Girls World Champion


