The 2023 World Tournament in Lansing, Michigan was very successful in many ways. There were 954 entries and some sensational competition. I would like to thank Julie Pingston, President and CEO of the Greater Lansing Convention and Visitors Bureau, Meghan Ziehmer, Executive Director of the Greater Lansing Sports Authority, and Scott Keith, President and CEO of the Lansing and Public Facilities Authority for their cooperation and assistance throughout the Tourna-



ment. We would also like to thank Donna Roy who worked directly with us every day. Our next host will have their hands full with equaling the performance of the Lansing staff.

I would like to thank our set-up staff for getting the courts ready for play. Volunteers included Pep Plummer, Roger Vogel, Clarence Lassiter, Roy Stahlsmith, Dwight Silvers, Buddy Lampkin, and Keith Shafer. Please excuse me if I forgot someone who helped. Several Michigan members also helped. The results were great competition courts with adequate practice courts.

As the Tournament was in progress, we were able to announce that the 2024 World Tournament will be held in Tri-Cities Washington. Kevin Lewis, who was our leader when our tournament was held in St. George, Utah, is now the President and CEO of Visit Tri-State. The Tri-Cities metropolitan area consists of key cities like Kennewick (population 83,921), Pasco (population 77,108), and Richland (population 60,560). The entire metropolitan area has a population just over 311,000 people. I am sure that Kevin will be planning a great event for us. I am very excited about visiting this part of the country.

The Council will be facing many difficult challenges this year. The first of these challenges is finding a new Secretary-Treasurer. As many of you know, Jim Kinney was an excellent person for this office. It requires many hours of work. Setting up the World Tournament and getting the schedule out as quickly as possible is very stressful. We will need to get a qualified person. Budgeting and constant monitoring of financial resources is also important for this job. Jim has agreed to help with a smooth transition. If you are interested in this position, please get credentials to me as quickly as possible..

## Rules/Bylaws Changes—Status


For My Article this time I will show all the Rules & Bylaw Changes that the Delegates voted on at the Lansing, Michigan delegate meeting.

PRC #2 PASSED

REQUIREMENT 3 - CHARTER/STATE INFORMATION

Section A - State Championship Play

3. Residency Eligibility



Charter. No one will be allowed to pitch in more than one State Championship Tournament per year.

This change took out NHPA requirements for eligibility in Charters State Tournaments.

PRC #3 PASSED

Rule 11; Section D; 1:

1. No Current Average - Any contestant without a current ringer average at their pitching distance shall pitch a minimum of one hundred (100) consecutive shoes on a sanctioned court to establish their tournament seeding percentage. This qualifying must be scored in writing and witnessed by two (2) one (1) NHPA members no more than thirty (30) days prior to the entry deadline. Note: This 100-shoe qualifier is not a sanctioned event. Alternately, NHPA Sanctioned League ringer percentage averages may be used if they are based on one hundred (100) or more shoes. Rules/Bylaws Changes...continued

This change modified the number of members who need to witness a pitchers certification pitching of 100 Shoes.

The next three changes modified the wording so that Tournament Directors will determine the pitching rotations for tournaments

#### PRC #4 PASSED

Under "III Guideline", "Section A Regular Doubles"

Section A - Regular Doubles

In regular doubles, both team members use the same pair of shoes and all contestants stay at the same end of the court for the entire game. To begin the game, the tournament director will determine who starts the pitching and how the pitching rotation continues. the highest-rated contestants will decide on the first pitch and pitch their shoes, just as in singles competition. Their partners, at the opposite end, will decide on and call the score, retrieve the shoes, and pitch them back following the same procedure. The decision on who pitches first in each inning depends upon the scoring system being used, following the rules of singles play. A single score sheet should be used that clearly shows the ringers and shoes pitched by all contestants.

#### PRC #5 PASSED

Under "III Guideline", "Section B Walking Doubles, 1. Shoe-limit games"

Section B - Walking Doubles

In walking doubles, all contestants will pitch their own shoes. A single score sheet should be used that clearly shows the ringers and shoes pitched by all contestants.

1. Shoe-limit Games - The lower-rated contestants will decide on the first pitch and pitch their four (4) shoes. The higher-rated pitchers will then pitch their four (4) shoes and all pitchers will then walk to the opposite end, decide on the scoring, and pick up their shoes. The tournament director will determine who starts the pitching and how the pitching rotation continues. The pitchers at both ends will pitch their four shoes and then walk to the other end and decide the scoring and pick up their shoes. The scores of the highest rated team should be recorded first and they will also pitch first for the remainder of the game. Which one of them (and their opponents) pitches first depends upon the scoring system (cancellation or count-all) being used, following the rules of singles play. This procedure will continue until the game is over.

#### PRC #6 PASSED

Under "III Guideline", "Section B Walking Doubles, 2. Point-limit games"

Section B - Walking Doubles

2. Point-limit Games -

Rules/Bylaws Changes...continued

The higher rated contestants will decide on the first pitch and pitch their four (4) shoes. The lower rated contestants will decide on the first pitch and pitch their four (4) shoes. The lower rated contestants will determine the scoring for these shoes. The partner of the pitcher who scores (or the partner of the contestant who pitched last, in case of a no-score situation) will call or record the score and will pitch first in the next inning. All pitchers will now walk to the opposite end. The highest-rated contestants will pick up their shoes (already scored) and step back. The scoring of the last four (4) shoes pitched will be determined and called or recorded. The contestant calling the score always pitches first. This procedure is continued until the game is over. For safety or other reasons, the Tournament/League Officials may select an alternative walking sequence, as long as the scoring sequence remains the same.

The next two changes will allow non-members to be used as pacers in Tournament/League to let non-members participate and play in a Tournament of League.

#### PRC #7 PASSED

Under "Requirement 1 – Tournament/League", "2. During the Event."

Add a second line to "a."

"Leagues can pitch non-members as pacers to encourage new players to participate."

#### PRC #8 PASSED

Under "Requirements 2 – All NHPA Tournaments/Leagues", "Section B"

After the word "Pacers" add:

"except in league play where non-members can be used as pacers"

This next change just added the wording "Electronic Meetings" to how we are currently conducting meetings.

#### PBC #1 PASSED

By-Law changes

Under "Article IV: Executive Council", "Section 3. Meetings", "c."

Add before the word "or", "Electronic Meetings"

... by any means available

This next change modified the wording of who is allowed to submit a travel allowance and lets the President review and approve or deny all requests with Council approval.

#### PBC #2 PASSED

Under "Article V: Officers; SECTION 5:

"All NHPA positions listed above in Section 3 (a-f) who attend the World Tournament may request a travel allowance in accordance with the current Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) of the NHPA. The President, with council approval, has full authority to grant a request, modify the request, or deny the request. Those with dual responsibilities receive only one travel allowance."

#### PBC #5 PASSED

By Laws; Article III; Section 7

SECTION 7. A membership card can be issued by eShoe or the Charter in which the member maintains legal residence as determined by the filing of federal and state tax returns or voting. and/or driver license laws. The NHPA Executive Council can grant exceptions to the residency rule on a case by case basis following established council guidelines. Charters collecting NHPA dues for a non-residence member should give only a receipt, and then forward the dues and address information to the NHPA Secretary-Treasurer who will advise the Charter of record. Residents of a State having no active Charter may become an NHPA member by sending their dues directly to the NHPA Secretary/Treasurer.

This last change designates where you are to get your Charter membership card by where you file your taxes or vote. We did take out the requirement of where your driver's license is issued. This change also added an option that NHPA members can apply for an exemption and request to purchase your card in a different charter. The Council is establishing guidelines to follow in what is allowed.

There was also an added rule change that lets a pitcher that has a medical issue to requalify and pitch 100 shoes to re-establish a new percentage with the medical issue.

Rule added at 2023 Delegate Meeting

Add to: Section D - Seeding Contestants (pg 19)

**4. Physically Challenged Pitcher:** A pitcher may apply to their Charter to reestablish a new ringer percentage due to a medical or physical issue. Upon approval from their Charter they can reestablish a new ringer percentage using current RGS guidelines. This will be sent to NHPA Sec/Treasurer to input into eShoe.



Rules/Bylaws Changes...continued

Here are the rule changes that failed to get the votes needed to pass.

#### PRC #1 FAILED

#### Add to Rule 1 - Pitching Divisions

Section G - Elder Women (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become seventy (70) years old).

1. Elder Women may pitch from any place on either the extended or full-distance platform, and shall observe the twenty-four-foot (24') foul line. but they must start behind the 27 ft foul line and take one step forward while releasing the shoe.( amended to 20 ft foul line)

Elder Women must notify their Charter Membership Director, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares herself a short-distance pitcher, she must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time, she may switch back to the Open Women's Division, but must remain in that division until the next year's membership card is purchased.

2. Physically Challenged Women - Physically challenged, Female pitchers less than seventy (70) years old may be given permission, by their governing Charter, to move onto the extended platforms in the Elder Women Division observing the twenty-four-foot (24') foul lines but they must start behind the 27 ft foul line and take one step forward while releasing the shoe. (amended to 20 ft foul head) The prior completion and approval of a Medical Exemption Application form (available from Charter Secretaries and on some Charter Websites) is required. At the World Tournament and at State Championship Tournaments, they shall compete in the Elders Women Division.

#### **PBC #3 FAILED**

#### Current wording:

SECTION 8. Terms of office

a. All officers shall serve a three-year term.

#### Proposed wording:

#### ADD:

b. All officers shall serve a maximum up to of three (3) consecutive elected nine-year terms. Footnote: Those currently in office shall go retro beginning the first year they were elected in office.

#### PBC #4 FAILED

Article V; Section 8

#### Add:

F. All Officers who have been elected to an NHPA officer position three consecutive times may not run for that office until after one election cycle for that position has been completed. If they were appointed to the position, they may not run after a third Elected consecutive term. They may not be appointed back into that position in either of these circumstances.

I hope this helps show you what was changed and how it will help increase our NHPA Membership.


The State of Washington is excited to be the site of the 2024 World Tournament. We extend the warmest welcome to all our family of horseshoe pitchers to join us next year.

#### 2024 WORLD TOURNAMENT ANNOUNCEMENT: TRI-CITIES CVB - KENNEWICK, WA

NHPA Members:

The NHPA council is pleased to announce that Tri-Cities CVB, Kennewick, Washington has been awarded the bid to be the site of the 2024 World Tournament!



The city of Kennewick is located near the southwest bank of the Columbia River in the Pacific Northwest of the United States. It is the most populous of the three cities collectively referred to as the Tri-Cities (the others being Pasco and Richland). The capital city of the state, Olympia Washington is located approximately 266 miles northwest of Kennewick. Referred to as the Pacific Northwest. Kennewick which is a native American word meaning "Winter Paradise". Kennewick is recently known for the Kennewick Man discovered at Columbia Park during the annual Water Follies hydroplane races. He is the oldest known inhabitant of the area. His skeleton is 9,200 years old, making it the oldest nearly complete skeleton ever found in North America.

Some of the best things to do in Kennewick when you are not competing are to 1) visit one of the 27 beautifully maintained parks, the Columbia Park is a 360-acre river frontage that has something to offer everyone.2) Burgeoning culinary scene, 43 world class wineries, vast outdoor activities such as Fishing, Swimming, Boating, Windsurfing, Paddleboarding, Golf, and a History and Science culture. 3) Several RV Parks, Hotels, Shopping, and Restaurants. 4) Richland has a five (5) mile paved walking trail and can enjoy an outside concert, is also home to three community theater troupes, medieval renaissance and folklife festivals, and a classic car and street rod event. Richland offers you steelhead fishing, beautiful and challenging golf courses, a selfguided walking tour of the National Historic Register's "Gold Coast Neighborhood" with its "Alphabet Homes" and several places that commemorate Lewis and Clark's Corps of Discovery. 5) Pasco is host to the Fiery Foods Festival, the Cinco de Mayo Celebration, the Sacajawea Blue Grass Festival, and Heritage Days. There is always something of interest taking place in historic downtown Pasco for visitors of any age. The area's largest farmers' market is a great place to find fresh produce on Wednesdays and Saturdays and the recently launched Food Truck Friday features a variety of cuisine all in one place.

PLEASE MARK YOUR CALENDARS: The event will be held in the Toyota Center/Toyota Arena, located at 7000 W. Grandridge Blvd. in Kennewick, Washington July 29th - August 10th, 2024, and has a 153,000 sq ft combined total with both facilities which includes an Olympic NHL ice surface as well as a place for the World Tournament to take place.

The Kennewick Horseshoe Club hosts 23 outdoor courts in "Kennewick" during daylight hours only, located on the corner in Eastgate Park at Oak Street and 10<sup>th</sup> Street, approximately 15 minutes from the Toyota Center/Arena with another 4 courts located in Chiawana Park in Pasco, 2020 Rd 88, 20 minutes from the venue. The Washington Charter is looking forward to providing a great hosting experience for everyone that comes to visit their city and state for the 2024 World Tournament. For all "Charter Secretaries" that would like to have 2024 World Tournament packets/bags sent to them to hand out at any time during next year, which includes Tri- Cities tourism information, please email Kaiya at Kaiya@visittri-cities.com to receive these in time for your state tournament. You can contact Kaiya at any time throughout the year for these tourist informational packets/ bags.

We will begin working with Tri-Cities CVB, and the local hotels soon. The NHPA has not officially signed any hotel contracts for the 2024 World Tournament yet, but we are in the process, so please know that if you have tried or have made a reservation, it may not be honored for this event until we have signed any and all hotel room block contracts and the hotel room rates are subject to change. 

#### NHPA WEBSITE – US MAP

When attending Sports conference's throughout the year to get potential bidders, we have issues with some of these websites and cannot pull up the main contact information for officers to get a point of contact for that specific charter, or to show a CVB (Convention Visitors Bureau) what they want to see or to possibly submit a bid and prepare to host a future World Tournament.

For the charters that need assistance or guidance with their current websites, here are a few suggestions. We understand that not every charter or club has the finances, computers, technical background, or knowledge to create or maintain a charter website. Contact the NHPA Newsline editor Blaine Scott for assistance and information in how to set up and maintain your website using a free service, or you can contact your local IT Department head at your local community college, university, and ask them to have their class assist your organization in setting up and maintaining your website.



### The Projected 2024 World Tournament Format

I want to sort of repeat an article that I wrote last year. Here goes. At the 2022 annual Delegate meeting I presented a World Tournament presentation that suggested a complete WT format change. I would like to present my suggested new format so that the change planned for 2024 will be well known in advance. Keep in mind that the council will change, and this format may well be tweaked somewhat or abandoned depending on un-known future situations.



#### **Potential 2024 World Tournament Format**

There are several main desired changes and requirements that I will list first.

The venue will have to hold 48 competition courts and guarantee that the Wi-Fi system can handle our needed load and band width requirements. There will be a featured court with adequate camera coverage where each and every adult final game will be played, one at a time. All these final games will be for the World Championship Title in each category. How exciting is that? Theses games will also be played on the middle Saturday or the day before the delegate meeting. It is hoped to have decent crowds watching live and on webpage. The lower pitchers can come a couple of days early and finally get to see the best pitchers in the world. Here's how I see all of this happening.

The first major change involves the seeding of half of the championship classes. That will be eight Men, eight Women, and eight Elders. The Senior Men get six and the Senior Women will have four or six depending on the number entries. The first three days of tournament will feature 4 shifts. Theses shifts will be the top six groups of the Men, Women, and Elders. The fourth shift will be four Senior Men and two additional Women to help included enough Senior Women if they don't have their own group. They did in Lansing so this may need changes. These preliminaries will produce the move ups in all five adult categories.

The Championship Classes will begin on Thursday. The Men, Women, and Elders will play six games on Thursday and Friday and three games on Saturday morning. The Senior Classes will finish their Championship Classes on Friday. All games will be 40 points or 50 shoes, which ever comes first. This shoe format is needed to maintain our schedule. This will be very important when we get to the Championship games which are played one at a time. Ties are ties in the Championship preliminary classes. If needed, an afternoon shift on Friday could start the lower classes in the first week. The Junior pitching will be very much like it is now, Thursday and Friday's last shifts. It may be possible to move the final games for the Juniors and Cadets to Saturday also, that remains to be seen.

All five adult categories will be evaluated to choose the top four pitchers in each category. The criteria will be wins, head-to-head, ringer percentage and over entering average. At 11:00 am in all categories there will be a pitch-off between the number four and number one finishers and between the number two and number three finishers. The winners of these two games will play for the World Championship of their category.

The Championship games will also be 40 points or fifty shoe games. Since there is a chance for ties in the four-person preliminary and the championship games, I am proposing that ties be broken with two shoes pitched at a time starting with a shoe flip and alternating who starts as ties continue.

The first four shoes will be normal "up and back" style. If the players are still tied, the game will continue as sudden death where each pitcher will throw 2 shoes and if one scores, they are the winner. This continues until someone wins. Again all five categories will have center stage in this order: Senior Women, Senior Men, Elders, Women, and Men. This format is my creation and is subject to change. The lower classes of pitchers will pitch in the second week with the usual format of 16 person classes when possible. Come to Washington next year as we begin the new WT concept with exciting finishes and winner take excitement. Washington is a beautiful state and a great lace to visit.

## Facebook Update

If you have an account on Facebook and are associated with the NHPA Facebook Page/Group, you have seen that the content on those two locations is not controlled by the NHPA. The page has been hacked, all admins removed by the hackers, and we have been unable to get Facebook/Meta to respond to the issues. Facebook is notoriously bad about helping victims reclaim their pages and their accounts.

We don't know how they gained access since all administrators of the page still have control of their personal accounts. Typically, they will change the passwords on personal accounts and have access to much more than Facebook if people have not followed strong security practices.

We know that many NHPA Charters have Facebook groups. We encourage the following:

- 1. Require two-factor authentication for each of your accounts—I am personally getting messages almost daily from people trying to hack into my accounts on any of the places where I am actively working. Two factor authentication will send a code to my email, which is usually one that is not accidentally guessable by the hackers, providing a stronger protection for my accounts. It can also send a message through text, phone call or on a third party authenticator app.
- 2. Assign a backup admin on the account—in our case, we had 3 admins assigned to the account, but they removed everyone from the account
- 3. Be wary of who you add onto the group—Create group rules that will require them to agree to the rules, but it also provides a way for you to review who is coming into the group and whether there is intent to join and participate or intent to harm or spam.
- 4. Change your passwords every 3 months. Use a strong password at least 8 characters and use a combination of letters, numbers, and symbols.

At this point, we are not anticipating positive assistance from Facebook/Meta and are anticipating that we will need to recreate our social media presence on Facebook but are trying to shut down the current site that is getting more and more inappropriate in the content. We have engaged with a Cyber Security expert who has been working the issue. They are finding the same challenges that we found in trying to resolve the issue. We are sorry for what this has caused in our means to communicate effectively on that platform.



## 2023 World Tournament Prediction Panel has a Winning Record!

Now that the 2023 World Tournament in Lansing, Michigan is a wrap, it's time to reflect on the tournament past and focus on the 2024 World Tournament in Washington next year. This year at the world tournament we presented a few very special awards; High Game over average, most improved, Alex Carson Memorial Sportsmanship Award, Gary Roberts Youth Lifetime Award, and the Alan Francis Award. All these awards will be given at each world tournament in the future, and we would like to congratulate all our inaugural winners. Below are my speeches from both the ACM Sportsmanship Award and the GR Youth Lifetime Award presentations for anyone who missed those. In the coming months, we'll be putting in the Newsline the criteria for each award and how each award was and will be determined in the future.



I would like to remind everyone that we have many vacancies on our Youth Committee that we'll be looking to fill. We've said it several times but this committee becoming functional and fully operational is critical to our youth programs success. Anyone interested in being on this please don't hesitate to reach out to me for information.

Our inaugural Brian Simmons Youth/Adult doubles was also a success with Dan Watson and Zack Grzembski (our 2023 Alan Francis Award Winner) becoming the inaugural champions in a tough field. Full results from this and the Sunday warm-up tournament is still to come! We had almost 90 pitchers in our Sunday singles as well and ran a horseshoe tour style format to accommodate the late entries, that went well I thought.

Without diving deep into our predictions in comparison to the results from the World Tournament, it's worth noting that the panel had a very high success rate in predicting the outcome of the championship classes. A few noteworthy oversights were made by the panel though that stand out. First...is Andy Adams. The panel failed to predict that Andy would qualify for the championship round and Andy not only qualified but finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the championship class. Andy has really stepped up his game this year making him a strong contender. Also, in the men's championship the panel underpredicted the success of Randy Zeiders. While the panel put him in the class we didn't predict he'd finish as strong as he did, pitching Alan Francis his longest game, Randy made himself known on the World Tournament stage this year. In the Senior Men's class, the major miss for the panel was James Dunlap. The panel predicted Dunlap would finish 6<sup>th</sup> and he walked away with the 2023 World Championship!

For the youth classes the panel only correctly predicted Eli Sullivan and Lizy Jordan to win their classes, missing the mark on Derek Reynolds and Za'kiyah Arbogast taking their respective titles. The panel in those two classes predicted the underdogs to win those classes but were incorrect in assuming that the top contenders would lose their grip so easily.

The most notable oversight from the panel came in the Women's division. An oversight almost deserving of a retraction on our predictions for the Women's class. While we did successfully predict the outcome of the Women's championship class and the majority of the qualifiers, we somehow missed the mark on a very important staple of the Women's world championship class.

The panel managed to miss 2011 NHPA Hall of Famer and 25-time Women's World Championship qualifier **AMY FRANCIS**, when predicting the 2023 move-ups. Amy would not only qualify but finish 6<sup>th</sup> in the championship class and push the retaining world champion Sarah Chaffee to her limit in a 92-shoe game where the final score was 42-38 Sarah. The women's division also seen a record tied with a 140-shoe marathon between Sarah Chaffee and Marlene Ray, where both pitchers averaged over 86%!

Congratulations to everyone on their success at the 2023 World Tournament and I hope to see everyone back at the 2024 World Tournament in Washington next year. Good luck to everyone in their state tournaments that're upcoming as well!

#### <u>Alex Carson Memorial Sportsmanship Award – Presented 7/22/2023</u>

This year for the first time ever we have introduced some new awards for our youth pitchers, as you've seen with the most improved and high game over average. All of these will be annual awards given to our youth pitchers. Most importantly of all though is the sportsmanship award. Webster defines sportsmanship as "fairness, respect for one's opponent, and graciousness in winning or losing. While pondering this initial award, it brought back memories of World tournaments gone by. I thought of individuals who had exhibited both good and poor sportsmanship toward me in the past around the horseshoe courts. Often, we forget about how we treat our fellow pitchers when we get caught up in the emotions of this game we love so much. I thought of the pitchers from when I was a junior that had treated me poorly and how I remember that to this day, along with the pitchers who treated me with the upmost support and respect. Both impacts have shaped my view of states and tournaments in different ways. I originally had no plans to dedicate this sportsmanship award to anyone at all and make a baseline youth sportsmanship award. However, through my thought process I kept going back to a gentleman who unfortunately left us suddenly in the year since our last world tournament. I met this individual and his wife as they were travelling the country in their RV visiting the various horseshoe sites en route to that year's world tournament. Since then, I was fortunate to foster a relationship with both of them that will last the rest of my life. This gentleman was taken from us much too soon, but it is his memory that will stick with the entire horseshoe pitching community. He was one to always be found lending a helping hand around the courts at the world. Whether it was scorekeeping, setup, breakdown, anything the council needed to run the event smoothly, he was there to help. Pitching in 11 world tournaments and netting only 1 victory back in his first 2009 world tournament, he left a timeless impression on all that knew him. Even when he wasn't pitching well, he could be found with a smile upon his face, and while he never achieved the high levels of pitching each of us long for, his sportsmanship in defeat especially was unquestionable. Not to get too religious with this award but Proverbs 17:17 teaches us that a friend in both the good and the bad times. This man, if we were to truly study our encounters with him would remind us that the world tournament and horseshoe pitching in general is about the wins and losses of course, but more about the friendships and relationships we gain along the way. This individual has exemplified a lifelong love of the game of horseshoes, has continued to grow the NHPA, along with their state charter. Maintained a high level of humility, sportsmanship, promotion, positive publicity, respect for the game, and respect for the history of our organization. Has committed years of dedicated service to the growth and evolution of the NHPA with their involvement in almost every role in our association. When all those factors are considered, there is one individual who stands out. This initial recipient will have the award named after them for this and every future award winner and will present the award if they wish to do so. Our recipient this year, began his pitching career back in 1960 and is a member of one of the most famous families in horseshoe pitching history. His knowledge for the history of the game is almost unparalleled. He has promoted our organization at every type of tournament at every level, along with his family's exhibition at the annual Bob Evans Farm Festival. He is competing in his 40<sup>th</sup> World Tournament this year and has maintained an overall ringer percentage of over 60% with a combined 39 years of tournaments. He has managed to maintain a winning record of 439 wins and 425 losses with 864 games played and almost 39,000 shoes thrown in world tournament competition. He has appeared in the World Championship classes 25 times between the Jr. Boy's, Men's, and Sr Men's divisions. These appearances have netted him 5 World Championships, 1961 through 1964 in the Junior Boy's and the 2018 Sr. Men's title as well. He is a 1986 member of the Ohio Horseshoe Pitching Hall of Fame and a 2013 member of the NHPA hall of fame. His knowledge for the history of horseshoes is almost unmatched, but perhaps most impressive of all is his conduct. He conducts himself at a high level both on and off the courts, and although he does have a temper, it is rarely shown to the public or even members of the council. Always willing to lend a helping hand and treating all pitchers and people with the same level of respect no matter how they rank in this game of horseshoes. This gentleman conducts himself with the highest level of self-care and respect wherever he is and whoever he's around. A true example of being who you are wherever you are and you will never go wrong. When we sat on a couch in Monroe, Louisiana last year the only guidance he gave on this position was that we need to do things that have never been done before and dammit I think we're accomplishing several new things. And if he fires me tomorrow, I can sincerely say he is a friend to many, a role model to all, Ohio's current sitting president, along with our NHPA President. Making the very first recipient of the Gary Roberts Youth Lifetime Award, Ohio's own, Gary Roberts.
